## as we see it

A man can't even rob a bank in peace any more, what with all these television producers looking for material. Take the case of William Roy Miller, who used a toy pistol to rob a Tucson, Ariz., bank in 1951.

Two months later he was captured in Los Angeles, and returned to Tucson. There he pleaded guilty to bank robbery and was sentenced to 15 years in prison. In the good old days, that would have ended that, but take a look at the listing for Big Story as carried by TV GUIDE's New York edition Friday, Feb. 18, 1955:

. 9:00 (8) BIG STORY-Drama

"The Man Who Wouldn't Run" is investigated by reporter Ken Alstead of The Tucson (Ariz.) Doily Citizen. The dawntown noonday crowd paid little ottention to the man who exited quietly from the bonk. Some of them even helped him tapick up the money he had dropped, little realizing these coins were part of his bank robber's loot. Chester Strotton ploys Alsteod.

Miller, charging that the sponsor of the show had exploited his "weakness for personal gain," has sued the American Tobacco Company for \$10,000. "Defendant's (the sponsor's) acts had the effect of portraying the plaintiff (Miller) in the role of a bank bandit in a dramatic re-enactment of a comic opera bank robbery to a nationwide television audience," Miller wrote. And, since his permission hadn't been asked, he asserted, the show was an "invasion of privacy."

It'll be an interesting case—and will undoubtedly be watched carefully by all the shows—such as *Dragnet*, *Line-up*, etc.—that rely on actual case histories for their material. Could be that crime won't pay even for sponsors any more.



NBC planning to preview its projected Wide, Wide World series on Producers' Showcase Monday, June 27. Live pickups will be made from Mexico, featuring CANTINFLAS, the famed Mexican comedian, and from the Shakespeare Festival at Stratford, Ontario.

NBC's Sunday, June 19, "spectacular," titled "Remember 1938," will be a cavalcade of show-business events that year: ETHEL BARRYMORE starring in "White Oaks," OSCAR LEVANT playing GEORGE GERSHWIN's "Rhapsody in Blue," etc. GROUCHO MARX emcees and GORDON JENKINS conducts. If the show is good, NBC may do others based on specific years! events.

Another summertime spectacular on NBC will be a musical variety show from Hollywood Saturday, July 2, in conjunction with Universal-International and starring JEFF CHANDLER, PIPER LAURIE, MAMIE VAN DOREN, TONY CURTIS and AUDIE MURPHY.

Various movie studios bidding for GORE VIDAL's "Visitor to a Small Planet," telecast recently on TV Playhouse. They see it as a starring vehicle for ALEC GUINNESS or DANNY KAYE . . . A telefilm version of "Robin Hood," starring RICHARD GREENE and filmed in England's Sherwood Forest, set for CBS Monday nights in the fall . . . Broadway comedian MENASHA SKULNIK, recently on The Martha Raye Show, may do a telefilm series next fall based on "The Education of H\*y\*m\*a\*n K\*a\*p\*1\*a\*n."

HENRY SALOMON, producer of Victory at Sea, working on a new documentary series for NBC about the Communist menace, titled The Red Nightmare . . . DICK SHAWN may be handed his own starring situation comedy series.

Kinescope repeats of best Elgin Hour and Center Stage shows will take over the Elgin time this summer, starting Tuesday, June 28 -- but under another name, not yet set . . . Dottie Mack Show moves to Thursday nights in July, replacing ABC's Pond's Theater.

Make the Connection, new Goodson-Todman panel show, replaces Justice for the summer. Whether Justice will return next fall is not yet certain . . . Singer JILL COREY, who started her career on DAVE GARROWAY's Friday night show last year, added to the cast of CBS' Orson Bean Show this summer.

# CBS Gambles \$200,000 On Gleason —And An Idea

CBS has been looking for a new show for Saturday nights. And the executive who mentioned this to Jackie Gleason is still wondering what hit him. In seconds. Gleason outlined for next fall a series of one-hour "night club" programs, tentatively titled them Cafe Mardi Gras and pocketed \$75,000 for an audition. He hired 48 dancers and showgirls, a king-size orchestra with Paul Whiteman and Ray Bloch, Hildegarde, Sammy Davis, Jr., the Flying Ashtons, comedians Noonan and Farrell. With incidentals, the audition cost \$200,000. CBS is now hopefully showing the test film to prospective sponsors.

# Eddie Fisher, Boy Corporation

If two's company, and three's a crowd, what's 30-plus? Company—and then some! A whole blooming corporation, in fact.

