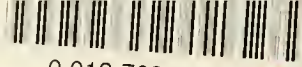

armed organization, first known as "The University Light Infantry" and later as "The University Light Artillery." Graduates sprang to arms on the outbreak of strife—on both sides, for the University had many Southern students; young men left her classes to join the fighting ranks; some were graduated prematurely to allow them to go; others awaited graduation, or until they should be old enough, and then went. It is believed that when the lists have been completed, so far as may be, it will be found that more Pennsylvania men were "in the War" than from any other institution of learning in the United States. There are included a few who came back to their studies, or matriculated freshly, after the War closed.

The list now presented is of those who were matriculates of the Department of Arts; those of Law and Medicine will follow in subsequent issues of the REGISTER.

It is related that at the battle of Turkey Bend, Va., a ball struck and wounded Gen. Meade. Dr. Stocker, who was close at hand, reached the General as he fell. Placing him on his horse he carried him to a place of safety, despite the protestations of the wounded officer, who wanted to be



left there, so great was the pain he suffered. Ever after that Gen. Meade credited Dr. Stocker with having saved his life. At the battle of City Cross Roads, Va., Dr. Stocker was wounded, but in a few weeks he was again in the field.

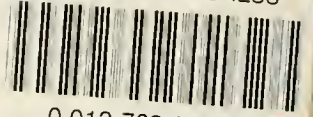
