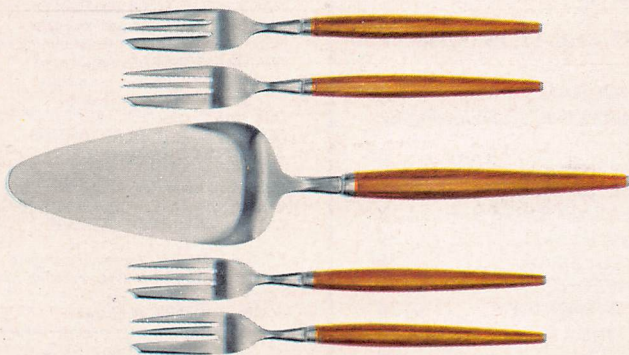

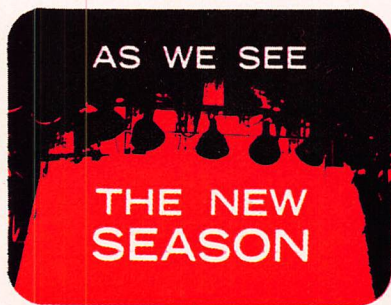

This should be an amusing season. It won't be packed with entertainment innovations or impressive drama or cultural uplift, but by and large it should be amusing.

The trial and error of past seasons apparently has proved to the networks that nighttime hours are most profitably

filled with a week-in, week-out schedule of pure escape—comedy and games and vaudeville and adventure and soap opera. As a result, 97 of the new season's 100 nighttime network programs are escapist; the other three are informational.

Whatever excitement the season holds will be found in the great number of special programs that frequently will pre-empt the regular network schedules. These outstanding documentaries, plays, variety programs and other painstakingly prepared, usually expensive efforts may add high standards of quality and a semblance of balance to the season's schedule. As will coverage of sports and news events.

This season, as always, television will be most satisfying to those who use the on-off knob most discreetly.

Specials and more specials and *still* more specials. That's the real news of the season.

It's these big shows, pre-empting the regular series and their rigid week-in, week-out formats, that provide not only welcome breaks in the viewing routine but, generally, television's most memorable moments.

Since there will be a larger number of entertainment specials this season than in recent ones, chances are there will be more of these memorable moments in the months to come. Add to this the scheduled prodigious output of specials by the networks' news and sports departments, and it does indeed look to be a year of plenty.

THE STARS

Julie Andrews and Gene Kelly are so good in their already taped special—NBC believes—that it is being scheduled twice, on Nov. 28 and March 23.

Harry Belafonte recalls the Harlem of the Twenties for CBS. Guests: Sidney Poitier, Sammy Davis, Diahann Carroll.

Jack Benny, with Bob Hope, starts the first of his two for NBC on Nov. 3.

Charlie Brown of the Schulz cartoon tells the meaning of Christmas (Dec. 9) on CBS. Guests: Lucy, Linus, Snoopy.

Carol Burnett and Zero Mostel forsake Broadway momentarily for a CBS special early in 1966.

Carol Channing and guests—George Burns and David McCallum—on CBS Feb. 18.

Maurice Chevalier celebrates Thanksgiving Day on NBC with an all-Cole Porter musical program. Invited: Robert Goulet and Nancy Ames.

Perry Como cranks up his seven-time soiree for NBC on Oct. 18.

Bob Hope's in again for six variety specials on NBC—interspersed among anthology shows. The first, Sept. 29.

Mary Martin is seen twice on NBC—in an Easter show and her "Peter Pan" perennial Jan. 21.

Barbra Streisand repeats her "My Name Is Barbra" for CBS on Oct. 20, and does a new one for springtime.

Danny Thomas does five for NBC, first on Nov. 8. Among his guests: Lucille Ball, Jerry Lewis, Shirley Jones.

Cinderella reruns on CBS with Ginger Rogers, Walter Pidgeon and Leslie Ann Warren.

Igor Stravinsky talks, conducts, visits with friends—in New York; Bucharest, Romania; in Austin, Texas. On CBS.

Young People's Concerts with Leonard Bernstein. Four times, on CBS.

PARADES, AWARDS, SPECTACLES

Awards include the Emmys (NBC, Sept. 12) and the Oscars (ABC).

Beauty contests include the Miss America (CBS, Sept. 11) and Miss Teen-Age America (CBS, Oct. 29).

NBC presents the Ringling Bros. etc. circus for an hour in November.

Parades: On Thanksgiving NBC and CBS cover New York's; CBS switches to Detroit, Philadelphia and Toronto for more of the same. On New Year's Day it's CBS again at the Cotton Bowl, NBC at the Orange Bowl Festival, and both at Pasadena's Tournament of Roses.

DRAMA

Ages of Man has Sir John Gielgud performing selections from Shakespeare for CBS on Jan. 23 and 30.

Hallmark Hall of Fame has six productions on NBC including "Eagle in a Cage," with Trevor Howard as Napoleon on Oct. 20; "Inherit the Wind," with Melvyn Douglas and Ed Begley (Nov. 18); "Lamp at Midnight," with Douglas as Galileo.

NBC Children's Theatre returns with E. B. White's "Stuart Little" and other productions.

The United Nations drama series: One on the world-wide narcotics traffic and the other on peace-keeping on the India-Pakistani border.

Robert Saudek's cultural specials on CBS study drama, music and dance.

THE WORLD

CBS Reports switches to Tuesdays; alternates with other CBS News shows including at least five *Town Meetings of the World*.

Mrs. Lyndon B. Johnson guides a tour of Washington. ABC, Thanksgiving Day.

The Making of the President: 1964, is scheduled for CBS on Oct. 19.

The National Geographic Society has four specials on CBS. Among them, "The Voyage of the Brigantine Yankee."

NBC White Papers illuminate and assess the great events and issues of our era. The first, on Sept. 19, deals with the decisions resulting in Japan's surrender.

Project 20 on NBC has scheduled documentaries on the Old Testament, the Great Plains Indians and immigration.

