# as we see it

We don't care much whether New York or Hollywood wins the current battle over which city will be the Nation's TV capital—so long as some of the places in between are heard from every so often.

There's no doubt at all that the polished, half-hour dramatic films and situation comedies can best be turned out in Hollywood. It's just as evident that live hour-long dramas should originate close to Broadway and its huge supply of talented actors, writers and producers.

In their concern over such shows, however, the networks sometimes forget that all the television brains in the United States are not clustered on Madison Avenue and Sunset Boulevard. The folks out in the hinterland have an idea or two once in a while, and it could be that those ideas deserve a chance.

A few weeks ago NBC televised a square-dance convention from Oklahoma City—in color as well as in black and white. It was the most refreshing half hour we'd seen in years.

Granted there is only one square-dance convention a year, aren't there other events worth televising from somewhere other than New York and Hollywood? What about the Barber Shop Quartet championships, turkey shoots in the South, "Frontier Days" in Cheyenne, rodeos all over the Southwest, state fairs, all the other events that now are seen on TV locally or in short newsreel clips?

We're afraid there's too much emphasis on big-city appeal these days, too much similarity of shows. Let's cross the Hudson River and the Sierras more often, fellows, and see all of America.

GLEASON, in order to buck COMO, had already reversed his plans by putting his half-hour Honeymooners show in ahead of the DORSEY BROTHERS' show, which he will produce.

Casting call for this week's Studio One (GEORGE M. COHAN's "Pigeons and People") included six pigeons that could "coo on cue" . . . SAM LEVENSON signed to replace HERB SHRINER this summer on Two for the Money . . . MITCH MILLER, Columbia Records' bearded chief, will be orchestra leader on CBS' ORSON BEAN show.

JO STAFFORD, who loses her Tuesday night time after this season, may turn up as a regular star on some big CBS musical program next fall . . . The network has no future plans for JANE FROMAN, who will concentrate on night-club bookings and occasional TV guest shots.

PAT CARROLL set for appearances on three upcoming Jimmy Durante Shows . . . PAULETTE GODDARD liked TV so much when she co-starred recently on "The Women" that she's now seeking her own telefilm series . . . # Cap'n John Of The Cheryl Ann



## Preston Foster Is At Home On Land, Sea—Or In A Trailer

This may come as a disillusionment to those viewers who look upon Preston Foster's Cap'n John role in *Waterfront* as the real thing, but the fact of the matter is, he lives in a trailer. And he may very well be the only TV star in the world who does.

The trailer, which the thrifty Foster and his wife, Sheila, promoted several years ago while touring the country as an act, is parked on the Hal Roach studio lot in Hollywood, a measured 71 feet from Stage One. Inasmuch as Stage One is Foster's normal place of business, this makes him perhaps the luckiest commuter in the country. It also makes him a pretty smart householder, inasmuch as he pays no property tax for the little plot of Roach soil and is hooked into all the Roach utilities for free—gas, water, electricity and telephone.

As befits a seafarin' man, however, Foster has had a painted canvas backdrop placed over the wall of the soundstage next to the trailer. It is a seascape and is visible through the trailer's living-room window. At night, two small spotlights play upon it. "I am the only man in Hollywood," he says, "with a night view of the ocean."

When the show is not working, Foster and his wife take off **continued**

for their 400-acre ranch up in the Sierra Palloma mountains, a place which they have had to put on a paying basis. "It's a working ranch," Foster grumbles amiably, "but the Government kept insisting it was just an actor's hobby, and you should see the tax bill I used to get. There I was, tearing that scraggly land apart practically with my bare hands trying to find water for irrigation, and they called it a hobby. Some hobby!"

A handsome hulk of a man in his fifties, Foster revels in his role as star of the syndicated *Waterfront* film series, first telecast in February, 1954. It is now seen in more than 90 cities, with a total audience of up to 22,000,000 people. The extent of its impact is indicated by the greeting given Foster by his mother when he visited her in Philadelphia last fall for the first time in five years.

"She looked at me there in the doorway for a second," he relates,

"then threw her arms around me and cried, 'Cap'n John!'"

