blamed on cuts made by the UK central government, according to a town councillor.

And another has reminded residents that the money raised by the tax is spent within Bridport, and the council needs to balance its budget.

Last month Bridport Town Council's Finance and General Purposes Committee considered the council's budget for the year 2014-2015, and made the decision to increase the council tax precept by 8.73 per cent.

This means that band D tax payers will see an increase of 25p a week and will now pay a total of £161.79 for services provided by the town council, up from £148.80. This decision was approved at the full town council meeting on Tuesday, January 28th.

The council discussed three possible options regarding the council tax precept, deciding on option two, with the aim of producing a balanced budget. The other options that were considered would see the council either go into the red or be left with a surplus.

Councillor David Tett, who is also a West Dorset District Councillor, said he hoped residents of Bridport would understand the position that the town council found itself in.

Speaking at the committee meeting, he said: "Whilst I am not one for asking more than what is required, it was incumbent upon the council to balance its books and propose option two, i.e. to break even.

"To one sitting around this table, an increase of 25p per week is probably no more than a drop in the ocean, but to many people in the town, taken with all other living costs, i.e. rent, mortgage interest and utility authority charges, it

is a lot of money. "If anyone is to

point an accusing finger it has to be at central government, who has reduced the support grant so drastically the town council is getting £6,000 less to administer its services. There are challenging times ahead in the years to come which we would have to meet as and when

they arise.'

A number of issues were considered by committee members when reaching the decision on the budget, including increased commitments for the town council, such as additional land management, and the possibility that the council may be asked to provide more services in the area.

The biggest factor is the reduction in the grant which the town council receives from West Dorset District Council. The grant was intended to cover the reduction in the tax base caused by the localisation of council tax

Town clerk Bob Gillis said: "The town council had been notified that this grant was to be reduced in 2014/2015 by over £6,000. The indications from the district council were also that this could be the last year of the grant funding, which in total in 2014/2015 was over £52,000."

Councillor Martin Ray, chairman of the Finance and General Purposes Committee, said: "There was a lot of discussion at the committee meeting on the budget and it was generally agreed that there was a need to set a balanced budget, including making provision for the reduction in the Local Council Tax Support Grant, which potentially over the next two years could cost the town council over £50,000.

"It was important that the town council set a budget that enabled it to continue to provide services and deliver projects that are important to local people, bearing in mind that all the money that we raise through the town council's precept is spent in the Bridport area.'

COUNTY COUNCIL PRECEPT ALSO UP

AT A Cabinet meeting on Monday, it was recommended that Dorset County Council consider an increase of 1.99 per cent for the council's part of next year's council tax.

The increase, the first in four years, will be discussed and decided upon at the full council meeting on February 13th. This is a rise of 44p per week for a band D property, a total of £22.88 a year.

Cllr Robert Gould, Cabinet member for corporate resources, introduced the report: "Although we are still waiting for the Government's confirmation of the referendum limits, this increase should be below that value.

"I am confident that the basis for the budget is sound and that it will support the council for the substantial chal-

MANY, in and around the Dorchester area, will know of, or have met Margaret Morrissey, OBE. Editor of the parish magazine, active with the church, a former lay schools inspector and chair of the Poundbury Residents Association, Mrs Morrissey is also often quoted in the national press and regional and national broadcasters for

her views on education and parenting.

After years as chair and then spokesperson for National Confederation of Parent Teachers Association she founded her own organisation, Parents Outloud, when she 'retired' several years ago. And apart from all this Mrs Morrissey is more than active with her seven grandchildren, five of which live locally, and can often be seen being ferried around in a car which would otherwise be far too big for her and retired hotelier and publican, husband Patrick.

■ DO you have a problem saying 'no'?

I agreed to do this interview, so yes! It is one of my problems - I often see something which needs sorting out and end up getting involved.

■ WHEN did you first come to Dorset?

About 1980 when Patrick took over the Worgret Manor Hotel at Wareham. We had met in Weybridge where he was a hotel manager, but he had always wanted to branch out on his own. We later moved to Poole and then came to Dorchester in 1990 at the Junction Hotel. I hated Dorset at first, after living in London, but I soon grew to

AND what did you do before starting a family?

I trained as a nurse, did some agency work and also worked for Securicor for while. I was at Queen Charlotte Hospital working on the unit where they pioneered changing a baby's blood, which was very exciting and very cutting edge at the time. Our first child was born at Barts which technically makes her a cockney and gives her the right to drive sheep over Westminster Bridge, although she hasn't tried it yet.

