It was pleasant to hear that *Toast of the Town* will be re-titled *The Ed Sullivan Show* next fall. Smilin' Ed deserves every bit of recognition his network can offer him.

Certainly there has been no shortage of vaudeville shows on TV. We've had big ones, small ones, good ones, bad ones—and *Toast of the Town*, which consistently has provided top variety entertainment.

Much, if not all, of the credit must go to Sullivan himself. While Marlo Lewis, an outstanding producer, does the real work of putting the program on the air, Sullivan is responsible for the tone of the show, its frequent excursions into new pastures, its newswiness. These have made *Toast of the Town* a real success.

Ed Sullivan started out as the world's worst television performer. He was scared; he was uncomfortable. As a result, he turned up with the sourest puss since Ned Sparks and was promptly dubbed by critics, "The Great Stone Face."

In six years he has acquired ease, and he even smiles. His warm personality, his real admiration for performers, come over now, and he's welcome relief from frenetic MC's.

Ed Sullivan, by refusing to become bogged down in a set format, by venturing to hire acts new to television, by insisting on presenting people-in-the-news on his show, has contributed a great deal to the medium.

Aside from his TV contribution, he has always conducted himself as a gentleman in his personal life, and has performed a tremendous service for the underprivileged. As a patriotic and influential citizen, he has worked untringly—and without publicity—for countless charities. If anyone deserves respect, as a man as well as a TV personality, Ed Sullivan does.

THELMA RITTER, one of Hollywood's better comediennes, making her TV debut in a featured role with JACKIE GLEASON in "The Show-off," scheduled as a Best of Broadway super-show in February . . . And GLEASON very interested in the offer from MILTON BERLE's sponsor to finance a half-hour telefilm version of "The Honey-mooners" next season. Budget would be \$5,000 more than JACKIE's present hour show, and the comedian would also share in rerun sales. But CBS must okay cutting GLEASON's show to a half hour.

NANETTE FABRAY, scoring heavily on Caesar's Hour, tosses bouquets at SID CAESAR. Says he's giving her the "greatest direction" she's ever had. . . "Yellow Jack," famous story of how Army doctors licked malaria during work on the Panama Canal, scheduled for Producers' Showcase this month.

With JOHNNY CARSON replacing him for two weeks, JACK PAAR is vacationing in Cuba as a guest of the Cuban government. It's in honor of PAAR's employing PUPI CAMPO and JOSE MELIS, both native Cubans, for his Morning Show . . . And wouldn't it be ironic if -- as rumor says -- the BAIRD puppets, recently fired from The Morning Show, were to join its competitor, Today? The BAIRDS just finished a trial run on the DAVE GARROWAY program.

Despite the sponsor's cancellation of Kraft Theater Thursday nights on ABC, the hour-long drama series will continue uninterrupted. A new sponsor will pick up the show Jan. 13, the week following Kraft's exit. . . . STEVE ALLEN flying the entire cast and crew of Tonight to Miami, where the show will originate the week of Jan. 10.

Viewers of the New Year's Day Sugar Bowl game should be able to hear the referee's instructions, foul-calling, etc. That pint-sized transmitter with which ABC director CHARLIE RUSSHON has brought viewers of NCAA games the ref's instructions to team captains, will be planted in the official's pocket throughout the Bowl contest between Navy and Mississippi.

First Tomorrowland episode on Disneyland, scheduled for March 9, should upset accepted concepts of space suits. The DISNEY show will introduce a space traveler's outfit, created by three outstanding scientists, that resembles a large tank with a cone on top.

RALPH BELLAMY planning a return to TV soon, but he insists that he doesn't want another private-eye show, such as his Man Against Crime . . . With American telefilm producers already swarming over most of Europe, Orion Films, a new outfit, plans to shoot its upcoming East to Adventure in Israel.

GENE AUTRY has bought a baseball story and plans to film it with himself as star -- his first break with Westerns. He may be thinking that his TV films will be hurt by cheaper competition from his old movies, now being released to TV with no return to him. ROY ROGERS will be in the same boat.

