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# LAPD MODEL

## POLICING BEST PRACTICES IMPLEMENTED

- LAPD is Civilian led: Sets policy, Inspector General, Robust Use of Force Oversight.
- AB 392 Compliant Use of Force Policy that includes reverence for life, de-escalation, proportional response and a duty to intercede and duty to report excessive force and misconduct.
- Robust Training: Implicit Bias Training, CIT Training, and Command & Control.
- TEAMS Early intervention system, Body worn cameras, In-dash cameras; Critical Incident video release policy.
- SMART Teams, Community Safety Partnership, RESET



# LAPD OFFICERS

## DELIVERING IMPROVED COMMUNITY OUTCOMES

- OIS at a 30-Year Low
- OIS decreased 45.83% over last 5 years
- OIS 37% below 4-year average
- Categorical UOF involving mentally ill suspect dropped 43% in 2019
- Less lethal force options increased

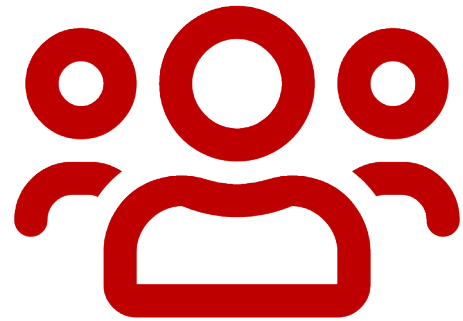
# LIES, DAMN LIES AND STATISTICS



Black suspects accounted for 13,485 violent crime suspects – 44% of the 30,975 total violent crime suspects in 2019.

Black residents represent 9% of the population of Los Angeles.

# LAPPL NATIONAL REFORM PLAN

## INVEST IN BETTER POLICING

**63%**

Some want to reduce the scope of what police do in the city by shifting non-emergency, non-criminal calls related to mental health or homelessness to professionals in those fields, but retain most officers for criminal investigations or violent calls for service

**23%**

The other approach is to keep the number and scope of what police do in the city about the same as it is now

-- or --

**13%**

Others want to reduce the number and scope of what police are doing in the city by cutting the number of police officers by more than 90%

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# LAPPL NATIONAL REFORM PLAN

## INVEST IN BETTER POLICING

Ensure there is ongoing and frequent **crisis intervention** and **de-escalation training** of police officers to build and refresh skills.

Expand the Mental Evaluation Unit which dispatches a **mental health worker with a specially trained police officer** for those experiencing a mental health crisis.

1. Determine which non-violent, non-emergency calls don't require a police response.
2. Determine which calls require specially trained officers & mental health experts to safely manage crisis incidents.

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# LAPPL NATIONAL REFORM PLAN

## INVEST IN BETTER POLICING

Ensure there is ongoing and frequent **crisis intervention** and **de-escalation training** of police officers to build and refresh skills.

71% 93%

Create a national **database of officers who have been fired** for gross misconduct so they cannot work in other police departments.

72% 90%

1. Increase funding for de-escalation and crisis intervention training.
2. Implement national database of officers fired for gross misconduct to prevent other agencies from hiring them.

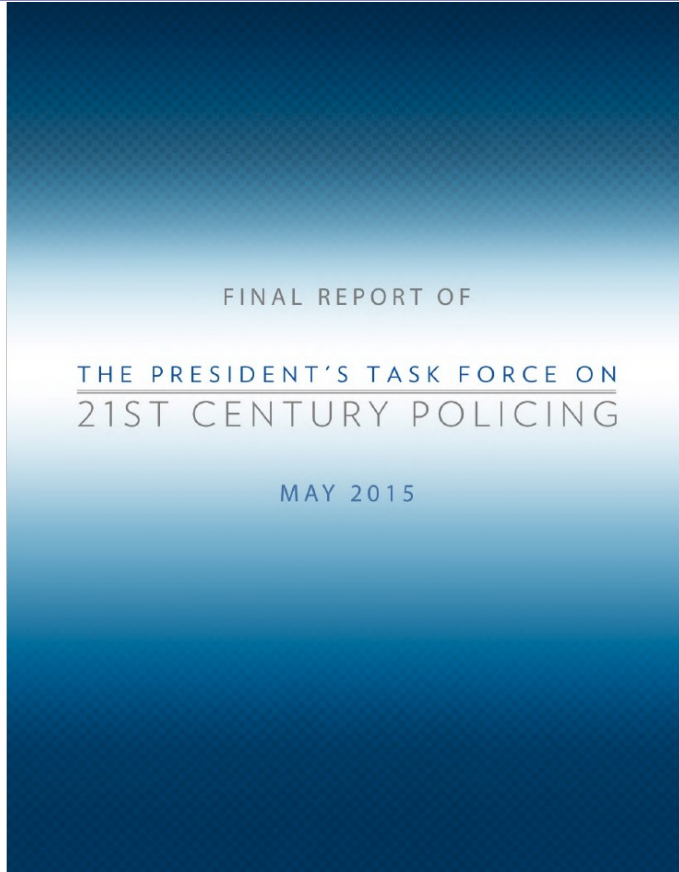
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# PRESIDENT OBAMA'S TASK FORCE ON 21ST CENTURY POLICING



- Law enforcement agencies should adopt procedural justice as the guiding principle for INTERNAL and external practices. (Recommendation 1.1.)
- “It follows that officers who feel respected by their organizations are more likely to bring this respect into their interactions with the people they serve.”





# LAPD OFFICERS

## DELIVERING IMPROVED COMMUNITY OUTCOMES



- Little to no public recognition by Police Commission & political leaders on the advancements made by LAPD over the last several decades.
- “Reform Plans” that include items already implemented by LAPD.
- Public vilification by city leaders of the Department and officers. Zero rationale for \$150 budget cut. Zero analysis of impacts of cuts on public safety.
- Leadership void in condemning physical attacks on our officers.

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The Police Commission, Mayor, and City Council should model the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Policing principles they promote INTERNALLY. The current failure to do so has led to the lowest police officer morale we can remember.
