



The immense growth of our Canna Business during the last few years has been so great that we have put up a winter storage house with a capacity of 150,000 Clumps, thus enabling us to keep the roots in best condition. Cannas should be planted in good, rich garden soil, mixed with half of old, rotten stable manure. Water sparingly for first two weeks after planting. When growing freely, water liberally. Set the plants 18 inches apart each way, and if more than one kind is to be used, be careful to plant the taller growing kinds in the center and the dwarf ones along the edge. This applies to planting in beds.


