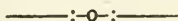

INHABITANTS OF LYNDON AND THE
SURROUNDING COUNTRY.



A list of, and short history of about 1800 men, women and children who live, or have lived during the years 1895-96 and '97, according to the assessor's returns, in Lyndon, or in Valley Brook township, Osage Co., Kan., or so close in adjoining townships that they in many cases trade and get their mail at Lyndon. And in other cases the names of some are given who belong to the numerous orders and have fellowship with Lyndon societies. In all cases where anyone's name is given, that lives out of the township, that fact is stated.

In giving distances and directions of farmers locations from Lyndon, I do not claim to be exact. This is only intended to be a help in locating a person so that with little inquiry they may be found, providing they are not like the Irishman's flea, here and there and everywhere, as some of the tenant farmers are year in and year out.

The ages of heads of families and in some cases ages of children or of grandparents are given; but the author does not claim them to be accurate as they are drawn from the assessor's rolls where frequent mistakes in copying are made, or in some cases from guesses made by second parties who may miss by ten or twenty years, so that I do not want to have trouble with any man for calling him a widower of forty who is yet a young man of twenty-five. By my giving the ages, I do not think it will hinder any from getting married neither will it keep them from living to a greater age. While on the contrary it makes the history of the present two or three generations: viz, grand-parent, child, and grandchild the more complete in a historical and genealogical point of view.

I have not in any case mentioned politics and only in few cases reference is made to what church a man belongs. If an old soldier, I have tried to remember and so state it. In many cases that tells the state from which a man originally came. In other cases by inquiry, or from my own knowledge, I have tried to tell the reader the native state:—The assessor's returns do not show this.

No effort has been made to tell about the lands, houses, monies, and worldly goods that these people possess. "The cattle on a thousand hills are mine, saith the Lord", so that in ten, twenty, or forty years from now, some of these

families that are now tenants will be the landlords and bankers of our community. And the rich men's sons and daughters of the present day will have their inheritance all spent and be inmates of some of our almshouses or be dead heading their way on electric railways to the Klondike. There will be no more Indian Reservations for them to squat on and lay claim to nice 160 acre farms as we did here at \$1.50 per acre, but all shall come to one common inheritance, a grave 3 by 6 for our dust, and the spirit to God who gave it. So let us look to it carefully that we lay up the right kind of riches and get titles to mansions in the skies.

The preparation of this list of names has cost weeks of labor on the part of the author and I now submit it to you with the desire that errors shall be overlooked and that whatever in it is good may meet with your approval.

Armstrong, William J. age 43,
resides in district 27, three and one

Keenan farm at North Lyndon. He
sold out to his older brother, James
Armstrong who had several Loys.
James in turn sold to Elisha Jame-
son and returned to Pa. Mrs. Wm.
Armstrong was Eva Richey, sister of
Mrs. Joseph Francis and aunt to Mrs.
Henry Gehring, of Lyndon. She died
near Vassar, Nov., 1892. Children,
Elmer 21, Jimmie 15, John 10,
Two more children lie buried in the
Lyndon cemetery. Mr. Armstrong
and his boys have bached for five
years.

Alexander, Mrs. Sarepta D. 67,
widow of Rev. S. Alexander. Resides
in Lyndon. They are from Pa. and
Mr. Alexander was for many years
pastor of the United Presbyterian
church in Lyndon. 3 Children.

Alexander, Charles 27,
A photographer, home with mother.
Alice. manages the household.
Rilla, who is Mrs. Sigel Gill.

Alexander, Carter S. aged 44,
a commercial traveler, on the road
away from home. His wife, Mrs.
Martha A., and a family of 5 children
lived here a couple of seasons 1895 '96
in the Coon house and in the
country on C. R. Green's old place.
Relatives of Mr. and Mrs. Dazey.

Adams, Jabez 55,
ex-superintendent of public instruc-
tion.