This Proud Land on ABC celebrates "the joys and wonders of America," in six specials. The first: Nov. 9. Narrator: Robert Preston.

ABC News plans include six by David Wolper, ranging from teen-agers to professional football; three within John Secondari's *Saga of Western Man*, including one on Beethoven; and at least three each by Robert Drew and Stephen Fleischman.

CBS News: Major scheduled specials include: "The Great Love Affair," about the American male's passion for automobiles; "The Traveling Americans," the U.S. citizen as a mobile animal; and one asking "Is the City Obsolete?" In addition, there will be "instant specials" on hot news subjects.

NBC News plans at least 50 specials this season, not including its "instant specials." Among the topics scheduled: the Reformation; the defeat of the Spanish Armada; the Congo; an appraisal of today's Hungary, and a study of America's teen-agers.

Homework: Both CBS and NBC will seek to involve audiences in programs to determine various skills, aptitudes, political beliefs and even the reading ability of Americans. CBS will have six such programs and NBC five.

AND SPORTS

CBS telecasts National Football League games, NBC the American Football League and NCAA games; all three networks cover the holiday bowl games. In golf, CBS handles the Masters, ABC the Open and PGA. CBS covers the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont Stakes; NBC has the World Series; ABC, baseball games of the week and professional basketball.

Saturday: A Mixed Foursome**Sunday: G-Men and Seamen**

A half-dozen new series have found a home in the weekend schedules. Four move in on Saturdays: a pair of offbeat entries (*Trials of O'Brien* and *Get Smart!*) trying to drown out Lawrence Welk, plus a bottled blonde (*I Dream of Jeannie*) and a Western wanderer (*The Loner*). Just two newcomers have cracked Sunday's lineup: *The FBI*, invading the ratings strongholds of Walt Disney and Ed Sullivan; and *The Wackiest Ship in the Army*, one of the new season's several military comedies.

Perry Mason and *Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea* have switched to Sundays from other time periods. (The chart on page 8 gives you the complete nighttime network lineup—newcomers, returnees and rescheduling—for the week.)

SATURDAY

Get Smart! is a cluck-and-dagger series. The cluck is one Maxwell Smart, known to his friends as Secret Agent 86. Played by dead-pan comedian Don Adams, Smart is an operative for the undercover government agency called CONTROL, which spends most of its time counteracting the schemes of that infamous network of evil, KAOS. Like James Bond and Napoleon Solo, Smart is dapper and fearless, a master of judo, karate and all deadly weapons. He is, in short, the compleat secret agent, except for one small flaw: Smart is stupid. He locks himself in closets, jumps into cars and forgets to close the door, gets stuck in chairs, even has trouble distinguishing men from women. Still, he always manages to foil

KAOS, with the help of outlandish spy gadgets that sometimes work, beautiful Agent 99 (Barbara Feldon) and an insolent dog named Fang. One episode, co-authored by Mel Brooks, involves a dwarf called Mr. Big, a New York Mets' double-header, a plot to blow up the Statue of Liberty, a diabolical weapon called Dante's Inthermo and a scow full of rubber garbage. Some of the plots, on the other hand, are preposterous. Debut: NBC, Sept. 18 (color).

I Dream of Jeannie starts when an astronaut (Larry Hagman) uncorks a bottle, and out pops a dish. The dish (Barbara Eden) announces that she is a genie and, true to her calling, tells her new "master" that his wish is her command. This poor sap, however, says he never touches stuff that comes in bottles. He's already engaged—to the daughter (Karen Sharpe) of his commanding officer (Philip Ober), and, besides, "I could get drummed out of the space program." Any trick any member of TV's exploding population of witches, warlocks, Martians and angels can do, Jeannie can match. And, since she wears the latest in harem fashions, she's bound to enchant at least part of the audience. Debut: NBC, Sept. 18.

The Loner is William Colton, a Civil War hero who, one month after Appomattox, resigns his Union commission and, sick of the brutality of war, heads west—"to get the cannon smoke out of my eyes, the noise out of my ears, maybe some of the pictures out of my head." Colton and the show have been created by Rod Serling, the *Playhouse 90* and *Twilight Zone* émigré, who will also write some of the scripts. His hero is played by another TV veteran, Lloyd Bridges, who switches from *Sea Hunting* for buried treasure to searching for The Meaning of Life. The first search (a Serling script) takes him into a saloon, where a young punk goads him into a gun duel. The Loner won't be all alone during his westward peregrina-

tions. His horse will be with him every step of the way. Debut: CBS, Sept. 18.

Trials of O'Brien introduces a really new lawyer hero to television. O'Brien is about as similar to Lawrence Preston or Perry Mason as Nathan Detroit is to Nathan Hale. Portrayed in whirlwind-dervish style by Peter Falk, he is a craps-shooting, pool-sharking, fast-talking, womanizing con man ("Of course I'm lying. I always lie"). Still, as one character puts it, "When his client's rights are being violated, look out!" His ex-wife (Joanna Barnes) is dunning him for overdue alimony. "If I pay you the alimony," he tells her, "I can't pay the bookies, and if I can't pay the bookies, they'll have me killed." With his remarkable combination of virtues and vices, he lives a rich, full life—and even finds time to practice a little law. Three Broadway and TV veterans—Elaine Stritch, David Burns and Ilka Chase—are regulars in the New York-produced series. Writer Richard Alan Simmons ("The Price of Tomatoes") is executive producer. Debut: CBS, Sept. 18.

SUNDAY

The FBI applies the melodramatic touch of Quinn Martin (*The Untouchables*, *The Fugitive*) to actual cases from the FBI's files. Martin's task is to make the stories dramatic as well as realistic, and the G-Men human as well as infallible. Thus one show is virtually a Western, with the series' hero, Lew Erskine (Efrem Zimbalist Jr.), tracking an Apache fugitive through the desert, on horseback. A running romance—and an accompanying conflict—are also guaranteed: Widower Erskine's daughter (Lynn Loring) is in love with his Bureau assistant, Jim Rhodes (Steve Brooks), but Erskine doesn't want his daughter to marry an FBI agent. Eliot Ness never had problems like that. What sort of man is this Erskine? Rhodes tells us: "I think may-

be this is a man who cares . . . I've disagreed with him more than once. But even when he's stubborn, I think he cares. Maybe that's why he's stubborn . . ." Time will tell whether viewers care. Debut: ABC, Sept. 19 (color).