That is one of the arithmetical facts of life which has confronted petite film star Debbie Reynolds, who was to wed TV and juke box favorite Eddie Fisher some time this month. For Eddie is not one man, but many.

As the time for the nuptials approached, storm clouds began to jostle all the hearts and flowers. First came hints by the gossip columnists. Then a denial by Debbie that anything was amiss. Then postponements.

Fisher ducked reporters, but began to squire other girls. Debbie volunteered to visit GIs in Korea last month and to start a new picture this month. To many, it seemed as if "the romance of the year" had come a cropper.

Why? Many reasons were advanced, but one theme in particular kept recurring: At 26, Eddie Fisher is Big Business—a going concern with an annual gross income in the very pretty neighborhood of \$1,000,000. And corporation mergers are much more complex than marriages.

In a way, when and if he's ever asked that certain question, Eddie should substitute "We do" for "I do."



For, like other big businesses, Eddie Fisher, Inc. requires a corps of executives and lesser employes—an entourage often reinforced by old friends, volunteer bodyguards, devoted fans and an occasional panhandler. All would have a vital interest in his marriage.





Important boosts also came from people like Eddie Cantor; (Fisher was his protege); Robert M. Weitman, ABC vice-president, who managed the Broadway Paramount; Jennie Grossinger, operator of a Catskill resort.

# A Couple Yards Of Laughter, Please



Have you ever sat at home wondering what's so funny about a television show?

You hear laughter—great gobs of it, little trills of it, polite fits of it—and there you sit, giving forth from time to time with, at most, a chuckle.

How do all those laughs get there? There means on the filmed comedy situation shows, 22 of which can be seen on the networks each week.

To start at the beginning, sponsors feel that if the home viewer hears gales of laughter, he'll think the show is funny—even if it isn't. So, to assure an adequate supply of laughs, producers have adopted a number of pat, but honest, procedures.

Fourteen of the shows are filmed without anybody laughing at the jokes. These films are run off before an audience of studio enthusiasts who, thrilled at previewing a coast-to-coast TV show and usually "warmed up" by a pre-show session with the star himself, laugh uproariously. Their laughs are recorded and printed on the film's sound track.

This method is considered practical and economical. Yet six of the 22 shows use another system. These six (Make Room for Daddy, December Bride, I Love Lucy, Our Miss Brooks, Willy and The Ray Bolger Show) set a cunning trap for laughter. They invite audiences into the studio to observe the actual filming, then grab off the laughs. This maneuver, in the opinion of Danny Thomas, gives the laughter a "warmer" character.

There is also a third technique available. It has been banned by one



network, and no one else will admit using it. In this one, no audience is required. The laughter emerges mysteriously from a small box. It has been rumored that the box actually contains a trained hyena; but this is untrue, according to Charles Douglas, who invented it.

Inside the box, Douglas insists, is a patented device capable of issuing anything from an intimate titter to a maniacal cackle. In addition, the box can be tuned up or down in volume. In high gear it sounds like a thousand hungry men slurping minestrone.

Douglas says his system is the best yet devised, but the networks seem to think that it's spooky. There's something uncanny, they feel, about laughter that comes out of a box.

Many shows are not above manipulating the canned laughter on their sound tracks. When the prop audience doesn't laugh heartily enough to suit the sponsor, an engineer in the sound booth turns up the volume. And when, on the other hand, the audience laughs so hard that the convulsion covers up a joke, they tone down the guffaw when synchronizing the laugh track to the finished film.

Other shows make lavish use of "laugh loops"—reels of exposed sound tape—to take up the slack when the studio audience runs out of wind.

Some shows apparently can't decide what to do about canned laughter. The Stu Erwin Show, Dear Phoebe and Halls of Ivy are in this position. All have used laugh tracks, ditched them, then put them back in.

For three years Stu Erwin produced his show weekly with no burbles of laughter on the sound track at all. Then along came a new sponsor who insisted on chortles. So for the next 26 weeks Stu and My Little Margie shared a rubberneck audience which often cracked its ribs laughing at one show and sat on its hands at the other. The temptation to swap the laughs was admittedly great but both producers swear they never did.

When it comes to studio audiences, most producers lean toward those who produce laughter easily. The exact type of laughter isn't too important—a simple bray will do—but highly specialized laughter is out. Desi Arnaz once dropped in on a filming of Make Room for Daddy, guffawed all the way through the first half and then was asked politely but firmly to go away. "That Cuban laugh of yours," Danny Thomas complained, "is lousing up the sound track."