A teacher of the county, owns a res-
idence in Lyndon but is a single man.
Also owns a farm in Lincoln twp.
where he stops considerable. A na-
tive of Ind., removing to Warsaw,
Mo., seven years before the war.
Served as a soldier in the 27th, Mo.
Vol. Inf.

Adams, J. H. age 27,
A county teacher who married Lola
Watson. Lived in Lyndon, now in
Ottawa, where he is principal of
one of the ward schools. Nephew
of Jabez A.—. One child.

Austact, Fred age 34,
and wife M. L. Austact reside three
miles west of Lyndon on the old
Laughridge farm. No children.

Abrams, James age 36,
Lives in town, a farmer, wife, Lydia
Abrams. 4 children:—
Bertha, about 12, Stella, Nel-
lie and William.

Anderson, W. J. age 37,
lived in town 1895.

Allen, D. J. 31, and wife A. K.
Live in Lyndon. Did work on the
Mo. Pacific R. R.

Antrim, George 46,
lives $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south of Lyndon.
Wife, Julia, sister of Will Boden-
hammer. Came to Miami Co., 1875
from Ill. Moved here and bought
out Harvey Riggs in 1878. 4 child-
ren alive.

Charlie, Frank, Edward and
Bertha.

Charlie and Frank are young men.

Athon, N. Dean 24, wife, Julia.
Live five miles east of Lyndon on
the old Elias Clark 80. One child
two years old.

Athon, A. W 26.
A brother who had lived with Dean
a year or so helping to farm.

Athon, Hallie 25.
A sister who seems to stop with
them some.

The Athons seem to have lived in
Agency twp. and some yet get their
mail at Quenemo.

Bradford, Moses 80, wife, Eliza,
Live in Lyndon. Mr. B— has a
very interesting narrative, pages 44-
48. A native of Ohio. He raised a
large family by a previous wife but
his family all live elsewhere. Child-
ren by his present wife:—

Mary E., now Mrs. Sam John-
son, of Lyndon.

Corwin C. Bradford 22, a son,
working for Henry Howell.

By a former husband Mrs. Bradford
has a daughter, Miss Clara Crumley,
who makes her home with her
mother, although working much of
the time in Ottawa.

Bickell, H. T. N. 37, wife, Jane.
Live 2 miles N. E. of Lyndon.
Farms Oll Deaver's land. Will live
on the Gill place near North Lyndon,
1898. Two children.

Barnes, Jerome age 55,

A. Barnes; dau., J. A. Barnes;
son, Martin Barnes.
Moved into town from Nebraska
two or three years since. Barnes
and Cline, blacksmiths, 1896, were
part of the same family.

Barnes, John 55, wife, Sophia H.
6 children:—
Harry S., Lulu, Grace, Bessie,
Vernie and Goldie.
Mr. Barnes was a soldier in Co. A,
187 O. V. I. and has been post-
master of Lyndon eight years.

Basel, John 38, wife, C— A.
Live four miles east of Lyndon on
the old Gough place. 4 children,
names unknown.

Bailey, C. A. 55, wife, Fanny J.
Live in Lyndon. Partner in the
Bailey and Gray grocery store.
4 children:—
Elmer, Blanche A., Grace E.,
and Beula May.

Bailey, Elmer Ellsworth 23,
wife, Carrie.
Runs the Bailey farm on the Dra-
goon, in Fairfax twp., where Mr. C.
A. Bailey and father settled in 1872.
Blanche A. is a graduate of the
Lyndon High School, 1896.
Mr. Bailey was a second cousin of
Judge L. D. Bailey's. From N. H.,
1869 to Douglas County.

Bailey, Cyrus N. age 44,
wife, Cornelia M.
Live 2½ miles north of Lyndon.
2 children:—

Eva May 16, and Lynn.
From N. H. Mrs. Margaret Hall,
Mrs. Bailey's mother, lives with
them. She is the widow of B. W.
Hall, who has died since '95. Mr.
Bailey came here from Douglas Co.
about 1882 and is related to Judge
L. D. Bailey, one of the founders
of Lyndon.

