Thus far, the viewers over there have had a choice between watching the British Broadcasting Corporation channel and turning off their sets. Come next September, another channel—a commercial one—will be airing programs, too.

It's a shattering prospect for our good friends. A Spanish Armada they could deal with. Napoleon's threats they could laugh off. German bombs, buzzbombs and rockets they could stand. But the prospect of lots of television has them shuddering.

It's been said that if the British can't settle a problem by forming a queue, they set up a rationing system. Their new TV ration rules—designed to prevent "the nation's home life" from being upset, go like this:

**1.** Television stations may be on the air a total of seven hours on weekdays.

2. No breakfast time programs.

3. A shutdown Sunday nights during church service time.

4. No TV programs between 6 and 7 P.M., the children's bedtime.

5. No TV before 9 A.M. or after 11 P.M.

# NEW YORK Bob Stahl reports:

STEVE ALLEN tentatively set to make his major movie debut in the title role of "The Benny Goodman Story" this summer. Plans call for the <u>Tonight</u> show to move to Hollywood for 10 weeks, starting June 1, while he works. Show will stop off in Chicago en route back to New York . . . STEVE, incidentally, is getting it from both left- and right-wing elements for a new song he wrote as a gag for <u>Tonight</u> Title: "Who Promoted Peress?"

With <u>Blue Ribbon Bouts</u> moving to ABC, CBS has now wooed <u>U.S. Steel Hour</u> away from ABC for its Wednesday night period effective July 6. <u>Steel</u> will alternate with a mammoth hour-long film show to be produced by 20th Century-Fox under General Electric sponsorship.

MARGUERITE PIAZZA, who's been appearing in night-clubs for several months, returns to TV Thursday, May 12, as star of <u>Shower of Stars</u>. She'll play a Metropolitan Opera star who inherits a major league baseball team. The show's title is a beaut — "The High Pitch." . . And speaking of the Met, look for it to produce a series of telefilmed operas for syndication next fall. \* \*

CBS planning a drastic reshuffle of its early evening schedule, apparently to meet competition of ABC's <u>Disneyland, Rin Tin Tin, etc.</u> The DOUGLAS EDWARDS news show, plus the PERRY COMO, JO STAFFORD and JANE FROMAN programs will be moved back next fall, and will be replaced by new shows pegged to an "all-family" level.

Studio One definitely will present the late GEORGE M. COHAN's "Pigeons and People" before season's end . . . ARTHUR GODFREY will host <u>Talent Scouts</u> through the summer but <u>Godfrey and Friends</u> will vacation come July . . . <u>Best of Broadway</u> winds up May 4 with an adaptation of "Broadway," starring <u>DICK POWELL</u> and JACK LEMMON.

# HOLLYWOOD Dan Jenkins reports:

Western Pennsylvania exhibitors (theater owners) have refused to show DISNEY'S "Davy Crockett" feature because DISNEY first released it, as a three-parter, to TV via <u>Disneyland</u> . . . No signatures yet, but it's in the works for <u>EDDIE MAYEHOFF</u> to play opposite MARIE WILSON in her new <u>Miss Pepperdine</u> show . . . HARPO MARX does a special guest shot on <u>I Love Lucy</u> of May 9.

Hallmark is trading in its weekly <u>Hall of Fame</u> next season for eight one-a-month Sunday <u>night</u> "spectaculars" (or "gigantics," as they are now being called), to be produced and directed by MAURICE EVANS. Total time-andtalent tab: \$1,800,000.

Just A Guy Who Comes Around'

He's Garry Moore, Who Doesn't Underestimate The Intelligence Of The Viewer-Or Sponsor.



Sponsors, as most everybody knows, are the undisputed Royal High Command of TV, in that they shell out the money. Not surprisingly, then, most performers look upon them as firebreathing dragons, and live in fear of provoking their displeasure. Garry Moore, one of the most off-handed men making a career of being funny, has 16 such "dragons," and not one wisp of smoke can be seen.

Calling them "clients" instead of sponsors, thus putting them on the



receiving end of his service, Garry doesn't consult with any of them as to what he will do on camera. He reasons: "No performer has ever been fired for irreverence for man or sponsor; only for irreverence for a product." So, before the camera, Garry chats away on anything viewers ask about, stating ideas that don't necessarily—if at all—coincide with the beliefs of the men behind the show.