The Wackiest Ship in the Army is the USS Kiwi, a leaky two-masted schooner which Army Intelligence, in one of its less intelligent moments, decides can help win the war in the Pacific in 1942. The 1871 tub is the joint responsibility of Maj. Simon Butcher (Jack Warden), a pig-headed Army veteran; and Navy Lt. (j.g.) Rip Riddle (Gary Collins), a bit moist behind the ears but no less stubborn than Butcher. Butcher and Riddle gad about the Pacific, snarling at each other, cursing the Kiwi, chasing girls, planting explosives in coconuts, bamboozing dimwitted Japs and generally adding to television's majority view of World War II—a really fun war. Debut: NBC, Sept. 19 (color).

Northern California Edition

Net Assets: While the three major networks have been hatching plans for the new season, National Educational Television—sometimes called “the fourth network”—has also been busy. NET has lined up some 75 specials and several weekly series to keep the Nation’s 95 educational stations well stocked during the months to come. Three of the series survey the history of the Negro, the arts in America, and our cultural and social heritage. Among the specials there are . . . Dramas: “The Old Glory,” Robert Lowell’s award-winning off-Broadway play; plus a number of British imports. Musical productions: recitals by Joan Sutherland and Elisabeth Schwarzkopf; “The Play of Daniel,” performed by the New York Pro Musica; a tribute to Sibelius; a BBC version of “The Mikado”; and numerous concerts. Dance: “Cinderella,” performed by Dame Margot Fonteyn and the Royal Ballet; and “An Hour with José Limon.” Other specials: “The World of Carl Sandburg”; and, from Lincoln Center, a one-act play by Frank Gilroy, presented in dramatic, operatic and dance versions.

More Movies?: The CBS *Thursday Night Movies* begin to unreel this week amid rumors that before long—possibly this winter—CBS will begin a second night of movies. The rumors came bobbing along last week in the wake of a report that the network had purchased 20 additional feature

films, paying \$8,000,000 for a Columbia pictures package. There has been no official confirmation of the deal, but The New York Times reported that CBS executives are now screening Columbia’s films, before making final selections. Among those under consideration are “Dr. Strangelove,” “Under the Yum Yum Tree,” “Bye Bye Birdie” and “Die! Die! My Darling!” and “The Victors.”

Watching the Telly: The British Broadcasting Corporation has conducted a survey of Britons’ viewing habits. After sifting the entries in 2353 diaries placed in viewers’ homes, the BBC reached such conclusions as these: Persons in the 15-to-24 age range watch less telly than those in other groups; on Saturday nights, just after 11 o’clock, male viewership hits a peak. These findings are by no means startling, but how do they explain that last item? Simple: In many areas 11 P.M. is the legal closing hour for the pubs.

Political Note: The producers of *Death Valley Days* are pondering a political problem involving the show’s host, Ronald Reagan. If Reagan announces his candidacy for the Republican nomination for governor of California, as many expect him to, will stations carrying DVD in that state be obliged to give equal time to his opponents? It may take a ruling of the Federal Communications Commission to settle the question. In anticipation, plans are being made to use substitute hosts, at least on the four California stations carrying DVD, during the campaign.

New Feats for Old Hands


Monday's premiering shows—five in number—bring back several TV old-timers in new surroundings: Robert Horton is a man without a memory, and Ben Gazzara a man without hope; John Forsythe has a new girl problem, and Steve Lawrence a show of his own.

Among the returnees, *Dr. Kildare* has moved to Monday nights—Tuesdays, too—in its new twice-weekly, half-hour format. *12 O'clock High* has landed on Monday's runway with Paul Burke as its new leading man. Also joining the Monday lineup is *Hazel*, with new family and new network.

A Man Called Shenandoah stars Robert Horton, the *Wagon Train* drop-out who vowed he'd never again get tied down to a Western series. The Western he's now tied down to is a moody, low-key affair that recounts the adventures of an amnesiac—"a man without a name . . . going from one town to another, hoping someone will look at you and know who you are." Since he wanders around with a pained expression under his cowlick, lots of people look at him, but none of them can quite place him. And, to add insult to amnesia, wherever he goes, they keep shooting at him. Debut: ABC, Sept. 13.


The John Forsythe Show is *Bachelor Father* multiplied by 120. Forsythe's a bachelor again—Air Force Maj. John Foster—but this time he has a whole schoolful of teen-age girls under his care. When the girls first see their dreamy new headmaster, they decide that he's "the greatest thing since the invention of the hot fudge sundae." Their enthusiasm is not reciprocated. To Major Foster, controlling the student body is "like wrestling an octopus in a phone booth." He has lots of help, though, from Ann B. Davis (Bob Cummings' former "Schultzy"), as a teacher; Elsa Lanchester, as Miss Culver, the principal; and Guy Marks, as Foster's assistant. In one episode Miss Culver is smitten with an office-supply salesman, which leads to this exchange among three students: "Golly, I've never seen Miss Culver with a man before!" . . . "Nobody has. It's a mackerel." . . . "Pamela, that's *miracle*—and you're right." *The John Forsythe Show* isn't calculated to achieve any mackerels—just a solid perch in the ratings. Debut: NBC, Sept. 13 (color).

