## Preface.

In offering a few remarks upon the Heralds' Visitations of the County of Somerset, I will first give the list of the MSS. containing such Visitations, as it appears in Sims's "Manual for the Genealogist and Topographer," p. 173.

Besides the MSS. mentioned above and marked \*, Sims has also indexed B. M. Add. MS. 12,477, which, on p. 219 of his Manual, he describes as containing "pedigrees from the Visitation of Somerset in 1573."

Of the above MSS., the only *original* one outside the College of Arms is in the British Museum and is called Harl. MS. 1141. This MS. has already been edited by Dr. Colby, F.S.A., for the Harleian Society (vol. xi), and it is constantly cited in this book as 1623, that being the date of this Visitation.

The MSS. which I have used in compiling this book are Add. MS. 14,315 and Harl. MSS. 1385, 1445, 1559.

MS. 1385 is a beautiful copy of the 1573 Visitation. MS. 1445 has as its title, printed on the back, "The Visitations of Somerset in 1623 and 1565 (*sic*)," the older Visitation being placed at the end. A copy of this MS. was made by Rev. T. Leman, and was left under his will to the Library of the Literary and Scientific Institution at Bath. There it came under my notice, and I copied it for my own use, and this was the beginning of the present work.

The Rev. T. Leman, M.A., F.A.S., was born in 1751 and was Chancellor of Cloyne. He was an ardent genealogist, as several beautifully written MSS. at Bath, containing Visitations of Somerset, Devon, Gloucestershire, Yorkshire, and other counties, sufficiently testify. A note in pencil in the Gloucestershire volume is worth recording:—

"29 Ap. 1822, at the age of 71, I begin this imperfect collection for the County of Gloucester, taken from a copy of Holland's lent me by the Revd. Mr. Lysons."

In some cases the pedigrees are brought down by Mr. Leman to the middle or end of the eighteenth century.

The county of Dorset was visited in 1565, Devon in 1564; and, as the West of England was usually taken together, the Visitation of Somerset may have been commenced in 1565 and finished in 1573; but it is not a little remarkable that this so called 1565 Visitation contains ten pedigrees, not to be found in MS. 1385, which is my authority for the 1573 Visitation.<sup>1</sup> These are—

1. Beresford of Taunton.
2. Bratton of Bratton.
3. Gourney of E. Harptree.
4. Newton of E. Harptree.
5. Palton of Palton.
6. Pauncefoote of Compton Pauncefoote.

8. Raleigh of Nettlecombe.

Others which are given in Sims's Index are really only portions of the above pedigrees.

The body of this book is taken from Mr. Leman's copy of MS. 1445, and variations from it, as they appear in the 1573 Visitation, are denoted by brackets. Thus, on p. 13, [Birchleighe] shows that MS. 1385 has this reading instead of Burckley, which is found in MS. 1445. Occasionally the same brackets are used to show where a place may be found, as on p. 11, Fowell's Comb [in Ugborough, Devon]. Where the parish is not given, I have either been unable to find the place on the Ordnance Map, or else the place itself is a parish and can be found in a Directory of the county in which it is situate.

MS. 1559 is Richard Mundy's amalgamation of the Visitations of 1573, 1591 and 1623. There is a series of such MSS. by Mundy in the British Museum. They are not Visitations properly so called, but are nevertheless of great value. More than fifty pedigrees "peculiar" to MS. 1559 are given in Part II. In this Harl. MS. the pedigrees are often very long, and are made up of several different families or branches of the same family belonging to different counties. Parts of these have already been printed in the Visitations of other counties and in the eleventh volume of the Harleian Society's Publications, which contains, as has been said, 1623 Visitation of Somerset.

My object in giving these pedigrees in Part II. is to print what has not been printed before; but it is only right to caution the reader that more information is often to be found in the original MS., and to recommend him to consult it for those families which are marked with an asterisk in Part II. To print the whole of MS. 1559 formed no part of my original design, as stated in the prospectus, which was simply to give the Visitations of 1531 and 1573.

It remains to speak of Add. MS. 14,315, which is a transcript of the 1531, or first, Visitation of this county. It contains the Arms of Bruton

Monastery, and the following twenty-one pedigrees, of which at least three properly belong to other counties.

The MS. contains pedigrees of Cornwall, Devon, Dorset, and Somerset, and there is no defined division between the counties. Somerset begins at p. 130 of the MS.

I have placed a note at the foot of each pedigree to say that it (or part of it) is contained in this, the earliest Visitation.

The only pedigree which is peculiar to MS. 1385 is that of English of Puddimore Milton, from co. Wilts, but according to Sims, the following eleven *portions* of pedigrees are to be found only in that MS.

With regard to names of places, wherever it appeared necessary and identification was possible, the *modern* is added in brackets after the *old* spelling, but not in cases where it seemed sufficiently obvious, as Porscuet (Portskewet), p. 20. In the Index of Places the modern spelling is given, as being more convenient for reference.

<sup>1</sup> N.B.—In Sims' Index, p. 215 (Add. MS. 14,315, p. 132), Blenet of Evenham should be Blewet of Grenham. This well illustrates the kind of error which should be guarded against, for sometimes the supposed family only owes its existence to a misprint or misreading of the original; e.g., Sims' Index, p. 117 (Hants), *Kingwood* of Credistowe should be *Ringwood*, a family which is given correctly on page 118. (Credilstow or East Mill is in Fordingbridge).

The references to Hutchins' Dorset are to the third edition. Mr. Greenfield kindly lent me his copy of Sir Thomas Phillipps's Visitations of Somerset, a very scarce book, of which there is no copy in the British Museum.

A word of caution is perhaps necessary as to the reliance to be placed on all Heralds' Visitations; it is constantly found when information is obtainable from other sources (such as wills, &c.) that the Visitations are full of errors, generations being missed out, a father and son represented as brothers, &c. And perhaps it is not too much to say that they cannot be relied upon beyond the grandfather of the "Armiger" who was cited to the Visitation; but when all is said, they still remain a valuable (and sometimes the only) clue to a gentle family, whose name now perhaps only exists as that of a remote farm house.

The old *place* knows them no more, but—

"Semper honor, nomenque tuum laudesque manebunt."

It is with the hope of rescuing some forgotten names, and of adding something to the antiquarian lore of the beautiful West of England, that I now commend my book to a Public, both in England and America, which is daily becoming fonder and fonder of genealogical studies.
