## WAYS OF THE TURK.

### Children Are Prohibited From Attending Foreign Schools.

(Associated Press.)  
Constantinople, July 17.—Following the graduation of the first Turkish girl from the American Girls' College, the Turkish government has issued an edict prohibiting Turkish children from attending foreign schools, the employment of Christian teachers in Turkish households or the appearance of Turkish ladies in public, accompanied by Christian women companions. The edict deprives hundreds of foreign governments of the means of subsistence. It is intended to prevent the dissemination of liberal ideas.

## MASSACRE OF SERBIANS.

### Bodies of Turkish Soldiers and Albanians Attack Villages Murdering Inhabitants.

Constantinople, July 17.—Bodies of Turkish troops and Albanians are murdering and torturing inhabitants of Servian villages in the neighborhood of Metrovitza. The outrages are alleged to be designed to drive out the Servian settlements possessing a modified independence along the great strategic road from Metrovitza to Berane.

## THE DUKE WILL ENTERTAIN.

### Conservative and Liberal-Unionist Delegates Invited to Blenheim Palace.

(Associated Press.)  
London, July 19.—The Duke of Marlborough is about to appear in a new role. There will occur at Blenheim Palace, the Duke's seat at Woodstock, Oxford, on August 10th, the largest political demonstration of recent times. Its object is to celebrate the third Unionist victory in the elections. Three thousand delegates from the Conservative and Liberal-Unionist associations throughout the country will be present, while the gathering will number in all about 7,000. Mr. Balfour will preside. The Duchess of Marlborough will entertain this great throng at luncheon in a huge tent specially erected upon the historic grounds. All the Unionist members of the House of Commons have been invited. The palace will be in full gala, and has not been for many years. A distinguished home party will follow, several of the most prominent persons present remaining till the end of the week. Among the features of the fete will be a recital upon the celebrated organ in the long library, leaving upon the lips about the rendering of hand music during the entire day. The Duke of Marlborough said to a representative of the Associated Press: "No significance is attached to this fete so far as I am concerned. I did something similar five years ago, only on a much smaller scale. I thought this would be good for the Unionist party, effectively prove its cohesion and the concord which prevails in the party, and also give the leaders a chance of personally thanking their agents and workers; so I asked them all to come to Blenheim."

The speaker said he wrote the manifesto because, after the meetings in Queen's hall and at the Reform Club, unless some clear repudiation of the statement regarding the war was made it was impossible for the Liberal party to continue to exist as a sound force, appealing to the highest sympathies of the country.