The Legend of Jesse James asserts that Jesse turned bad because he had no choice. The real villain is "the railroad." It is buying up land, and those citizens who don't want to sign on the dotted line face the possibility of being

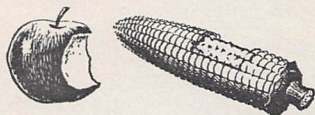
dotted themselves by the bullets of railroad employees, the scraggiest bunch of baddies you'll ever want to see. This is a bit much for even a "peace-lovin' feller" like Jesse. He and his brother Frank buckle on their guns and strike back by robbing trains and giving the proceeds—Robin Hood style—to ranchers who have been bilked. They owe most of their success to the atrocious marksmanship of the posses that chase them. A newcomer, Chris Jones, is Jesse; Allen Case (*The Deputy*), Frank. Debut: ABC, Sept. 13.

Run for Your Life is something of a misnomer. Paul Bryan is running not because his life depends on it but because he knows he's incurably ill and will die within two years. The series proceeds from this bleak premise, with Ben Gazzara (*Arrest and Trial*), as Bryan, looking appropriately lugubrious as he rushes about, trying to "cram a full lifetime into a day—or a minute" (or 52 minutes, plus commercials). Each episode takes him to some new exotic port. Wherever he turns up (He's got some travel agent!) romance and adventure are waiting for him. In a small Mexican fishing village, for example, he encounters (a) a rich divorcée, recently recovered from a suicide attempt, and (b) "the greatest fighting fish in the world." Before moving on to his next port of call, he hooks one from column (a) and one from column (b). If there's a family resemblance to *The Fugitive*, it's no accident—both are the peripatetic brain children of producer Roy Huggins. Debut: NBC, Sept. 13 (color).

The Steve Lawrence Show shapes up as a free-form musical-variety hour, with Lawrence displaying his vocal and comedic talents and welcoming other performers. The format each week depends on Lawrence's guests. Some editions include comedy sketches; others don't. Some may be presented in concert form. Everything, except for a few segments, will be taped in New York.

Usually it will be in color. 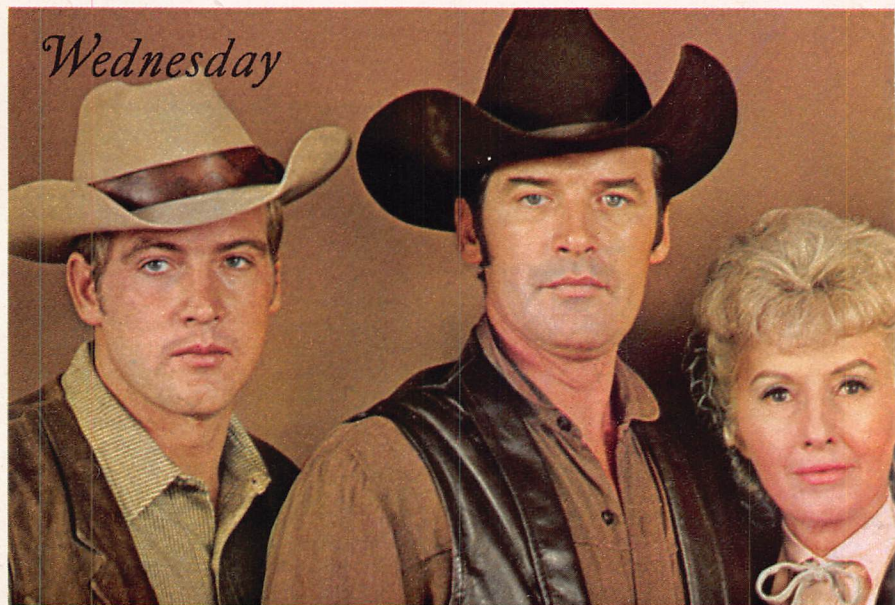

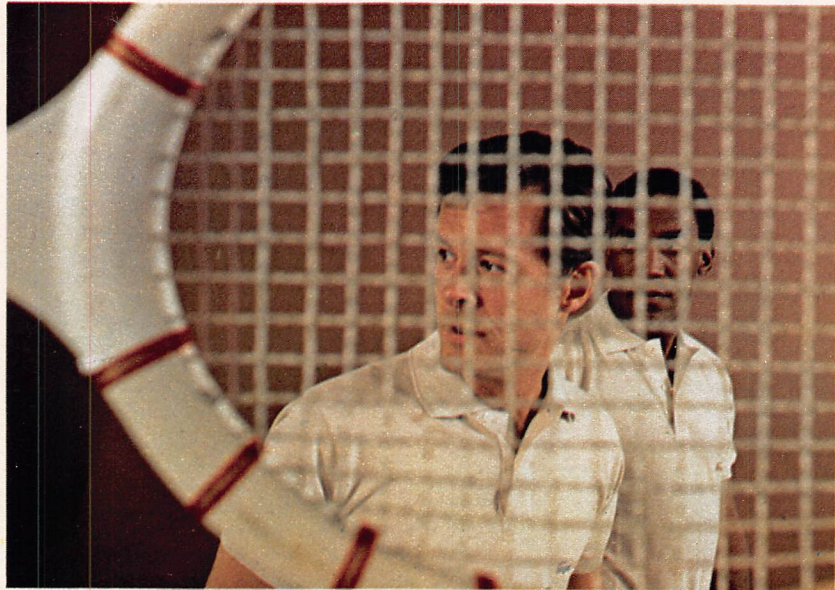

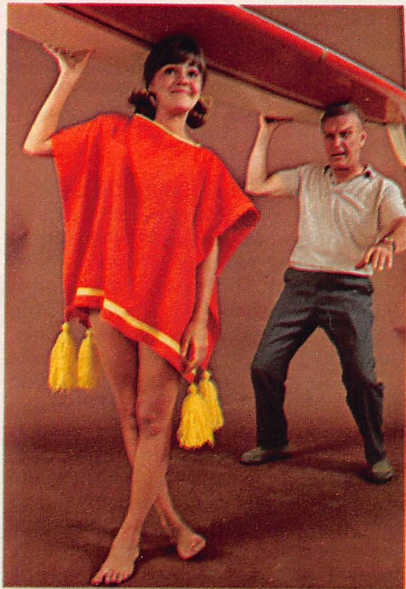

From Gidget in the Surf to Gadgets in Space . . .

