After lunch some of the party proceeded up the creek, where several species of birds were observed. From here we went to the Botanical Gardens in the East Bay Regional Park, where most of the members dispersed. A pleasant day was enjoyed by all.

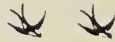

**April Meeting:** The 307th meeting was held on the 8th in the Assembly Room of the San Francisco Public Library, President Mrs Harold C. Austin presiding.

Dr. Alden H. Miller, Director of the Museum of Vertebrate Zoology, University of California, gave a most interesting and instructive account of "Social Parasitism Among Birds". The Cowbird, our local example of such behavior, is constantly increasing and extending its range in California. In the southern part of the state it particularly parasitises the Least Vireo. It is a surprising fact that the Cowbird slips into its victim's nest, lays an egg, and is off again in thirty seconds. Besides the cowbirds of various species, certain cuckoos, honey guides and a few other foreign birds have similar habits. Ducks are not too particular about laying eggs in their own nests.
