THE findings of a three-month cardboard and mixed plastic collection in Beer have pleased council bosses.

No promises have been made, but it is possible that the concept will become permanent throughout the district.

The trial was held to see if it would be possible to include cardboard and so-called mixed plastics in household kerbside recycling collections throughout the district.

Since the trial concluded in November last year, participants have been asked for feedback. East Devon District Council (EDDC) sent a questionnaire to 700 householders in January 2012.

Of these, 49 per cent of householders responded with feedback on the service. • 95 per cent of respondents felt the

cardboard and mixed plastics recycling trial was a good trial overall 98 per cent felt it was a good

opportunity to recycle cardboard and mixed plastic. Analysis also show that three tonnes of

cardboard were collected over the three-

month period. An EDDC spokesperson said: "Now, EDDC is looking at the best options for providing a collection service across the whole of east Devon, based on the findings of the Beer trial.

"A further report will be submitted to the Waste and Recycling Partnership Board at the end of March so members can decide the best way to manage the collection of cardboard and mixed plastics in the future.

"Other options are being reviewed as a short term interim measure would be the introduction of cardboard possible recycling 'bring-banks' in some parts of the district.

"In the meantime Tesco stores do take cardboard and mixed plastic in Exmouth, Honiton and Seaton areas. Civic amenity sites also accept these materials." From a plastic point of view, only bottles

- and milk containers are collected. Mixed plastics in the trial included: Ice cream tubs
- · Biscuit trays and meat / fish trays
- · Fruit and vegetable trays
- · Margarine and butter tubs Yoghurt pots
- · Ready meal trays
- · Takeaway containers



THE fire and rescue service has revealed detailed plans for its outdated station in Axminster.

As reported in last week's Axminster edition, police are in talks with the fire and rescue service about a station share arrangement.

The plan is to shut the current police station and move officers to a new base at the fire station. But Axminster Fire Station looks set for a comprehensive refurbishment programme regardless of police moving in or not.

A spokesperson for Devon and Somerset Fire and Rescue Service said: "Proposed construction works would essentially consist of an extension and major refurbishment of the station to bring it up to the standards required by a modern fire and rescue service.

"This will include dignity at work improvements, kit drying breathing and breathing apparatus facilities, a muster room and

improve the energy efficiency of the building through better insulation, light fittings, and a new heating installation with

improved controls.

"The station was originally constructed in 1963 and apart from general maintenance little else in the way of improvement has been carried out since then.

"Accommodating the police would involve additional works to the above. The plans have yet to be finally approved by all parties, and until this happens we will not be submitting a planning application."

Town and district councillor Douglas Hull has spoken against the proposed move of police to



Compromise made over six-home plan

COUNCILLORS have allowed a proposed development in Chardstock to go ahead after accepting a compromise.

Six dwellings can be built on land adjacent to Sopers Cottage on condition that two affordable dwellings are provided at Cookes Field.

In short, applicant Jameson Homes Ltd applied for permission to build three four-bed units and three threebed units on land referred to as Sopers in the application.

But there was no provison made for what is known as affordable housing, which is against planning authority criteria. The situation was explained in East Devon District Council (EDDC) Development Management Committee agenda papers, saying: "Under Policy H4 of the East Devon Local Plan on developments of five dwellings or more in settlements with a population falling below 3,000, affordable housing provision of a minimum of 40per cent will be required.

"The six units proposed would therefore generate a need for two units (40 per cent of six units equates to 2.5 affordable units but it is common practice to round down).

"Policy H4 requires affordable housing to be provided on site as part of the development but identifies that in exceptional circumstances, where the council (EDDC) and the developer consider the affordable housing would be better provided on an alternative site, the council may enter into negotiations for off-site provision."

This is exactly what happened and planning permission has already been given for a development at Cookes Field

The agenda papers explained: "Although Cookes Field has already been approved a legal agreement can be entered into which links occupation of the open market units on Sopers to the delivery of the affordable units.

"However, notwithstanding the two sites being linked in this way, the two sites do not fall to be considered as one development in terms of the number of affordable units delivered.

"Although the sites are being linked together for the delivery of the affordable housing, it would not be reasonable to link them together in an attempt to secure a higher number of affordable units i.e. it remains 40 per cent of six, not 40 per cent of 10."

EDDC's Development Management Committee passed officers recommendation to approve the planning application (with conditions attached).