Foster's biggest thrill was in proving that a Hollywood actor knows his way around the water. When he visited Cleveland last year for a press shindig, his sponsors in that area threw a party aboard a scow—which was anchored out in the middle of the lake and could be reached only by tug. With a bevy of skeptical newsmen looking on, Foster swung aboard the tug, took over the helm, rang all the right bells and finally eased her alongside the scow like an old salt.

"Been around boats most of my life," he says (he was born in Ocean City, N.J.) "and owned one for a number of years. Getting the hang of the Cheryl Ann was no trick at all."

The Cheryl Ann, which practically co-stars with Foster, is rented from a Wilmington, Cal., tug company. A replica, built in sections and mounted on wheels, is used for the interior shots on Stage One. More and more, however, producer Ben Fox is doing

his shooting on location at San Pedro harbor, giving the show an authentic flavor not always attained in TV.

A stickler for both realism and continuity, Fox has built the *Waterfront* cast to the point where it now has more regular characters than perhaps any other show on the air. On an average, each appears in one out of every three or four shows, which, Fox says, gives the show a constant change of pace without having to introduce brand-new people every week.

Foster, too, likes it that way. "I appear in maybe a third of the footage in each show," he says, "and in some episodes I hardly appear at all. That's all to the good. People can get sick and tired of the sight of you on a week-in, week-out basis."

*Waterfront* has been a high-water mark in Foster's career, putting him in the public eye as none of his motion pictures ever did. "I appeared in 'The Informer' back in 1935," he says, "and I was in 'The Last Mile' with Spencer Tracy—the picture that brought Gable to M-G-M. But it has taken television to put me where I am today."

Foster is a favorite with local and regional sponsors because of his willingness to endorse their products and have his picture taken with them for publicity purposes.

But even cooperation is not without its problems. When a Midwest brewery sent Foster six cases of beer for both photographic and personal consumption purposes, the red tape closed in like a forest in a nightmare. "First thing I knew," Foster recalls, "they were after me for importing without a license. We finally had to route the stuff through a big importer downtown, and even then you'd have thought I had a reputation as the biggest rumrunner since Prohibition. All for six cases of beer."

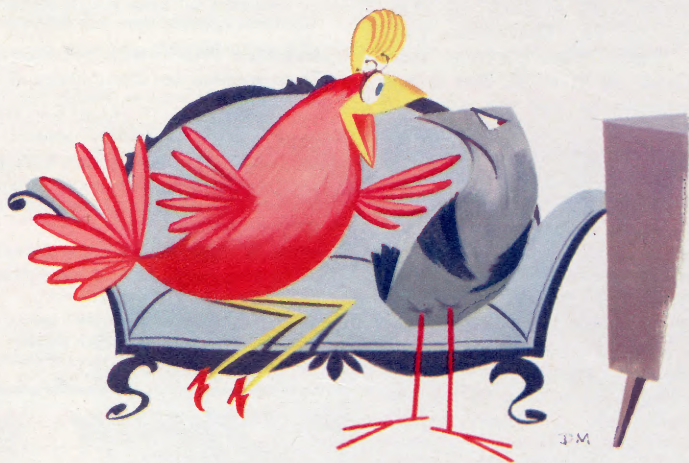

# TV *Birdwatchers'* GUIDE

Television has hatched a whole new genus of birds. Take a position near any set and you are sure to spot a Swooping Channel Changer, Fiddling Flipwit, Clarifying Coot or some of the weird types shown here.

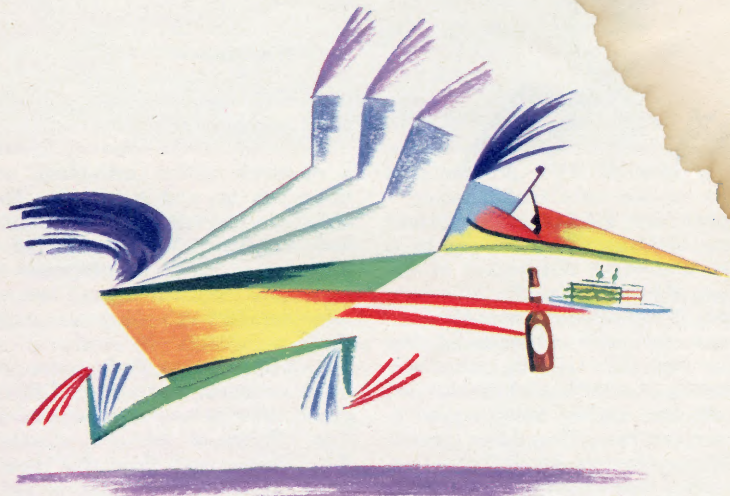
**The Insistent Upstart.** A small but fiendish bird, which warbles in a nerve-racking manner until it gets what it wants; whereupon it emits a triumphant crow. The best precaution against it is a periodic wing clipping.



