House of Commons Adjourns -Lords Ignore Government's Veto Bill

London, Nov. 25.—Sir John Rees, a Liberal member, crossed the floor of the Commons on Wednesday night, desorting the government. J. William Redmond asked the Speaker it it was in order for Rees to cross the floor on the last day of the session, against the government. "That was silly enough to make him a knight," said Redmond.



AMNESTY GRANTED BRAZILIAN SAILORS

Crews of Warships Stationed at Rio de Janeiro Surrender Vessels -

(Times Leased Wirer) London, Nov. 25—The correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph Co. at Rio de Janeiro cabled today that the mutineers on board the Brazilian battleships at Rio de Janeiro had surrendered unconditionally.

Private despatches received by Lon don merchants with interest in Brazil, addise that the chamber of deputies today followed the example of the Brazilian senate and extended amnesty to the mutinous sailors con board the Brazilian battleships in the

harbor at Rio de Janeiro harbor at Rio de Janeiro.

In return for the hattleships in their possession, the sailors are to be permitted to go free from punishment despite the fact that they killed three of their officers and turned the guits of the warships upon the city of Rio de Janeiro, inflicting slight damage to property.

Rio de Janeiro, Nov. 25.—About 10 o'clock at night on November 22nd, as Captain Neves, commanding the battleship Minas Geraes, came back from dinner on board the French training ship Duguay Trouin, he heard a violent uproar and a fusilade of shots. It was the crew of his vessel, who had revolted. Captain Neves and two other officers offered resistance to some of the sailors, and were killed, and one officer was mortally wounded. Several sailors were killed. The mutinous crew meanwhile shouted Long live liberty."

The insurfectionary movement then broke out on board the other new firazilian dreadnought, the battleship Soa Paulo, and on the sout ship Bahia. All the officers having been landed, a plain sailor of the first class.

## WATER BYLAW MEETS DEFEAT

**BIG ADVERSE VOTE ON** GOLDSTREAM QUESTION

Outcome of Campaign Romarkable for Bitterness of Feeling

Water Bylaw Against 1572 For 1172 Majority 400 Total vore cast, 2,771; spoiled bal-Fire Protection 

Such are the results of the voting on the three bylaws which were sub-mitted to the ratepayers-yesterday. The defeat of the water bylaw by so large a majority as four hundred came as a great surprise to every-body. The announcement of the re-turning officer was received with-cheers by the opponents of the by-

The total vote cast broke all re-

The total vote cast broke all records for bylaws submitted on a date other than a general election contest, and this fact demonstrates most eloquently the tremendous amount of interest awakened in the fate of the measure providing for expropriation of the holdings of the Esquimalt Water Works company.

The day was a memorable one, inasmuch as never before in the history of the city was such vigorous effort expended by rival forces. From the hour of the opening of the polls until the last ballot had been cast a strong committee of leading citizens of the community exerted every endeavor to induce ratepayers to vote for the bylaw, and those against it were equally. law, affil those against it were equally

active.

At 7 o'clock, the hour for the closing of the polls, tboth sides rested from their strenuous labors and both were confident of the result. It was not long, however, before those in the polling booth watching the proceedings attendant on the counting of the ballots saw that the bylaw was defeated and the word was soon passed to the waiting crowds on the defeated and the word was soon passed to the waiting crowds on the streets. The newspapers posted bulletins, and when the final count was made known, about 8.30 o'clock, a considerable crowd thronged Broad street. The victorious element cheered lustily, and there was keen disappointment amongst those who had advocated the measure.

This is the second time that the ratepayers, have turned down a proposal to endorse what is popularly alluded to as the "Goldstream proposition," and as the adverse vote yesterday was an emphatic one, it is assumed that there will be no further attempt, at least for some years, to revive the proposal.







able form of motive power.

Alison, however, is not at all content with the mere prospects of his new car superceding the horse-car in New York, but is confident that once the superiority of his storage battery as a motive power has been demonstrated it will quickly supersede the ordinary electric surface car that uses the underground conduit or overhead trolley for its power. It costs \$130,000 a mile to construct a street car line of the onduit type, while Edison asserts that a line that would use his storage batteries gould be built for \$30,000 a mile. 

#### DIRIGIBLE AIRSHIP SAFE FROM WIND

Walter Wellman Says That With Plenty of Room There is No Danger

It is generally supposed that naving gating the air in a huge dirigible airship must be perilibus during a heavy wind storm. It seems that this is not the case, according to Walter Wellman who, in writing about his recent attempt to cross the Atlantic Ocean in the airship "America" in Hampton's Magazine for December says:

"Men who thought there was danger that the America might be torn to pleces by a storm had not reflected well upon the physical conditions surrounding a ship of the A steamship or sailing vessel in the steamship or sailing vessel in a partly immersed in an ocean of fluid which offers great resistance and subjects it to violent shocks.

"An airship is completely immersed."

"An airship is completely immersed in a medium which offers so little resistance that shocks are impossible. It is not an easy fact to grasp—but is still a fact—that the only resistance an airship offers to the wind, the only strain or pressure upon her parts, is that which she herself creates with her engine and propellers. her engine and propellers.



"To understand this principle, imagine the America in the air far out over the ocean. It is calm; no engine is running; the crew, perchance, is saleep. Up springs a gale, fast gathering force till it reaches a yelocity of fifty miles per hour. Nothing whatever in the motion, the vibration, the pitching or rolling of the ship alarms and awakens the crew. The America being a 'free balloon,' because no exgine is turning simply becomes a part of the wind, so to speak, moves with the wind, offers no resistance to it, floats along as peacefully as if it still were dead calm. A member of the crew awakes, rubs his eyes, goes to his post; but, if it be night, and he cannot



, ABE RUEFS FIGHT.

San Francisco, Cal., Nov. 25.—The court of appeals has affirmed the judgment of the superior court whereby Abraham Ruef, the former political boss was convicted of bribery and sentenced to serve it years imprisonment. The decision was made after the court had read a record consisting of 25 bound youmes of 2500 pages, said to be the longest ever submitted to an appellate court in this country. In every particular the motions of the defendant's attorneys were overruled. Several of the rulings made by Judge Lawlor, who sat at the Trial were criticised by the appellate justices, but they agreed that none of the alleged lapses vitally affected the rights of the defendant.

"In our opinion," says the decision on the appeal, "the evidence not only supports the verdict of the jury, but no other verdict could reasonably be justified."

The charge of misconduct brought against Judge Lawlor by the defence was dismissed with the comment that, while the propriety of a court indulging in reflections on an attorney or questioning the credibility of a witness might be questioned, no misconduct had been proved.
