Hirst's art sees visits to gallery up by 20pc

THE number of visitors to Walsall Art Gallery has soared by nearly 20 per cent as people flocked to see an exhibition by controversial artist Damien Hirst.

A total of 235,938 people packed into the £21 million renue during the year-long display – up 18 per cent on the same period the previous year.

Gallery bosses said the Hirst exhibition had proved to be one of their most successful displays, running from October 6, 2012 to October 27 this year.

Gallery director Stephen Snoddy said: "This large increase in attendance figures fully demonstrates that it pays off to be ambitious in our exhibition planning and that the people of the West Midlands have a real interest in contemporary art alongside our marvellous Garman Ryan Councillor Anthony Harris, cabinet member for leisure and culture at Walsall Council, said: "We're absolutely delighted by the news that the Damien Hirst exhibition has been such a huge success."

The exhibition included major works spanning the whole of Hirst's career including a self-portrait With Dead Head from 1991 and 1994's Away from the Flock, showing a lamb in a tank of formaldehyde.

£46k raised is new record

THE Mayor of Walsall has smashed the record for fundraising for mayoral charities and has so far raised over \$46,000.
Councillor Mohammed Nazir is raising money for the St Giles Hospice and Midland International Aid Trust that works with parents and children in the developing world.
Councillor Garry Perry previously held the fundraising record for the mayor's charity appeal when he raised a total of \$41,548 during his term in office.

HREAT TO HEALTH SERVICES IN CUTS

IMPORTANT health services in Walsall are under threat. say chiefs who have written to council bosses concerned at the impact of millions of pounds in budget cuts.

Walsall Healthcare NHS Trust is concerned about savings on shortterm residential home placements and children's services as part of the authority's proposed cutbacks. Chief executive Richard Kirby has now asked Walsall Council for more infor-

mation so bosses can respond as part of the consultation exercise.

Club dancers are stabbed with needle

TWO women were stabbed with a needle in a nightclub in Walsall as they danced together, police have revealed. The attack on the revellers at Revolution Vodka Bar in Bridge Street mirrors a spate of stabbings in Birmingham in recent months.

The women felt a sharp pain in their upper arm while they were dancing and both believed they had been stabbed by a needle. Their injuries led police to launch an investigation into the attacks.

It comes after up to 11 women were targeted in Birmingham city centre in recent months. Police last month released CCTV of a man they believed was behind the stabbings in Birmingham's Broad Street nightspot. Officers were originally investigating five attacks – but they then received reports of a further six.

Police insist they do not believe the latest stabbings are related to the Birmingham attacks. They are now appealing for witnesses to come forward. De Lynsey Damms, from Bloxwich police station, said: "Police in Walsall are investigating two reports of women who were assaulted with what they believe may have been needles while in a Walsall bar. The women were dancing when they felt a sharp pain in the upper arm."

The cash-strapped authority needs to save £19 million in the next final year with more than 330 posts earmarked for the axe.

In the letter to council chief executive Paul Sheehan, Mr Kirby said he was aware of the financial challenges facing the council. Although in support of some of the proposed budget allocation, representatives of the health trust will be meeting the council for further clarification.

"As you might expect we strongly support the decision to protect the intermediate care services currently provided by the council as far as possible," Mr Kirby said. "It will be more important than ever that these services are able to support people to remain in or return to their own homes as effectively as possible.

"We note your proposal to save £1.5m by reducing short-term residential home placements and reducing use of domiciliary care. There are a number of proposed savings that relate to children's services.

"The size of the planmed reduction on children's centre spending is particularly important in this context. We understand the scale of the task facing the council but there are a number of savings proposals that could have a very significant impact on the work of the trust about which we do not yet have sufficient information."

children's centres, where £930,000 will be

Schools could be forced to pay the wages of the 82 crossing patrol workers across the borough. And though bosses have admitted schools could end up withdrawing the patrols, they insist that the cuts are necessary. The proposals have angered Labour opposition deputy leader Councillor Sean Coughlan, who is chairman of governors at Fibbersley Park Parimary in Willenhall.

Waisall Council transport boss Councillor Adrian Andrew said: "This is some-ching we are looking at to share the burden. What we don't want to do is cut lol-lipop services like other areas have done."