**Twittering Chit-Chats.** These birds use TV as a conversational spring-board, never thinking of turning off either the set or themselves. From a squawk about the star's gown, they flit off on to a discussion of a bargain basement sale, then exchange recipes and bits of neighborhood gossip. No one within earshot can possibly miss them—nor hear the program.



**The Outnumbered Pouter.** This adolescent bird is usually recognized by its moulting expression as it moans about missing Eddie Fisher and having to watch wrestling instead.



**The Bee-Lining Darter.** A distinctive flight pattern marks this species. It is most active during commercials or station breaks, at which times it heads unerringly for the refrigerator, then swoops back, all in a matter of seconds.

**The Slipped Glue-tail.** After a rush dinner, it turns the set on and happily roosts in an easy chair until a weary-voiced announcer signs off The Late Late Show.

## TV's Effect On Our Children

There still should be a considerable reduction in the volume of crime-and-shooting shows telecast during the hours most children watch. But the situation has improved recently.

That's the belief of Sen. Estes Kefauver, who is now investigating the rising tide of juvenile delinquency. In seeking the forces responsible, he has taken a look at TV's programs of violence as one unbalancing factor.

Further, as a TV fan and the father of four children, Kefauver takes a special interest in this aspect of the problem. He feels that the television industry is not entirely blameless.

"I can say with confidence," the Senator told TV GUIDE, "that the investigating committee's hearings last fall and this spring have served a good purpose here. They have created a public awareness of the situation, and notified the industry of the desires and demands of the public.

"This has brought about a substantial improvement in the types of programs being offered during the principal watching hours of children. And the programs will become still better. I can reveal that we've even had network and station people in to discuss types of children's programs with us.

"As a father, my objection is not so much to any *individual* program of crime or violence, but that there are too many of them. Some stations carry so many they build up a cumulative effect upon a youthful audience."

Some contend that the TV crime shows—especially those, like *Dragnet*, based on police records—teach youngsters the valuable lesson that the

criminal always loses in the end.

Not necessarily so, counters Kefauver. "Our committee," he says, "has contrary information from officials of juvenile corrective institutions. Say, a boy there watches the dramatization of a real case in which a hardened adult criminal is caught.

"The boy, in the training school for a relatively minor infraction, sometimes sits up and comments, 'Hey, I didn't do anything nearly as bad as that and the law sent me here for even longer.' So those programs teach some boys they can commit lots worse offenses and pay no heavier penalty."

The Senator also finds some validity to criticism that many of the programs show private individuals, rather than officers of the law, eliminating the villains, and that this does not teach respect for properly constituted law enforcement.

"I do not favor Government censorship," the Tennessean says firmly, "but there is something to the argument that the Federal Communications Commission should create specific over-all standards. I agree stations should be required to submit more information about their programs to the FCC for consideration when stations seek license renewal."

Kefauver takes exception to those who attack the voluntary Code of good practice of the National Association of Radio and Television Broadcasters because it lacks the power to enforce and punish. He contends the industry is new, the Code even newer and that, given time, the Code will achieve desired results.

NARTB officials testified before Kefauver's committee that they never notify the FCC about stations which violate or ignore the Code, and would be loathe to do so. To this, Kefauver says: "I believe the experience of the Association should be made known to the FCC. It should be evidence to be considered at license renewal time."

Kefauver chuckles over reports that devious "pressures" were responsible for all mention of television being eliminated from the committee's first report to Congress.

"The fact is that we didn't believe we had adequate expert testimony on the effects of TV on juvenile delinquency. Now, thanks to our more recent hearings, we do have all the information we need and our television report will be out shortly."

There are still a few odds and ends to be cleaned up. One of the most important is the status of the producers of filmed TV package shows.

