Russell Larsen was born in Spokane, but he has spent most of his life in Walla Walla. His interest in music began early when he started taking private clarinet lessons at the Whitman Conservatory during the sixth grade. He attended Walla Walla High School and took an active part in the band as the student conductor.

He graduated from Eastern Washington State College with a BA in music and later received his Masters from Washington State University. He continued to perform with groups during his army service and also attended the Rochester School of Music in New York.

He came to Walla Walla in 1949 to be the director for the Walla Walla High School band and supervisor of music. In recent years, he has taken the band to two music educators' state conventions and one AllNorthwest convention in Missoula, where the band received a standing ovation.

Mr. Larsen has been a long time member of the Community Concert Board, of which he is currently vice president. He is the Area Coordinator of Seattle Symphony School Concerts and is a member of the State Music Advisory Board. This year, he is the AllState Band Organizer for Washington State Music Educators' Association. He is a member of Phi Delta Kappa and Phi Mu Alpha, music honorary.

Starting the season with 14 lettermen and 3 starters, the Devils comprised a respectable 6-3 season and finished third in the Big 8. Coach Fletcher, who is in his 23 rd year as coach, had to rely on inexperience.

Pairing against Pasco in the Jamboree, Wa-Hi figured to have an evenly matched game, but the Devil defense took over from the start with Kevin Scribner recovering a fumble for a TD. From then on, Pasco was on the losing side. Interceptions by Jim Oury and Doug Filan and Filan's going for a TD spurred on the offense. Don Hanson, on the second half kickoff, stole the ball and ran for a score. All told, it was an unexpected $34-0 \mathrm{win}$.

The Devils next took on Pendleton, ranked 9th in Oregon. Led by linebackers Mark Thompson and Don Hanson, the defense kept it a $0-0$ tie at the half. The Big Blues came back out and won 22-8. Dan McCauley and Oury played good defense at defensive halfback with the offensive punch coming from Dave Bateman and Joe Moreno.

With the season standing at 2-0, the Blue Devils were
ready to take on usually easy Kennewick. It turned out to be the toughest and most satisfying game of the year. In the first 3 quarters, the defense had their problems, but they still managed to hold the score to 13 Kennewick to $7 \mathrm{Wa}-\mathrm{Hi}$. Then Lon Wyrick, defensive guard, led the charge. The offensive line, led by Dave Parson, gave quarterbacks Oury and Mike Mitchell needed time to throw. A pass to Bateman made it 1313. The big break came when Gary LeValley and Mike Minnich teamed up on a blocked punt. With 28 seconds, Dave Veley won it with a 21 yard field goal. Kennewick went on to tie for the league championship.

Eisenhower was next. It was a 7-0 squeaker, with outstanding defensive play coming from Frank Hanson and Chuck Eisele. A 65 yard pass play from Oury to Filan cashed in on the score.

It couldn't have been done without the help of the front line, especially guard Jay Gehrett. The defense seemed to be back to its old ways-21-8 Wa-Hi. Standing tall and blind to the idea of a loss, the Big Blue stubbed its toe on Pasco. There is nothing to say except that Wa-Hi lost 12-6.

The season finale against Richland proved to be another story. Chuck Eisele helped boost the spirit in more ways than one. Mitchell played a good game in his first start of the season. While Oury played fullback, Ron Lentz, who came on strong at the last of the season, Taylor, McCauley, Bateman, and Scribner had good defensive games. It was a great way to end the season with a $28-6$ victory.

At the conclusion of the season, guard Mark Thompson and defensive halfback Jim Oury were named to the Big 8 all-conference team. Defensive end Kevin Scribner, tackle Randy Taylor and halfback Dave Bateman were given honorable mention. The annual fall sports banquet highlighted the 1969-70 football season with Washington State's head coach, Jim Sweeny, as the guest speaker. The Blue Devils opened their 1969-70 season with non-league victories over Pendleton and Hermiston. Then, bouncing off loss to Pendleton, The Devils trounced LaGrande by 14 points and outgunned Rogers of Spokane 77-68. The three Gregs- Jewell, Fink, and Garland-did most of the damage as they hit for 27,19, and 16 points respectively. Hermiston became Wa-Hi's final preseason victim as the Devils bombed them by 30 points.

The league opener against Wenatchee was won by Wa-Hi, 66-48. Greg Jewell, captured game honors with 19 points followed by Gregg Garland with 17. The four game win streak was halted as the Pasco Bulldogs downed the Devils 75-58. The next evening saw the Davis Pirates come out on the short end of a 77-44 verdict. Wa-Hi then beat Richland by 6 points in the Devil's Den. Following an 86-81 loss to Moses Lake, a few last minute heroics were needed to stop the Kennewick Lions $53-50$. Clutch shooting by Jewell, Garland, and junior guard Mike Mitchell pulled the game out of the fire. Wa-Hi then rolled over Eisenhower 70-60. Junior Mike Minnich came off the bench to play an important roll in the victory.

Wa-Hi again became a victim of the Bulldogs 68-52 for their only home-court defeat. Fink, a transfer from Kennewick, pumped in 21 points. However, the Devils managed to hang onto second place by ripping Davis 81-58. Balanced scoring was the key as Mitchell led with 22 points followed by Jewell with 16. Both Fink and Jim Oury chipped in 15 each. The Devils then downed the Bombers 79-78 in a thriller. It was the first time in 15 years that a Wa-Hi team has won in Richland's gym. Jewell topped scoring with 27 points. Fink followed with 19 while Garland contributed 18 to the assault. Next Wa-Hi avenged an earlier loss to Moses Lake by pounding the Chiefs 77-46. The Big Blue lost to Kennewick by 6 and to Wenatchee by 1, but sandwiched a 25 point win over Eisenhower between. This left the Blue Devils in second place in the Big Eight Conference with an impressive 14-6 season record and a 9-5 league record.

The District tournament began on a high note as the Devils shot down Richland 79-68. Wa-Hi then challenged number one ranked Pasco for the league title and a chance to advance to the Regional tournament in Spokane; but, despite a tough defense, the Devils lost to the Bulldogs 59-49. In the final tournament game Wa-Hi bowed to Richland 71-51, losing all hopes of a Regional berth.

The Blue Devils finished with a $15-8$ season total and placed Jewell and Fink on the "Big Eight" All-star team. Garland was picked for honorable mention. Jewell ended his Wa-Hi career with an average of 15.6 points per game followed by Fink with a 15.2 . With Jewell, Garland and Oury the only seniors, next season should be a promising one. Juniors Mike Minnich, Doug Filan, Mike Wagoner, Tom Jessee, and Randy Barton were also in the action.
