Chicago, July 13.—Saturday ended the most remarkable national convention since the Demorratic party in 1890 was rent asunder on the slavery issue. To-day the convention completed the work with the party in twain on the financial issue. Arthus Sewall, of Maine, a Bath shipbuilder and an ardent free coinage man, was named vice-president on a ticket headed by William J. Bryau, the eloquent young orator from the prairies beyond the Missouri. Over 160 delegates to the convention, all of whom with the exception of the gold delegation from Wisconsin and a portion of the delegation from Minneasota, came from east of the Alleghanics, refused yesterday to participate in the nomination of the presidential candidate on a free silver platform. Over 259 to-day declined to participate in a nomination for vice-president. Mapy of the delegates have left the city in disgust.