"Do you realize," Kefauver points out, "there are approximately 140 producers of these shows, and only a relatively few subscribe to either the Broadcasters' or the motion picture industry's codes? This is important because so much of television reaches

the station on film. We intend to question some of these producers."

Although Kefauver withholds comment at present, there is considerable sentiment in the television industry for a voluntary, industry board of review. It would be along the lines of the motion picture industry code board, which polices films and issues its seal of approval to all who comply.

The Senator approaches the entire problem as an average American father who finds much good in TV for his children. And is himself an admirer of the medium.

"In my family," he explains, "there is one rule for all four of my children. They must do their homework before they are permitted to watch TV. Then they may watch till bedtime.

"The two younger aren't permitted to see programs of violence and shooting. But I permit the older ones, my boy of nine and my daughter, 13, to watch whatever they want.

"There's a lot on television that's helpful to children. There are travelogs, historical shows, programs of news and current events. Generally speaking, television does a fine job.

"But there is room for improvement in the shows offered for children."

## Beautiful Baritone

PEGGY KNUDSEN PLAYS  
... AND OVERPLAYS  
... A HOLLYWOOD STAR

No malice is intended, of course, but a TV series is currently portraying a "Hollywood star" as a devastating female who has a voice like the bottom valve on a bassoon, a cigaret holder as long as a pool cue, and an unqualified willingness to lay down her double's life for her fans.

This character, hardly designed to promote amicable relations between movies and TV, is one April Adams, the plague of "stand-in" Mitzi Green in *So This Is Hollywood*. In real life, she is Peggy Knudsen, the leggy, blonde daughter of a Duluth, Minn., fireman. She is also the wife of TV director Jim Jordan, son of radio's "Fibber McGee and Molly."

Peggy's imitation of Garbo imitating Bankhead is only one of the tasks she undertakes on TV. She has also bid for recognition as the medium's most amusing viper by breaking up a marriage on *December Bride* and playing "heavies" on *The Bob Cummings Show* and *City Detective*. All, of course, with that startling voice.

Such roles are a logical development in Peggy's career. Gravitating toward Chicago after high school graduation in 1941, she entered radio as a heroine in daytime serials. Gradually she worked her way down, via her escalator voice, to a full-time job as *The Other Woman*. Since then, she has engaged in nearly every type of female villainy, mainly in movies.

This is emphatically not type-casting. Away from the cameras, Peggy's the mother of three small daughters, a gal inclined to look on the cheerful, wholesome side of things.

## Appointment With Adventure

### PROGRAM OF THE WEEK

As its title suggests, *Appointment with Adventure* concerns people involved in exciting situations. The first of these live half-hour dramas, for instance, dealt with two cave-explorers trapped 3000 feet under the earth's surface; the second, with two youthful hitch-hikers falsely accused of murder and almost lynched by farmers angry over a damaging hurricane.

The first was dull, marred by a trite romantic triangle; the second, tiptop. Succeeding shows have been consistently good.

Superior casting is one of the show's best features. But, of course, a good actor is only as good as his script. If all the scripts were as good as the hitch-hiker drama, a weekly appointment with Talent Associates' *Appointment* would be a TV viewer "must."—R.S.

## STAR TONIGHT

*Star Tonight* is a commendable venture which might properly be called a "trade show," in that it is designed to give young actors and actresses a break. It repairs an oversight by the so-called "talent" programs, which seem to limit their boosting to singers, dancers and the like.

In each show, a comparatively unknown youngster is given the lead, and, all things considered (including, in some cases, the "star's" obvious lack of experience), the program adds up to interesting entertainment.

There's no question about the fact that a really good young actor is a rare commodity and that inexperience tends to shine through like a beacon. The show has been loaded with examples of lesser lights, but every now and then, as in the case of Joanne

Woodward, viewers do enjoy a first-rate performance. In "Death of a Stranger," Joanne played the part of a strong-willed backwoods girl bent on murder for money, and she showed every sign of knowing her way around the stage.

If it's fresh new faces you're looking for, talented or not quite so talented, *Star Tonight* is for you.—D.J.