If this sort of thing isn't hilarious, Garry doesn't mind at all. He doesn't want to be a buffoon, anyway. "I wouldn't even call myself a comic," he says. "I'm just a guy who comes around every day." He'd as soon stick to straight entertaining, but believes that "If you look back and realize you haven't made anyone mad, you haven't said anything, either."

"The popularity of our show," Garry theorizes, "stems from the fact that we respect our viewers' intelligence. They are aged three to 90, and include cab drivers and university professors. The idea of an 'average-housewife audience' is a ridiculous myth."

Garry is fearful of performers' power to influence-audiences. "It's terrifying that an entertainer should have political influence, just because he's liked. I'd stump for ideals or ideas, but I wouldn't dream of telling people how to vote."

When Garry takes the stump, one of his favorite targets is the fan club. On hearing that one was started for him, he told his viewers to "do something useful—like round up blood donors." His explanation: "It's foolish to blow up an actor who's already inflated."

Although he is certainly one of the brightest men in the business, Garry is best at charming people, without being a professional charmer.

"We're like a comic strip," he said, referring to CBS' Garry Moore Show. "We don't have the pressure of having to hit a home run once a **continued**

week. When I look back, I think of my frantic early days with Durante and I shudder at what goes on—firings, new writers, new formats, ulcers."

In the last three years, Garry has had to fire two people. It takes 85 to run the show. "Talent is only the first thing a performer must have," he asserts. "Executive ability might even be the most important—the ability to get good people around you and then let them alone to do their jobs."

Looking on TV the way other men regard their office jobs, Garry works a five-day week, 9 to 5, except on Wednesdays, when he moderates the *l've Got A Secret* panel later at night. Evenings, he drives to Westchester with all the other workaday husbands, and doesn't go out of his way to socialize with entertainers. He's been known to go out on quiet parties Wednesday nights with show people, but to cafes not ordinarily frequented by them.

"Too many of us know only what the boys at Lindy's are saying. You know, of course, that outside of New York, no one cares what's being said

here." Because of this approach, Garry's closest friends are not in his business; they are in advertising agencies, textile mills. One is a metallurgist, another a doctor, another a former FBI agent.

Although Garry never finished high school, he's hardly uneducated. He reads a great deal, is willing to talk on any subject and does so—well. He has an appreciation of the professions. His father was a lawyer, his brother is a doctor. He is certain that "No actor, by virtue of being an actor, could ever be great the way a doctor is great."

As an individual, Garry has attained a status most people in show business envy. He credits everyone connected with his show, at every possible chance. He says, "Too many men who are good take the bows alone. To me, writers are like the peasants of feudal times. They raise the crops but never get invited to partake of the feast."

Such personal feelings about writers may be rooted in his early days in radio, when he was a writer in his native Baltimore. He claims that there's little difference between Moore

 Morgan and Moore: Garry says he's no comic but the dog seems to disagree. the comedian and Moore the man. "But on camera, I have four top-notch men putting clever words in my mouth. My brother is much funnier than I am and he doesn't have to be."

Free and easy on camera, Garry attributes his calmness to the pace of a daily show. "We never say, 'Now we're going to perform.' If we're silly, everyone knows it's just for the gags."

Living in suburban Rye, N.Y., Garry sails often (he learned as a child), has a 35-foot yawl, "Red Wing." Only once has he allowed his children, Mason, 14, and Garry, Jr., 11, to be photographed professionally; and then he tore up every available print. "I don't think it's healthy for kids to be used as props."

His wife, Nell, runs a successful interior decorating shop with a friend. She got her start decorating her own home, branched out to Garry's office and then began advising friends. "It's good for her to have something to do," says Garry. "Our kids are almost grown."

This summer, the family is taking a six-week tour of Europe. "For all practical purposes, that's the last we'll see of our eldest, except for vacations. He's going to prep school, then college, then he's on his way."

The unspectacular home life of Thomas Garrison Morfit—the name Garry was born with and uses nonprofessionally—is what you might expect.

"I'm doing exactly what I've always wanted to do. I haven't had a bit of adjusting to do for TV. It's like having my own business and yet it's like partying—games, lights, music, pretty girls. When I come home, I need to rest. My wife might like to get out and see the lights more often. I'd say that she's the one who's had to adjust to TV."—Katherine Pedell.

Paul duPont Creates Costumes For TV In Wholesale Lots

Television's Diors and Schiaparellis grind out wardrobes at so frantic a rate that one of them, Paul duPont, figures his eight-year total of costumes in the hundreds of thousands.