Man airlifted after collision

ONE man was airlifted to hospital after after a two-car crash on A358 at Tatworth between Axminster and Chard in the morning of Wednesday, February 22nd.

The accident happened at about 9.40am and fire and rescue service crews from Axminster and Chard were despatched.

A spokesperson for the fire and rescue service said: "The incident commander confirmed that there was one person trapped within a vehicle so crews started to stabilise the car and set up their hydraulic cutting equipment.

"They then removed the roof and door in order to access the casualty and remove them on a long board for the ambulance to assist with."

The vehicles involved were a red Hyundai Accent and a gold coloured Peugeot 106.

Police believe the Hyundai was travelling towards Chard when it appeared to go out of control on a bend and was in collision with the Peugeot, which was travelling in the opposite direction.

The driver of the Peugeot is believed to have suffered lifechanging injuries — including broken legs and arms — and was airlifted to Musgrove Park Hospital in Taunton.

A police spokesperson also explained that a female had been taken to hospital in Taunton.

Anyone who witnessed the accident or events leading up to it is asked to call accident investigators at Avon and Somerset Police on 101.

Charter will mark foster-carers' work

DEVON has launched a charter to recognise the work done by foster-carers in the county.

The move follows a national charter aimed at improving conditions for foster-carers across the country, introduced by children's minister Tim Loughton.

Based on the results of consultations run by the Fostering Network on of Devon County Council behalf (DCC), the new charter hopes to attract new carers to help with the increasing number of children in care. To make this possible the charter outlines the commitments necessary of those involved in the fostering service. The fostering service's

commitments include valuing foster carers' "skills and expertise equally to those of other professionals" and giving them "all the information they need to care safely for the child".

Foster-carers are expected to 'respect and promote a child's religious, linguistic and cultural heritage" and allow a child to make decisions about their life "appropriate to their age and understanding". Andrea Davis, DCC cabinet

member for children in care, said: "We are committed to supporting this charter and helping to make it a reality so that foster-carers get the recognition they deserve and need to provide children and young people with the best possible care."



The key to sound portrait painting

THE interplay of light and shadow is the key to a successful portrait drawing.

It is how an artist achieves volume in three dimensions on a flat piece of paper and so brings the work alive.

This was the central theme of a demonstration entitled Finding Structure and Form in the Portrait given to the February meeting of Axminster Art Society by Roger Clemens, pictured above, himself a professional portraitist.

Roger demonstrated through his portrait drawings why it is essential to

know the basic structure of the human skull in order to understand where the light and shadows fall, and with what values

He also showed the importance of perspective in a life drawing and how to achieve the correct proportions while avoiding some of the errors that even professional portrait painters make. It became clear as he worked that hard lines had no place in his drawings but rather he relied on the clever use of light and shade, plus what he termed the "spectator's share", the ability of the viewer's eye to fill in gaps

It was an afternoon packed with tips and advice which was well appreciated by the enthusiastic audience of members and friends.

Roger Clemens will be holding an all-day Life Drawing workshop at All Saints Village Hall on Saturday, March 3rd. Anyone interested can get details from Kathryn Harding (01460 221060).

Chris tells of his 40 years in travel trade

He was living on the Isle of Man when the time came for him to leave school and, at his parents' suggestion, he applied for an interview with a local travel agency. This was successful and his career

It has been an interesting 40 years in which he has visited 50 different countries and feels that there are still many more he would like to see

As a young man he travelled by bus from Sydney to Perth which took four days, for three of which he slept on the bus.

THERE was a full-house of members and guests at Colyton Youth Centre when Valerie Belsey, Sidmouth-based author and historian, spoke of Green Lanes in East Devon at the February meeting of the Devonshire Association's Axe Valley branch. Valerie created а welcome precedent by adding musical illustrations to her impressive stock of slides shot in this area and beyond.

The speaker chose not to become bogged down in definitions of what exactly is meant by a "green lane".

She allowed that they were put down over the centuries, and voluntarily maintained as they still

are, for ordinary walking as well as the movement of animals and goods. With its particularly taxing mileage in made-up roads, Devon probably has more in the way of unofficial pathways than anywhere.

