

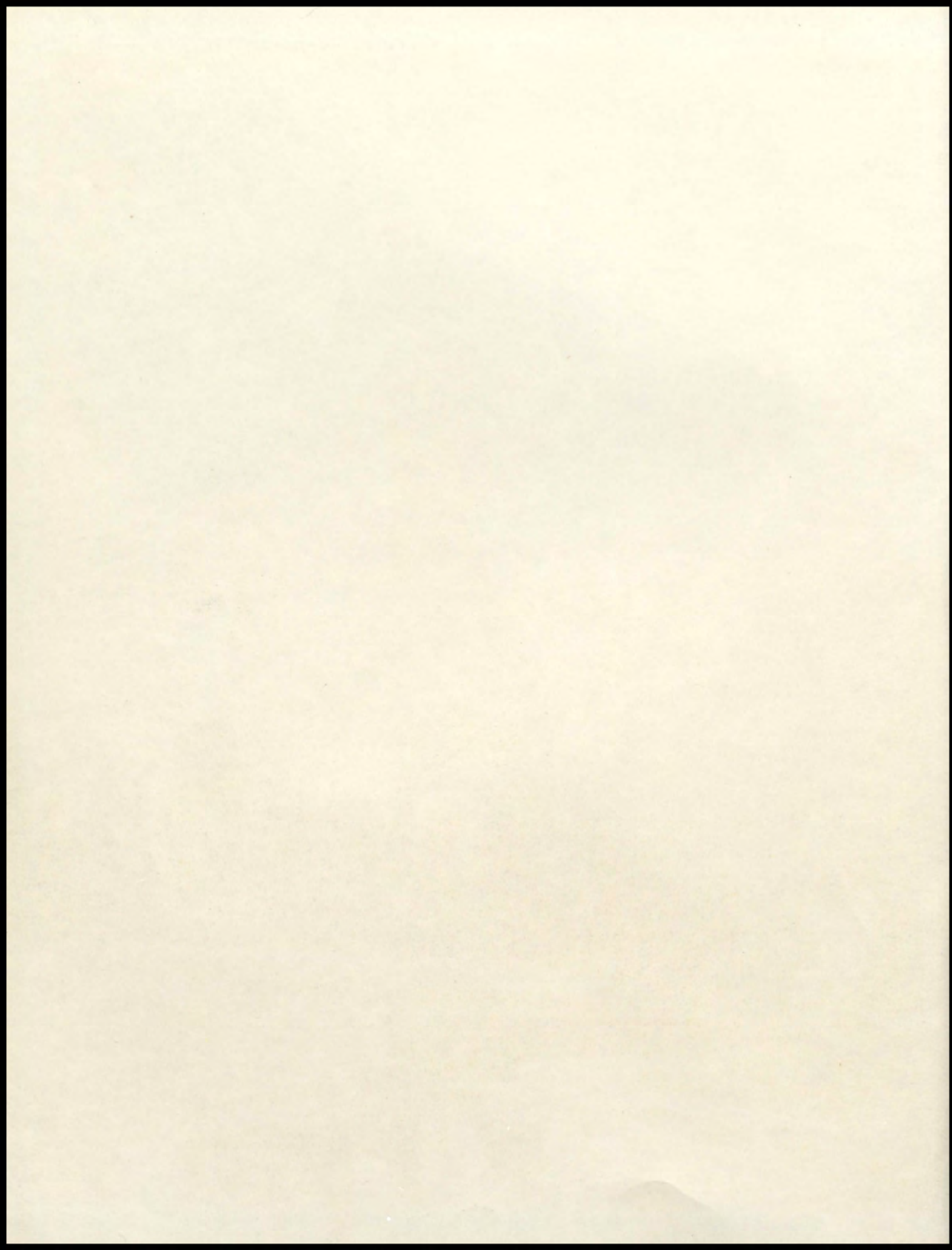

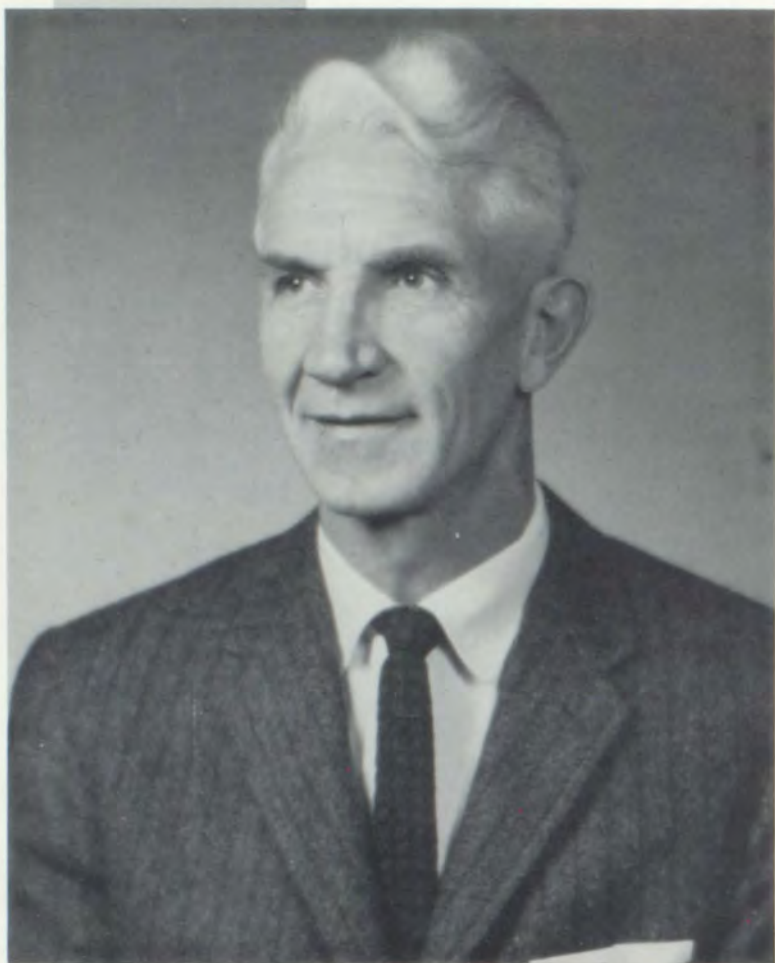

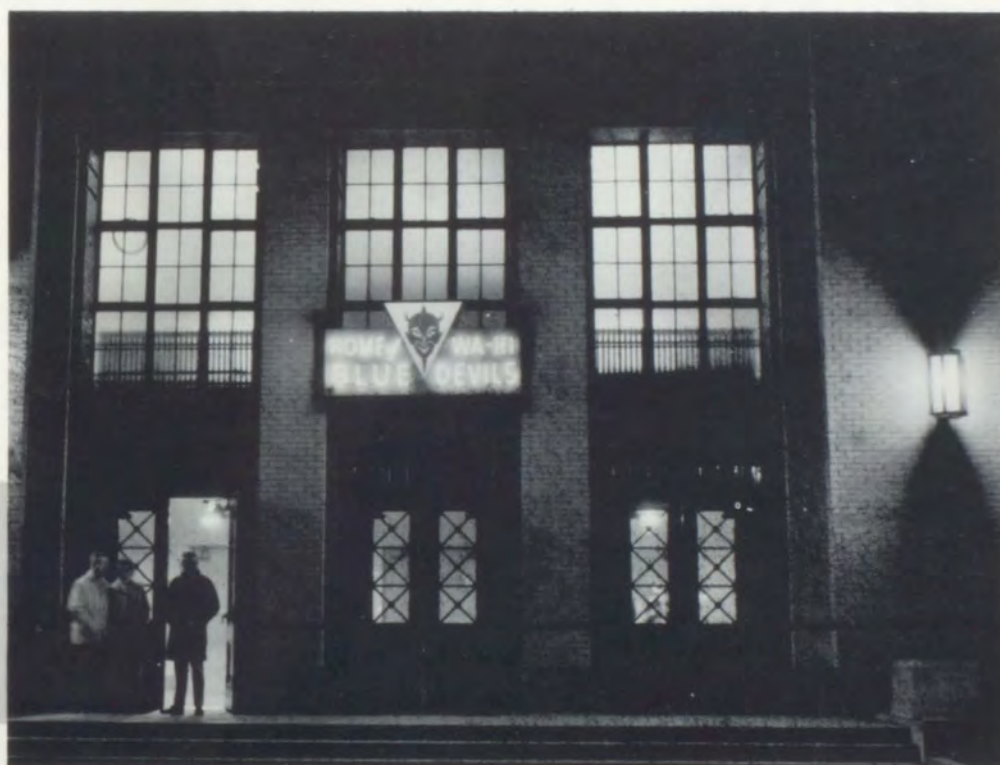
In his twenty years at Wa-Hi he has taught woodshop, algebra and mechanical drawing, also.

The winter months kept the girls inside for basketball, volleyball and badminton. For the first time in three years, co-educational dancing was taught.