Bailey, Wells P. 70, wife, Julia.
Bailey lives 2¼ miles east of Lyndon.
3 children alive. Mr Bailey is
an old pioneer in Iowa and Kansas.
His wife was a Pryer, another pio-
neer family of Lyndon and they
have just celebrated their golden
wedding, Feb. 7, '98. His history is
very interesting and will be given
in another volume.

Nellie,—Mrs. J. Rynearson,

Bailey, Eugene 40,
m. Nora Whinrey three years since
and lived on farm with his father un-
til 1897, when on account of Jean's

Lived near Lyndon up to '97, re-
moved to near Topeka. Farmers.

Bristow, Joseph 26, and wife (—).
Live in Lyndon. Son of J. L. B—.

Barnard, W. A. 45, wife, E. J.
Live seven miles S. E. of Lyndon.
2 children; boy aged 15, girl aged 14.

- Burnett, Lucas 76,
 wife, Lavina. Live two miles N. W.
 of Lyndon. Mr. Burnett was born
 in Mass. and identified himself with
 Kansas in its beginning. He is an
 old plainsman of 1848. He married
 Sarah Ward and settled down in
 Johnson Co. about 1860. After the
 birth of her seventh boy, she died
 at Black Jack 1878, soon after which
 time he moved to this place.
 7 boys.

 Lives in Junction twp. with his
 brother Arthur.
- Burnett, David W. 34, married,
 lives at (—), Montana.
- Burnett, George A. 32, wife A. E.
 live three miles west of Lyndon.

 Weber's farm three miles south of
 Lyndon. 2 children. BLANCHE is
 the oldest.
- Brecheisen, C. Henry age 33,
 and wife, ANNA E., live $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles
 east of Lyndon on the old Harold
 place. 6 children.
- Brcheisen, Ed E. age 29,
 and wife, J—. A., live six miles N.
 E. of Lyndon in dist. 68.
 Mother, Mrs. Wilhelmina Brecheisen
 lives with them. 4 children. The
 farm on which they live, John
 Barnes settled on in 1872 when he
 came into the country.
- Brittain, W. D. 62, wife, Maggie.
 Live in Lyndon. They came here
 from Pa. about 1884. 7 children.
 Mrs. Mary McKean,
 who lives near Lyndon, is a dau.
- Brittain, J. Ross 30, and sister
 Hannah,
 live on their farm 4 miles N. E. of
 Lyndon.
- Emmet, Bertha and Harry
 live at home. Bertha is a graduate
 of the Class of '95.
 Mr. W. D. Brittain and son Emmet
 run one of G. W. Morris's farms, the
 old Hooper place, besides farming
 some for themselves.
- Baker, C. 58, a German
 who owns the 80 on which the
 Knouff dist. cemetery is located
 about 6 miles east of Lyndon in
 Valley Brook twp. There are five
 children. He is separated from his
 wife, she taking two of the children
 and leaving home.

Blackwell, James F. 75,
wife, LOUISA. born in Breckenridge
Co., Ky. Removed when 12 years
old with his parents and brothers to
Orange Co., Ind. m. there and some
of the children born there. 1865 re-
moved to Ill. 1876 removed to Po-
mona, Kan. 1877 removed to Lyn-
don where he followed his trade of
blacksmithing many years.
5 children;—

KITTIE MINERVA m. JOHN CROW but
is separated; lives in Herrington,
Kan. 3 children.

CHARLES C. 37, wife NELLIE. Lives
in Melvern where he works as a
blacksmith. 2 boys.

Blackwell, John A. 34,
wife FLORENCE. 2 children, Zula 13
and Du-tt 10. Keeps a barber shop
in Lyndon.

