Eva Jarvis Critz, an eminently able and highly articulate representative of the "Business Community" of Princeton, who has embarked upon her second year as Executive Director of the Greater Princeton Chamber of Commerce and Givie Council, As the 800-member Ghamber-Council, placing as much stress upon its public responsibilities as it does upon its communents to the individual and collective interests of its constituency, prepares to observe the 10th anniversary of its founding. Mrs. Critz, a Princetonian for some 15 years, is playing a more and more active role in interpreting Princeton to others and in seeking ways in which Princeton can become "an even stonger place."



S. Matine Corps in 1913. Returning to civilian life with the rank of Segeant following three years of World War II duty, during which she had uuct her busband adule serving as a Chaple organist, she carned the degree of Bachelor of Music at the University of Mississippi and first saw Princeton in the mid-1950's when her husband was named the University's Presbyterian Chaplain and, then, Assistant Dean of the University Chapel.

Mrs. Gritz, the mother of three (a 23-year old daughter now a, needical serverary in Princeton, a 20-year old son serving with the infantry at Fort Lewis, Wash, and a 13-year old daughter) will be recalled as a volunteer-leader in such diverse programs as Princeton Hospital, the Girl Sconts, the YWCA and the University Chaplel. As her childhen came of age, she accepted positions of growing responsibility within the University, initially with the Development Office and ultimately with departments of instruction on both the Main and Jance Fortestal Campuses.