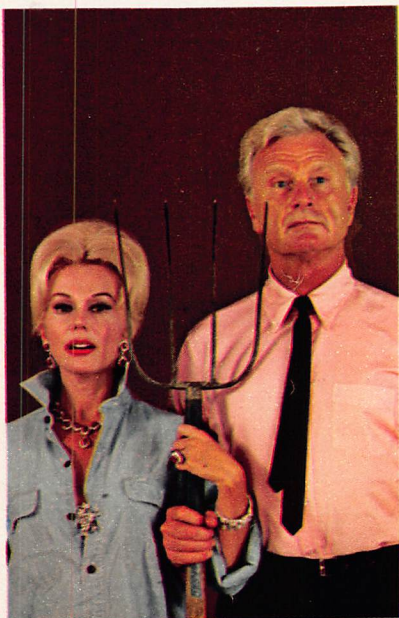
The great outdoors and the far-outdoors get all the play in Wednesday's five new shows. Three of them are adventures (*Lost in Space*, *The Big Valley*, *I Spy*), the other two comedies (*Gidget*, *Green Acres*).

The Big Valley has—well, let's take inventory: a strong-willed matriarch (Barbara Stanwyck), her cool-headed son (Richard Long), hot-headed son (Peter Breck), sensitive son (Charles Briles), and ravishing, impulsive daughter (Linda Evans), and their illegitimate half-brother (Lee Majors). With Pernell Roberts on the lam, that puts this show three up on *Bonanza* before the first

shot is fired. There seems to be everything in *The Big Valley* but a jolly green giant. Debut: ABC, Sept. 15 (color).

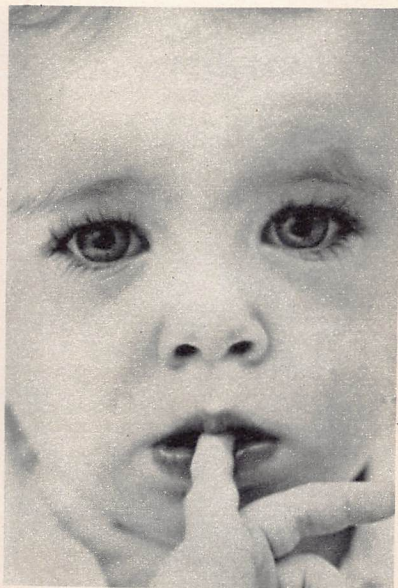
Gidget recounts, in moving detail, the love affair between a girl and her surfboard. Gidget is, as you can plainly see, a typical teen-ager. She talks like this: "For 15½ years, my life was a complete ick. Then I fell in love with Jeff, my moon doggie, and surfing." And, typically, she has a goopy girl friend named Larue, keeps a steamy diary, spends her life at the beach eyeballing vacationing Princeton boys, has a square older sister who's married to a cubed psychiatrist, is motherless but has the wisest, kindest, most understanding daddy in the whole worldsville. Sally Field is appropriately cutie-poo as Gidget, and Don Porter suitably long-suffering as Dads. Debut: ABC, Sept. 15 (color).

Green Acres is another testimonial to the virtues of the simple life by one of North Hollywood's busiest millionaires, Paul Henning (*Beverly Hillbillies*, *Petticoat Junction*). This one is the Counter-Clampett Gambit: City folks move to the country. The folks are Oliver Wendell Douglas, a Park Avenue lawyer who quits the rat race and buys a ramshackle farm; and his wife Lisa, a socialite who thinks the biggest rat in the race is Oliver. Their attitudes are summed up in this exchange—Oliver: "A farm would give me a feeling of accomplishing something. I'd take a seed—a tiny little seed—and I'd plant it in the ground, cover it with dirt, water it, and pretty soon do you know what I'd have?"

Lisa: "A dirty little wet seed." As the Douglasses, Eddie Albert and Eva Gabor plow this comedy furrow for all it's worth. Debut: CBS, Sept. 15 (color).

I Spy combines Clark Kent with James Bond and produces a tennis bum who, in reality, is none other than that deadly American undercover agent, Kelly Robinson. As this one-man Racquet Squad travels hither and yon, hitting backhand smashes and keeping the world safe for democracy, he is accompanied by his trusty trainer-masseur, Alexander (Scotty) Scott, who, *entre nous*, is also an agent and is a Rhodes scholar, fluent in every language from Sanskrit to Hipster. The dauntless duo is portrayed by Robert Culp (*Trackdown*) and Bill Cosby, the stand-up comic. The dialog is flip and the situations almost as far-fetched as the locations—producer Sheldon Leonard is filming all over the world, starting in Hong Kong and Japan. Debut: NBC, Sept. 15 (color).

Lost in Space is, according to the advance publicity, about "an average American family pioneering the frontiers of the future on strange, distant planets." This "average" family is composed of a handsome astrophysicist (Guy Williams); his stunning wife (June Lockhart), who is a biochemist; and their three children, two of whom are precocious (Billy Mumy, Angela Cartwright) and the other voluptuous (Marta Kristen). The year is 1997, and the Robinson family blasts off—nattily attired in silver-lamé space suits—to become the first family to put down stakes up yonder. They are accompanied by a dashing young geologist (Mark Goddard) and by a stowaway who, clearly, is up to no good. Visual effects abound (monsters, storms, ray guns, futuristic machines, etc.) and each episode ends with a cliff-hanger—or crater-hanger, as the case may be—Out There. Produced by Irwin Allen (*Voyage to the Bottom of the Sea*). Debut: CBS, Sept. 15.