LULU B.—Mrs. Arthur Gilbert, Crip-
ple Creek, Col. 2 children, Ed and
Harry.

MAY B., single. at home, also a
grandchild John Crow lives with
Mr. Blackwell.

Blackwell, Cyrus W. 71,
his wife, MARY ANN died Jan. 13,
1897. since which time Mr. Black-
well has lived with his daughters in
the Richview neighborhood, Mel-
vern twp. 6 miles south of Lyndon.
He came to Kan. from Ind. in 1887.
Three of his children, viz. MRS.
MARY JANE STARR, MRS. CALISTA
E PATTERSON, and MRS. ANN
RICHARDSON lived in Richview, and
his brothers, James F. and John S.
had lived in Lyndon 11 years when
he came here.

Besides the three children mentioned
above he has a daughter Dora m. to
Geo. Weber Jr. of Lyndon and two
sons here.

Blackwell, James N. 40,
wife, JENNIE. One girl Violet; live
on the Lindsay farm, Richview
neighborhood.

Blackwell, Franklin A. 21,
working for Mr. Dawson in Olivet
twp. Single
There are other older children of
Mr. C. W. Blackwell's in Ind.

Blackwell, John S. 58,
a widower; brother to James and
Cyrus. Lives with Tom Williams in
Lyndon. His family of six children
are all grown and living in Lawrence
Co., Ind.

Ball, Miss Sarah 76.
Her home is with the Richardson's
to whom she is related. Miss Ball
came to this country with the Hills
in an early day, from Medina Co.,
Ohio, and is one of Osage County's
old teachers. Of late years she has
lost her sight, and for 8 or 10 years
has been a resident mostly of Lyndon.

Blake, Alex 78, wife, Mary H.
Have their home in Lyndon, though
spending the winters with some of
their children

Judge Blake, who had the distinc-
tion of serving four consecutive
terms here as Probate Judge, yet
keeps out his sign of Councilor at

Broder Broderson and family of 5 children and old Mrs. Broderson all removed to Atlanta, Cowley Co., Kan. Jacob Broderson lives in Ottawa. Two more of the Brodersons live in Topeka.
Andrew has been living a few years on Mrs. Andrew Hanson's place, but will remove the spring of 1893 to his farm, 4 miles S. E. of Lyndon near Anker Johnson's. 3 children. Harry 13, Anthon and Wilhe.

Beighley, Wm. 71,
live 3½ miles S. W. of Lyndon. His dau., Mrs. ALMEDA DUNCAN, keeps house for him.
The Beighley family moved here from Pa. about 1881-84. Mrs. FRANK WOLF, living near is a daughter. Also the two sons DAVID and SIDNEY who are for themselves and have families. Stephen living near Michigan Valley, Junction twp. and having 2 children, Russell 7 and Minnie.

Beighley, David 36, wife, Kate.
Live 6 miles S. W. of Lyndon in Olivet twp. 5 children:—
EMMA E. 11, JULIA, LULU M., HARRY I., and JAMES F.

Baum, C. S. 35, wife, Jennie,
were Lyndon residents 1895.

Bryant, C. C. 51,
unknown to me, lived in Lyndon '95

Bair, Wm. A. 48, wife, Rachel,
live on the Eljah H-d-e farm 4 miles S. E. of Lyndon. Came from Pa. about 1883, to near Lyndon. Moved thence to Scranton and in 1897 to present location. Relatives of Mr. Widney's. 5 children:—
J. Frank 22, William A. 20, L. Blanche, Elmer A., and Howard C.

Buck, Nathaniel Y. age 56,
wife, Elizabeth, live in Lyndon. Mr. Buck is the city Marshall. He is an old soldier of 40th Ind. Inf. ELVA BUCK, recently married to Henry Peterson, of this twp. is a dau. Son, MELIN BUCK, a young man. Mr. Bucks also raised Charlie McElwee who works around.