# \$500-A-Word Star

Verna Felton, 64, Makes TV Pay

The air waves have been kind to an ex-stock company actress named Verna Felton, who will be 65 next month. TV and radio have offered her a variety of juicy roles, such as Dennis Day's domineering mother, Red Skelton's bombastic grandmother and, currently, Spring Byington's pixielike crony, Hilda Crocker, in December Bride.

For a while, too, Miss Felton was being touted for a job which could well have established her as the Marie Dressler of TV—the title role in a contemplated *Tugboat Annie* television series.

What with December Bride, a regular spot on the radio version of My Little Margie, four cocker spaniels and an 18-month-old granddaughter, Verna's time is pretty well filled these days. But she admits she wouldn't have turned down that Tugboat Annie role.

"If they do the show," she says with a shrug, "they'll probably put some glamorous young actress in the part and call it "Tugboat Anne."

It's possible, thanks to a stint with Walt Disney, that Miss Felton is already the highest paid actress in TV. (Per spoken word, anyway.) A fiveword speech in a Disneyland auto commercial already has netted her \$2500, counting royalties. Right now



she's looking around eagerly for a nice 10-word commercial.

Miss Felton is by way of being a member of an acting dynasty. She made her debut at age eight as "Little Lord Fauntleroy" in her parents' touring stock company, which means she's had all of 57 years in show business. Her late husband was also an actor. Their son, Lee Millar, is a regular on The Bob Cummings Show.

Even one of Miss Felton's dogs, Hildy, by name, has been infected with 'the urge,' having served as the model for Lady in Walt Disney's cartoon feature, "Lady and The Tramp."

So far, this hasn't affected Hildy visibly; but, her mistress observes, "She hasn't seen the picture yet."

NBC Chicago network originations may be cut to 60 minutes a week, with only two half-hour programs-Mr. Wizard and Zoo Parade-on the docket. Hawkins Falls, the veteran week-day soap opera, may be dumped next month. Reason: lack of sponsor interest.

Sonia Henie's former co-star, Michael Kirby, has broken the ice. The skating champion, now operating a Windy City ice rink, has been signed as an announcer for WGN-TV's Sherlock Holmes thrillers.

Ruth Crowley is busily filming shows to fill in her network commitments when she vacations for the first time in three years this August. Ruth plans an ambitious tour of the Pacific Northwest.

Ailing NBC commentator Clifton Utley has been awarded a citation from the Disabled American Veterans for "Exemplary courage against physical adversity." Cliff, still battling back from his stroke of two years ago, hopes to return to TV this fall.

Both Dorsey Connors and Tom Duggan plan to star in musical comedies at local summer theaters. WBKB, incidentally, is laying plans for a new musical variety show for Duggan on Saturday nights, probably from 8 to 9 P.M.

Frann Weigle, a glib commercial announcer, has renewed his active membership in the musicians' union. Weigle is nursing an ambition to emcee a musical variety show reportedly already in the works.

There's quite a splash being made these days on the Bob & Kay with Eddie Doucette show. The program is presenting an eight-week series of swimming lessons for tots, in co-operation with the Chicago Chapter of the American Red Cross. Visiting toddlers are taught in a plastic swimming pool by two experts: Adolph Kiefer, ex-Olympic champ, and James Carnahan, Red Cross water safety director.

Ulmer Turner, always meticulous and conscientious about his newscasts, has constructed a special radio room in his home. Ulmer's "radio den" is equipped to receive newscasts from all over the world.

"Toothpick" Sam Jones' no-hitter last May 12 was memorable in more ways than one. First, it was the first Cubs no-hitter since 1917. And second, Jack Brickhouse, who described the action on TV, flaunted a long-standing taboo by saving that Jones had a no-hitter in the late stages of the game.

This was not standard broadcasting form. The theory that a player or announcer can jinx a pitcher even by hinting of a no-hitter has persisted for years. This, of course, is just about the most stupid precept in baseball. Although Jack is to be commended for defying this taboo, he could have made more frequent references to it than he did. The game was certainly made more dramatic by knowing that Jones was fashioning a perfect game.

Although most Chicago sportscasters no longer conform to this ridiculous tradition, many naive Chicago baseball fans still believe in it.

It's been interesting to note that, like most athletes suddenly making headlines, "Toothpick" Jones has been infected by an actor's temperament. Chicago sportscasters have found him almost impossible to cope with for personal appearances.

