Of course, if we stand still, we make no footprints.

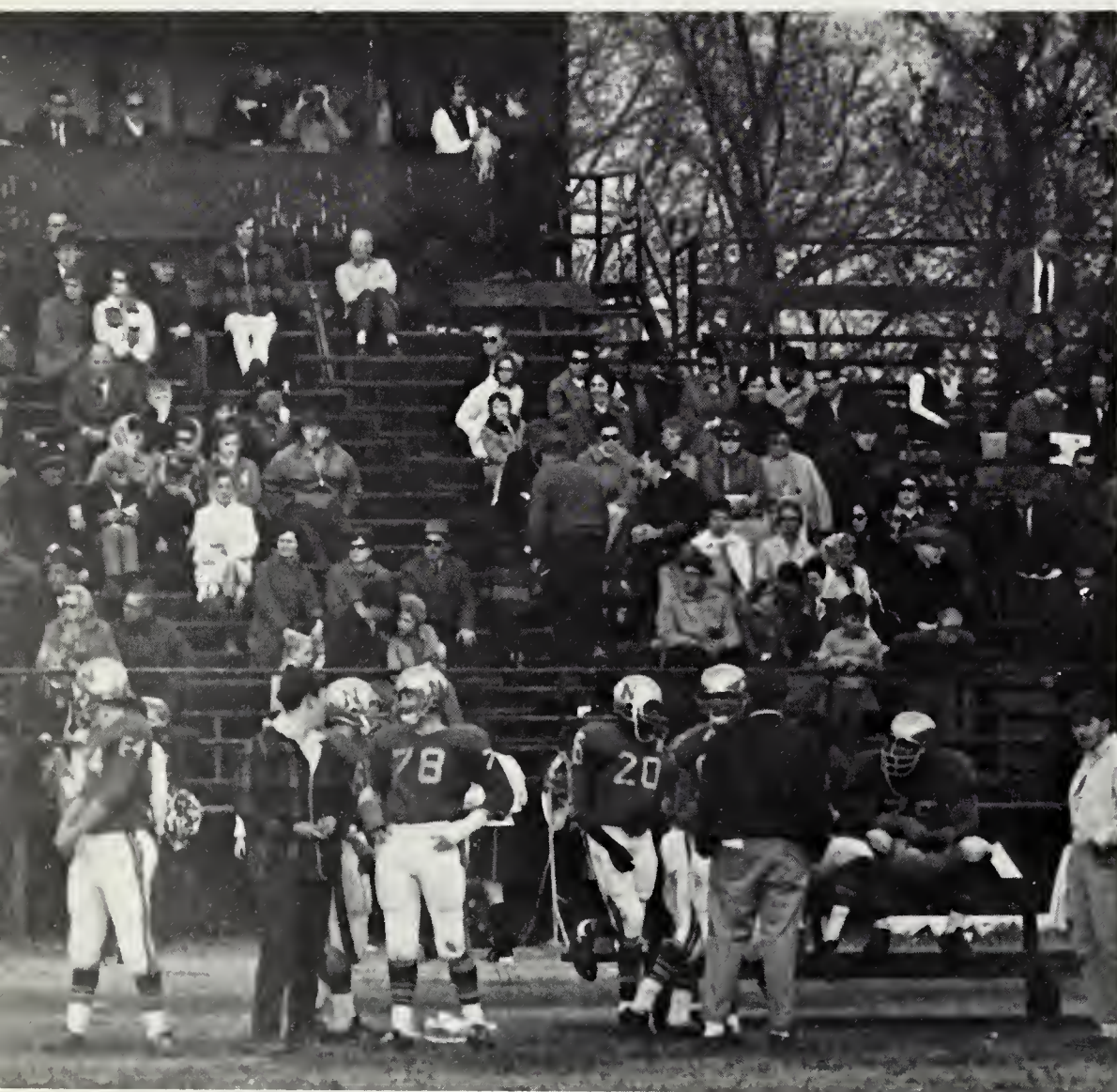

Teamwork Insures Forward Motion



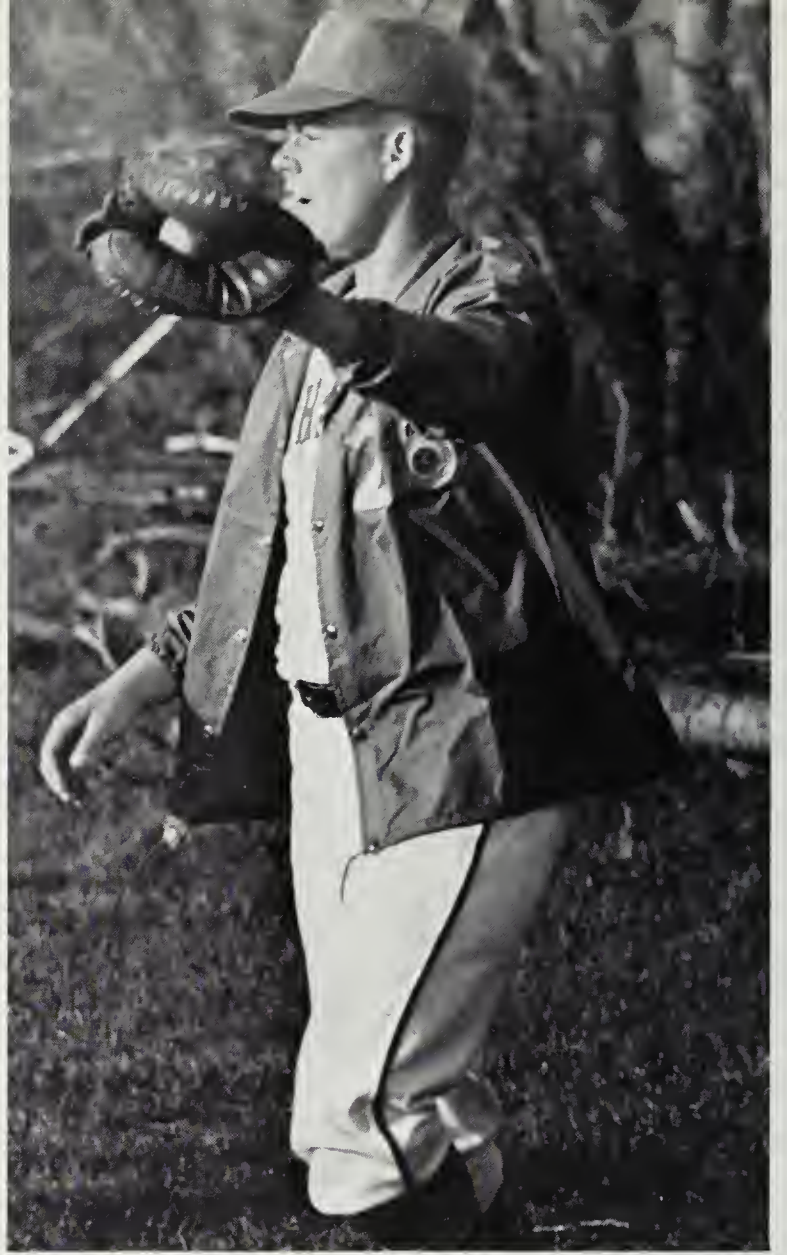
Jackets Boast 11-4 Record

Northampton's baseball team ended its most successful season in several years with an 11-4 overall record and a 7-4 conference tally. This was the best percentage of wins achieved by any Jacket varsity team in five years.

The squad boasted several offensive stand-outs—Kenny Collins, David Partin, Steve Lewis, and Lew Willis—who each hit better than .240. Three of these lettermen will be returning to the 1970 team.

Tony Partin headed the pitching staff, and back-up pitcher Norman Gladden recorded a 6-1 score. An infield comprised of nearly all underclassmen supported the pitchers by holding the opponents to a relatively small number of runs.