■ HOW did you get involved in educational mat-

The head at the nursery heard me complaining about a zebra crossing and told me I was just the person she needed. Before I knew it I was a school governor and on the PTA...that was the start of it and I never looked back from there. Her name was Mrs Grubb, I won't forget her, my husband says she has a lot to answer for. I used to go along to the Inner London Education Authority and speak



AND how did your involvement continue in

At the Worgret Manor some of the local persuaded me to stand for the town council in Wareham. Later David Jacob's came to Swanage to broadcast "Any Questions" from the Mowlem Theatre. I put in a question about the teachers strike affecting my daughter's education and he made a quip that with a mother like me, she ought to do just fine. The next day the phone didn't stop ringing and myself and a few others called a meeting at the Purbeck School and started the All Dorset Parents Action Group. We used to hold breakfast meetings and ran a number of campaigns which often led to us going to London to lobby MPs and the Minister. Eventually we became the Dorset group of the National Confederation of Parent Teachers Association and I became involved nationally with the organisation as chair and later as spokesperson.

AND did you get to know many of the key players

Yes, but it's a sad indictment that in 30 years or so of meeting with secretaries of state for education there was only one, John MacGregor, who seemed to genuinely care about children, and he only lasted a few months in the post. David Blunkett was very nice and used to phone me quite often until he became a Minister and then all I would get in response were letters addressed to Mrs Morrissey. John Patten even described me as a 'Neanderthal'. Luckily I bit my lip and thought about my response when I was asked by the press what I thought about his comments on me. I also got to know all of the national paper journalists who write about education and many from the TV and radio, some of which still phone me today for my

I GUESS you were quite academic at school?

Far from it, but I used to run church services, was the sports captain and was busy with lots of other things. Somehow I think everyone, including me, forgot about my education. There used to be a time when bits of paper weren't that important but if I had my time again I might have made more effort. It certainly true now that you won't even get a job interview for most things without the paper to prove you can pass an exam.

HAS the church always played an important part in vour life?

Yes, I started going to church as a child. It would be Sunday School in the morning and church in the evening. I'm not even really sure if I'm a believer, but I do believe in

AND apart from the church and Patrick what else is there that fills your time now you are retired?

The parish magazine takes quite a lot of time, there's ten editions a year and the deadlines come around remarkably quickly. I do try and be organised and put items aside as I go along, but the biggest thing in my life is the grandchildren, all seven of them varying in age from four to sixteen. At the weekend I had all five of them and was exhausted when they went home, but I just love it.

A BRIDPORT councillor has been shortlisted for a national award in recognition of her work as a community champion.

Ros Kayes, who represents Bridport on the town, district and county councils, is in the running to be named a top councillor in the Local Government Informa-

Plans to improve coast path

A SCHEME to improve the South West Coast Path has been launched with the hope of raising £250,000.

The Great South West Walks 2014 has been unveiled by the South West Coast Path Association (SWCPA), an initiative which consists of 100 guided circular walks taking place this year between Saturday, September 20th, and Sunday, September 28th.

The plan is to raise funds for 50 improvement projects, which SWCPA hope will be completed by the summer of 2015.

It follows the success of the Great South West Walk 2013, where the entire length of the coast path was covered in a series of relay walks across five weeks.

Ken Carter, project chairman of

the Great South West Walks 2014, said: "When we held our Great South West Walk last year to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Coast Path, we never imagined we would receive so much support.

"Our £250,000 target was greatly exceeded and over £600,000 was raised from sponsorship and the release of match-funding provided by the South West Coast Path Team's grant from the Rural Development Programme for England.

"This resulted in 130 improvement projects along the South West Coast Path."

The 100 walks will cut across the length of the coast path in Dorset, Devon and Cornwall, as well as the Exmoor coast through Somerset.

There will be guided sponsored

walks of various lengths to suit all types of walkers, and many will be themed.

Each walk will be guided by local experts, rangers and path wardens, who are all assisting the South West Coast Path Association with this

The South West Coast Path is the longest of the country's 15 national trails and enables walkers to explore 630 miles of stunning coastline - part of the South West's heritage and identity.



Broadband drop-in session

BRIDPORT residents will have the opportunity to find out about the town's superfast broadband project today (Wednesday), at a drop-in session at the town hall.

