EXPLANATORY NOTES.

An asterisk (*), as usual, indicates the decease of the person to whose name it is prefixed. Wherever ascertainable, full names are given; an initial not followed by a period denotes that there is nothing beyond the initial.

In the list of TRUSTEES biographical notes are appended solely to the names of those deceased who were members of the board by charter or election.

In the list of PROFESSORS, which includes Associate and Assistant professors, the professorships are arranged in general groups in the order of establishment. In each of these groups the order is strictly chronological, and the names of the professors of the general subject are followed by no qualifying word or clause, while subordinate rank is indicated by the words *Associate*, *Assistant*, etc. In this list also, biographical notes are given only in the case of those deceased.

The list of MATRICULATES includes both graduates and non-graduates, and is intended to give in all cases the record of study at the University, comprising the years and terms of attendance, the course pursued, or the degrees received, and the original residence of the matriculate. In the case of undergraduates in attendance in June, 1888, the years are enclosed within parentheses to indicate that the record is unfinished.

Besides the common abbreviations for degrees, the following are used to denote the various courses of study, etc.

In the list of MATRICULATES, the names of graduates are printed in **heavy face** type and are followed by a note containing such biographical information as has been obtained in response to the circulars sent to all graduates. Where no reply has been received from living graduates, information obtained at second hand has been given, but such information is printed in *italics*. The biographical note is intended to give (1) colleges previously attended (in parentheses); (2) colleges attended after graduation at Cornell; (3) present profession or occupation; (4) official positions; (5) publications; (6) the present address of the graduate. Where the publications were numerous, only a few of the more important have been named. It is intended, however, to prepare a full Bibliography of publications by Cornell alumni, covering the period from 1868 to 1893—twenty-five years—and the replies to the circulars for the Ten-Year Book have supplied much material for such a bibliography. In order that the record may be made complete, all alumni are earnestly requested to send to the Librarian of the University the exact titles and dates, and, if possible, a copy of any books or articles they may publish.

Corrections of biographical data, changes of residence, titles and dates of positions held, dates and places of decease, and all similar information concerning the alumni should also be sent to the LIBRARIAN OF CORNELL UNIVERSITY.

BY THE CHARTER.

1865 *EZRA CORNELL, *Founder of the University*, 1874

Born at Westchester, New York, January 11, 1807; removed to De Ruyter 1819; came to Ithaca 1828, and was occupied in mechanical pursuits 1830-40; associated with Professor S. F. B. Morse in the construction of the experimental telegraph line between Washington and Baltimore 1843-4, and appointed Assistant Superintendent 1843; Superintendent of the construction of the line between New York and Baltimore 1845; Contractor for the line from New York to Albany 1846, and for that from Troy to Montreal 1847; Director and President of the Erie & Michigan Telegraph Company 1847-55, and Director of the Western Union Telegraph Company 1855-74; Member of the National Republican Convention at Pittsburgh 1856; President of the State Agricultural Society of New York 1862, and delegate from the Society to the Royal Agricultural Exhibition in London in the same year; founded the Cornell Library at Ithaca 1863; was a Member of the State Assembly of New York 1862-3, and of the State Senate 1864-8; President of the Board of Trustees of the Cornell University from its foundation in 1865, till his death, at Ithaca, December 9, 1874.