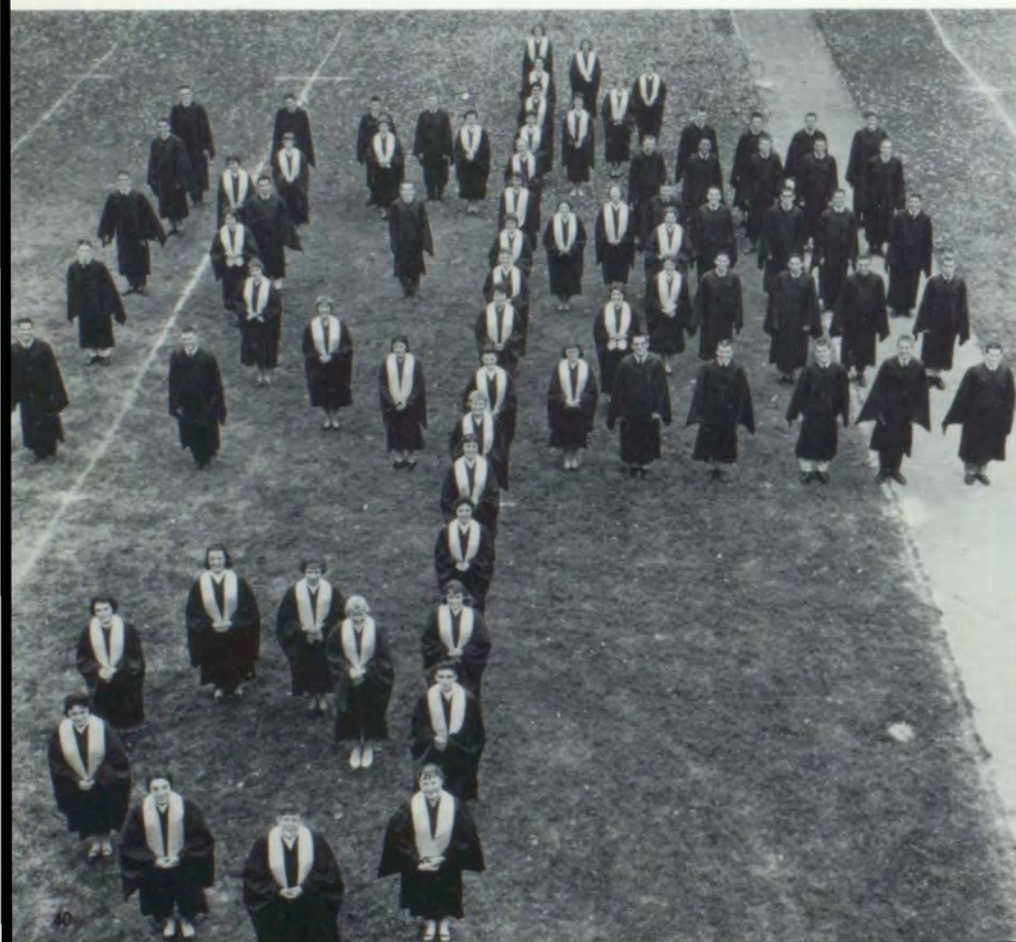
Spring found the girls outside for tennis, softball and track, which is a relatively new sport for the girls at Wa-Hi.

The 1961 track season was opened with the Mac-Hi Carnival of Speed, where Bill Wallingford was Wa-Hi's only first-place winner. The first official meet was a triangular one with Kennewick winning by 60 points to Wa-Hi's 44 and Richland's 39. John Nelson was high-point man, earning 12 with firsts in the high-jump and the high hurdles, and a third in the low hurdles. We next scored 56 points in the Wa-Hi Relays to tie favored Pendleton for first place. Wallingford on the javelin, and Kerns, Currie, Duncan, and Miller in three relays, added greatly to our success.

In the Davis Invitational at Yakima, Wa-Hi placed third out of a field of six teams, behind Davis and Wenatchee. Wa-Hi defeated Pasco 68-59 in a dual meet, with Currie winning the 100, 200, broad-jump, and running on the 880 relay to earn 16¼ points. Wa-Hi was in turn defeated 74-53 in a dual meet with Richland. Highlights of the meet were Wallingford's record javelin throw of 207'5" and Duncan's record-breaking :52.7 in the 440.

Wa-Hi won the District meet and qualified the following boys for the Tri-District meet at Spokane: Currie, Miller, Duncan, Kerns, Oldfield,

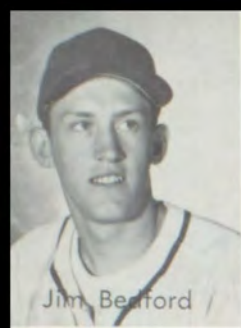


Scruggs, Nelson, Lane, May, Folsom, Irving, Glover, Eagon, and Wallingford. At Spokane Wa-Hi scored 40 points and placed fourth in a field of 19 teams. Blue Devils qualifying for the State meet were Eagon on the discus, Nelson in the high-jump, and Wallingford.

In the State meet at Pullman, Wallingford won the first championship by a Blue Devil in several years with a 191'5½" javelin throw.

Other highlights of the season were Oldfield's 2:00.8 in the half-mile at Tri-District, and the development of sophomores Scruggs in the mile and McDonald in the hurdles.





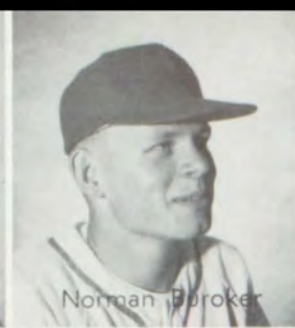