## THRIFTY AUDREY MEADOWS HAS STRUCK IT RICH

Among the more incredible happenings in the golden business of TV has been the signing of an \$11,000,000 contract between a free-spending sponsor, CBS, and Jackie Gleason Enterprises. Naturally not a modest man, Jackie (with a capital "J") refers to his organization in small type. But there's nothing small about the amount of loot being divvied up at J.G. Enterprises, Inc.

Audrey Meadows, the slim, nasal-voiced girl who, as Alice Kramden, rules the "Honeymooners" roost (and often the rooster—burly, loud-mouthed Ralph) gets approximately one-eleventh as her share. This is estimated, logically enough, as about \$1,000,000.

## How Audrey Convinced Gleason To Hire Her

Audrey did what any woman would do; she lit out for some of New York's better shops. Considering the circumstances, she kept a surprisingly clear head, cautiously spent a lot for a few good things. She even resolved to stay in the three-room, \$200-a-month apartment that she and sister Jayne had shared before Jayne's marriage to Steve Allen. And aside from new bedspreads and draperies, the only refurbishing she has done to date was to paint two small, unpainted bureaus in the bedroom.

"This eased my conscience," she reports, "so I didn't feel too guilty when I bought my (first) mink stole." The daughter of an Episcopalian minister who had spent years in missionary work in China (both girls were born there), Audrey has, at least, the conscience of the thrifty.

But since Audrey can be tempted, her lawyer brothers invested her money for income and so tied up her cash that she doesn't get much of it. "They decided it was safer if I never got it to spend," she admits. She complains cheerfully that she had more ready cash when she was earning \$75 a week. "Then, after I paid the rent, it didn't matter what I did with my pay."

Role that made her rich: Alice Kramden, of the 'Honeymooners.'

For two sisters working in the same medium where rivalry is rampant, Audrey and Jayne surprise outsiders by the way they stick together. They say this closeness goes back to their childhood. "With a minister for a father, we were shifted constantly—to new countries, cities, homes, schools. We *had* to stick together—for protection."

They tried recently to invest in a private Jayne-Audrey corporation, found it wouldn't be profitable and invested instead in the doll business.

This summer, "Audrey" and "Jayne" dolls for children will be marketed. They also are endorsing products and have recorded songs. (Audrey started in show business as a singer, got her big break in "High Button Shoes.")

Audrey's theory: "In show business, you're like a court jester. You may be in favor for three years—or 10—and then you may be out.

"The really mad part of all this is that when Jackie hired me, he had never seen me act, he had never heard of me, except from my manager. He didn't know if I *could* act."

Just after Pert Kelton, the original Alice, left the Gleason entourage, Audrey's manager, Val Irving, met Jackie's manager, Bullets Durgom. Val suggested Audrey for the role but Jackie turned her down. Too pretty. "Alice," the great Gleason ruled, "has gotta be a mess."

To Audrey, a gag is one of the world's better sports. On hearing the verdict, she hired photographers for a candid session. "My hair was uncombed, I wore my oldest clothes, a

torn apron and no make-up. Then," Audrey reports, "I stood in the kitchen and fried eggs. I looked awful. The kitchen looked awful. Even the eggs didn't look edible."

Jackie didn't believe the girl in the pictures was Audrey. When convinced, he roared, "Any girl who would let herself be seen like that for a job deserves it."

On recalling her early days with the unpredictable Gleason, Audrey says, "Luckily, I had worked with Bob and Ray first. Sometimes, they don't even *start* with a prepared script. But six hours before Jackie and I did our first 'Honeymooners' routine, we hadn't rehearsed. I was so nervous I almost committed hara-kiri."

Her sister Jayne has this to say, "Audrey is naturally round-shouldered. Next to the enormous Gleason she seems thin and put-upon, and much smaller than she really is (5 feet, 6 inches). That's what makes her so funny. And when she says, 'Listen here, Ralph, you can't go *now*,' the *now* comes straight through the nose."

The girls say this is not pure Brooklyn-ese but the accent of a Connecticut society girl. The two attended some of the fancier schools of Connecticut on scholarship. "Not because we were smart—but because we were the minister's daughters."

Audrey's nasality later prompted Henry Morgan to comment, "She is the only human female who can sound like Fred Allen." And another friend suggested, "She sounds like a road company Katharine Hepburn with a clothespin stuck on her nose."

