Your color set is still two to three years off.

You'll be able to see demonstration models in your dealer's showroom within a few months. You'll be hearing that all of a certain network's shows will be televised in color at least once in 1954. You'll read items about filmed programs being shot in color as well as black and white.

But as for sitting down in your own living room and looking at exciting color television on a 21-inch tube set you bought for \$500-\$600—that day won't come until at least 1956.

You say you want the facts? The National Appliance and Radio-TV Dealers Association met in Chicago recently. These are the gentlemen who must know exactly what's ahead so that they can buy goods to sell you. They were curious as to whether they should buy black and white sets for you or wait for color receivers that will bring a new dimension, a new reality to TV.

They're buying black and white.

The NARDA men saw impressive color demonstrations on 11½-inch picture tubes. They heard that while a few sets would be turned out with those tubes, the manufacturers were developing much larger ones. They heard that at least two different kinds of large color picture tubes are under development, that neither of these has reached the production stage. They heard that two of the networks haven't even started real color planning.

If the businessmen in NARDA are convinced that despite all the advance publicity, color will come by evolution instead of revolution, then we might as well take our cues from them, settle down with our black and white sets, and enjoy television now.

NO MORE TELETHONS ?

TELETHONS may soon become a thing of the past. On the assumption that these TV fund-raising shows are ruining the careers of too many performers, an organization representing all actors' unions has banned the appearance of any performer on network telethons. That immediately put an end to the national TV charity drives such as Milton Berle and Dean Martin and Jerry Lewis have conducted.

In addition, this same organization has ruled that 10 percent of the gross collection of local telethons must be paid into its own charity fund. This

means that actors can still appear on telethons if it's a strictly local show, but the charity group turns over 10 percent of all money collected to the actors' fund. With pay already the order of the day for electricians, stagehands and musicians, charity groups fear this cut for actors may make all telethons unprofitable.

The unions' action was not unexpected. While most viewers might think all performers contributed their services gratis to telethons, actually it's been only the top-name stars who work for free — and then only on shows conducted in the star's home

town. If a New York TV star, for example, travels to Cleveland, Washington, or some other city to emcee a telethon, he's paid his regular fee plus expenses. Some stars turn this money back to the charity. In most cases, however, the performers as well as their agents consider telethons just another working engagement.

On past network telethons, usually conducted from New York or Hollywood, the stars didn't have to travel from home base. In such cases they worked for nothing, either as emcee or answering phone calls. But again,

most of the variety acts who entertained viewers between pleas for money received the same fee they would get for an appearance on a regular TV show, or in a theater or night club.

The new ruling permitting only local telethons will not hurt some charity groups, such as United Cerebral Palsy. UCP, most successful as a telethon campaigner, works only with local shows. In an individual city, according to UCP, each pledge over \$25 can be double-checked before it is racked up on the tote board. In addition, members of the local branch of-

fice can go out personally to collect pledges.

Some local UCP telethons have produced, in actual cash, as much as 118 percent of the money pledged by phone. (The figure may be a slight exaggeration, since a number of phone calls became backlogged on the switchboard and so could not be included in the total amount pledged on the show). But whatever the reason, UCP's telethon in New York in December, 1952, listed \$553,000 pledged and \$642,824 collected.

Despite its bright record, UCP has

had its share of collection troubles. In a recent New York telethon, for example, when Actor David Wayne was answering phone calls, an unidentified person promised a \$5000 check for UCP if Wayne would pick it up personally at Table 15 in Lindy's restaurant. Without waiting for one of the phone operators to verify the call, Wayne rushed over to Lindy's. The call turned out to be a phony. Nobody knew anything about the check.

On the same telethon, however, John Barrymore, Jr., received a call promising him \$5000 if he would pick up the money personally at the Hotel

Statler. He too rushed out, and found a business executive waiting to greet him with a \$5000 check. To avoid mistakes, though, UCP has made it a practice to verify all calls pledging \$25 or over. Two phones on each show are used exclusively to phone pledgees and verify the call.

UCP and all other charities planning to conduct telethons henceforth will have to pay that 10 percent to the actors' group, known as Theater Authority (TA). In return for this, TA has agreed to waive its previous insistence on fees to name stars ap-

pearing on a telethon. But lesser-known performers, or rank-and-file union members, must still be paid the standard minimum union scale.