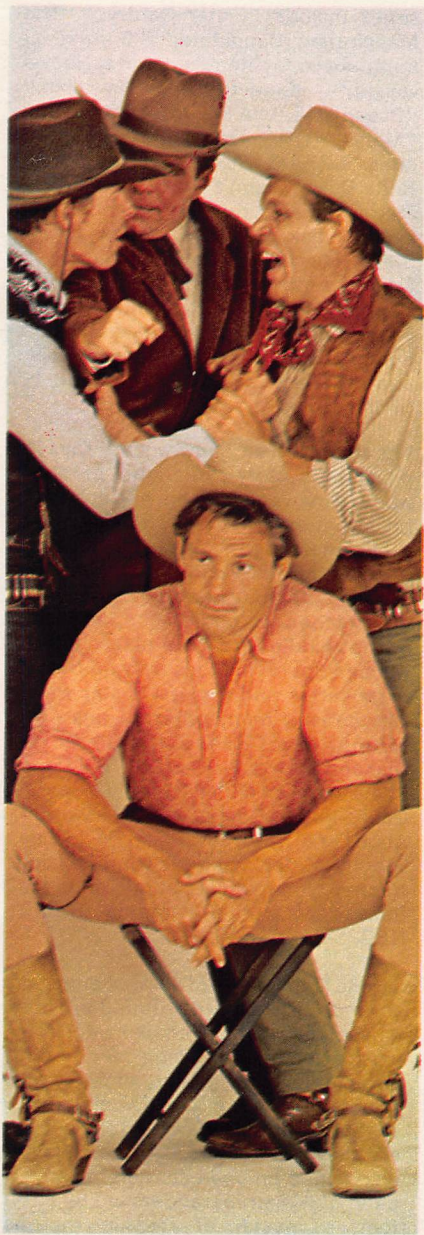

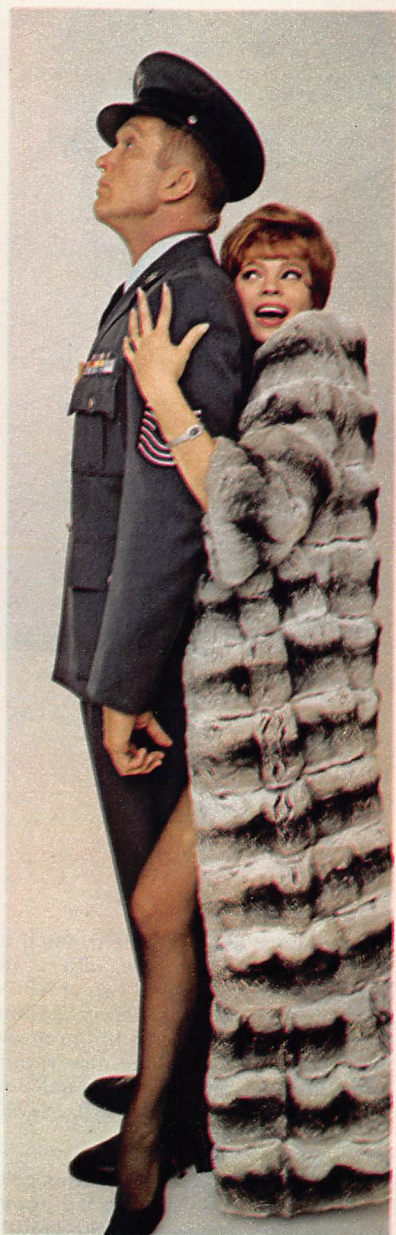

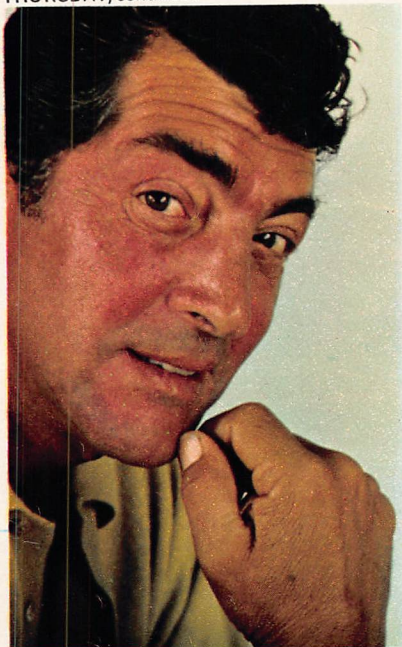

CBS Stockpiles Movies for the Rating War

Thursday ushers in a potent batch of CBS movies to compete with a revamped NBC lineup and two of ABC's biggest drawing cards, *Bewitched* and *Peyton Place*. In addition to the movie bill, there are five other new series, with Dean Martin, Juliet Prowse, Burl Ives, Edmond O'Brien and Neville Brand as the headliners.

The CBS Thursday Night Movies celebrate CBS's capitulation to the prime-time flickers trend. The 30 feature films currently scheduled for this

series include "Elmer Gantry," "The Manchurian Candidate," "Sunrise at Campobello," "Requiem for a Heavyweight," "Gidget Goes Hawaiian," "Ocean's 11," "A Majority of One" and "Mary, Mary." The names are good ones: Richard Burton, Leslie Caron, Bette Davis, Glenn Ford, Greer Garson, Alec Guinness, Burt Lancaster, Janet Leigh, Jack Lemmon, Jerry Lewis, Steve McQueen, David Niven, Kim Novak, Anthony Quinn, Lee Remick, Debbie Reynolds, Rosalind Russell, Jean Simmons, Frank Sinatra, Robert Stack, James Stewart, Spencer Tracy, and on and on. Debut: CBS, Sept. 16 (mostly color).

The Dean Martin Show will be, says its phlegmatic star, "the kind of show where a man can take his wife and kids, his father and mother—and sit around a bar and watch." What they'll see is a taped-in-Hollywood variety hour—songs, patter and stand-up comedy but no sketches, no chorus line, no stools in the middle of a bare stage. Martin will be kept on his toes by a quartet of marionettes and a guest roster which lists, among many others, Louis Armstrong, Pearl Bailey, Milton Berle, Diahann Carroll, Vic Damone, Bill Dana, Eddie Fisher, Ella Fitzgerald, George Gobel, Robert Goulet, Joey Heatherton, Abbe Lane, Carol Lawrence, Peggy Lee, Johnny Mathis, Bob Newhart, Mickey Rooney, John Wayne, and various ambassadors from Ratpackia. Debut: NBC, Sept. 16 (color).

