
The surrounding foothills and trees of the Walla Walla valley frame our beautiful Wa-Hi campus.







The Wa-Hi Student Court consists of five justices who hear testimony on cases brought before the Court and reach a verdict, a secretary who keeps court records, and a bailiff who keeps order in the court room. The chief justice receives all cases, summons all defendants, subpoenas witnesses, schedules court sessions, and presides over the court.



and defeated them 20-0. Denny King made a good showing for the Blue Devils.






Girls' Track