TA spokesmen insist they have nothing against charity drives as such, and certainly are not against charities. The only reason for their demands is to protect the careers of performers: if a star does his regular night club act on a telethon for free, nobody will pay to see that same act in a night club. A performer often must work with insufficient lighting, sets and props. This, according to TA, may injure his reputation and his career.

The death warning for telethons might have sounded several years ago, by the Damon Runyon Cancer Fund.

The Runyon Fund initiated telethons in 1949, when Milton Berle went on a 12-station network to emcee a 22 1/2-hour show. No one appearing on that show received pay, so there was no overhead. The fund collected about 70 percent of all money pledged, which made the show extremely profitable.

Thumbs Down

The Runyon Fund also staged telethons in 1950, 1951 and 1952. From 1949 to 1952, some \$4,000,000 was pledged. But—because too many pledges were phony or because figures were hiked to ease performers' ego—only about \$1,000,000 was finally collected. That would be a healthy sum for any charity and the Runyon Fund would have continued its yearly telethons if it could have done so on a cost-free basis. But when the various guild and unions asked for a percentage of the gross, Fund authorities called it quits.

Then Bob Hope and Bing Crosby staged their telethon in 1952 to raise money for the U.S. Olympics team. This one was almost a fiasco. About \$1,000,000 was pledged. Only about \$350,000 was actually collected.

Boredom Tolls The Knell

What may actually give the final blow to telethons was summed up by a Chicago newspaper columnist, Irving Kupcinet. He has been emceeing the UCP telethons in Chicago the last two years. According to Kupcinet, it is the viewers' apathy that may kill off telethons ultimately. "The day of the telethon is slipping," he said, "because the people are getting tired of it. It looks as though we'll have to devise some new system of collecting charity money by television."

HEADIN' FOR A NEW RANGE ?

JACK BENNY, still riding along on an even keel at the pinnacle of his career, is perhaps the least pretentious star show business has ever known. He'd as soon throw a wad of paper at a script girl as shake hands with the Queen of England, and he's done both. The script girl and the Queen, to him, are two very likable human beings.

If there can be a secret to any man's success, Benny's lies in his enormous capacity to enjoy his work. He takes it seriously, but never to the point of undermining either disposition or health. He plays golf, shooting in the high 80's and never worrying about the time he might have shot a 79. When, as he occasionally does, he feels that he

has to get away from it all, he merely piles into his car and takes off.

When he works, he is a perfectionist. He spends as much time on his radio show today as he did ten years ago when radio was king and he was its crown prince. And he gets as much fun out of it.

Oddly enough, Benny's wife, Mary Livingstone, suffers miserably through the whole business of a Jack Benny show. A mainstay on the radio show almost since its inception, she has no conception of herself as a star, dislikes publicity and would give her left arm to get out of it. She loves show business for Jack, hates it for herself. "This," she says defiantly, "is absolutely my last season."

May Abandon Radio

Jack himself is reluctant about returning to radio next year. "If the sponsor wants me to do TV every other week, that will be the end of the radio show."

Benny thus far hasn't found it at all difficult to come up with a TV show once every three weeks and feels at the moment that every other week won't be any harder. "The ideas just seem to come," he says. "We never point deliberately for a 'great' show. And if one does happen to come off better than most, we don't knock ourselves out trying to top it. We just do 'em as they come along."

Papa Won't Push

If Benny has a major interest aside from show business, it is his adopted daughter, Joan, now 19 and a junior at Stanford. He and Mary have made it a policy from the beginning to keep her in the background and to let her grow up in as normal surroundings as possible. She has appeared on two or three of Jack's radio shows and on one TV show, but the decision has always been hers. Benny is proud of his daughter and sure she can make her own way without undue help from him.

Perhaps the master of comedy timing onstage, Benny offstage can bumble along with the best of them. He frequently forgets names and is honest enough to become covered with confusion instead of trying to ad lib his way out with a funny line. The funny line, in fact, has never been Benny's forte. He is more the introvert, a quiet man content to let things ride and preferring to have his audi-

ences seated out front rather than gathered around him at a bar. Unlike most comedians, he invariably thinks the other fellow a very funny man and is known among his cohorts as "the best audience in the business." With Benny in the front row, a comedian is guaranteed a belly laugh on even his worst jokes.