Laredo is the home of a trio of engaging scoundrels who barrel around in Three Musketeers fashion, challenging strangers to gun duels, swilling beer, betting on anything that moves, dallying with saloon girls and, in general, acting like anything but the true-blue Texas Rangers they are supposed to be. They're dispatched on one occasion to catch a band of Indian marauders led by Lazyfoot, a master of redskin rhetoric ("When the sun is high, you will sing a

song of truth"). But they're more interested in double-crossing each other to get their greedy hands on a gold cache. Neville Brand (*The Untouchables*), Peter Brown (*Lawman*) and William Smith (he'll have to change that name) are the rambunctious Rangers, and Philip Carey their exasperated commanding officer. Debut: NBC, Sept. 16 (color).

The Long, Hot Summer is icumen in to steam up your picture tube. It's based on the movie of the same humidity, which claimed ancestry to Faulkner's "The Hamlet." The scene is dusty, sultry Frenchman's Bend, which is known as "Will Varner's town." Into town comes Ben Quick, to challenge Old Man Varner's power ("I'm nobody's boy, Mr. Varner"), fascinate his marriageable daughter ("You filled out nice, Miss Clara") and otherwise stir up the natives sufficiently to keep the plot boiling until a long, hot summer replacement comes along. Varner (Edmond O'Brien) is equally adept at delivering foals and ultimatum, like this one (to Clara): "Tahm was, them Quicks infested this country lahk rodents. Not one of 'em with a dime. But it's said they had a way with women. You stay away from him!" Y'all think she will? Ben is Roy Thinnes, a former resident of *General Hospital*. Others in a large cast include Ruth Roman, Nancy Malone (*Naked City*), Paul Geary and Lana Wood (Natalie's kid sister). Debut: ABC, Sept. 16.

Mona McCluskey is easy on the eyes (Juliet Prowse is in it) but a strain on one's credulity. We are asked to believe that Mona, a big Hollywood star making \$5000 a week, is content to live on the \$500 a month her husband, an Air Force sergeant, brings home. "I do it," says she, "because my husband wants it that way." Home is a two-room apartment, where Sgt. and Mrs. Mike McCluskey live on love and peanut butter, thumbing their noses at The Affluent Society. The task of distracting you from the absurdities of the plot has

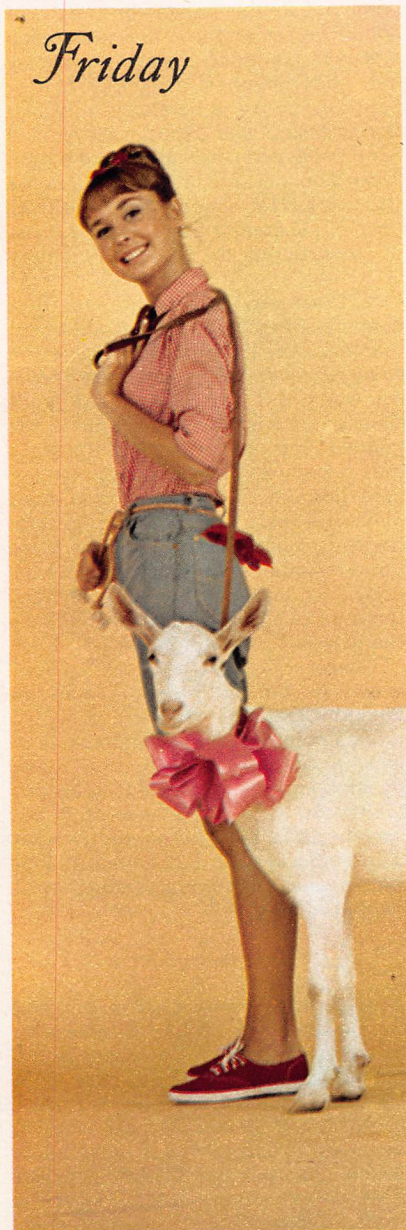
been put in the hands—and legs—of Miss Prowse, who is a delicious Mona and gets plenty of chances to display her underpinnings. The role of her Spartan spouse is acted by muscular Denny Miller, who used to call himself Scott Miller when he was aboard *Wagon Train*. Don McGuire, a veteran TV name dropper (*Hennesey, Don't Call Me Charlie!*), is creator and principal writer of *Mona*. Debut: NBC, Sept. 16 (color).

O.K. Crackerby! stars Burl Ives in a comedy series created by a pair of old masters, Abe Burrows and Cleveland Amory. Crackerby is the richest man in the world, but he's a rough-and-ready Oklahoman who is not welcome in the genteel circle of what he calls "the social mob." He hires a penniless young Harvard graduate, St. John (pronounced *Sin-Jin*) Quincy (Hal Buckley), to tutor his three children (Brooke Adams, Brian Corcoran and Joel Davison). "Somebody," he tells St. John, "gotta teach them those stupid little niceties to help them get in." "In what?" asks St. John. "Society." "What's society?" "Whatever I'm not in," says Crackerby. Though Crackerby can—and does—acquire a hotel within five minutes just by picking up a telephone, his money doesn't impress or repress the uninhibited St. John. They travel from one society playground to another, locked in a battle of wits, but united in their war against snobbery. Debut: ABC, Sept. 16 (color).

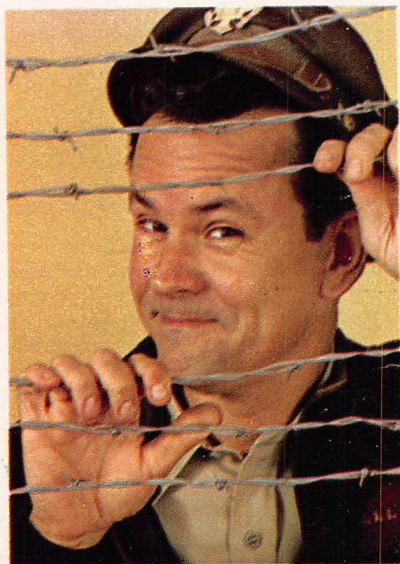

Friday has nine newcomers, more than any other night of the week. NBC's lineup has been renovated completely, with a quartet of untried hopefuls backed up by *The Man from U.N.C.L.E.* in its new time period. CBS has three new ones and ABC two, all of them featuring heroes or heroines with remarkable aptitudes.