Members of the Superfast Dorset team, a £31 million Governmentfunded partnership between Dorset councils and BT, will be on hand to answer questions from the public, between 1pm and 4pm.

Superfast Dorset aims to provide 97 per cent of premises in Dorset, Bournemouth and Poole with access to the fibre network, which will offer a range of high-speed connections - a facility that is not currently available in most of rural Dorset.

The project is now in an implementation phase with rollouts planned in six-month phases, starting from spring this year.

The project aims to have Bridport connected to superfast broadband by summer 2016 at the latest.

Project leader Dugald Lockhart said: "We look forward to telling people how our project will improve the way they live and work. Please drop in and see us."

After his death, his widow was unfortunate enough to have a fire which left the bungalow as four walls. It was rebuilt and was even smaller, possibly due to planning refusal or maybe because it wasn't insured for enough.

When the owner felt the need, she moved to her daughter's home where she lived to the age of

Having inherited this small building we wished to extend it to accommodate our family - planning permission was refused. Eventually we were allowed to extend but only on the one level. This

Eventually we sold it, and the next owner turned it into a play room, which in no way interfered with any planning laws.

The building has since changed hands again and the name changed, but it must have been the first to contravene the rules and regulations

HAVING recently visited South West Coaches, I was met with a warm welcome at a privately owned, family run company. Upon entering reception I learnt that they run a number of excellent value holidays to a variety of different places, as well as many short breaks and day trips.

The business is owned by Mr and Mrs Alan Graham. who operate from three locations: Lufton Business Park in Yeovil, Southgate Road in Wincanton and Tradecroft Industrial Estate on the Isle of Portland.

In 1987 Mr & Mrs Graham went into business buying a third of a company called A. G. Hulbert and Son. A.G. Hulbert and Son operated from Victoria Road. Yeovil and successfully ran a fleet of around 14 minibuses which ranged from 8 seats to 24 seats. The vehicles were used to transport children and adults to various schools in and around Yeovil, they also specialised in PHAB transportation (Physically Handicapped Able Bodied). Mr Graham's passion for the bus industry was soon realised and he grew the company over a period of 13 years adding day excursions & holidays to his portfolio. The fleet also grew at which point an opportunity came his way...

In 2000 a local company called Wakes Services came on the market. This company was based in Wincanton which posed a different set of challenges. The Victoria Road site was quickly sold and a vard on Lufton Business Park was purchased. Over

 $South\,West\,Coaches\,went\,from\,strength\,to\,strength$ and in 2007 Safeway Services came on the market and a purchase agreement was made. In the same year Yeovil Town saw a major boost to its infrastructure with four brand new Optare Solo buses, this was soon followed by a new Optare Versa for the 81 South Petherton service and an additional new vehicle to the No 1 Shepton Mallet service. The most recent purchase came in 2009 when they entered Dorset and purchased an operation on the Isle of Portland. Sureline was now part of the South West Coaches





The Story of St.Valentine

IN 270 A.D., marriage had been outlawed by the emperor of Rome, Claudius II. Claudius issued this decree because he thought that married men made bad soldiers since they were reluctant to be torn away from their families in

the case of war. Claudius had also outlawed Christianity in this time period because he wished to be praised as the one supreme god, the Emperor of Rome. Valentine was the bishop of Interamna during this period of oppression. Valentine thought that the decrees of Rome were wrong. He believed that people should be free to love God and to marry. Valentine invited the young couples of the area to come to him. When they came, Valentine secretly performed services of matrimony and united the couples.

Valentine was eventually caught and was brought before the emperor. The emperor saw that Valentine had conviction and drive that was unsurpassed among his men.

Claudius tried and tried to persuade Valentine to leave Christianity, serve the Roman empire and the Roman gods. In exchange, Claudius would pardon him and make him one of his allies. St. Valentine held to his faith and did

not renounce Christ. Because of this, the emperor sentenced him to a three-part execution. First, Valentine would be beaten, then stoned, and then finally, decapitated. Valentine died on February 14th, 270 A.D.

While in prison, waiting for his sentence to be carried out, Valentine fell in love with the jailer's daughter, the blind Asterius. During the course of Valentine's prison stay, a miracle occurred and Asterius regained her sight. Valentine sent her a final farewell note. He signed his last note, "From Your Valentine." Even today, this message remains as the motto for our Valentine's Day celebrations.







