

#### REMARKS.

This, the fourth part of the catalogue of the Collection of Engraved Portraits gathered by the Hon. James T. Mitchell, Chief Justice of Pennsylvania, embraces his extraordinary and unique series of the Presidents of the United States from Washington to the present incumbent of the Presidential Chair.

The Portraits of George Washington include that on the "Battle of Prague," the rare Peale Mezzotintos of the General and Lady Washington, the rare Norman portraits of the General and Mrs. Washington, the rare Hodson Mezzotinto, printed in colors, and a fine copy of the Freeman Mezzotinto, printed in colors.

The portraits of Thomas Jefferson are the most important and largest collection we have ever had the pleasure of presenting to the public, and contains all those engraved by Edwin and Tiebout, as well as the very rare, and, we may say, unique, portrait in Mezzotinto by Savage and a very fine copy of the portrait by Field. Those of John Adams include all the rareties, as well as the excessively rare portrait by Savage. The portraits of James Madison embrace all the rareties known, and the collection of portraits of Andrew Jackson has long been known to be the most complete in the country.

Of the portraits of Abraham Lincoln, the collection is the most complete and extensive known, containing many impressions from plates not published, special artists' proofs, as well as original unpublished drawings from life made by Morand a short time before the Great Emancipator's death.

Those of the other presidents embrace all the portraits that can be had, and the whole forms a galaxy such as has never before been placed before the American public.

We wish to draw particular attention to the numerous beautiful banknote Vignette portraits published by the Government in proof on large paper. These the Government no longer publishes for sale, and are most difficult to obtain. And we also wish to impress upon the public the importance of the great variety of lithographic portraits by Fenderich, Newsam, D'Avignon and Hoffy. These, the masters of the art, are represented in this collection by specimens of their very best work. Many are so finely executed that it is difficult to tell

them from choice Mezzotintos, and they are, as a rule, in the finest possible state.

The Lithographic Art is further represented by many interesting scenes in the lives of the presidents, campaign banners and memorial designs, which really represented the art of the period, and are the old familiar prints that fifty years ago were seen hanging on the walls of our country inns and in the homesteads of the worthy country people, and special attention should be called to the many campaign poster lithographs, they being valuable as historic material, both as to politics and arts, which could not be duplicated.

The catalogue has been thoroughly compiled, so as to give a correct rendition of the character and condition of the portraits enumerated. The reproduction of a few of the rarest items will give a correct idea of the value of the collection as a whole.

The most artistic and beautiful series of Portraits of the Presidents ever engraved.

A fine copy of this excessively rare portrait, with all the music. Baker only saw one impression, and this is the second impression which has come under my observation, and the only one with the music.

A contemporary drawing in red and black ink after the C. W. Peale portrait—a hole between the eyes. Curious.

PATER PATRIÆ. Bust in uniform, head three-quarters to Oval medallion, upon the shaft of a monument pyramidal in shape, surmounted with a funeral urn. The medallion is supported by Minerva, and Fame holds over it by her left hand a laurel wreath which encircles the title, held to her mouth a trumpet, from which hangs a banner inscribed "Trenton, Princeton, Monmouth, Yorktown." In a tablet upon the base, to which the Genius of America is pointing with averted head, the inscription in seven lines: "Sacred to the Memory of the truly Illustrious George Washington, Renowned in War, Great in the Senate, and possessed of every Qualification to render him worthy the Title of a GREAT and GOOD MAN." Upon the plinth, "Born Feb. 22, 1732, Ob. Dec. 14, 1790." In the right foreground a soldier, wearing a conical shaped hat, is expressing grief, his gun upon the ground. Two cherubs at the top of the shaft are draping the monument with laurel, a part of which hangs down over the left side of the medallion. The genii of War, Liberty, and Truth, with emblems, surround the shaft. (Head after Savage.) Line and stipple. Painted by John Coles Jun. Engd. by E. G. Gridley. (Boston, July 28, 1800.) Baker No. 403. Size 13 x 8 14-16.

One of three known copies. Undoubtedly, the Print Engraved by, and referred to by, Chas. Willson Peale in his Ms. note-book of 1778, as begun Oct. 16, finished and printed Nov. 15th & 16th, and which was advertised in the Pennsylvania Packet Nov. 21, 1778, as on sale by John Dunlap. It is the rarest of the Peale Portraits, and is a discovery of a very recent date. See reduced facsimile. Not in Baker or Carson.

22 LADY WASHINGTON. Three-quarter length, head slightly to right; resting on the right hand, the arm supported by Consul table to the left, over which is an open window exhibiting a view of a river and buildings; to the right two stone pillars. Messotinto. Size 11 12-16 x 9 12-16.

This is undoubtedly a companion print to the preceding Portrait. Engraved by Charles Willson Feale; and intended to be sold with it. Only three copies of it are known. These two portraits, as far as is known, are the only ones with the engraved title, the other two known copies having the title supplied with a pen. The pair form one of the remarkable features of this great collection. Not in Baker or Carson. See reduced facsimile.

Both prints are slightly trimmed on sides and top, which accounts for the difference in measurement. The portrait of Martha Washington is somewhat water-stained.

This pair of prints are of the greatest rarity, and "are the first portraits of Genl. Washington and Mrs. Washington executed by a professional engraver in America. The messotinto by Peale, advertised for sale in 1780, although the first in point of time, must be considered in a different light, as Peale was not a professional engraver, the plates he produced being often his own designs." (Baker.)