Though such a twang wouldn't get her through a speech course in dramatic school, this fact hasn't made a bit of difference to the "million-dollar baby." Alice Kramden couldn't pass the course, either.—*Kathy Pedell*

# 'Operation Q' Was Greatly Overdue

## The Long Wait At Yucca Flat Cost Networks \$5000 A Day

"Operation Q," an NBC executive said wryly, after the fifth postponement of the Civilian Defense-sponsored atom blast, "is the highest rated show never to go on the air.

He might have added that it was also the most expensive. The blast had drawn an NBC-CBS pooled crew of 95 technicians, engineers, announcers and photographers to Nevada's Yucca Flat site five days before the Apr. 26 date, to set up seven cameras and a microwave route to

Las Vegas, where the picture would be transmitted to Los Angeles via cable.

Charles Collingwood, of CBS' *Morning Show*, was there. So was Dave Garroway, of NBC's *Today*. The two early-bird programs had planned to show viewers not only the blast, but the split-second reaction of people hunched in a trench less than two miles from the 500-foot steel tower that held the bomb.

However, after the seventh postponement, with charges climbing at the rate of \$5000 a day on top of the original \$80,000 cost to networks, the expensive commentators and crews were called home. Back to New York

went Garroway, Collingwood, Walter Cronkite, John C. Swayze, Morgan Beatty and John Daly, leaving one camera crew to keep watch.

It was a frustrating experience for sleepless commentators and scientists who put up a brave front, stood before the costly camera set-up and talked—as people have done even before Mark Twain's day—about the weather.

And nothing could be done about it.

'STAND-INS' PLAY BIG ROLES,  
BUT NOBODY EVER SEES THEM

You never see them. Their only job is to stand (or, rather, stand-in) during rehearsals, and to wait. These are the "stand-ins," the guinea pigs of the business, on whom lights and make-up are tested, camera angles set. Now and then they run through a skit to test its impact. But when time for real action comes, the star, who has been relaxing all the while, takes over. For some, like a barber (Groucho Marx's Sam Ben-Ami) or a stunt girl (Marcia Henderson's Maxine Garrett), the salary supplements their regular income. To others, like bit-player Vicki Carlson, Martha Raye's stand-in, the work offers valuable TV experience, plus pay.

**NEW YORK . . .** Jack Benny's frank admiration of Jackie Gleason hasn't prevented Gleason from playing tricks on him. When Benny guested on the Gleason show recently, Jackie—as a gag—fitted up a dressing room for Benny that was ridiculously small. Jack could only get into it sideways, and all the furniture was old and broken-down. When Benny was led into it, the Gleason troupe roared. Benny turned to them and, with his sad look, said, "I don't know what you're laughing about. This is *much* bigger than my dressing room back in Hollywood."

■ No, Arthur Godfrey hasn't fired any of his sponsors yet, but. . . Recently, when he took on a new one, he said in effect to ad agency spokesmen: "Now don't be wasting my time sending me three pages of junk to read in preparing a commercial. Put the salient points in three lines. I'm no moron . . . and I am busy!"

■ I took an out-of-town friend to *The Garry Moore Show*, and the "warm-up" was quite funny for so

early in the day. "How many are seeing the show in the studio for the first time?" Garry asked. The members of the audience indicated they were all newcomers. Said Garry: "Well, I'm the only one who's been here before! But I think you'll like the program. It's my favorite show—in fact, I watch it every day. Well, I've got to go off now and come back on again—so act surprised, will you?" . . . Backstage, afterward, Garry remembered an early failure: "I was on Fred Allen's radio program once and I set a record—I was the only guy ever fired between the East Coast broadcast and the repeat for the West Coast."

On Fridays he suffered an ulcer attack, took a bad fall on stage, tumbled down a flight of stairs, severely hurting his back, and was notified that his three children were seriously ill with the virus. So now he wears a key chain on which are two rabbit's feet, a four-leaf clover, a good-luck horseshoe, a small salt shaker and a cigaret lighter. The lighter is there because he recently lit a match and burned his hand badly—on a Friday.

■ Jack Eigen, who was fired from a Chicago TV program for his marathon on-the-air smooching with blonde actress Cleo Moore, has invited her back on his new television program. "I wouldn't mind getting fired again for the same reason," he informed Cleo.