JAMES DALY'S ROAD
TO TV SUCCESS
IS PRACTICALLY
A COOK'S TOUR
OF THE CONTINENT

JAMES DALY, an experienced Broadway and television actor, has made it from New York to Paris in one jump and is doing nicely, thank you.

When Sheldon Reynolds, producer-director of *Foreign Intrigue*, flew in

the face of the old theatrical axiom to "Never touch a hit" and agreed to replace the show's star, Jerome Thor, he came up with Daly, who was eager for a little traveling music.

Daly packed up his wife and three young daughters and set sail for Paris,

where the first of the new film series was being made. He likes his new life, but had to rearrange some living habits to fit the European way.

The family found a nice apartment in Paris, but few of New York's conveniences. "Our refrigerator," Daly said, "is a chicken-wire box on the window sill. The place also doesn't have an easy chair or sofa in its mammoth living room. It seems the only place French people sit down is in cafes."

Sardines Swedish Style

Daly's favorite commentary on his "Innocents Abroad" experiences deals with the week's motor trip he, his wife and kids made to Stockholm in their new Fiat, a small European car. "I took it for granted that we could drive leisurely, stopping whenever we got tired at a roadside motel, just like in the States. Was I wrong! We slept in the car two nights, and with five, it was sure a tight squeeze."

Jim also remembers doing his wife's shopping in Paris, French style. He was walking home carrying a long loaf of unwrapped bread, a bunch of carrots complete with tops, bottles of milk and paper-wrapped meat, when an unidentified American tourist stopped him on the street, asking "Aren't you a TV star?" After that, he let his maid do the marketing.

Daly Gets Involved

Why did Reynolds decide to switch lead actors in *Foreign Intrigue* at a time when the show had its highest ratings? Actually, Thor had wanted to bow out. His weekly exposure to millions of viewers in the role of an American correspondent had made him a star. Several movie companies, particularly Universal - International, had been flirting with him to do a feature film, but only if he would leave the TV show. Thor's deal with U-I is still pending; meanwhile, his agents are building him a new TV show.

Although *Foreign Intrigue* continues its story line, Reynolds cited one subtle change occasioned by the switch in leads. "Daly is a completely different type of actor from Thor," he said. "It would be ridiculous not to re-write our show to fit him. We're playing him as a rougher-type guy. Where Jerry was mainly an observer

walking through the action, Jim will be more intimately involved."

With several top Broadway shows to his credit, Daly is also well-known to TV audiences for lead roles on such dramatic programs as *Kraft Theater*, *Studio One* and *TV Playhouse*. Why, then, did he leave New York, with its stage and TV opportunities, to work on a single telefilm series in Europe?

"It will be fun to travel in Europe," he said. "The chance to establish your name in one part on a regular show offsets the pressure of 39 telefilms in eight months. And we would like our three daughters to learn to speak European languages like natives. There are other reasons, but maybe they can all be rolled into one—a dream my wife and I always had, to spend an entire year in Europe. And the *Foreign Intrigue* offer included what I like most to do—act."

TV's Week: It's the homestretch for Channel 11! The drive for Chicago's TV educational outlet has netted \$860,000, drawing within 20 per cent of its goal. Meanwhile, CETA (Chicago Educational Television Assn.) is awaiting a Federal Communications Commission decision on station call letters.

Lee Schooler's *Press Conference*, winner of TV GUIDE's 1953 award for best forum show, was erroneously reported recently as being off TV. Actually, the program, seen Sundays, on WGN-TV at 7 PM, has run consecutively for 136 weeks since its TV debut in 1951.

The New Show: WGN-TV's Mike Douglas, who bagged TV GUIDE honors as best male vocalist of 1953, is set to emcee *Talent Showcase* which returns to Channel 9 Thur., Feb. 11 at 8:30 PM.

Advance Tips on Shows: *Meet the Doctor*, an AMA-approved medical advice show, starts on WBKB Feb. 15. AMA health director Dr. W. W. Bauer and Elizabeth Hart, local radio favorite, will head up the program taking over Stuart Brent's daily 1:15 time niche. Bookish philosopher Brent switches to 2:30 PM to accommodate them.