Valerie's pictures of every variety, of more or less green paths, showed everything from cattle ways to once essential paths ensuring that all who lived nearby could get to church. This made Valerie's musical choices

all the more useful. Drawing from the English folk pop developments at the end of the last century, she included the bouncy Jolly Wagoner of Mike Waterson and the "four seasons" vocal essay that is Martin Carthy's unaccompanied January Man.

Most poignant was the Steeleye Span hit of the 1960s All Around My Hat, the green ribbon all around the hat being a memorial a "true love, far far - no doubt deported to Australia away' for sheep stealing or whatever.

Walkers along such lanes appeared to have almost limitless stamina. Valerie remembered one local commuter, presumably lacking a horse, who became famous for walking from his home at Membury to his work as a surgeon at St Thomas's Hospital in London.

'Welly zone' investigation

ONE of the lowest tides of the year will take place on Sunday, March 11th and will provide an ideal opportunity for volunteers to investigate the

"welly zone" at Lyme Regis beach. What, you may well ask is the welly zone? Started a year ago, this is a three-year project funded by the Esmee Fairbairn Foundation and the Dorset AONB's Sustainable Development Fund and it involves local people discovering more about the wildlife of the beach and shallow water habitats along the coast. In our case the information gained will be added to Dorset's marine biodiversity database. All of which means what? Well, the welly zone

stretches from the top of the beach, where debris is stranded down to the shallow margins of the sea and which are accessible with Wellington boots. It's an area much neglected and under-studied. Last year, for instance, volunteers discovered

abundant honeycomb worms at Eype, a tree trunk covered in thousands of goose barnacles which had been washed up at West Bay, common and soprano pipistrelle bats feding along the strandline at Osmington Mills, over 100 empty shark and ray eggs cases, all collected within an hour, at Swanage, an oceanic sunfish at West Bay and a rare rock-pool beetle living at Portland Bill.

So, if you have a pair of Wellington boots and feel like a beach scour to see what you can discover, then meet at noon in front of the beach huts on Monmouth beach, the beach west of the Cobb and be prepared for some walking on uneven rocks and boulders. You'll be given a beach survey pack to take away so

you can record finds whenever you are taking a stroll on the beaches. For more information call 01929 481044. Still on the fishy tack the tireless Dorset Wildlife Trust

has just released the winning images from the Dorset Seasearch Underwater Photography competition.

This is all part of a national programme to record wildlife beneath the waves and contributed by local volunteer sports divers.

The winning photograph, taken by Matt Doggett from Southampton, shows the rare Baillon's wrasse in Poole harbour. The fish is in breeding colours and is a first in the history of the competition.

Runners-up in the competition were Fiona Ravenscroft's seaslug at Portland, Justin Evans' undulate ray on Christchurch ledges, Gordon Bird's picture of sea cucumbers, anemones and seaweeds at Lulworth banks and Mike Markey's reef in Lyme Bay showing pink seafans and sponges.

From fish to birds. A few late afternoons ago, whilst walking across some farmland near Tolpuddle with a view to trying to complete a roe doe cull, I watched a large pure white bird drift up from the proximity of a herd of cattle.

At first I thought it was a swan, but then quickly realised the neck position and flight were wrong. It was, I suddenly realised an egret but not, I believe,

the relatively common little egret. I suspect that this was a cattle egret as I observed it landing, again in proximity to cattle

Several of these birds, native to Africa, have been seen by the Seaton Marshes and, again, always close to cattle. In Africa, where I have frequently seen them, they follow herds of buffalo and cattle, seeking insects disturbed by the beasts as they graze the grasses

Earlier that day I had seen several little egrets close to Dorchester, but always close to water. Both birds can be distinguished by the fact that little egrets have black legs, whilst cattle egrets' legs are yellow and, in addition there are buff coloured plumes on the bird's plumage. Was it a cattle egret? I wonder.



Judi grows old disgracefully vith her team of Brit misfits

THE BEST EXOTIC MARIGOLD HOTEL favourable. (12A)

ADAPTED from Deborah Moggach's novel These Foolish Things, The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel is a hilarious and touching comedy about growing old disgracefully.

Ol Parker's warm and witty script provides the predominantly British cast with moments to shine and tug our heartstrings as love is lost and found beneath a foreign sun.

Director John Madden, previously at the helm of the Oscar-winning Shakespeare In Love, captures a different side to life in modern India from the poverty and crime of Slumdog Millionaire.