CBS' I Love Lucy, with the Ricardos moving to Hollywood, is beginning to add names to bulwark the show. EVE ARDEN, BILL HOLDEN and HEDDA HOPPER are among the first. And a future show will be loaded with wives of male stars. . . Lucy's head cameraman, veteran Hollywood cinematographer KARL FREUND, has written a book called "50 Years: Nickelodeon to Lucy."

NBC reportedly seeking someone to replace RED BUTTONS. . . TV GUIDE's SHEILAH GRAHAM has been set by NBC for a five-a-week, 15-minute Hollywood TV news show starting Jan. 3 . . . LIBERACE is writing -- or at least dictating -- his autobiography.

ANN SOTHERN has formed her own company and plans to produce and star in two feature films. . . FRANK SINATRA swung on a press agent, reportedly said he hated "cops and newspapermen," next day demanded 50 per cent of the profits to star in a picture at Warners. He didn't get the terms he wanted -- or the assignment.

* * *

BING CROSBY now says he will do two hour-long shows or three half hours, all on film, per season -- starting in the spring. But he still hasn't signed anything. . . DINAH SHORE will appear for three weeks at the Waldorf Astoria beginning Jan. 13 and is now kinescoping several TV shows in advance. She will do two or three from NY.

GEORGE GOBEL has had 110 press interviews in 10 weeks, which is a record even for Hollywood . . . VICTOR MOORE makes his TV film debut in a So This Is Hollywood episode for NBC.

CLAUDETTE COLBERT is talking with CBS about doing an hour-long combination live-film series, The Story I'll Never Forget, in which she would act as hostess and occasionally star. She is very enthusiastic about it.

FRANK WISBAR, producer-director of Fireside Theater for the past six years and considered the TV film man in Hollywood, has quit -- and that probably marks the end of TV films' first era.

BARBARA RUICK, daughter of LURENE (Life with Father) TUTTLE, has been signed by CBS here as a stock player. . . Thought for today: major movie studios often spend as much on a single screen test as TV does on a complete half-hour film. . . One of these days you are going to see the Grand Canyon on color TV -- if you have a color set.

1955—YEAR OF CHALLENGE

Television will not sit back and rest on its laurels during 1955. Instead it faces a year of challenge as a dynamic, fast-growing medium in which change must be the order of the day.

Here are some of the changes:

CBS is extremely enthusiastic about the pilot audition for a new situation comedy starring Phil Silvers as a GI top sergeant, tentatively slated to be seen Tuesday nights at 8 (E.S.T.), starting Jan. 25. CBS also has new shows in the works to star Jack Carter, Orson Bean and Johnny Carson, last being the young comedian who scored as replacement for the injured Red Skelton last summer.

On the NBC agenda are new shows starring Kaye Ballard, Pat Carroll and Paul Gilbert, none a stranger to

TV audiences; *The Marriage*, the Hume Cronyn-Jessica Tandy family comedy series that was so successful last summer; *The Great Gildersleeve* and *Fibber McGee & Molly*, both veteran radio shows. In addition, NBC is working on a series to star Tom D'Andrea and Hal March, whose GI routines were hits on the Eddie Cantor shows last year.

Emphasis will continue on color TV and color "spectaculars," though heads of the various networks—and some sponsors—do not yet agree on their value. CBS, while it will continue to colorcast all its regular programs in rotation, has no plans for new super programs to add to its two once-a-month color shows, *Best of Broadway* and *Shower of Stars*.

NBC, whose president, Sylvester L. (Pat) Weaver, originated the concept of "spectaculars," is enthusiastic about them despite some early-season setbacks. It's too soon to determine, Weaver says, whether any new series of spectaculars will be launched this year or changes made in current ones. But he emphasized the 90-minute specials will continue in 1955.

Weaver believes the anticipated increase in the number of color receivers will put over the spectaculars. But an unexpected bottleneck in tube manufacture has delayed mass production plans. There were an estimated 20,000 color receivers in the hands of the public at Christmas. Most manufacturers think they have licked the bottleneck and now predict that the output, chiefly of 19- and 21-inch models, will pass original estimates by February.

This week will see the premiere on NBC of *Norby*, a comedy series starring David Wayne and produced entirely in color. One of every four

Ford Theater telefilms will be colorcast during the rest of the season. Once enough color sets are bought by the public, it's possible all networks may switch some regular programs to color on a permanent basis.