Commencing with the Feb. 12 issue, only Chicago programs will be listed in TV GUIDE. Additional news of Chicago shows will replace the Milwaukee listings. Wisconsin viewers will receive their own TV GUIDE edition which will carry listings of three Milwaukee channels and the one in Green Bay.

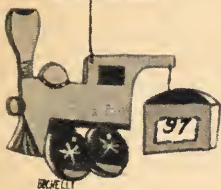

What Makes

Opera Theater, had a scant five minutes to make his own network telecast at WNBQ, a substantial hop away. But thanks to a speedy auto, he was at his usual post by 11:05 PM (when the show was telecast to the network). Perched on the corner of a table, Howard, with elaborate casualness, addressed a "Hi" to the NBC audience.

Howard's magnificent aplomb in the face of such minor crises has contributed largely to his overwhelming success. As one of the most reputable disk twirlers in the business, Howard's pace would make the average 40-hour-per-week man flinch. His schedule is estimated at some 70 hours a week. This includes emceeing some 150 -radio and TV shows, auditioning close to 200 new records, personally answering some 1,000 fan letters and conferring with sponsors, agencies and station personnel. All this within a seven-day span composed of 6:30 AM to 1 AM work days.

Such a monstrous schedule might give the impression that Howard is just one complicated network of nerves, tightly held together by a steady stream of black coffee and a chain of cigarettes. Actually, he's as cool as the proverbial cucumber and as relaxed as a mass of protoplasm.

Howard has earned a reputation in the trade as the guy who can do most for a waxing. Such tunes as "Why Don't You Believe Me," "Because of You" and "Here in My Heart" are evidence

CASUAL, composed Howard Miller probably noticed a slight rise in blood pressure at five minutes to 11 the night of Jan. 15, 1954. At that moment, he was receiving TV GUIDE's award for having Chicago's top favorite TV show. (Earlier he had copped the title for best interview and comment show.)

The excitement of winning such honors was only one contributing factor to his climbing blood pressure. Howard, accepting the award at WBKB's Civic

of Miller-backed hits. Yet he claims no clairvoyant powers in pinpointing top tunes. Says Howard: "The luck I've had in picking hit records is due to the fact that I know nothing about music." He listens for the over-all effect rather than for technical perfections of each note. This, claims Howard, enables him to hear songs as Mr. Record Fan does.

Stars Value Howard

Top talent, too, has recognized the Miller influence in the recording trade. It doesn't take much talking to convince stars to appear—gratis—for an interview with Howard when they're in town. And some head-line artists like Patti Page, Frankie Laine, and Tony Bennett have even flown in for a five or 10 minute guest shot on his show.

One of the shrewdest jockeys in the Tune Pan Alley industry, Howard has reached the top without the benefit of "payola," that under-the-table profit offered to deejays in return for plugging a tune. "Nobody had to pay to make 'Tennessee Waltz' or 'Crying in the Chapel' a hit," he claims. "If a tune is good, you don't have to pay to make it sell. If it's a dud, plugging won't help."

Howard's job-heavy schedule has led to a barrage of questions about how he found time to court June Valli, the former *Hit Parade* songstress and now Mrs. Howard Miller. Their meeting was strictly in the line of duty for Howard. He attended a luncheon at which June's new record, "A Shoulder to Weep On,"

was introduced. (A rare visitor at such functions, Howard had gone only to meet the artist in whose voice he had detected a sincere quality.) When he was introduced, he quipped: "You'll never need a shoulder to weep on, but if you ever do you can borrow mine." Whether this remark launched their romance is a moot point, but one year later, they were married.

Recently Howard joined wife June in burlesquing a little ditty on their *Close-Up* show (5:30 PM, Mon. through Fri., WNBQ). The effect was something short of spectacular. But, if Howard approaches singing with his usual effortless effort, here's fair warning. Move over, Perry Como, here comes Miller!

TV's Job Mart

CHOOSE YOUR CAREER, an educational show unveiled this season by Channel 2, wouldn't have been popular at all in the 1890's. True to the modern trend, the program is devoted to helping local youngsters find a livelihood best suited to their talents, and in grandad's day such advice would have been wasted. An obedient lad simply followed father's craft or profession, and girls were mere marriage-fodder.

