

## The Fable of the Bees

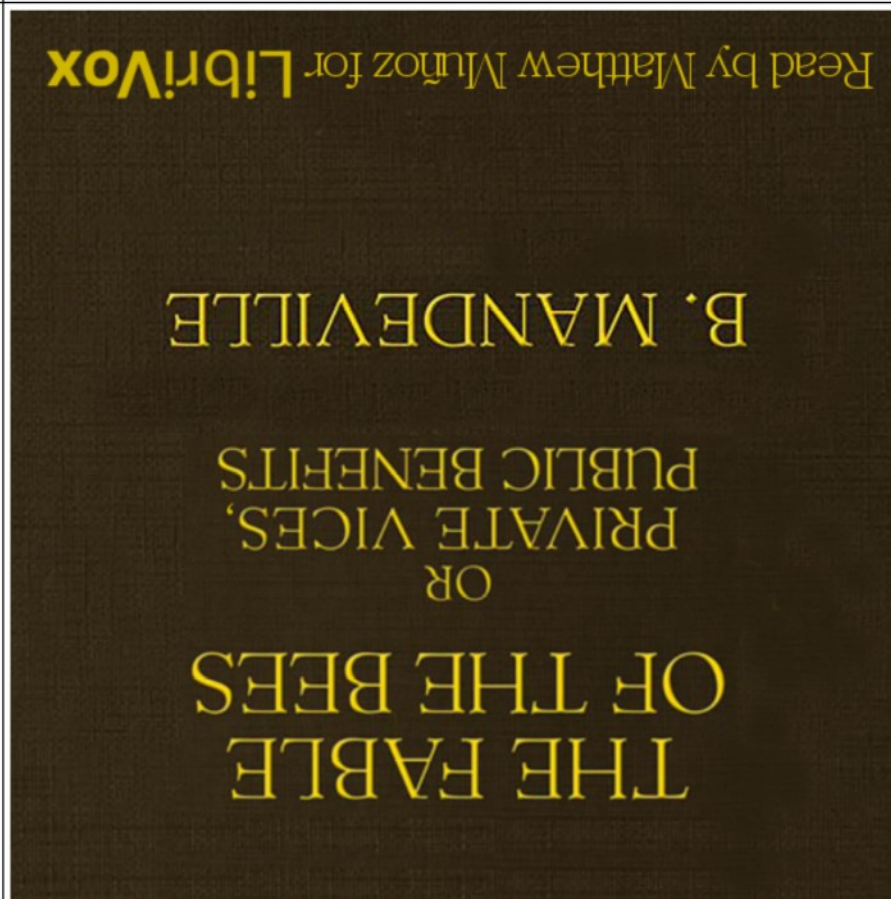
Bernard MANDEVILLE (1670 - 1733)