Buck, Aaron M. age 53,
m. Mrs. OSBORNE in 1896. She had 5 children by former marriages and they have a young Buck in the family now.

Banta, A. M. age 78,
and wife HANNAH live in Lyndon. Mr. Banta is a smart active man for his age. GEO. BANTA 36, lives at home. Mrs. WRIGHT and Mrs. IRVINE of Topeka are daughters.

Beard, John 32, wife, C.—. H.
Was until recently a merchant of Lyndon. He has now removed to Olathe. His wife is a dau. of N. J. Roy of this place. 4 children.

Bellows, C. S. 74, wife, H. A. J.
Moved here from Douglas Co. to be near their dau., Mrs. OSCAR BELL. Mr. Bellows was a soldier in Co. A. 106 Ill. Inf. ROSE BELLOWS, a teacher of the county is a dau. living at home.

Burkdoll, Stephen age 64,
and wife, PHEBE. B. live east of
Lyndon 2½ miles. They are of the
early settlers, with three married
children living on the Burkdoll farm
of 400 acres more or less.
FRANK, MAGGIE now MRS. SIPES,
and JOHN.

Burkdoll, Frank P. age 42,
and wife, ERMINDA, and family of
4 children. Live ¼ mile east of
his father's.
R. HOVEY 15, BESSIE MAY 9, SADIE
VESTA and OLIVER CLAYTON.

Burkdoll, John age 38,
and wife OLLIE and 3 children.
Live ½ mile north of his father's
on the road east from Lyndon.

Bell, Oscar 30, wife, Ida May.
Live 2½ miles S. W. of Lyndon.
3 children:—
DELLA A. 8 yrs., SUSANNA 6 and
HENRY 2. Mrs. Herbert Goodman
and Mrs. James Kennedy are sisters
of Mr. Oscar Bell's.

Bell, F. M. 56, wife, Sarah,
moved to Lyndon 1896, from An-
derson Co. Son-in-law of J. M.
Carson. No children.

Bryson, Daniel W. 49,
wife, SARAH R. Live in Lyndon.
Nursery agent, repairer of sewing
machines etc.
Came from N. C. to Humbolt Co.,
Kan, 1868. To Quenemo, 1887. To
Lyndon 1893. 4 children; all girls.
FLORENCE E.—MRS. W. H. GRAHAM,
Miller, P. O., Osage Co. 1 child.
JOSIE J. 16, ANNA and CARRIE L.
live at home.

Bessee, Benj. F. age 66,
wife and family live several miles
N. W. of Lyndon in Fairfax twp.
His son, CHARLES W. B. age 33,
has been clerking for Horace Clark,
Lyndon. A son J. BESSEE 31, and
dau. ELLA E. live at home. Mr.
Benj. Bessee was a soldier in Co. B.
75 Ill. Inf't.

Bowers, Solomon age 62,
was away at Salt Lake City with
his wife JULIA when the assessor
took the names; since which time
Mrs. Bowers died, Mar. 23, 1897.
Mr. Bowers brought the remains
home for burial in the Lyndon cem-
etery. He makes it his home here
although he travels and visits among
his friends considerable. He is an
old soldier of Co. H 2nd. Iowa Cav.
and one of the oldest settlers on the
Sac and Fox Reserve. See his nar-
rative page 116.

Barrett, Mrs. S. F. age 53,
widow of E. A. BARRETT, one of
Lyndon's founders. Resides here
sometimes and again at Kansas City.
Her son, WM. A. BARRETT, is agent
for a Kansas City firm in selling
organs, pianos etc. in Kansas.

Bedwell, C. S. 42, wife, M. E.
moved here from Iowa in recent
years. Living in Lyndon. A stock
buyer. No children.

Buckman, J. H. 52, wife, Lida E.
Live in Lyndon. Ex county clerk.
An old soldier of the 73rd Ill. Inf't.
Business, Real Estate, Loan and
Insurance,—Buckman and Hussey.
One boy ROY, a young man.