Jones recently turned down a sizable fee for a brief interview on Dave Garroway's Today Show. Norm Barry was all set to interview "Toothpick" on the NBC-TV network but Johnny Erp, NBC's sports director, refused to pay Jones' fee. "Apparently," grumbled Erp, "Jones figures he's a big star. He's just not worth the money he asks!"

Godfrey's Sister Act

Is Slowly Getting Used

To Big Clty Ways

Back in 1952, when the McGuire Sisters (Chris, Phyllis and Dorothy) first came to New York from Ohio, they were, in their own words, "three scared little rabbits." They hardly moved—except together—and they never went out after dark.

Since joining the Godfrey entourage, they've been going out a lot after dark—to the biggest night clubs in the country. And everywhere the McGuires go, crowds follow. continued

### They Always Insist On Dressing Alike

They broke attendance records in Chicago, Boston and Miami.

While Arthur occasionally has pouted when other Little Godfreys tried their wings, the girls say he is "thrilled to death" about their success.

The girls are thrilled, too, though nervous. "Night clubs," according to Phyllis, "are very different from television. Why, anyone can prepare one song well enough for TV. But it takes time and energy and thought to get up and entertain for 40 minutes people who pay to see entertainment."

So nervous are they that they've set themselves a Spartan-like improvement schedule master-minded by musical arranger Murray Kane. "He stages everything," Phyllis reports. "Walking, dancing—even the expression in our eyes." This is so they won't repeat their less graceful moments, like the time Phyllis fell-flat on her face in Chicago.

Neither do the girls want to repeat

their Florida exhibition, when all three reverted to their "scared rabbit" phase. That happened at the fashionable Polo Ball, attended by the Duke and Duchess of Windsor, Esther Williams, Vera-Ellen and Ginny Simms.

"We got there and discovered we were the show," Phyllis gasps.

"As soon as we saw dancer Vera-Ellen, we dropped the dance step in our routine," Chris recalls.

Dorothy says she felt "positively inferior." "We did our act and ran to our rooms and cried. We didn't even take a bow, we were so sure we 'laid an egg.'" (They didn't.)

Phyllis, the youngest McGuire, is the sisters' self-appointed spokesman. Chris, the oldest, does most of the trio's thinking. This division of labor leaves Dotty in the middle. Neither talker nor thinker, she calls herself "the normal one."

Two-and-a-half years ago, fresh from Miamisburg, Ohio, the girls wouldn't admit any marital entanglements. Phyllis said at that time, "Arthur wants people to think of us as being free as the little birdies that fly through the air." Actually, all three were already married when he hired them.

They still are, although Dorothy and Julius La Rosa were front-page copy when the fact came out that she was considering a divorce from Army Sgt. John Brown. Then Godfrey stepped in, invited all three girls and their husbands on a Florida vacation, hoping love would solve everything. On the surface, at least, it has.

Brown has joined Dorothy in the Manhattan duplex apartment which she shares with Phyllis and her husband, Neal Van Ells, a radio-TV man from Cincinnati. This living arrangement, since Brown is still in the Army, apparently is temporary.

Chris, who has two young sons from a previous marriage, lives with her youngest son and husband, John Teeter, nearby. Her 12-year-old son attends school in another city, and her major complaint is that she does not see him often enough.

The girls, like most women, are outspoken on the matter of clothes. They consider dressing alike their "stockin-trade," and dressed differently only once, for Sherman Billingsley's Stork Club. (He couldn't tell them apart.) For identification, they usually stand, left-to-right, Chris, Phyllis, Dorothy.

They never wear seductive dresses. Chris, who does all the buying, says, "People would rather think of us as sweet girls than any other way."

Their combined wardrobe includes 90 gowns, but these don't last long. If one dress is ruined, all three become useless. Lights and make-up wreck them quickly. The most expensive outfit to date retailed for \$395 (that's apiece), with matching cashmere sweaters. Luckily, those ensembles were bought wholesale.

Chris is convinced they get along as well as any sisters. "Sure, we have arguments, but they don't last."

They have reason not to fuss. Before Godfrey, they were three ordinary girls from Ohio, daughters of a retired lady-minister, and had grown up singing in church. Since Godfrey (he hired them right after they appeared on his *Talent Scouts*), they've had three hit records in a row, won their first gold disc from Coral Records for selling a million copies of "Sincerely," and boast 200 fan clubs—one in Hong Kong.

Phyllis, the most ambitious, has further plans for her sisters. "First, we have to get more poise," she says, "and more audience contact, and see more disc jockeys, and maybe next year, we'll be in Irving Berlin's new Broadway musical. And after that..."

