

Preface.

THE first Visitation of Hertfordshire and Middlesex was made in 1572 by Cooke, and the second in 1634 by Sir Richard St. George. The original MSS. of these are G 17 and C 28 at the College of Arms.

This Volume contains so much of these two Visitations as relates to Hertfordshire.

Copies of the Hertfordshire portion of the first Visitation are to be found in Harl. MSS. 1433, 1504, 1546, and 6147; and of the second in Harl. MSS. 1504 and 1547. These MSS. contain many additions to the Visitation Pedigrees, which are not repeated in these pages. Harl. MS. 6147 also contains the additional Hertfordshire Pedigrees which are given in Appendix I.; a copy of this MS. is in the Library of Queen's College, Oxford, and has been erroneously called a Visitation of Hertfordshire in 1615 by CAMDEN.

Appendix II. contains Hertfordshire Pedigrees added to Harl. MS. 1546 by R. Mundy.

A few explanatory notes are given in brackets.

The third and last Visitation of Hertfordshire is that of 1669 by Bysshe, D 28 at the College of Arms, of which no copy is known to exist elsewhere.



Rules.

1. This Society shall be called the HARLEIAN SOCIETY.

2. It shall have for its chief object the publication of the Heraldic Visitations of Counties, and any manuscripts relating to Genealogy, Family History, and Heraldry, selected by the Council.

3. The Council shall consist of a President, nine Vice-Presidents, and twelve Members of Council, two of whom shall hold the posts of Secretary and Treasurer; and any four, including the Treasurer or Secretary, shall form a quorum. In case of equality of votes, the Chairman to have a casting vote. Any Candidate may be elected with the consent in writing of one Member of the Council, the Treasurer, and the Secretary.

4. Three Members of the Council shall retire in rotation annually, but shall be eligible for re-election.

5. The Annual Subscription shall be One Guinea, paid in advance, and due on the 1st day of January in each year; and new Members shall pay an Entrance Fee of 10s. 6d. in addition to their first Annual Subscription.

6. Members may at their option subscribe Two Guineas per annum, in which case they will be entitled to the publications of the Register Section of the Society.

7. The funds raised by the Society shall be expended in publishing such works as are selected by the Council; but no payment in money shall be made to any person for editing any work for the Society.

8. One volume at least shall be supplied to the Members every year.

9. An Annual Meeting shall be held in the month of January every year, at such time and place as the Council may direct; and due notice shall be sent to the Members of the Society at least a fortnight previously.

10. No work shall be supplied to any Member unless his Subscription for the year be paid; and any Member not having paid his Subscription for two years, having received notice thereof, shall cease to belong to the Society.

11. No copies of the publications of the Society shall be supplied to persons not actually Members, and each Member shall be restricted to a single Subscription.

12. An account of the receipts and expenses of the Society to be made up to the 31st of December in each year, and published with a list of the Members and the Rules of the Society in the following Volume.

13. These Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual Meeting, and three clear weeks' notice must be given to the Secretary of any such intended alteration.

Report for the Pear 1885.

DURING the year twenty-one Members have joined the Society; twelve have resigned, nine have died, and the names of seven have been removed under Rule X.

Three hundred and sixty-two remain on the Roll of Members, of whom one hundred and seventy-eight are subscribers to the Register Section.

The Volumes which have been issued for the year are—The "Visitation of Dorsetshire in 1623," and the "Visitation of Gloucestershire in 1623."

The "Visitations of Hertfordshire in 1572 and 1634," now in the Press, are almost completed, and will be issued to the Members very shortly.

The Shropshire Pedigrees, comprising the Visitations of 1569, 1584, and 1623, are fully transcribed, and will, it is anticipated, form Two Volumes.

In the Register Section, the Second Volume of the "Registers of St. James, Clerkenwell," has been issued.

The "Register of Marriages at St. George, Hanover Square," Volume I., is in the Press, and in a forward state. The Second Volume is now being transcribed.

The "Registers of Christ Church, Newgate Street," are ready for the Press.

The Accounts for the year are appended to this Report.

The retiring Members of the Council are Messrs. COURTNEY and ELWES, and Sir JOHN MACLEAN.
