This man is one of the 39 prisoners removed from Konstantinsbad to Revins and now possibly at Wiesbaden.

He was the head technician of the outfit and a very competent man, with several electrical patents to his credit.

During interrogation he stated that he had designed and built a machine for R.F.P., and that no similar machine existed anywhere else in the Wehrmacht. This machine expressed the signal of a given transmitter as a perfectly stationary pattern on a screen of the oscillograph type and this pattern could then be traced on a sheet of paper and filed. The system of analysing patterns and dividing them into more and more restrictive categories was very fully worked out and it was even possible, for example, to decide whether a given set was being operated over land or water. The technical difficulties of the machine all turned about the obtaining of a stationary pattern, but these were satisfactorily overcome.

This man claims he can rebuild this machine in a month, given the necessary facilities for design and construction. He is carrying with him some equipment which I liberated for him and which he needs to make this machine.