The softball team charted a 3-3 season record in its second year under Coach Mary Walker. The captain, Cynthia Mapp, led her teammates in hitting and did an outstanding job of fielding from her third base position.

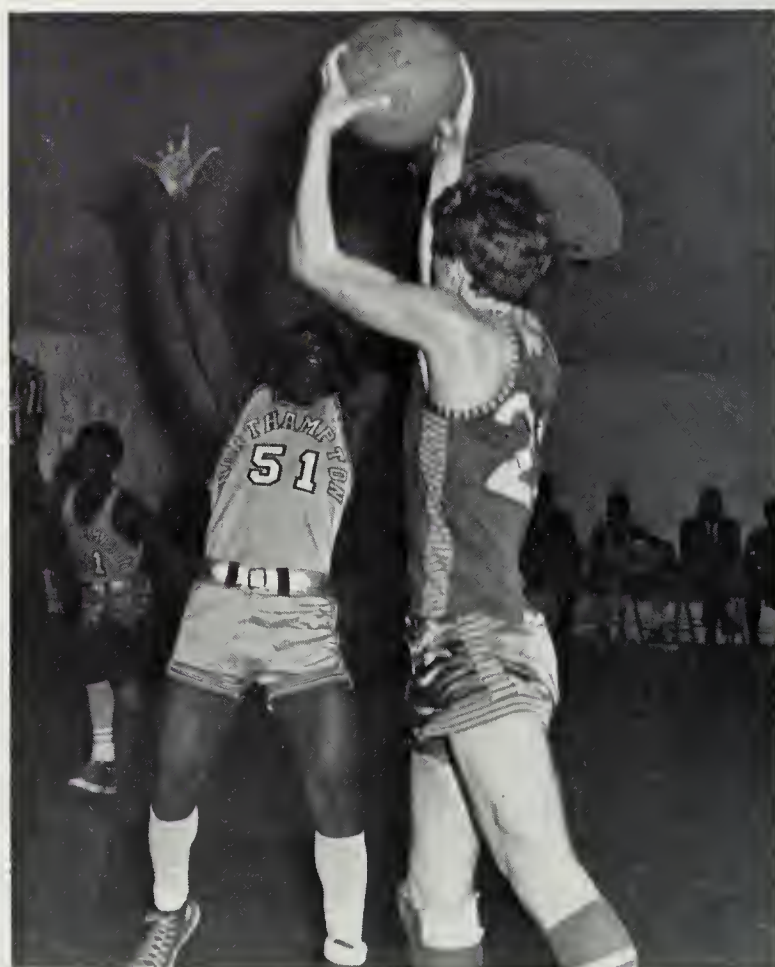