TRIUMPHANT HOMETOWN RETURN FOR **BRISTOL-BASED PARTY MERCHANTS**

Papa Le Gal at the Marine Theatre, Lyme Regis. Saturday, January 25th. Review by Ross Packman

ON A frigid January evening, the Marine Theatre in Lyme Regis was host to a dose of undiluted sunshine courtesy of Papa Le Gal, the town's biggest musical exports, returning home after a long absence.

Following an extended hiatus in 2013 and a relocation to the buzzing musical hub of Bristol, this event served as both Papa Le Gal's first hometown show of the year, and a statement of intent for 2014. Before the main event, and easing the crowd into the evening, Ella Squirrell offered up a selection of sultry acoustic numbers, her diminutive stature belying an impressive vocal maturity

Papa Le Gal have built up a reputation for their showmanship as well as their sunshine-filled songs, and this evening was no exception. For one

Under My Skin



IF YOU have ever had a surgical procedure or been caught up in the tension of an operation in a TV drama then an extraordinary and inspiring new work from Sadhana Dance will give you a new understanding of the skill of surgical teams.

Surgery may seem an obscure and unlikely inspiration for dance, but in Under My Skin, performed at Dorchester's Corn Exchange on Wednesday, February 12th, three performers take us to the heart of the operating theatre, where intricate detail, perfect timing and precisely controlled exchanges are as important as they are in dance.

Working hand in hand with eminent surgeon Professor Roger Kneebone from Imperial College London, choreographer Subathra Subramaniam undertook extensive research with internationally renowned scientists to prepare the piece.

The result is a work that combines classical Indian and contemporary western dance and demonstrates how art and science complement each other.

Rosalind Conlon, Dance Producer from Activate Performing Arts, saw the piece when it was first created and says: "The precision and care that surgeons take to prepare and undertake surgery requires a precise and careful set of movements. We have all seen TV shows where Doctors scrub-up in preparation for the theatre. This piece is an excellent demonstration of how this process can be transformed into choreographed movement - the piece is really beautiful and moving. In the pre-show I also learnt how to stitch (simulated) skin - fascinating!"




AWARD winning Australian comic Yianni Agisilaou will headline the first Comedy Café night of the year this Friday (February 7th).



Valentines Night Special: 'Realms' in Bridport

A romantic musical soiree awaits at the Bridport Arts Centre Jazz Café

REALMS is an intriguing collaboration of singer Rosalie Genay and pianist Rebecca Nash, two musicians who share a fascination and fondness for the songs of contemporary lyrical legends Tom Waits and Leonard Cohen. Together they have embarked on an ambitious journey to arrange some of their idols' tracks for this new project, consciously including less well known songs in amongst the more popular ones and setting them into imaginative new arrangements.

The song covers might lend themselves well to a more jazz-inspired backing but Genay is careful not to lose anything in the transition. By offering a different perspective on Waits and Cohen's music, and by including their own original tunes in their repertoire as well, Genay and Nash provide ample opportunities for enjoyment. This tour takes them outside their London base and around the UK to promote the release of their debut album in February 2014, supported by Jazz Services and Arts Council England. The album was partially funded through a very successful crowd-funding project via PledgeMusic, reaching its funding target within 20 days.

Rosalie Genay is a Dutch born, London based vocalist and songwriter and has been working professionally in London since moving there in 2004 after graduating from the Australian Institute of Music. She has worked with many leading musicians and vocalists on the scene and has appeared in various venues in Australia, Europe and the UK: the Bb Jazz Club - Berlin, Chet's Jazz Bar - Amsterdam, The Spice of Life, The Archduke, Pizza Express, Arcola and Soho Theatre, Oliver's Jazz Bar - London amongst others.

Rebecca Nash graduated from the Trinity College of Music Masters Course in 2012. She plays in a number of projects; her own trio, the folk-iazz fusion ensemble Wizahikken, Entropi, Paradox Ensemble,

the Potter Ensemble, and Benin City. She has played at festivals including Glastonbury, Meltdown Festival, Isle of Wight Jazz Festival, Llangollen Jazz Festival, as well as many jazz clubs nationwide such as the Vortex, the Southbank Centre, and the Spice of Life. Rebecca has shared the stage with artists such as Tina May, Ed Jones, Anita Wardell, Steve Waterman, Christine Tobin, Phil Robson, Mark Lockheart, Henry Lowther and Alex Garnett amongst others.