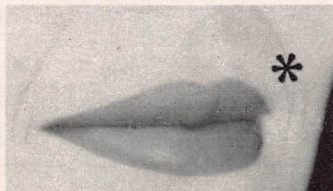
Camp Runamuck is for those who like their comedy low and outside—it's slapstick all the way, set in a boys' summer camp. Runamuck is headed by a man who hates children (Arch Johnson), run by a nincompoop (Dave Ketchum), staffed by assorted nuts and dolts (chiefly Dave Madden and Leonard Stone) and occupied by an army of short-pantsed campers who evidently have been trained by the Viet Cong. Most of one episode is spent running through the woods under a bathtub—with time out for a few bops on the casaba and flops into the lake. Fortunately for male adults whose children may insist on watching this flapdoodle, there is a girls' camp across the lake, one of whose counselors is Caprice Yeudleman (Nina Wayne). Caprice may not know how to put up a pup tent, but she can do wonders for a middy blouse. Debut: NBC, Sept. 17 (color).

Convoy, a seagoing *Wagon Train*, has freighters instead of covered wagons, destroyer escorts instead of scouts, U-boats instead of Indians, torpedoes instead of arrows. Two ships are the center of attention: the destroyer escort DD 181, captained by Cdr. Dan Talbot (John Gavin), who'd rather be doing something more exciting than babysitting for a convoy; and the freighter

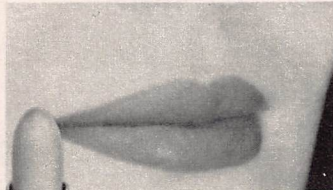
flagship, piloted by merchant Capt. Ben Foster (John Larch), who doesn't always see eye to eye with Talbot. 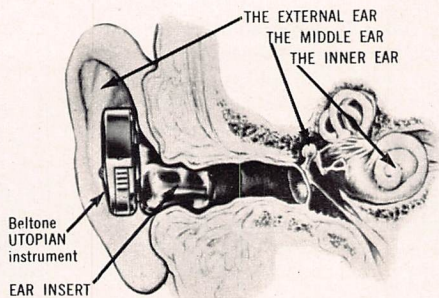

there's Doc (George Ives) and a stir-crazy crew with nothing on their minds except when they'll get liberty and how they can drive the captain out of his mind. Debut: NBC, Sept. 17 (color).

The Smothers Brothers Show is still another exercise in comedy-fantasy. It's built around the unique but indescribable comedy talents of Tom (he's the funny one) and Dick Smothers. Tom is cast as Dick's long-lost brother who returns to earth as an angel, "to help people when they get in jams and stuff." He's the most ineffective angel since Bo Belinsky. His first assignment is to break up a gambling ring, but all he succeeds in doing is breaking up Dick's date with the boss's daughter. Here's some dialog (in a restaurant, where Tom wants to attract Dick's attention)—Dick: "There are better ways of getting a message to a person than putting it in a fortune cookie." Tom: "What'd you want me to put it in, a meat ball?" Dick: "They don't have meat balls in a Polynesian restaurant." Tom (triumphantly): "See!?" This sort of thing comes in half-hour servings. Debut: CBS, Sept. 17.

Tammy opens with our heroine milking a goat. A few minutes later she falls into a pig wallow. She talks like this: "They say I got fast reflexes. It's somethin' y' git borned with, like bein' good with th' haws." You may not believe this, but

Tammy is not written by Noel Coward. As it was in the movies, Tammy's philosophy is: "A friendly smile is better'n gold in a money hole." The swamp girl's fast reflexes (she types at super-sonic speed) and friendly smile (she's seldom without it) win her the job of secretary to a rich plantation owner and bring her into conflict with some of the snootiest folks this side of O. K. *Crackerby!* Debbie Watson, last season's Karen, plays Tammy. In the supporting cast are Donald Woods, Dorothy Green, Denver Pyle and Frank McGrath (*Wagon Train*). Debut: ABC, Sept. 17 (color).

The Wild, Wild West refers to both locale and protagonist. The West of the 1870's is the place, and Jim West is the ace. President Grant calls West "the finest underground intelligence agent we have." He poses as a dude, but up the sleeves of his Sy Devore buckskins he has pop-out guns; another, a tiny derringer, is secreted (in two parts) in the heels of his boots; he has smoke bombs under his holster, a skeleton key behind his lapel, a sword in a pool cue and, no doubt, a man-eating partridge in a pear tree. He is, as you may have gathered, a James Bond on horseback. Robert Conrad (*Hawaiian Eye*) swashes, buckles and dazzles the ladies as West; Ross Martin (*Mr. Lucky*) is his Gabby Hayes. One case pits West against a fat Fu Manchu heavy—not a TV critic—who says things like, "Heh, heh, heh. I find you very amusing, Mr. West." Debut: CBS, Sept. 17.

An even dozen new shows are on the networks' schedules for daytime viewing. Half of them are aimed at housewives, the rest at youngsters.

Three new soap operas will see the light of day (*Morning Star*, NBC; *The Nurses*, based on the nighttime series, ABC; and *Point Paradise*, NBC), two game shows (*Fractured Phrases* and *Let's Play Post Office*, both NBC), and

a talk show (*The Young Set*, ABC).

Five of the children's shows are cartoons (*Atom Ant*, NBC; *The Beatles*, ABC; *Milton the Monster*, ABC; *Secret Squirrel*, NBC; and *Tom and Jerry*, CBS). The sixth (*The First Look*, NBC) introduces moppets to such topics as the UN, jazz, mythology and time.

(All the new daytimers are in color except *The Nurses* and *The Young Set*.)