In our specialized era, kids plot their own futures. And like Dr. Kinsey or Sgt. Friday, they're out for facts, ma'am.

Many Careers Surveyed

Choose Your Career is presented by WBBM-TV each Saturday afternoon at

2:30 PM in cooperation with the Chicago Public Schools. Each weekly program features a panel of experts from a particular field (sales, real estate, teaching, dentistry, etc.), four high school students who are keen about that field, and an emcee (Frank Reynolds).

Each week the show focuses on a different vocation, ranging from meat packing to social work. Reynolds and the students grill the guest VIP's about job opportunities in their fields, educational requisites, salaries, etc.

The show for a while was the victim of a drastic switch in program format. When launched last October, it hewed to its present format, a lively one by



and large. Then for a number of weeks, the program was staged without students, supposedly because there was difficulty finding enough enthusiastic teen-agers to make appearances. Later, the programmers tried using only one youngster on each show, leaving the bulk of the quizzing of the experts to emcee Reynolds. The practice proved unsatisfactory, however, and recently *Choose Your Career* went back to its original set-up, using a full four students.

Guest Students Sought

Currently the show is getting its students through the public school system and through letters submitted to the station. High-schoolers, wishing to appear on the show should write to WBBM-TV, Wrigley Bldg., Chicago.

The decision to use teen-agers prominently on *Choose Your Career* was both proper and wise. If this first TV venture at vocational guidance is to succeed, it must play down the oldsters and let the young people take over. After all that's what they're going to do soon.

Patterson, an heir apparent...

THE hottest prospect to someday wear the world's *heavyweight* crown is a rangy, sinewy youth named Floyd Patterson. But the date of his enthronement is about a year away. Hard punching Floyd has just turned 20.

Having appeared twice on TV (WBBM-TV, and WGN-TV), he's a dream to watch in action. He's fast on feet, agile at feinting and cobra-quick with his dynamite-laden fists.

Although Floyd's only handicap is inexperience, his tutor and manager, Custie D'Amato, is wary of matching him against ring wise heavies. Custie wails about the shortage of opponents, but he won't court disaster by being impatient. Custie is confident and so am I, that he has a champion.

Floyd's closest pro scrap was at Eastern Parkway Arena when he pounded out a split decision over light-heavyweight Dick Wagner. He immediately sought a rematch and wiped out the stigma of near defeat by shellacking Wagner with a TKO on a nationally televised bout.

In style, Patterson has been compared to Joe Louis, whom he idolizes. He stalks and swings like Louis, but shows better footwork. As a growing light-heavyweight, he's certain to add the necessary poundage to merit heavy-weight ranking. Whether he'll ever reach the title as the Brown Bomber did is unknown. But, in tout jargon, Floyd is really "one to tab."



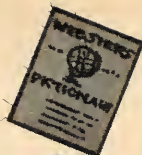

Reviews

PROGRAM OF THE WEEK

JACKIE GLEASON SHOW

JACKIE GLEASON is one of those rare performers for whom there is no middle ground in the eyes of the public. People either love him or hate him. His shows this season have given ample ammunition to both factions.

On the credit side, Gleason has displayed a versatility which has made him the delight of CBS and a powerhouse among network comics. He can switch from low comedy to genuine pathos without losing a beat, and he is a bear for work. The *Jackie Gleason Show* is just that: Jackie Gleason.

On the debit side, Gleason has gone overboard in the use of girls, even employing a whole bevy of them as announcers, and opens each stanza with a well-trained chorus line of 16 high kickers. It makes a great hit with the studio audience, but to the home viewer with a small screen it's like sitting in the last row of the fifth balcony, way off to the side.

Gleason personally is today a faintly embellished version of the old Milton Berle, even to the point of adopting Berle's discarded line about "Oh, I feel great tonight." Like the old Berle, too, Gleason tends to hog the proceedings, dominating every sketch and resorting more often than not to slapstick so lacking in finesse as to be painful. His various characters—The Poor Soul, Reggie Van Gleason, The Honeymooners, Joe the Bartender—may be starting to wear thin, however well-bolstered by the presence of Art Carney.