With program time on NBC and CBS almost completely sponsored, the problem is where to schedule new shows. Some old ones must go.

On CBS, for example, the new *Professional Father*, starring Steve Dunne, will replace *That's My Boy* on Saturday nights. There is talk, too, that June Havoc's *Willy* is wobbly. The Tuesday night lineup will shift to take care of the new Phil

Students each week produce one 15-minute and three half-hour shows, telecast via kinescope over six commercial TV stations in the state.

Missouri is another leading university with a full-scale TV department, and operates a commercial station at Columbia, KOMU-TV, affiliated with all four major networks. Missouri students can take bachelors', masters' and doctors' degrees in speech or journalism with emphasis on TV.

One of the first university-owned TV stations is WOI-TV, operated by Iowa State College at Ames, Ia. This, too, is a commercial outlet where approximately 400 students each year assist in the production of live programs. Advanced students work for

pay as part-time assistants on the station's various staffs, and produce five telecast courses each week.

Indicative of TV departments in big city universities is that at Columbia, in New York. Columbia has joined with NBC to provide students with courses in all phases of TV programming, production, publicity and writing, taught jointly by university and NBC personnel. Although Columbia does not own its own studio, students have a chance for workshop instruction at NBC's studios in Radio City. Supervising the courses for NBC is Edward Stanley and for Columbia, Erik Barnouw, associate professor of dramatic arts and a former NBC script editor.

Hardly King Size

GEORGE GOBEL'S TINY FRIEND OWES
HER TV CAREER TO A COMMERCIAL

The fact that a radio singing commercial she recorded "when I was starving" put her on the road to success makes Peggy King one of the smallest pioneers in history.

Five feet high and a mere 100 pounds, Peggy crashed the back door to popularity via a tomato sauce aria, "I can cook and cook and cook."

Mitch Miller, of Columbia Records, heard the commercial on his car radio, signed her to a contract and proceeded to sell 100,000 copies of her first effort, "Hottentot."

That was about five months ago. Overnight, Peggy was in such demand that she made 90 radio and TV appearances in eight weeks. When NBC, readying *The George Gobel Show*, needed a singer who wouldn't make George look like a midget, non-king-size Miss King solved the problem.

Peggy, 23, is the wife of Knobby Lee, a trumpet player she met while singing with Charlie Spivak's band. Although she has never had a singing lesson and can't read music, the brown-eyed redhead had wanted to be a singer ever since she was a child in Ravenna, Ohio. When the staff warbler at WGAR, Cleveland, broke a leg, Peggy, a WGAR amateur contest winner, got the job.

Going on to sing with name bands like Spivak's and Ralph Flanagan's, she landed a one-year M-G-M contract in 1952, but was cast adrift because she "looked too much like Judy Garland."

Then came unemployment—and that ode to tomato sauce.

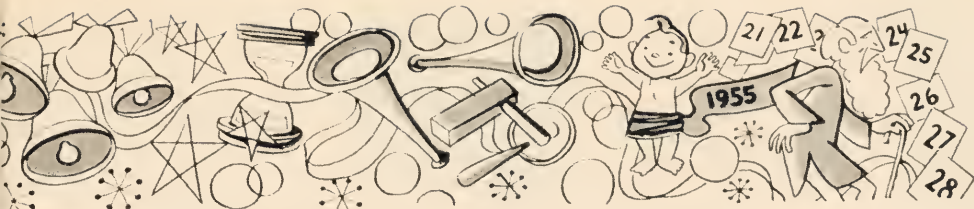

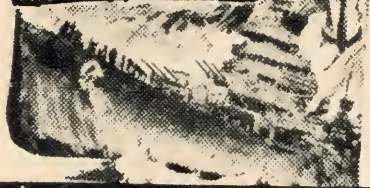

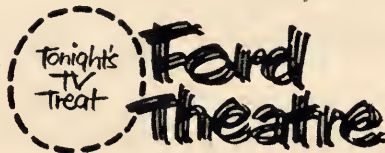

Loretta and Her Men

**HOW ARE THEY PICKED?
FOR THEIR 'ELECTRIC' EFFECT
ON THE GIRLS, OF COURSE!**

When Loretta Young and her husband, Tom Lewis, were kicking around the idea for a TV show about a year and a half ago, they fell victim to one of those pleasant accidents designed by the fates to prove that "them as has, gits." En route to see someone else, they ran into a young actor named George Nader on the steps of the William Morris agency. They

couldn't have planned it better if they'd planned it.