Assigned to the NBC "spectaculars," duPont allows himself a whole week to costume each of the 90-minute color extravaganzas.

For "Naughty Marietta," he whipped up 3000 yards of ruffles for a chorus of cancan girls. And for "Variety," he hastily designed a hoopless hoopskirt for the dancers.

First duPont discusses ideas with producer Max Liebman. Then he broods, makes a few sketches, bastes a costume together, drapes it on a show girl and revisits Liebman.

"Then," says duPont, "Max tears it up, kicks it around, throws it out the window—and I start all over again."

No such drastic treatment, however, was accorded these duPont duds . . .



# Come Out Of The Bleachers!

Television Wants To Put You Down Front For Sportscasts


Television's theory of how to succeed in the vast sports field is simply this give the viewer the best seat at the park, field, stadium or racetrack and you have made a friend for life.

But there's a vast difference between theory and practice. Even now TV officials are sweating out the problem of bringing home viewers the broad sweep of action from any part of the baseball park that the paying customer can see. And this includes the dugouts.

While a few teams allow TV cameras to look into the dugouts, most refuse on the theory that what occurs there is just between a manager and his players. But, as pointed out by John Derr, CBS director of sports, many fans seated in the park can peer into the dugouts, so why not give home viewers a peek?

Derr would also like eight cameras to cover a baseball game, instead of the five in general use today. To bring viewers the most information about a game, he says, six cameras, in teams of two, should be posted behind home plate and along the firstand third-base lines—one to cover the action, one to shoot close-ups. The remaining two cameras would scan grandstand and playing field.

However, Tom Gallery, NBC's director of sports (he was formerly a vice-president of the New York Yankees), believes TV's baseball coverage is near-perfect now. Present camera positions give viewers better seats



than the best in the parks, he says,

But, given unlimited funds and complete command, Gallery and Derr would have a lot of fun and get plenty of excitement from other sports. Here are some of their ideas:

GOLF—Derr would adopt an idea, proposed by a Midwestern club, to redesign the course in the shape of a wheel. The clubhouse—and TV cameras—would be at the hub, with the fairways going back and forth along the spokes. The first tee, for example, would be in front of the clubhouse, with the first green on the rim of the wheel. The second tee would then be on the rim, with the second green back at the clubhouse. Cameras at the clubhouse could cover the action on nine alternate tees and greens.



'Take me out to the ball game:' TV does, and tries to assure you a good seat.

(To get back to earth, NBC is currently trying to lick the coverage on a regular course by stringing cables underground at the Augusta, Ga., National Course, to follow the players along the fairway instead of picking them up only on the tees and greens.)

BOXING—Gallery hopes to suspend a camera directly above the center of the ring, right above the microphone used by the ring announcer. "If a boxer is knocked flat," Gallery said, "we could cut in for close-ups of his face or of the referee counting him out."

FOOTBALL—Gallery wants a cameraon-wheels rolling along the sidelines. "We could get right down on the scrimmage line," he said. "We would have fine close-ups of the team captains surveying the opposition."

More valuable than that camera, in Derr's opinion, would be cameras placed high in each end zone. These would show the defensive line-up of each team and the offensive backfield, would alleviate the problem of the cameras' losing the ball on intricate T-formation plays.

BASKETBALL—It has been suggested that black basketball floors and a white ball would make plays easier to follow. But Gallery believes three cameras along the side at about balcony level can pick up all the fast action of basketball. And NBC, this past season, inaugurated use of a fourth and fifth camera at floor level behind each basket to give a better view of players shooting fouls.

### FROM COLLEGE CAMPUS TO TV STAGE

You surely must have noted by now that WBKB is elated over its newest star, Norman Ross. Never before has any personality received the promotional ballyhoo being showered on him.

Personable, soft-spoken and conservatively dressed, Norman talks about memorable historical events each weeknight at 11 P.M. A meticulous worker, he and his colleague, Dave McElroy, work eight hours each day to produce their nightly 10-minute stanza. "We try our level best to make the show entertaining rather than educational or academic," Norman declares. "Our prime goal is to tell a good story."