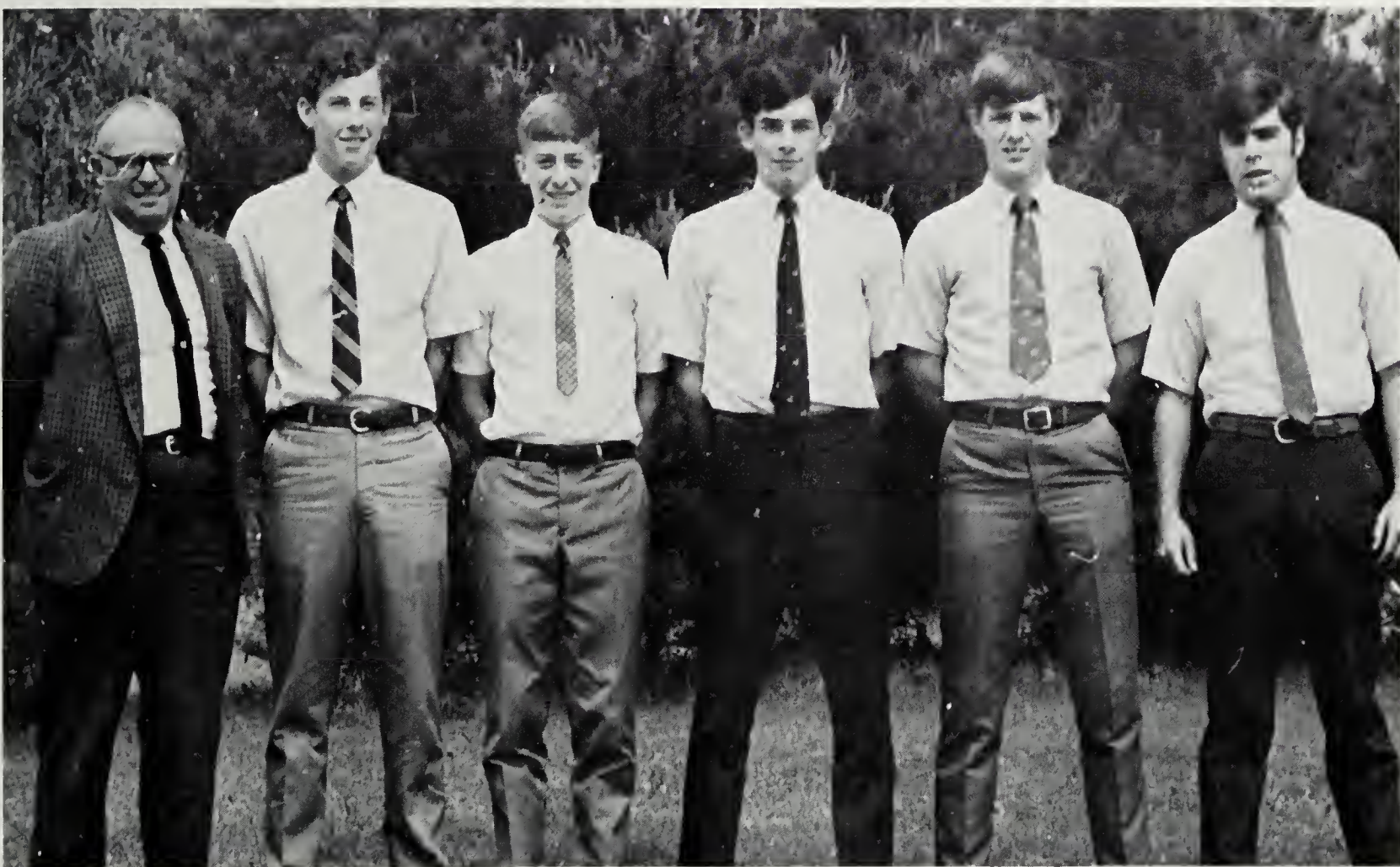

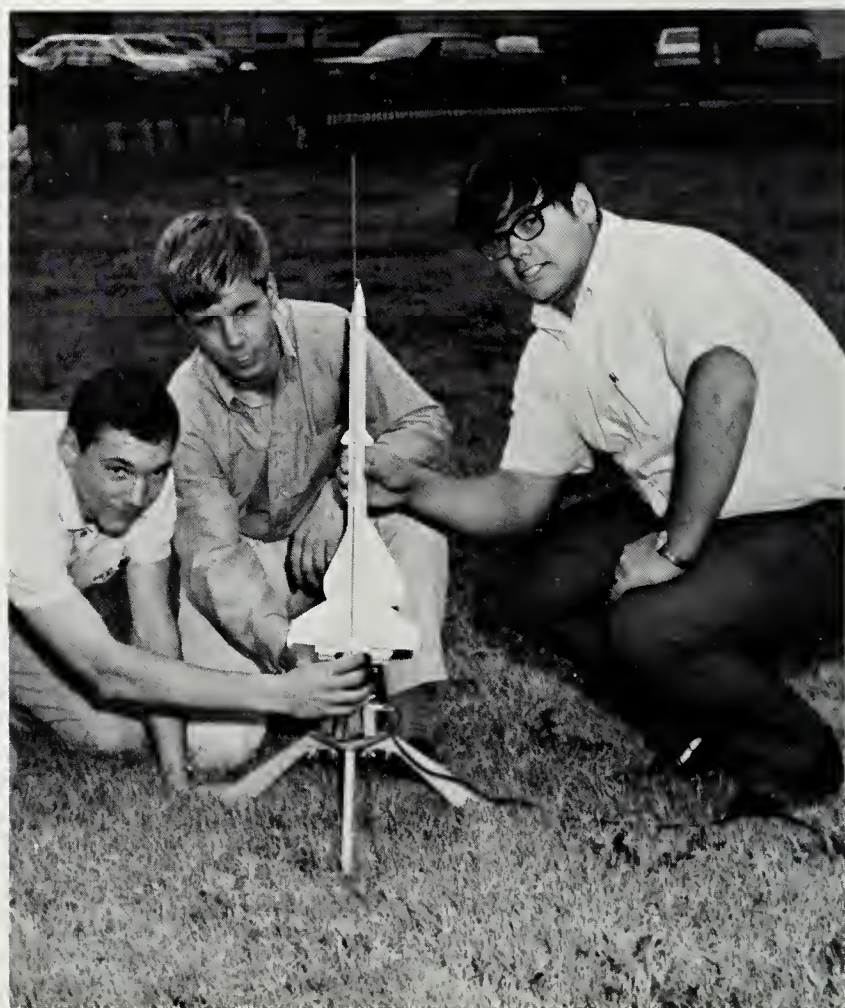

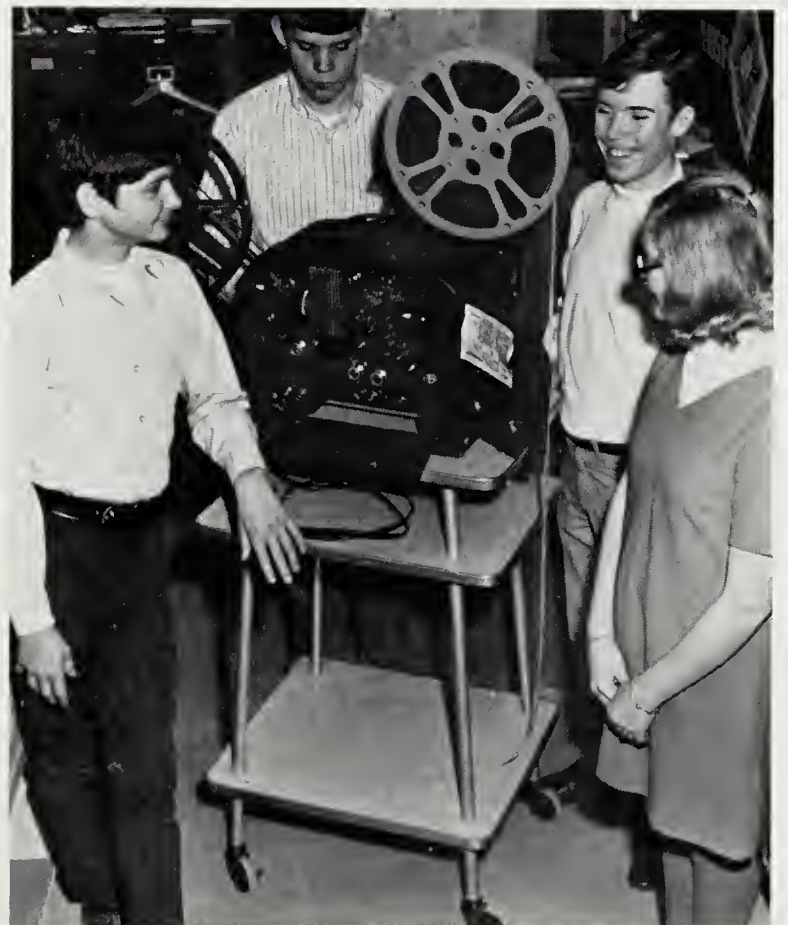
