


In September 1954, eight African Americans quietly joined the student body at Spring Hill College and, without hysteria and unnecessary disturbance of any kind, changed the campus forever. Included among them were Mary Andrea Abrams '57, Patricia Blackmon '58, Robert Buchanan '57, Elbert LaLande '57, Cecilia Mitchell '58, Julia Ponquinette '58 and Fannie Motley, who entered in the spring of 1955 and who would become the College's first African-American graduate a year later. As Spring Hill College commemorates the 50th anniversary of integration this academic year, we honor the spirit and courage of these first students and we celebrate those who have helped shape the richly diverse College community we share today.

The next morning, a sh with a painted head and two e hung from the sign near third entrance. The hangmen I inscribed it: "KKK's are Chi en." A prefect heard about












Spring Hill Welcomes Arun Gandhi


Arun Gandhi, grandson of Mohandas Gandhi and President of the M.K. Gandhi Institute for Nonviolence, on Thursday, October 28th, 2004 for panel discussion on the philosophy of nonviolence.



Gandhi illustrated the role of nonviolence in the problem of racial intolerance in America and argued that the United States has not been able to accomplish successful integration. Gandhi has said that no matter how many laws requiring integration are enacted, true racial understanding and respect will only occur if the people of the United States desire it to be so.

HURRICANE HAN

Hurricane Ivan formed around September 4th, 2004. After only a couple days in the Atlantic, Ivan strengthened to a category 4 hurricane. By the time it reached Jamaica, Ivan was a Category 5 hurricane. Ivan moved into the Gulf of Mexico, headed for the Gulf Coast. Spring Hill College reacted quickly, cancelling classes from September 14th to the 20th. The majority of campus taped their windows and left town. Spring Hill's campus, luckily, sustained little serious damage beyond having to remove some trees and revise the fall academic calender.

During its life, Ivan created 165 mile per hour winds. It caused over \$16 billion in damages and was responsible for 92 direct fatalities accross its path, which included Jamaica, Cuba, Alabama, Florida, Texas, Louisiana, and many areas along the east coast.










