

HOW TO ORDER

Please read the following carefully:

OUR TERMS ARE STRICTLY CASH WITH ORDER-We do not send C.O.D., as the cost of collecting return charges is quite an unnecessary item of expense, and the prices being given, we can conceive of no necessity to warrant goods being so sent.

HOW TO ORDER-Write your name, postoffice, state and express office plainly, with black ink, on every order and every time you write to us. Give plain shipping directions; where none are given us we use our best judgment, but it must be at the customer's expense and risk.

VERY IMPORTANT-We aim to fill your orders immediately, and you can greatly aid us in making them out on your Order Sheet as follows:

1. Place the quantity wanted before each article.

2. Use one line for each kind ordered.

3. As nearly as possible make your list in the same order in which the seeds are catalogued, beginning at the front.

4. Kindly use Special Order Sheet for plant orders, and inquiries and other matters not pertaining to the order.

HOW TO SEND MONEY-Send cash with order (as we do not open book accounts for small amounts, and can only send to the value of money received), by New York or Chicago Draft, Registered Letter or Postoffice or Express Money Order; all are cheap and absolutely safe. If local checks are used, 25 cents must be added to cover the cost of collecting. Make money orders payable to "Vaughan's Seed Store."

ORDERS-Order early. Do not wait until the rush of planting time. We strive to fill all orders promptly and at short notice, but a rush season always and everywhere has its inevitable delays. First come will be first served.

PERISHABLE STOCK—Onion Sets, Sweet Potatoes, etc., are sold and shipped only at buyer's risk. For damages arising from delay or from heating while in transit we will not be responsible.

OUR RESPONSIBILITY



SEED CROPS Throughout the vegetable seed producing sections of the world the 1913 crops may generally be regarded as below normal. However, on account of increased acreages, there are few stringent shortages. Garden Beans are probably the most important of the short items and here, especially on Bush Wax Varieties, the situation is alarming. Users in quantity should cover early.

Other scarce seeds are Paris Golden Self-Blanching Celery, large varieties of Pepper, Egg Plant, Parsley, Early Seed Potatoes and a few kinds of American Early Cabbage. Prices on Peas, Beet, Carrot and Parsnip are much lower than last year and the seed is a better quality. Radish shows much better germination than last season. Flat Onion, or Set Seed, is in good supply with a large demand. The best quality Globe Onion Seed is not plenty and with a heavy demand, not unlikely on account of the present high onion prices, will be hard to locate late in the season.

Novelties and Specialties Varieties listed on this and the next page are entirely new sorts, or else new types or selections of old varieties, to which we wish to call especial attention—a reading we think well worth the time of an up-to-date gardener. No new sort is added to our list without a careful trial and to our best knowledge. "Old faces under new names" are entirely eliminated; also, we take enough pride in being up-to-date to offer proven, desirable novelties introduced by other seed houses under their right and orignal names.

Copenhagen Market Cabbage


The illustration above is a good representation of this splendid, new, early Cabbage. It is the earliest large, round or flat-headed sort. It ripens early and uniformly and in season almost with Early Jersey Wakefield. The heads are of good size, averaging 10 pounds; very compact; its leaves, which are light green, are round, dish-shaped and fold tightly together; the stem is short and heads are formed close to the ground; all of which permits very close planting, so that more plants can be grown to on acre than is possible with most sorts. 


CHICAGO GIANT SELF-BLANCHING CELERY





season, wonderfully prolific wax bean, pods KIDNEY WHITE WAX very similar to Davis. Round Pods—Among KIDNEY WHITE WAX the earlies: Round Pod Kidney Wax, Stringless and Prolific Black Wax; for a main crop—Pencil Pod, Curries Rust Proof, Improved Golden Wax, Valentine Wax, a very early variety in the South; Horticultural Wax, early as Wardwell's, hardier, but not stringless.


