The issue appears to have been unknown until the very late 19th Century. Haseltine had none in his famous "Type Table Sale" in 1881, nor did he mention it in the addenda to that sale. One specimen is known to have appeared in a Charles Steigerwalt Fixed Price List in the latter part of the last century, and the issue appeared at auction only twice prior to 1950: the specimen in the Chapmans' sale of the H.P. Smith Collection (June 29, 1906, lot 801), and that in the United States Coin Company's sale of part of the H.O. Granberg Collection (May 1915, lot 620, where it was called "Extremely Rare" but was not photographed). (SEE COLOR PLATE)

*To the best of our knowledge there are only six specimens known, at least two of them permanently off the market:*

- 1) A specimen in the Smithsonian Institution.
- 2) A specimen in the American Numismatic Society's collection, earlier from Morgan and Brock.
- 3) A specimen discovered by Osear G. Schilke in a New England estate. Reportedly sold to Art Kagin some 30 years ago.
- 4) The specimen in our James A. Stack Sale, March 13, 1975, lot 55; next appearing in the 1978 ANA Sale, lot 731; purchased by Stack's and sold to Reed Hawn.
- 5) **The present specimen.** From B. Max Mehl's Jerome Kern Sale, May 23, 1950, lot 1432; later owned by Art Kagin and sold by him to Q. David Bowers, who in turn sold it to the later consignee to Paramount's Century Sale, April 30, 1965, lot 872. It next appeared in our R.L. Miles Sale, April 10, 1969, lot 918; a private collection; our S.G. Steckler Sale, September 13, 1974, lot 39; a private collection; via Stack's to Ellis Robison; our Robison Sale, February 10, 1982, lot 1304; RARCOA's session of Auction '86, lot 597; most recently offered in Mid-American's sale of August 21, 1987, lot 332.
- 6) The Norweb specimen, sold in Bowers & Merena's Norweb Sale II, lot 1572, with no pedigree. We strongly suspect that this was the specimen in the United States Coin Company's 1915 sale of the H.O. Granberg collection mentioned above, passing to Virgil Brand, and reaching the Norwebs through one of the dealers involved in the dispersal of the Brand estate. To date, the present location of the H.P. Smith coin is uncertain. We suspect it may well be #5 above.

Copper blank, 31mm, with two concentric guide circles, one of normal Half Eagle diameter with a small "U" punched in at the edge; the other circle of 24mm diameter like the above named Judd patterns, with "UNITED STATES OF AMERICA" punched in around the perimeter, and "FIVE DOLLARS" at the bottom (thus eliminating Judd 1569 and Judd 1570, which have "FIVE DOL."). A similar example, on a larger planchet, may be seen in Appendix A of Judd, the "obverse" struck with the Judd 1570 obverse die. **Probably unique.**

The specimens in William Woodin's collection were illustrated by Edgar Adams in *The Numismatist*, August 1911, p.279. These pieces appear to have been part of an unofficial design contest for coins and medals which was held in 1896. The pieces are quite rare; we can only recall seeing three in the past decade or so.

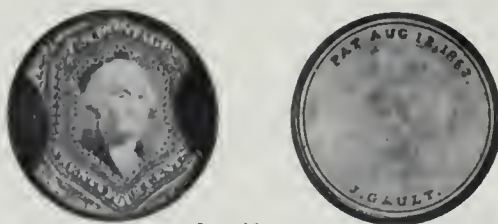

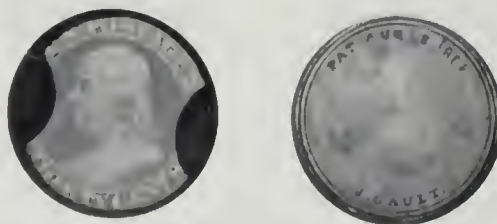

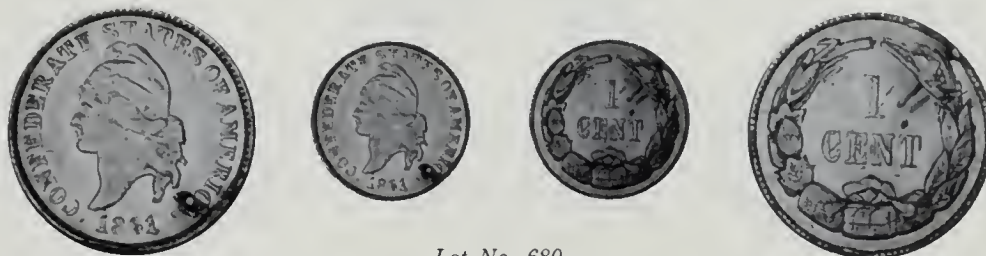

Almost exactly 100 grains (for comparison, the Stella weighs 108 grains). **Brilliant Proof**, a dent at the last A in AMERICA and some hairline obverse scratches; minor edge nicks. Rich yellow gold, deepening at the borders, fully mirrored surfaces. An **extreme rarity**, almost never available for purchase. In a custom lucite holder. (SEE COLOR PLATE)

