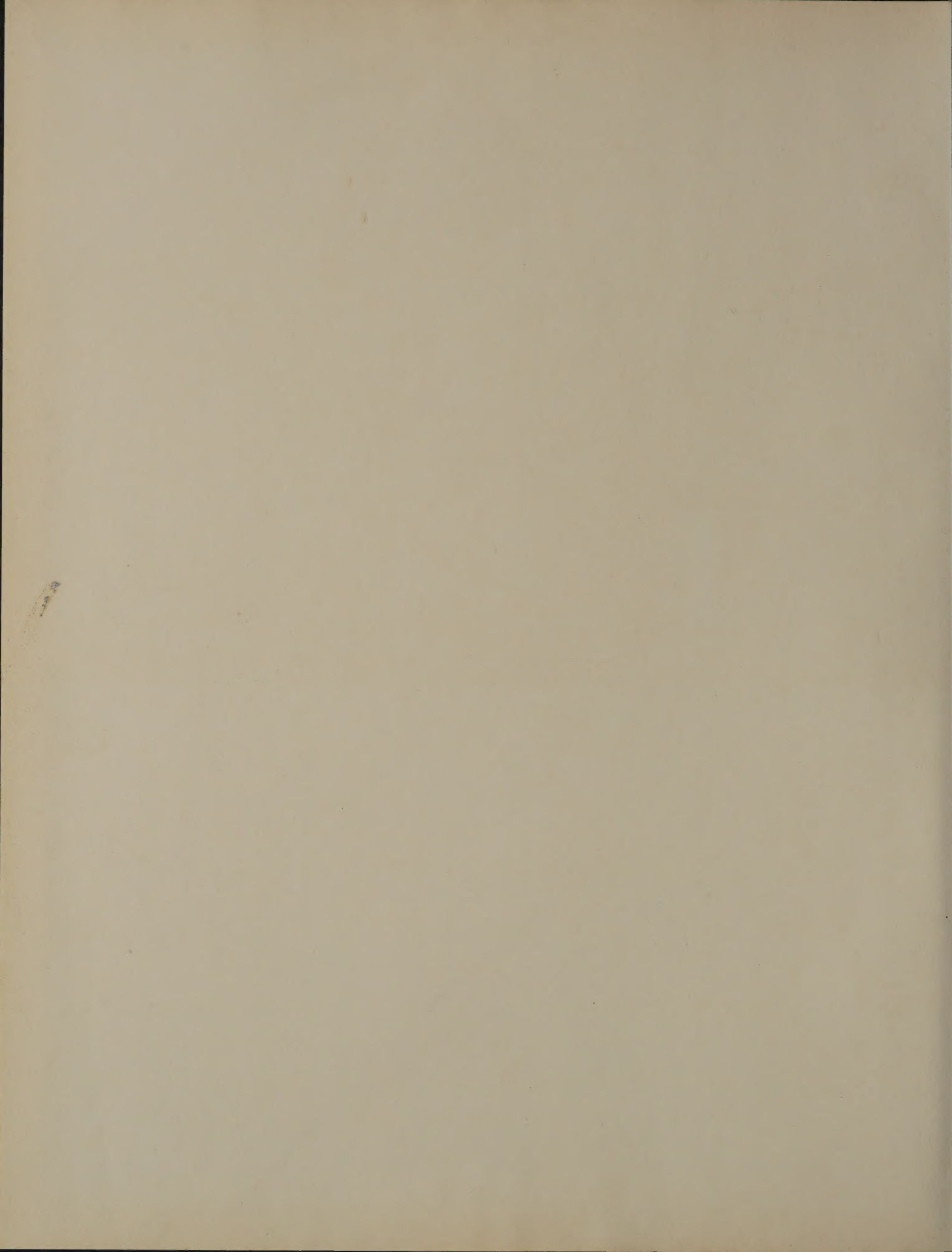


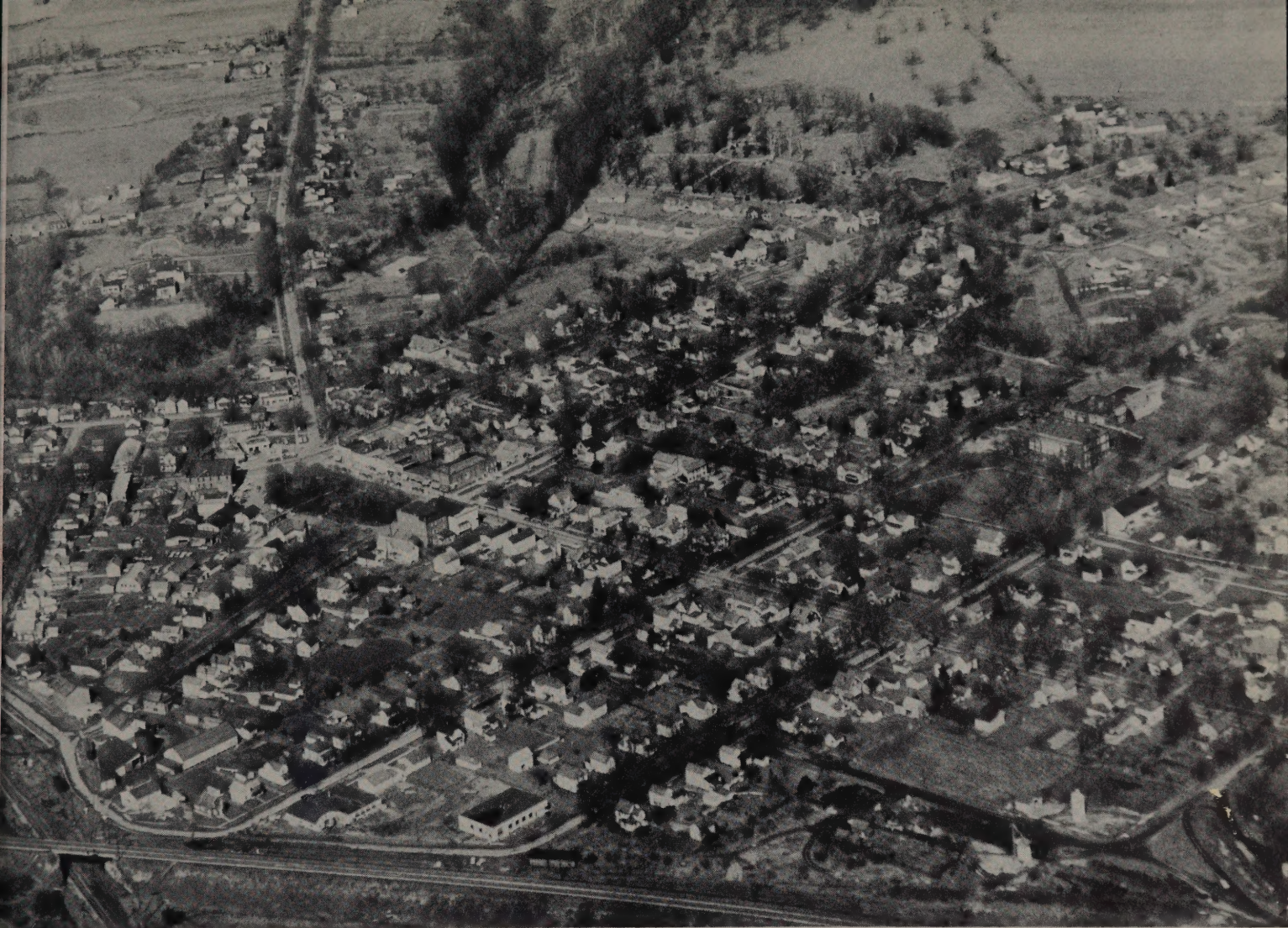

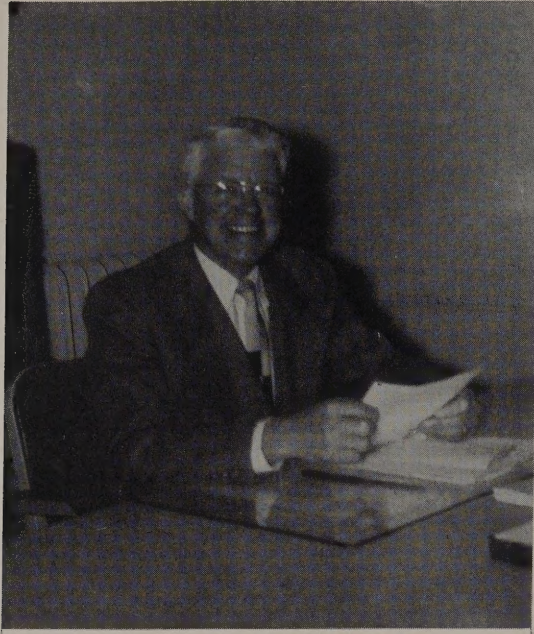




Dedication