Carney, a master of timing and a comedian as opposed to a comic, is Gleason's good right arm. Without him, the show would be run-of-the-mill.

Audrey Meadows also is a considerable help, as is Ray Bloch's music.

MARTIN KANE

MARTIN KANE, with Mark Stevens in the title role, is perhaps the most improved show of its kind on the air today. With all due respect to William Gargan, Lloyd Nolan and Lee Tracy, Stevens' precedes-

sors in the part, the current star has managed to bring the proceedings to life and make them entertaining.

Credit for this, to be fair, must be given chiefly to the show's producers. They have dropped the hard-bitten private eye format, in which Kane more often than not was in conflict with a dullard from police headquarters, and have concentrated instead on making Kane an intelligent, hard-working private investigator who realizes the value of cooperation with the police. The police are portrayed as intelligent, hard-working men who, in turn, are not above accepting the help and advice of the affable shamus.

Stevens has brought a wealth of motion picture experience to the show, and is not a man who has ever been typed in "B" picture roles. He plays Kane with an easy assurance, seasoned with a touch of dry humor. The writers, for their part, have lifted the show out of the rut and placed it at least within shouting distance of the formidable *Dragnet*.

lawyers and goes into a State-administered trust fund. His take-home pay is 75 cents a week, doled out of the household budget by his mother.

The boy who charmed audiences and critics in "Member of the Wedding," "Mrs. McThing," "Shane" and now, *Jamie*, eyed us without compassion. Kenny Schmidt, a classmate of Brandon's, announced his arrival by slamming the door. Temporarily reprieved, Brandon jumped up and yelled, "Let's go."

Outside, we met more of the De Wilde clan—a cousin, Audrey Utter, and her two children, Jeff and Roger.

The picnic was Mrs. De Wilde's idea. Although rehearsal time for *Jamie* is less than that for other weekly half-hour shows, Brandon's only free day is Saturday. Interviews away from the studio would have to take in doing what Mrs. De Wilde thought Brandon ought to be doing. In this case, it was letting off steam.

We drove about 25 miles to a State park and picnic area. It was a chilly, sunless winter afternoon and on ar-

rival, Brandon and Kenny took off with a whoop towards the swings. The smaller boys tagged after them. We built a fire and for an hour or so, in the stilted way of adults, kept warm by staying near the blaze. While wrapping bacon strips around frankfurters, Mrs. De Wilde briefed us on her son's rise to fame.

Brandon was invited to try out for "Member of the Wedding" by the casting director, Terry Fay, an old family friend. "I think the reason he got the part is because his diction is so unusual. Many people think he has studied voice. He never has. He's just

picked up a little of my Southern accent. Most of the boys who tried out spoke a too typical New Yorkese.

"My husband and I were leery about Brandon going into the theater. Opening night of 'Member' at the Philadelphia try out, Brandon peeked through the curtain and started crying. I wished then we had never gotten him into it. I walked away because I was in the theater at one time and I knew he would go to pieces if I came near him. The stage hands quieted him. They told him that he knew his lines as well as anyone. Now he's nervous on opening nights. But after that, he's fine."

Brandon, Kenny and company came back to gulp hot dogs and toast marshmallows. Mrs. De Wilde talked mother-talk, about jackets and buttoning up. Brandon talked boy-talk about a girl named Linda, about rocket ships and guns.

Brandon told us he might not always be an actor. "When I grow up, I might direct plays. I directed a school play once—and it turned out okay. I know all about directing." We asked for some tips but he wasn't ready to divulge everything. "I guess

I made a lot of it up as I went along."

We wanted to know if he ever acted in school plays and Brandon sucked in his lower lip scornfully. "No," he said, "that's kid stuff."

Later, at the house, Brandon showed us his room and the crowded cellar which stores heating equipment, a freezer, furniture being saved for a larger house, and his toys. He ran his electric trains and explained the war being waged on the cellar floor in two boxes, each filled with tin soldiers. One was the good army and the other was the enemy. "We lost a lot of good men last night," he announced.

Aw, Gee Whiz, Mom!