*The background of this issue in gold was well related in Lester Merkin's catalogue of October 31, 1973, lot 457, where he was cataloguing a different specimen: "Designed by Robert Lovett, Jr., in Philadelphia for the Confederacy. After striking 12 pieces in copper-nickel, Lovett, fearing prosecution by the United States government, hid the coins and dies. According to the Red Book, Capt. J.W. Haseltine, Philadelphia coin dealer, later bought the cents and dies, striking seven pieces in gold, twelve in silver, and fifty-five in copper. However, quoting J.W. Haseltine from Confederate Currency and Stamps (1949) by Claud Fuller, and published by the Tennessee Division, Confederate Daughters of the Revolution, Haseltine states: "I purchased the dies from him (Lovett) and, as you all probably know, did not strike any in nickel (copper-nickel) considering them to a certain degree as originals, but we had three struck in gold, and I believe five in silver and fifty-five in copper, the die breaking on the fifty-ninth piece, which is in existence showing the break in the die."*

*When we sold a different specimen of the CSA Cent in gold in our 400th Sale (January, 1988, lot 538), we knew of four specimens in gold, including the present example. Further research during the past year has added to this information. We now know of six distinct specimens (of the 7 struck):*

- 1) Smithsonian Institution.
- 2) Eliasberg Collection, ex William F. Steinberg in 1948.
- 3) *The present specimen.* Its first recorded appearance was when it passed from Major Mackey of Jacksonville, Florida to Louis Moskovits of New Smyrna Beach, Florida, around 1934; next it appeared in the Brand-Lichtenfels Sale (Kreisberg and Schulman, March 18, 1964, lot 1107); Lester Merkin Sale (October 31, 1973, lot 457); Donald Groves Collection (Stack's, November 12, 1974, lot 467); Ellis Robison Collection (Stack's, February 2, 1979, lot 325); Bowers & Ruddy Sale (September 21, 1982, lot 2013). This marks the third time we have auctioned it!
- 4) The specimen in our 400th Sale, lot 538.
- 5) The Farouk Specimen, sold as lot 335 in the 1954 sale of the Farouk Collection; C. Ramsey Bartlett; lot 992 in our February, 1966 sale of his collection.
- 6) The Judson Brenner specimen, exhibited by him in the 1914 ANS Exhibition, where it was photographed, and again shown in the 1916 ANA Convention exhibit. From photos, it is not the same as any of the above coins.

*The first recorded appearance at auction of any specimen in gold seems to have been in H.P. Smith's sale of July 27, 1882. A specimen, possibly the same coin, was offered in W. Elliott Woodward's auction of January 21, 1889. These could be any of the above coins.*

The coin was tested with a scanning electron microscope equipped with an EDAX for elemental surface analysis; the surface read pure silver. Calibrated Alpha source X-ray analysis was performed using both Cadmium 109 and Americium 241. The results showed that the coin was 92+% gold, with alloy elements of copper, silver, and lead in the 2%-3% range each. It has the right amount of gold for a normal mint product.

- 735 1808 Breen 4-B. Extremely Fine, a hairline through the chin and neck, and another behind the head. The weight is 8.73+ grams (against 8.75 standard), consistent with wear. 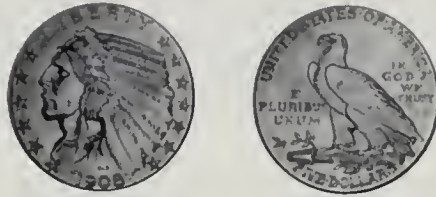

*The only possible conclusion regarding strike sequence is that the first issue of 1799 Br.5-G took place before the reverse die cracked; then the 1800 Br.1-A pieces were struck, the reverse initially unbroken, with both dies developing cracks progressively; after the 1800 obverse die failed completely, the old 1799 Br.5 obverse die was pressed back into service to allow the Mint to fill an order for Eagles late in the year. Finally, the reverse was again used for the first issue of 1801 Br.1-A, an R-7 issue as both dies failed quickly.*

*The most probable period for production of the 1800-dated Eagles involved the mint deliveries of July 15 and 26, and perhaps part of the delivery of September 4; the 5,999 pieces delivered in November would certainly have been dated 1799, and we suspect that at least a part of the September delivery was also made with the 1799 obverse. This distribution would leave the mintage of 1800-dated pieces at about 6,000, and the total of 1799-dated pieces around 37,500.*

