Uni High has seen many people come and go. Last year more went than came giving Uni a sort of empty feeling. This year new life was poured through its veins by bounding, virgorous, young, Form I's dashing through the halls. New teacher were added and a new administration.



The hungry minds of these young adults (or old children) have gobbled up information on everything important for the future of this country. Each student is an expert on such vital fields as chess, four-square, computer, football, and foreign languages.

People are not the only important part of the school. Students at Uni who are not part of the Form I program take structured courses like Euclidean Geometry a la Beberman, Social Studies a la Leppert, and French a la Bond. The Form I's are involved in projects in electronics, biology, recreation, and other such important fields.

All of these new extracurricular activities added on to old extracurricular activities, added on to curricular activities, provide an often busy and always hectic life for Uni students.

The members spent up to three meetings discussing such soul searching issues as whether or not to allocate 150\$ to Uni-Film, whether or not to make the girls lounge coed, and whether or not Student Council could determine whether or not. 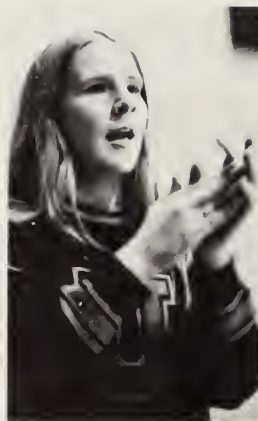