Selected for the pilot film and first show of NBC's *Letter to Loretta* series, this 33-year-old son of a Pasadena oil broker thus became the cornerstone of a flourishing TV institution. Nader made such a hit with the lady, her husband, the sponsor, the fans and Universal-International Studios that the inevitable happened. Currently starring opposite Maureen O'Hara in "Lady Godiva" at Universal International, he's so busy in pictures they can't get him back on TV.

Since Nader, some 25 of the most eligible men around have appeared on what is now known as *The Loretta Young Show*. Recruited from all leagues, major and minor, the boys are turning in some astonishing batting averages. There is, for example, Hugh O'Brian, whom Tom and Loretta encountered in a corridor at the MCA agency.

Until that moment, O'Brian was well on his way to becoming a career Indian. A 32-year-old six-footer, he played small parts in 18 pictures at Universal in three years—usually supporting roles as an Indian. He was free-lancing when Lewis decided to try him on comedy. Playing a confused young cartoonist and his double,

a clear-thinking crook, O'Brian connected so solidly with the sponsors' detergent and toothpaste buyers that he was promptly signed for eight more shows.

Loretta just happened to be along when Nader and O'Brian were discovered. Normally, the chore of finding an actor to play opposite her falls on the capable shoulders of Lewis and half the agents in Hollywood. "The trick," says Lewis, production half of the Lewislor Enterprises combination, "is to find a guy the women feel electric about and the men don't object to."

Lewis, a veteran producer, sometimes resorts to a little light office-polling to determine how "electric" the opposite sex feels about a prospect. After the actor has left his office, Lewis asks his secretary what she thinks of the man. If she drops her notebook, swallows her gum and asks, "What man?" the guy is in.

The actor who came closest to filling this particular electric bill was Jack (now Jock) Mahoney, a former Marine pilot and movie stunt man. Six feet, four inches tall, he has been for several years the star of Gene Autry's *Range Rider* TV series. He branched out into the leading-man business last year when Lewis need-

The Lineup

It wouldn't seem likely that a new TV show closely patterned after a top-rater would stand much of a chance. But despite inescapable comparisons to *Dragnet*, *The Lineup* on CBS more than holds its own. It's a taut, well-written, well-produced telefilm series.

Dragnet is based on the Los Angeles police files; *Lineup* depends on the San Francisco police files. *Dragnet* has policemen Jack Webb and Ben Alexander; *Lineup* has policemen Warner Anderson and Tom Tully. Both shows receive semi-documentary treatment. Both stress "crime doesn't pay." Both are based on radio shows.

Where *Lineup* differs is in its greater fluidity and scope of action. The producers have wisely shunned *Dragnet's* emphasis on stark close-ups,

and while both Anderson and Tully often underplay their roles for realism, it's not Joe Friday's exaggeratedly lifeless monotone. Each episode contains at least one view of suspects in a police lineup.

Anderson and Tully, as police inspector and lieutenant, are near-perfect choices for their roles. So are the supporting players, particularly those cast as criminals.—R.S.

TV COMES TO MAIN STREET

Series About Small Town Banker Uses Logical Locale: A Small Town



When Marilyn Monroe was in New York to film scenes for her next movie, hundreds of curious fans crowded around a busy Manhattan street corner at 1 o'clock in the morning to watch the star perform.

But TV has topped even that. When the cast and crew of *Norby*, a new

television series, are working on location, they tie up almost an entire town of 3,200 people. And this happens two or three days each week.

The town is Pearl River, N.Y., a pleasant little village across the Hudson River from New York City. Since *Norby* is a small town bank executive, played by David Wayne, the show's producers, believe it or not, decided to film all their outdoor scenes in a small town. After scouting the area for miles around New York City to find the best community, they chose Pearl River—partly because they considered it average, but chiefly because the local bank, before which most of the outdoor action takes place, faced south. This meant they could take most advantage of sunlight in their filming.