There are three distinct families of Browns here around Lyndon not related. Capt. Geo. W. Brown, of Scranton. Newton A. Brown, of Lyndon. Samuel F. Brown, or as generally known, "Doc" Brown, 4 miles west of Lyndon, and Mrs. Elizabeth Brown Oard, Vassar, constitute one Brown family who came into this country in an early day from Ind. Only one of these Browns strictly speaking, belong to the list of Lyndon people.

Brown, Newton A. 61,
wife ELIZA A. Came from Ind. in 1832. Settled near Lyndon. 5 children alive, who all live in this county.

Brown, Edgar E. 34,
m. now has 2 children. Lives now near Olivet; will move to Lyndon the spring of '98.

ELIZABETH A. m. Henry Brecheisen. Lives 4 miles east of Lyndon.

CORA M. Vinton Myrick. Lives east of Vassar. 4 children, 3 boys, 1 girl.

Brown, Jesse R. 25,
wife Minnie. Live in Lyndon. One boy Leo, 3 yrs. old.

DORA BROWN lives with her father Newton A. in Lyndon

The second family of Browns live at Riverview, Melvern twp. MRS O. C. WILLIAMS, CARTER and WILL BROWN constitute that family so far as I know.

WILL BROWN 27, unmarried lives with his sister Mrs. O. C. Williams.

CARTER BROWN. whose P. O. is Melvern, has 5 children.

Ellis 16, Addie 14, Edwin 11, a boy and girl, twins.

Brown, Robert 49, wife Mary.
Live in Fairfax twp. 6 miles N. W

of Lyndon, dist 66, Lyndon P. O. Not related to the other Browns.

Black, Samuel 65,

wife, MISSOURI L. Mr. Black settled the first white man in this part of the Sac and Fox Reserve, 1865, 1½ miles from Lyndon. See his history page 9. Nesbitt, Nelson 30, wf., Katie. 3 children. Lived 4 miles N. W. of Lyndon near Wm. Wilson's. Removed 1897 either back to Princeton, Franklin Co., their former home, or to Colorado.

Newell, John H. 44, wf., Mollie. Proprietor of the Lyndon jewelry store located in Whitman's. From Ill. 1885 to Williamsburg, thence to Lyndon 1896. One girl, ALMA 17.

NICOLAY.—JOHN JACOB NICOLAY, (brother of J. G. Nicolay who was private secy. of Pres. Lincoln), and family of wife and several children, came to Osage Co. Oct., 1866, and located on a fine tract of 850 acres on the Dragon bottoms, several miles N. W. of Lyndon. When the Sac and Fox Trust lands were offered for sale, it is said that John G. Nicolay was able to secure under a sealed bid, this fine tract for his

brother at 30cts. per acre. Four of the sons of J. J. Nicolay still own farms and live on the tract; viz,—GEO. H. and JACOB E. NICOLAY, who have families and get their mail at Lyndon; COLUMBUS E. and JOHN F., who live more convenient to and get their mail at Scranton. C. S. Martin, in an Osage City paper, says that when he preached Jacob J. Nicolay's funeral sermon 1891, there were 9 children, 36 grand-children, and 1 great-grand-child present. Being the entire family besides four sons-in-law and four daughters-in-law. Mr. Martin further says to date 1897 since 1869, he has married 7 of the Nicolays. There is only one that is well known to me: viz,—

Nicolay, James W. 50, wife, CAROLINE N. Live in Lyndon. He is the eldest of the family and was about 19 years old when they came from Ill., recollecting the early events here very well. He helped Sile Hill to build his log house down on his claim on Salt Creek, near Lyndon, in 1868. Mr. J. W. Nicolay traded his farm, in 1895, for Gehring's stock of mdse.; but the enterprise was a failure, Mr. Gehring being the only one who made anything. Nelson, Frank M. 50, w. Alice M. Osage Co. Treas. 1894-'95, residing in Lyndon at present but will remove to their Burlingame home after the expiration of his term in Oct. Born

in Warren Co., Ohio. Came to Burlingame in 1871. Engaged in stock business first year. Afterwards 15 years Cashier of the Burlingame Bank and 8 years in the Mercantile business. Married a dau. of Rev. V. M. King, who used to live there and is a well known Presbyterian minister, residing in Emporia. Mrs. (—) Lord, of Burlingame, is a sister to Mrs. Nelson. 3 children:—VICTOR C. 21, who is studying dentistry in Kansas City, Mo.

