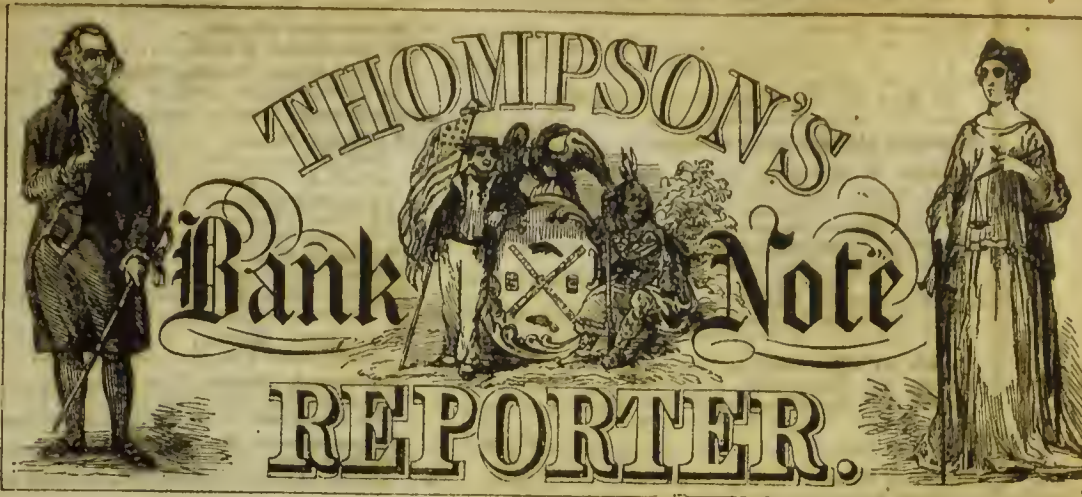

Pasting operation.—This mode of making false tokens has of late become so prevalent that scarce a bank escapes its practices. To enumerate all the alterations thus made would be to fill the List with isolated descriptions, when a single paragraph would answer every purpose:—3's, 5's, 10's, or higher figures are pasted over 1's or 2's, and the words expressing the original value of the bill are defaced, or some times erased and the fictitious value substituted. Another practice is, to take a number of bills of the same bank and denomination and so tear them and paste them together again, that one bill is gained in about every ten so altered. Another is, the pasting of parts of different (spurious) hills together; and this is done with a great deal of ingenuity—but they can all be detected by close inspection when held to the light. The better way is to refuse bills that are in any way deficient.

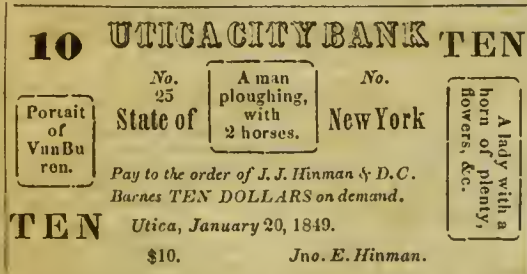
The letter (D.) attached to a bank indicates that the rate of discount is doubtful. The Safety Fund banks in the State of New York are designated by (S); the Free banks by (F). If a bank is dashed (—) it is worthless. If the name of a bank cannot be found in this list, do not take it.

Deceptive—if not Fraudulent.

CHECKS ON THE UTICA CITY BANK.

Checks on this Bank, having the appearance of Bank notes, and evidently intended to be passed as the notes of the bank, are in circulation.

We have seen the 10's, which require some scrutiny to discover the real character of the shinplaster. When carefully read, it will be found a check on the Utica City Bank, as follows:



If this device has been sanctioned by the UTICA CITY BANK, it should be wound up by the Comptroller without delay, and the engraver who furnished the plates should never receive an order from the Banking Department for another bank note plate.

We published the above last week; since then we have received from Mr. Hinman the following letter:

J. THOMPSON, Esq.—

Dear Sir—In your Bank Note Reporter of April 5, under the head of "Deceptive if not Fraudulent," you speak of a check drawn by me, and make some remarks, reflecting on the Utica City Bank, as well as on myself.

I was not before this aware, that it was deceptive or fraudulent to draw on a Bank, or for a Bank to be drawn on, for funds in its possession, merely because the check is drawn on silk paper.

You also say, "Checks on this Bank having the appearance of Bank Notes, evidently intended to be passed as notes of the Bank," carrying the idea, that they are intended for a fraudulent purpose, and designed for circulation, as Bank Notes. I can only say, that not one word of this is true, the checks having been used for the purchase of produce, in the village of Ottawa, Illinois, where I am known, and interested in an establishment for that object only.

You would seem to desire the reader to infer, that the "device" (as you are pleased to term it), had in some way been sanctioned by the Bank, and then invoke the Comptroller to wind up its concerns, (a modest request), and not satisfied with this, you make a fling at the engraver of the check. This is all wrong, and my opinion is, you will not differ from me on reflection. No institution stands higher, for the length of time it has been in operation, than the Utica City Bank; and its officers are all above suspicion, and are competent to judge for themselves of the propriety of receiving funds and allowing them to be drawn out, either on checks drawn on cotton or silk paper, as shall best suit the depositor, and that too, without consulting any Bank Note Reporter.

No checks of any description, except these tens, have been issued, and the reasons for printing them on silk paper, (if you must know), I will give—*first*, to prevent frauds and forgeries, and *secondly*, convenience and safety of transmission in the winter season, when there is no convenient communication, (except by mail), between Utica and Ottawa, a distance of about 1,400 miles, and the third reason is, that it is no business of yours, as you or any other man are not obliged to take them. All genuine checks issued by me will be received by anyone acquainted with me, either in Ottawa, New York city, or Utica my place of residence for the last 50 years; and I think any Bank having my funds in deposit, will pay any of these \$10 checks at sight, even if they should, some of them, be drawn on silk paper, and without consulting a stranger first.

Now sir, you will oblige me by correcting the erroneous im-

pression designed by you, to be created by the publication of your article, in such a manner as is calculated to undeceive the community, and oblige your humble servant,

JNO. E. HINMAN.

UTICA, April 6, 1849.

In addition to the foregoing we have only to say,

1st. Mr. Hinman enclosed a ten dollar Utica City Bank note to the engravers, as a sample for his check.

2d. A proof sheet of the check was sent to the Bank, and the Bank virtually approved it.

3d. The check which we have in our possession, was taken by a Wall Street broker for a ten dollar Utica City Bank note.

4th. We do feel that it is a part of our business to keep the public informed of all "such devices;"—*particularly* when "such devices" are calculated to deceive the public, (whether done intentionally or otherwise,) do we feel it our business to place them in their true light. Our object is more to keep irresponsible operators from following Mr. Hinman's example, than to interfere with his "issues."

The Canal Commissioners have advertised for a loan of \$1,739,000, 6 per cent. stock, redeemable in 1865, which with the amount in the treasury, will discharge the \$2,149,400 which falls due in July next.

The Constitution of the State, Article vii. Section 1, provides that \$1,300,000 per annum of the Canal revenue be set apart as a Sinking Fund, until 1855, and \$1,700,000 per annum from that year, from which the interest is to be paid, and the balance go to liquidate the principal. The operation of this sinking fund will cancel the Canal debt in 1865.

Section 2d of the same article of this Constitution, sets apart \$350,000 per annum of the Canal revenue, until the time when the entire Canal Debt shall be paid off, (1865), and \$1,500,000 after that time, as a sinking fund for the payment of the General Debt. The operation of this compound sinking fund will cancel the entire State debt in 1870, even if a portion of the contingent debt shall fall upon the State.