Good light is particularly important, for this weekly half-hour comedy-drama is the first television program to be filmed and telecast entirely in color. Appearing with Wayne are Joan Loring and Pat Marshall. Richard Whorf directs. And the chief writer is David Swift, who was the first scripter for *Mr. Peepers*. The series, scheduled for launching this week on most NBC stations, will be sponsored by Eastman Kodak, which hopes to promote use of color film.

Pearl River has pinned its hopes on *Norby*, too. Citizens, from the mayor and police chief to waitresses in the town diner, went all out to cooperate. The actors and crew naturally mean extra business for Pearl River merchants. But aside from that, the townspeople hope that *Norby* will put them on the map, perhaps bring an influx of residents and business.

It's taken for granted now that when the crew is working on the main street of the town (and it's

called Main Street, too), the police chief himself will be there to hold up all traffic while the cameras are rolling. The mayor, the chief and the local bank president have worked as extras in the film. And it often happens that residents are coaxed off the streets to serve as walk-ons.

The extent to which *Norby* has invaded Pearl River can perhaps best be judged by the confusion inside the diner where the cast and crew lunch each day. While they try to relax with a sandwich, the townspeople crowd around their table to rubberneck. Those who can't get inside peer through the windows. The proprietor, taking his cue from the plush New York restaurants where actors gather, has hung a photo of David Wayne on the wall above his counter—right next to a sign reading: "Tuna Fish Sandwich, 40c."

NEW YORK . . . NBC is worried about Dorothy Collins' weight since the *Your Hit Parade* songstress had her baby. Dorothy changed her hairdo, hoping to look thinner . . . Unlike most actresses, Janis Carter, of *Feather Your Nest*, is a scholar. She holds two degrees from Western Reserve. One reason she prefers TV to Hollywood is that when she went into movies and mentioned her college background, one of her closest advisers said: "I think it'd be best around here if you kept it quiet about getting a college degree. And for heaven's sake, don't ever, ever mention that you have TWO degrees!"

■ Garry Moore's vocalist, Denise Lor, is being guarded when she leaves the studio—since some screwball got on stage during the show and began expressing his love for her. He had a bottle, flung it into the air. Nobody tried to stop him when he started on stage. Everybody thought he was a "surprise guest." He was, too.

■ How come this writer, who has a crew cut, has been mistaken lately for both Garry Moore and George Gobel? . . . A film of Fred Allen's second quiz show, shown to a couple of sponsors last spring, is being kept under wraps until next spring—when clients suddenly find themselves in urgent need of new shows. . . . Some TV comics think they shouldn't be seen more than once a month. Bert Lahr, who is constantly asked to perform some of his semi-classic comedy routines (like "The Wood-chopper") is declining to do them more than once a year.

■ Bill Cullen noticed that a friend of one of his relatives was eligible for a prize on one of the Cullen shows, managed to maneuver him out of the running. Bill didn't want anybody to think he was helping throw prizes to friends . . . Jerry Lester, one of TV's "greats" only three years ago, is now in Australia doing personal appearances . . . A Broadway TV writer was asked, "Do you have steady work now?" He replied, "No. I'm with Red Buttons."

■ Margaret Truman's agreed to do three or four more shows for Jimmy Durante in late winter or spring. The Schnoz will be on all summer, via film ("fillum," Jimmy calls it) he'll make in May and June. Jimmy has a letter from Harry Truman, thanking him for being nice to Margaret, and refers to his act, when she's on, as "Truman, Jackson and Durante."

■ Robert Montgomery's suggestions on President Eisenhower's TV style have finally begun to pay off. "Ike" was so eloquent—and smooth—at a recent dinner that his speech topped all others. Montgomery sat on the front row—"watching him like a mother," said one observer. Montgomery, homburg-hatted and all, looks almost like a diplomat these days.

■ Janis Paige has one of the biggest TV writers slowly, carefully drafting a series for her—for after the closing of her Broadway hit, "Pajama Game." One adviser wants her to capitalize on the show's publicity and call her TV series *Pajama Girl*.