An introvert by nature, Ross dislikes the hustle and bustle of show business. He has always dreamed of becoming an author and leading the quiet, serene life of a college professor on campus. In fact, Ross was well on his way to making this dream a reality when he was working for his Ph.D. at Oxford University in England. His academic life there was interrupted by the death of his father, Chicago's beloved Norman Ross, Sr. He immediately returned to Chicago and a new way of life.

Ross began to dabble in radio. He later made his initial television pitch to WGN-TV where program director Jay Faraghan tentatively agreed to star Ross in a musical show. But WBKB offered Ross a more fluid format for his *This Is the Day* program and Ross asked to be released from his WGN-TV commitment. Faraghan courteously consented and Ross moved to WBKB where he has been a smash success since his first show last month.

Ross readily admits that it was Burr Tillstrom who influenced his switch to WBKB. Norm signed a one year contract and was given a free hand in the production of his 10-minute stanza. Over and above his nightly video stints, Ross handles numerous local radio programs, most of them featuring classical music. He's a record collector, an avid reader, a free-lance writer, a part-time actor, and a better-thanaverage tennis player.

It may be that all this activity is just a way of dodging romance. Dapper Norman remains an eligible but a wary bachelor.

Claudette Colbert Wants To Act, Not Sell, On TV

A reporter recently had occasion to question Claudette Colbert concerning her attitude toward television.

"I love it," she snapped. "Sue me."

Her remark, of course, had reference to the long-standing hostility of moviedom's upper crust toward TV. continued

# Miss Colbert Has A Mind Of Her Own—And Uses It

As one of Hollywood's ranking First Ladies, she might be expected to sniff a trifle condescendingly at the subject, but Miss Colbert is not the sniffing type. She might better be described as a "snaffler"—a snaffler being one who explodes cheerfully on any given topic instead of mincing around its edges.

"We invited two movie producers for dinner not long ago," she recalls, "and you should have heard them scream when I told them it was for Thursday night. One of them couldn't miss Groucho Marx at 8 o'clock, so we had cocktails in the den and everybody had to keep quiet. The other couldn't miss *Dragnet* at 9 o'clock, so we raced into the dining room promptly at 8:30, raced through dinner and raced back to the den at 8:59. They may sneer at TV publicly, but they can't live without it privately."

Miss Colbert herself, who has a way of doing things as she pleases and has been doing them rather well





for some years now, shocked the other Ranking Personages of the movie world back in April, 1951, when, by way of showing her scorn for Standards of Behavior, Motion Picture Industry, Anti-TV Division, she appeared as guest star on The Jack Benny Show.

But although Miss Colbert professes to 'have gotten a large charge from that initial TV appearance, the fact remains that three-and-a-half years elapsed before she appeared again this time in "The Royal Family" for CBS-TV's Best of Broadway last fall. Early this past January she made her third stab at it in a Ford Theater film, "Magic Formula," and followed it last month with "The Guardsman," also a Best of Broadway program. She's to be on Ford again April 28. Meanwhile, last summer, Miss Col-

bert was persuaded to make a pilot film of a series tentatively titled *Leave It to Liz*, in which she was to have played a young widow.

"For the first two months," she now confesses, "I was afraid it wouldn't sell. For the three months after that, I was scared to death it would."

It did sell, as it happens—only by that time Miss Colbert had become more fully aware of the demands made upon an actress by a weekly TV film show and she wanted out.

"The papers all said I got out of it because I didn't want to do the commercials," she says, "but I just plain didn't want to do the show."

Miss Colbert is still adamant about commercials, however, and manages to make it quite clear that she will have no part of them.

to be a salesman. It's my job to entertain, somebody else's to sell."

She hastens to explain that she is not anti-commercial, just anti-Colbert-doing-the-commercial. "Television is built on commercials," she says. "Without them it couldn't survive."

Having thus nailed down her position, Miss Colbert proceeded to cast her lot with CBS, signing a contract to make five appearances with the right of script approval for each.

This clause has already brought a touch of grief to the harried CBS executive roster. Ten days before "White Carnations," a *Climax!* show, was scheduled to go on the air, she exercised her right of approval. Or rather, disapproval.

"They gave me the script a whole week after they had promised it to me," she explains, "and it just wasn't one bit like the original story and I just couldn't do it and I didn't." Her schedule next called for "The Guardsman." This script she readily approved. ("After all," she shrugs prettily, " "The Guardsman' . . .")