**The present coin is the only specimen we have ever heard of with a completely unbroken reverse!**

*The dies for this piece were engraved in or around June of 1792, in the carriage-house "mint" of John Harper (where they were also struck, since the U.S. Mint did not have any coining presses until the Fall of the year). The die cutter was probably William Russell Birch from England, and the obverse design was derived directly from his earlier white metal "GWpt" version of the Birch Cent. The initial striking took place by July 13 since Thomas Jefferson on that date recorded the receipt of 1,500 specimens.*

*The Half Dismes of 1792 were not Patterns, but an actual circulating coinage, released largely to Jefferson though Washington himself undoubtedly distributed some to friends. Most were probably released through one or another of the major banks, and the extent of their circulation is indicated by the extensive degree of wear on most specimens. It is suspected that a further striking of the coins - after the July 13th delivery of 1,500 pieces - may have taken place in the U.S. Mint itself in the Fall of 1792; this second striking probably amounted to fewer than 500 pieces.*

*All the 1792 Half Dismes were struck on "medal axis," i.e. with the reverse rotated 180 degrees relative to one of our present coins. This was the standard die alignment in England for the silver coins of George III from 1787 until after 1800. This die alignment explains the persistent weakness of the "A" in HALF and the "M" in DISME: those two letters were directly opposite the high points of the shoulder and the bust when struck.*

*The 1792 Half Disme is generally conceded to be the first issue of the U.S. Mint in Philadelphia. It was designed and engraved by William Russell Birch and, as numismatic tradition would have it, was minted from the silver from George Washington's own personal silverware. Over the years it has also become part of numismatic lore that the figure of Liberty is actually a portrait of Martha Washington. Only 1,500-2,000 specimens were struck and most surviving pieces are well worn; G-VG is typical and specimens are very rare. (SEE COLOR PLATE)*

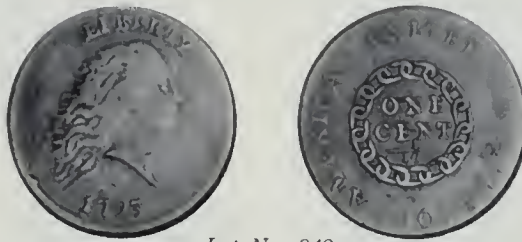

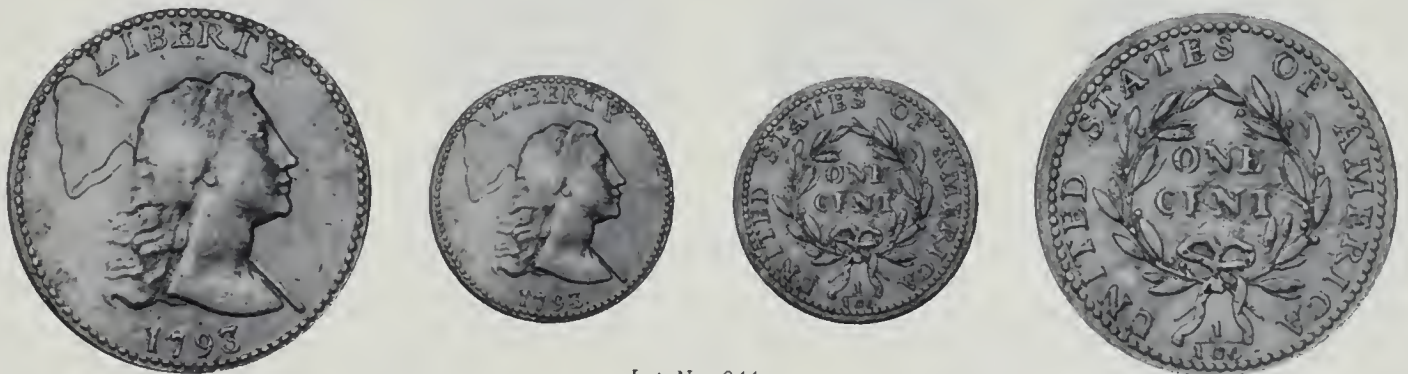

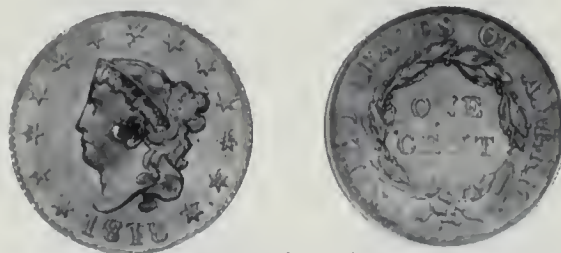