We asked if Brandon felt different from other children. His mother said, "Sometimes. He gets annoyed that he has to miss out on things that happen at school. (He's in the sixth grade at the local public school) He'll say, 'I wish I didn't have to be different. Why can't I be like everybody else?'"

"Whenever this comes up, we tell him he can leave *Jamie* any time. We have a contract that allows Brandon to drop the show at a moment's notice. But when we tell him that, he backs out. He really likes acting."

The De Wilde's plan to take Brandon out at the end of this year. They feel a debt, that he has already missed out on too many things. "Of course, it's all exciting for him and he loves the people he meets. But it's too hard on him. He has to be tutored an hour for every half day of school he misses. He's due at his tutor's now."

Mrs. De Wilde got up to look for her boy. He was coming in the door. "You'll have to go to Mrs. Cowan's now, Brandon."

The star trudged inside, picked up his books and walked slowly out the door, like many another boy going to his lessons.

"Don't slam the door, Brandon."

The door slammed shut.

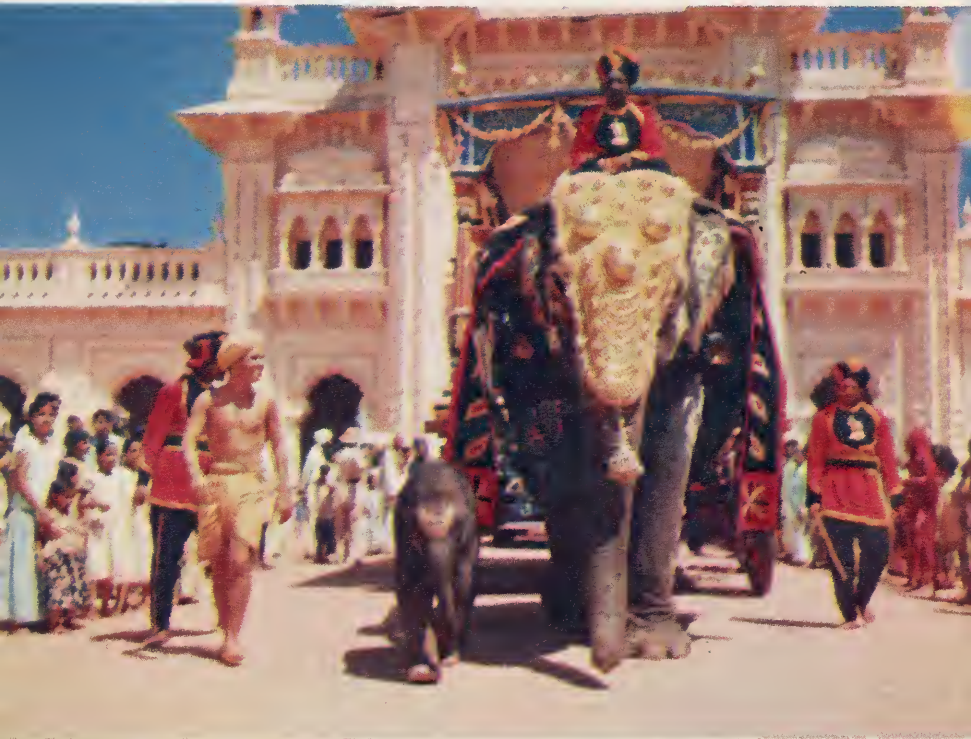


THE PIED PIPER OF TV



'SMILIN' ED' McCONNELL

ONE of the least-publicized yet most looked-at television shows currently on the air is *Smilin' Ed's Gang*, a Saturday morning children's entry on ABC which has exceeded its sponsor's fondest dreams.

The show started on radio 12 years ago under the sponsorship of a shoe company. Since that time, the company has almost quadrupled its business (from \$8,000,000 to \$30,000,000), has built seven new factories and has established so many dealerships that it takes a certified public accountant to keep up.

The Gremlin Helps

The entire advertising budget has been allotted to *Smilin' Ed's* radio and television program for years now. What's the secret?

The show's success lies in the drawing power of 61-year-old Ed McConnell, who has been on the air for 28 years, sponsored every minute of the time. His formula is simplicity itself: he tells stories. These he augments with Froggy, the exasperating gremlin; Midnight, the musical cat; Squeaky, the mouse, who also plays a musical instrument; a hamster and a few other assorted characters.