Miss Colbert doesn't mean to be temperamental and quite likely isn't. Witty, candid, outspoken, vibrating with energy, she has won two skiing championships at Sun Valley and is an expert swimmer, diver, horseback rider and skater. She hides behind a high evergreen hedge surrounding a large Colonial home she built some 20 years ago in Holmby Hills. She is quite possibly the only star in all Hollywood who has not changed her home, hairdo or husband (Dr. Joel Pressman) in two decades.

"With that record," a CBS man grudgingly admits, "who needs the money?"



A Cartoonist Tells The Brutal Truth On:

# How To Make Children Laugh

## **By Paul Terry**

In 40 years of "Terrytooning" I have had to study and analyze the problem of what makes people—particularly children—laugh.

That's been necessary to get as much fun as possible into "Mighty Mouse," "Heckle and Jeckle," "Dinky," our other animated cartoons—and, for the past year, Barker Bill's Cartoon Show on CBS.

My research has convinced me that what is funny to children in the theater is usually just as funny to them in their own living rooms.

Perhaps I shouldn't come right out

and say so, but it's true that children react best to situations in which there is a slight suggestion of violence. This does not mean that a child will laugh at gory, sadistic scenes. On the contrary, too much violence will scare a youngster.

The child will laugh at a character who falls down—provided the child is aware that the character can and will get up. The child will laugh at seeing someone get punched in the nose—provided the child realizes that no one is really getting hurt.

In short, there can be no subtlety in humor designed for children. The base has to be broad.

This is not to say you must "talk



down" to children to make them laugh. But children have to know in advance that what they are watching is meant to be funny. Hence, the looks and behavior of animated characters are obviously strange.

It is also true that a child must feel physically and mentally superior to a character in order to laugh at him or it. Generally speaking, children will laugh at small objects and be frightened by big ones.

In the field of cartooning we have learned that children love small characters like "Mighty Mouse" much more than they love—say—elephants, although there is certainly a way of presenting an elephant so that he, too, will cause laughter. This can be accomplished by making the elephant somewhat silly. The youngster will then feel mentally superior and no longer fear the animal because of its sheer size.

A child will laugh at the antics of an animated hero if the child identifies himself with the hero. But children seldom laugh at the antics of the villain in the story, because the villain presents to them an image of something they want to conquer he's an enemy, and no laughing matter except when he is getting the worst of it at the hands of the hero.

In "creating" humorous situations, of course, we are inventing nothing. We are restating some of the thousands and "thousands of tried-andtrue gags and situations, weaving them into new story lines. In fact, the first 460 animated film shorts I made were all based upon Aesop's Fables characters and situations.

Basically, humor never changes, nor do tastes in humor. The same situations which made children and adults laugh 2000 years ago cause them to laugh today, when done up in modern dress.

Check through your memory and you will discover that by far the most successful comedians have been "sight" comedians, as compared with comedians who appeal to the mind. That is why the popularity of animated cartoons will live on and on; the humor in them is visual and, therefore, universal.

It isn't often a TV producer will tamper with a winning show. But when *I Love Lucy* slipped from its top position once or twice, Desi Arnaz and Lucille Ball decided to revamp. The new look was just the fillip needed to steer *Lucy* away from a possible rut and restore its wallop. The show should continue high on TV's Top 10 list, if not always in first place, for some time to come.

The revised format has given the Ricardos (Lucy and Desi) and the Mertzes (William Frawley and Vivian Vance) a chance to leave the New York apartment where they had gamboled since the show's inception. Desi won a Hollywood screen contract, which started both families for the Hollywood hills. Besides providing new situations in the motor tour to California and in Hollywood itself, the plot permits the introduction of many guest stars.

Wisely, the Arnazes did not tamper with the lead characters. Lucy is still the madcap housewife, eager not only to further her husband's career but also to break into show business herself. She continues to rank with the best of TV's comediennes. Desi is great as the harassed Ricky Ricardo, continually blowing his Cuban top at Lucy's shenanigans. And full credit goes to Frawley and Miss Vance as the show's second bananas.

The Lucy writing staff also rates deep bows for its contributions. The writers have come up with some really funny situations. Remember the stars' adventures in a flea-bitten motel down South, Ethel playing the great Broadway star for her hometown cronies and Lucy swooning when she meets her first movie star (William Holden) in person?

Besides Holden, the show boasts such guests as Hedda Hopper, Tennessee Ernie Ford (return engagement) and some movie wives. They've all helped *Lucy* regain lost momentum.—*R.S.*