ADELINE H., a student of the Emporia College.

HAYDEN F. at home.

Nelson, George 52, wife, Mary. A Dane. Lives 3 miles S. E. of Lyndon. They have 7 children:—GEORGE, SADIE, ADDIE, JOHN, FLORENCE, EDWARD, and CHARLIE. George, the eldest son, about 25 yrs. of age, has been away in Ill. 2 or 3 years. The rest are at home.

Nelson, Rasmus 50, a person who was at Geo. Nelson's in '97, or, in that district.

Nelson, Peter 33. Some one living in Valley Brook twp. 1895.

Norris, Edward 80, wf., Eliza A. Live in Lyndon. He is an old settler and has three pp. of interesting reminiscences beginning on p. 92. Mrs. BODINE, Mr. Norris's only dau., lives at Pomona Calif. There is a son back in Iowa from which place Mr. Norris moved. Mr. Norris is an Englishman.

Mr. Nielson is a Dane and came here among the first settlers.

Nielson, P. 34, of Melvern.

Single man who worked for and lived with Carl Feich 1895 and has been in this vicinity since.

Neeley, Frank 44, wf., Amelia, and several children, some grown, lived on John Keenan's farm near Gregory school house, 1897; removed.

Naylor, Roy E. 62,

wife, GEORGIA D. Did live in Valley Brook until '96, when they sold out to Mr. J. H. Harper and removed to Superior twp., about 5 miles west, 1 mile south of Lyndon. They had several children well known to Lyndon people. JOHN, THOMAS S. 31, MARY, who is Mrs. John Humbert, of Topeka. CHARLIE, HURON, NORA, and ROY.

Tom and Roy are the only ones at home. Nora lives not far away. They are Ohio people; 12, or 15, yrs. in Kansas.

Later,—Nora, m. Elmer L. Miller 1897 and Mar., 1898, they removed to a home just south of Hunnewell, Kan. in Oklahoma.

The Junior member of the firm, Olcott Bros. One child, MARIE.

Mrs. May Patterson, of the city, is one of the Olcott sisters.

Overfelt, Henry 39, wf., Lillian.

Engineer of the flouring mill. A native of Kansas. Been in Lyndon 5 yrs. 7 children:—MINNIE 15, OLLIE, a boy of 13; LEODA, RALPH, ZODA, STELLA and ARTHUR, the baby.

OARD—There are two families, living in the neighborhood of Vassar. The brothers came in an early day from Ind. and both died between '90 and '93.

widow of G. W. Oard, an old soldier of the 83rd Ind. Inf't. Lives on their farm about 1 mile S. W. of Vassar. R. B. OARD 25, runs the farm.

L. T. Dazey. They moved into Lyn-
don 1897 from the Richview neigh-
borhood, Melvern twp.

Pryer, Julius and brother,
Henry Pryer,
pre-empted the qr. one-half mile
east of Lyndon, upon which in later
years Dwaine Tiffany lived, and
where Jas. Hodgen and Mrs. Katie

Kelley now have their two homes. The Pryer family originally came from New York. I cannot tell where some of the Pryer girls married their husbands, nor the proper order of their places in their family. The children's names, I believe, were,—**JULIUS PRYER**, who is living in Ia. and has a family.

LAVONA PRYER, who in recent years m. Capt. Milton Whirey, of Lyndon, and lives at Passaic, Kearney County.