Indians Brown, Indians Red

With television, the emphasis of his program has shifted somewhat to the filmed dramatization of Ed's famed stories based on the jungles of India, as well as some of North American Indian life in days gone by.

Responsible for this latter day secret is a former advertising man, Frank Ferrin. Ferrin, a quiet-type genius, originally sold the sponsor on using McConnell to tell stories and sell shoes. Then, he sold McConnell on the idea of using film to help tell his stories.

When TV came along, Ferrin put the show on film immediately, making this the oldest continuous film show on television, now in its fourth

season. He sent a camera crew to India for a full year. With it, for three months, went young Nino Marcel, who plays the part of Gunga Ram, the young hero of *Smilin' Ed's* tales.

In Hollywood, Ferrin merely matches the jungle film with studio shots and it takes an expert to tell where one ends and the other begins.

As for the miracle man, himself: Ed McConnell, son of an Atlanta, Ga., minister, started out as an evangelist song leader. He later developed his singing talents in vaudeville.

On a visit to an Atlanta radio station in the early 1920's, he was literally pushed on the air by the station manager, frantic because the talent scheduled for the next hour had failed to show up. Ed has been on the

air steadily ever since that time.

The future seems just as secure as the past for *Smilin' Ed's Gang*. With color television at hand, Ferrin and McConnell are exchanging congratulations because every foot of film they made for the program is in color. The boys are ready for almost anything.

MOW 'EM DOWN MICHIGAN APPLE PIE

Line a deep 10-inch pie plate with tender, flaky pie dough. Then in a separate bowl blend: 3 T. melted butter with 4 c. freshly peeled, sliced apples, $\frac{2}{3}$ c. granulated sugar, $\frac{1}{2}$ c. brown sugar, 1 T. cornstarch, 2 T. tapioca, $\frac{1}{8}$ t. salt, $\frac{1}{4}$ t. freshly ground nutmeg, 1 T. quince jelly dissolved in $\frac{1}{4}$ c. apple jack (be generous). Fill shell, add top crust, seal edges. Bake at 360 degrees, 50-55 min.

THE PRIDE of boxing's Cauliflower Row is that distinguished television thespian, Rocky Graziano, former *beau ideal* of the Marquis of Queensbury, lover of the arts and high ambassador of good will for the honorable sport of pugilism.

As Martha Raye's TV boy friend and affectionate "cumpa," the former middleweight champ is playing comedy, but it's still a pretty serious proposition to him. "Everybody asks Rocky about memorizing," said a friend. "Well, they ought to see him take hold of a script—just like a terrier latches on to a bone. After he's got it memorized an atom bomb could fall on the studio and the Rock would come up out of the debris mouthing his lines letter-perfect."

Rocky, a nervous pacer before his

big fights, is a model of composure before a TV show. "Everybody is on edge, you know," says Rocky, "so they all come up to me pumpin' my hand every minute telling me not to worry and good luck and all that. I ain't nervous—it's them."


Nat Hiken, the writer and director for the Martha Raye shows, is dead earnest about Rocky's talents. "Rocky," says Hiken, "is going to be another Louis Wolheim—the tough, sensitive actor who played in 'All Quiet On the Western Front.' He's gentle and appreciative and improves amazingly."

Tough, But Oh! So Gentle

Rocky's rugged, gentle personality is his stock in trade. On TV as in real life, he's the tough Brooklyn pug who fought some of boxing's most savage fights, yet sidesteps ants in the street. Hiken has to coach him to "act madder" when the script calls for Rocky to grab an actor threateningly.

But to his buddies on 8th Avenue, New York's street of busted beaks and cauliflower ears, Rocky is Rocky and when he visits the old haunts the boys in the sweat-box gymnasiums like to rib their TV "star." Rocky elaborates: "They say things like, 'Martha, I got some flowers for you'—you know, some of the lines I have in the show. But they know I'm still in good enough shape to clobber 'em."

Married and the father of two daughters, The Rock is really getting the breaks. He is slated for his own TV show, *Rocky*. And a book of his life is due to hit the presses soon. Who wrote it for him? Says Rocky, "A guy by the name of Simon Schuster."