# LOOK WHO'S A HERO!

As TV's 'China Smith,' Dan Duryea Enjoys His Vacation From Villainy

"I've gotten more public recognition from 26 TV films," Dan Duryea noted recently, "than from more than 40 features and 12 years in Hollywood."

What this proves, even Duryea is not quite sure; but he does know this for certain: he's glad to get away from villainous roles.

A past master at playing mean, lowdown characters on screen, Duryea had reached the point, three years ago, where to know him was to hate him. He is that rare actor who can add all sorts of dimensions to a nasty character. With most villains, the audience is content with a good paste in the nose. With Durvea, nothing will do but slow torture.

"Only once during those movie days," Duryea says mournfully, "did someone stand up for me. I took my oldest boy, Pete, to see one of my pictures, figuring he was old enough by then to understand the difference

between his father at home and his father as an actor. But when the hero got set to let me have it, Pete stood up on his seat and hollered, 'Don't you dare shoot my daddy!"

Duryea greeted the advent of television with all the fervor of a child left alone in a candy store. He shuffled through scores of scripts before stumbling on something called "The Affairs of China Smith." The hero ("Get that," Duryea marvels. "Hero yet!") is a light-hearted, lightfingered but hardly light-headed American adventurer. To the inspector of police in Singapore he is a notquite-lovable nuisance, whose regard for justice varies in direct proportion to the availability of a buck.

Before TV, Dan couldn't land a sympathetic movie role for love or money. Now they're coming at him so fast he has to turn roles down. Addition-

ally, China Smith has introduced him to a brand-new audience—the younger set, who for the most part had not been allowed to see the pictures Duryea had been making.

"Youngster asked me for my autograph recently," he muses, "and I automatically signed my name. Kid looked at it and snorted, 'Not that—sign your real name, China Smith!'"

Duryea got his start some 15 years ago when a doctor told him that tramping around Philadelphia streets as an advertising space salesman wasn't doing his health any good. Duryea promptly set about turning a hobby into a profession and headed for New York, where four stage roles in three years brought him some experience, if not much else.

In Hollywood, he hit the villain jackpot in short order. But off-screen, Duryea is a veritable model of deportment. Married to the same wife for more than 20 years, he is the father of two strapping boys, Pete, 14, and Dick, 11 with whom he spends considerable time engaged in nothing more sinister than shooting, sailing and fishing.

### Damon Runyon Theater

### PROGRAM OF THE WEEK

Damon Runyon fans around the country can breathe easier, now that the Damon Runyon Theater has had a chance to settle down. The premiere program was a near-fiasco, completely devoid of Runyonesque flavor. Since then, though, the show has successfully coupled its fantastic yarns with the proper Runyon spirit.

The program capitalizes nicely on the wealth of material left by the popular storyteller. The characters are the Broadway sharpies Runyon made famous—the gamblers, bookies, chorus girls and others who live an inch or two on the wrong side of the law, but who, almost without exception, possess hearts of gold.

Vivian Blaine, Robert Strauss and Bruce Bennett were co-starred in the first program, about a gambler and his doll trying to strike it rich at the Florida race tracks, but the script was, to put it bluntly, terrible.

Subsequent players have fared better. Scott Brady was fine as a gambler who bought a small-town bank which refused to cash his checks. Broderick Crawford and Marilyn Erskine scored in a story about a bigtime mobster who refused to let a guy marry a girl because the girl reminded him of his mother. And Steve Brodie was good in a yarn about a Broadway card sharp captured by the Nazis.

Produced by Screen Gems in Hollywood, Runyon Theater reflects a big budget and technical skill.

### Conrad Nagel Theater

Probably no telefilm dramatic series gets a more pretentious build-up than does Conrad Nagel Theater. Nagel, as host, introduces each week's story by referring to Shakespeare, Dickens and others in the same league as literary immortals—a fact nobody will dispute. He then goes on to imply that the story you're about to see may be the literary classic of tomorrow—a fact almost any viewer will dispute.

The series has one saving grace; it does attempt off-beat stories. But in this era of big-time TV, a well-intentioned try isn't enough. A fantasy about a newspaperman who finds a beautiful female genie (named Jeannie, of course) in a bottle failed to come off. Another, about a Harvard-graduate-turned-beachcomber who inherits \$1,000,000 when he finds a note in still another bottle, was nonprofessional in conception and in execution.

Nagel himself lends nothing to the show except possible marquee glamor. His introductory, closing and between-acts remarks have no direct link to the stories.—R.S.