And last, the youngest of the family, **MATTIE PRYER**, who m. E. D. Tiffany, 1889, and has always lived around Lyndon.

Peterson, Peter 50, wf., Susana.

Live in Junction twp., less than one mile N. E. of Vassar which is their P. O. He enjoys the distinction of living in almost the one locality 40 years. His father, Peter Peterson, and 6 boys all born in Sweden; settled on the government lands of this county north of the Sac and Fox Reserve in 1858. Mr. Peterson has filled the office of county Treasurer to the satisfaction of everybody. He does a good deal of business with our Lyndon merchants and machinists and his dau.

Anna is a member of one of our Lyndon churches and works in the Treasurer's office in busy times.

Peterson, Andrew 42,

wife, **MARY**. Their place adjoins Hans, and Loren's and comes out on to both roads, their house being on the north and south road.

3 children:—**ELLA** 13, **ANNA** and **EDNA**. **LOUIS RIGGS** 22, also lives with them.

Painter, George 84, wf., M—, A. was born in West Moreland Co., Pa. about April 19, 1814. Was m. at McComb, Ill., whence he removed about 1878 to Council Grove, Kan., and thence to Lyndon, Kan., about 1896. He served in the war in Co. I, 78th Ill. Vol. Inf. and is the oldest veteran in Lyndon. They have 3 children:—JOHN A. PAINTER, a stock man living near Omaha, NEB. DR. D. YATES PAINTER, of Council Grove, and CATHARINE LUCY, now Mrs. W. R. Leigh, of Lyndon.

Comrade Painter gets a pension of \$24.00 per m. He and his wife and Mrs. Leigh and her children all live together in the old Fairbanks property. The infirmities of advanced years confine him to the house now.

Powell, Lemuel W. 54, wife, EVA M. Live in Olivet twp., 10 miles S. W. of Lyndon. P. O. Osage City. Was a soldier of Co. G, 116th O. V. I., and is a member of the Lyndon G. A. R. Post. Mr. Powell came from Meigs Co., Ohio to Olivet in 1870 with his family. His first wife died about 1878 or '79, leaving him two boys:—CHARLES POWELL, who is single and living in Wyoming; and EDGAR POWELL, 24, a graduate of the state Agricultural college at Manhattan, at present at home. Mr. Powell m. for his second wife, Miss Eva M. Tweed, dau. of Ellis Tweed, from Ripley, Ohio. He came in an early day with a family of several daus. and settled in Agency twp. Pleasant, Robert D. 65, wife, SARAH J. Live in Lyndon. They are the parents of the Pleasants known to Lyndon people. There are 7 children, 5 of which live in Osage Co. Mr. Pleasant was from Crawford Co., Ind. originally. Settled near Pomona, Kan., in 1879.

J. M. and W. B., the eldest of the children are mentioned below.

CORA married J. Shuster and settled north of Quenemo many years ago. 3 children.

ANNA is Mrs. Benj. Tomberlin who removed from Lyndon to Ottawa a couple of yrs. back.

WALTER PLEASANT was one of our Osage Co. teachers. He m. a Miss May Whitebread, of Franklin Co.; dau. of one of Lyndon's earliest settlers. They live at Ottawa where Mr. Pleasant is practicing law.

ALTA PLEASANT was also a teacher of this Co., but went to Calif. and m. a merchant of San Jose, by name of W. H. Mossman.

GEORGE W. PLEASANT, the youngest of the family, went back to Ind. of late years.

Mr. R. D. Pleasant removed from Pomona to Lyndon, fall of 1895.

ATTENTION, READER.

It is more than three years since we printed the preceding pages of this "Historical-Genealogical Directory" of people around Lyndon. We cannot very well revise what has been printed. When we get through the alphabet, if space permits, we will make corrections of the first. From this page we will try to bring the matter up to the 1900 assessor's returns.
