SUBJECT: Interrogation of Rudolph Trappe.

TO: Commanding Officer, Signal Security Detachment "D",
APO 757, US Army Attn. TICOM.

1. The above named civilian was employed by the Chiffrier-
stelle office, at first the Reichswehrministerium and later the OKW
since 1919 until its capture by the Americans at Werfen, Austria
(A-08).

2. His work follows:- (a) Translations of French and English
military manuals, newspapers, technical articles, clear text
messages, radio and press items.

(b) Decoding French military codes and
systems on hand from base material furnished by OHI. Removing
of double encipherment of same,

(c) Working on successors of codes he
had previously been working on,

(d) Card index of names resulting from
decoding.

3. His places of work follow:

1919 - Munich at military wireless station at Oberwiesenfeld.

1922 - Kassel at military wireless station at Niederzwehren

1924 - Stuttgart - first at Rotebuehl Kaserne

1932 - Stuttgart area - then at Burgholzhof

1933 - Berlin - Reichswehrministerium

1942 - Berlin - Roon Strasse (low number)

1943 - Berlin - Prinz Heinrich Strasse

1943 - Berlin - Haus des Fremdenverkehrs, Potsdamer Brücke

March 1945 - Halle - Heeresnachrichtenschule

5 April 1945 - En route to Prien, Chiem See, Bavaria;
however, because of air attacks never
reached there

3 May 1945 - Arrived at Werfen, Austria.