The teeming streets of Rajasthan burst with colour and vitality and composer Thomas Newman adds plenty of spice with his evocative score.

Performances are an embarrassment of riches, from Maggie Smith's racist housekeeper, who surveys a black nurse at her local hospital and sneers: "He can wash all he likes - that colour's not coming out", to Penelope Wilton's well-to-do wife, who constantly belittles her husband, telling him: "When I want your opinion, I'll give it to

Our opinion of Madden's film is extremely

Evelyn (Judi Dench) has recently lost her husband and is coming to terms with solitude in her twilight years.

Determined to start anew, she abandons Britain for the balmier climes of Jaipur and a grand retirement home called The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel.

En route, Evelyn meets six other retirees all bound for this "luxury development for residents in their golden years"

They are cantankerous wheelchair user Muriel (Smith), who is bypassing the NHS waiting lists to undergo a hip replacement abroad, waspish snob Jean (Wilton) and her long-suffering husband Douglas (Bill Nighy), retired judge Graham (Tom Wilkinson), incorrigible ladies' man Norman (Ronald Pickup), and love-hungry spinster Madge (Celia Imrie).

When the exhausted travellers arrive at their destination, they discover a building in disrepair and an inexperienced manager, Sonny (Dev Patel), struggling to keep the creditors off his back.

"I have a dream to outsource old age. And it is not just for the British. There are other countries that hate old age!" he excitedly informs his dubious guests.

The Best Exotic Marigold Hotel is a delight, milking laughter and tears as



characters reach crossroads in their lives. Like The King's Speech, it's a film with appeal across the generations, tapping into universal fears of being forgotten in old age. Dench is the emotional heart, narrating drolly in voice-over, while Wilkinson delivers a beautifully nuanced performance as a man with heartbreaking ties to India.

Imrie and Pickup are delicious comic relief. The former asks at one point: "Aren't you scared about having sex at your age?" Without missing a beat, he replies: "If she dies, she dies!"

Smith is in imperious form as a xenophobic working-class battle-axe, who shuns Indian food in favour of packets of chocolate biscuits because "I don't eat anything I can't pronounce". Age hasn't dulled her rapier wit.





Rear-wheel-driven Toyota out in June

THE price of the long-awaited Toyota GT 86 rear-wheel-drive sports car will start at £24,995 when it goes on sale in June.

The GT 86 and its sister car, the Subaru BRZ, have been developed as the forerunners of a new kind of sports car breed that returns to bygone days, where the power and grip available were in perfect balance.

With motoring costs increasing by the week, the 197bhp GT 86 is designed to offer huge driving enjoyment at a fraction of the cost of less dynamically rewarding opposition.

The entry-level price is on a par with the 207bhp Volkswagen Scirocco GT, but initial reports suggest the GT 86 is a far superior machine for driving enthusiasts.

A six-speed manual gearbox is standard but there is an automatic available if needed. Further details will be announced closer to the launch date but orders are being taken now. • Initial details of the next Vauxhall Astra VXR have been released, including power outputs, top speed and equipment.

The car will be based on the Astra GTC, which has already acquired a reputation for fine handling. Powered by a 276bhp 2.0-litre engine that also pushes out 295lb.ft of torque, its top speed is 155mph, although it's not yet known whether this is organic or limited.

It will feature a mechanical limitedslip differential in conjunction with Vauxhall's HiPerStrut (High Performance Strut) suspension system to create massive cornering grip, and it's safe to assume an attempt will be made on the frontwheel-drive Nurburgring lap record in due course.

Also standard will be the FlexRide adaptive suspension system, which incorporates Sport and VXR buttons in order to offer two different stages of harder, more aggressive damping, steering and throttle response

Two exhausts and a swooping boot spoiler give identity to the rear end, while a revised grille is more aggressive at the front.

The Astra VXR will go on display at the Geneva Motor Show, which opens to the press on March 6.

• Another special edition Mini has been released, following the Baker Street and Bayswater limited runs announced last month.

The convertible Highgate continues the theme of naming cars after fashionable areas of London.

It comes in a metallic brown with a roof and matching bonnet stripes. Unique to the Highgate are 17-inch double-cross-turned alloy wheels, the design of which is apparently inspired by the Union Jack.

A finishing touch comes in the shape of "Highgate" lettering on the side indicator surrounds, door sills and seat tags.