The crossing patrols are currently funded by Walsall Council but bosses are looking to make schools pay instead to save 285,000.
Councillor Coughlan said schools were concerned about whether they would be able to afford the wages.
He said: "As a chairman of governors I think Councillor Andrew's words are irresponsible. He knows the pressures that schools are under with decreasing budgets." He added he hoped council chiefs would have a rethink.

Respected journalist Dave dies, aged 61



A RESPECTED journalist who spent more than three decades covering the area where he grew up has died suddenly.

Dave Lawley was 61, and was renowned for his brilliant sense of humour.

A grandfather-of-one, he began his career on the Warley News Telephone, followed by a brief spell on The Evening Mail in Birmingham before

'larger-than-life character'. His wife Hilary, to whom he had been married for 39 years, said: "Almost all of the time, he was joking around. He was a really good family man and adored his daughter Rebecca.

"His grand-daughter Isabelle was the light of his life and, talking to everybody else, he loved me to bits." Former Express & Star chief reporter Ken Tudor, who worked with

Mr Lawley for many years, said: "He was such a funny man with an amazing brain."

The Home Office has said his continued ties to America and the length of time he has lived here do not meet requirememtns.

Texas-born Mr Morris has been forced to stand down from his job with the risk of leaving the UK imminently, prompting his team of solicitors to now directly appeal to Theresa May to allow him to remain and continue with his work. He moved to the UK in 2006 and studied at Birmingham University

Bland wooden boards have been transformed by a collection of talented artists, adding a dash of colour to the setting.

Other striking images include a bluewash picture of a woman running her hand playfully through her flowing locks as she gazes out from the board, and the artist has incorporated images in her body and clothing such as San Francisco's Golden Gate Bridge. Another picture depicts a woman's face, with her eye covered by a blue rectangle.

Paul, who is known as Pilgrim, said each artist has their own style and current trends provide inspiration. "It depends on

Whitter, of Rose Hill Gardens, Willenhall, has been jailed for three years and eight months after admitting robbery.

Massive haul of drugs was 'packed to order'

FOLLOWING the discovery of one of the largest hauls ever uncovered in the West Midlands, detectives this week have said it was 'packed to order' ready for shipment.

Almost two tons of cocaine, cannabis and ecstasy was uncovered at Maybrook industrial estate in by Lisa O'Brien Brownhills

Brownhills.

The drugs, worth up to £30 million, were being unloaded when a 30-strong police squad struck. It was one of the largest seizures ever made by West Midlands Police and included 120 1lb

Police and included 120 Ilb
bags of camnabis, five 1kg
bricks of cocaine and 50 1kg
bags of MDMA, which is also
known as ecstasy.

Detective Sergeant Carl
Russell, from Force CID,
today said the impact of the
discovery could not be

drug dealing in the region
and the UK as a whole.

He said: "This is the
largest seizure of drugs I
have secured in my 24-year

The operation resulted in
two men, aged 50 and 53,
from Brownhills, being arrested on suspicion of supplying a controlled drug along

Dementia diagnosis is one of lowest in UK

WALSALL is one of two areas of the West

WALSALL is one of two areas of the West Midlands to have been named and shamed as being among the worst 10 parts of the country for the diagnosis of dementia.

In Walsall, diagnosis is as low as 37.2 per cent while the Stafford figure is even worse at just 36.4 per cent, this compares to some parts of the country where diagniosis rates are above 70 per cent.

The figures were released as it was revealed that fewer than half of people suffering from dementia are being formally diagnosed because doctors fear stigmatising

diagnosed because doctors fear stigmatising their patients, according to the Health Sec-

Jeremy Hunt's 'dementia map' of England showed that in some areas, fewer than four in every 10 dementia sufferers have their condition recognised by the NHS. The disclosure comes as the Government begins a campaign to boost diagnosis rates, which will include Britain leading a Group of Eight conference on the issue next month. The Department of Health estimates that 670,000 people in England are suffering from dementia.

However, only 319,000 have been diagnosed, NHS figures show. Overall, 48 per cent of the estimated dementia cases are being formally recognised by the NHS.

as 7b per cent. But in the worst performing areas, it falls to 39 per cent. Mr Hunt said he was disclosing the diag-nosis rates in an effort to drive up standards and end what campaigners have called a postcode lottery in the treatment of dementia sufferers.

Challenges

The figure is expected to pass the million mark in the UK alone by the end of 2020. Mr Hunt said: "Dementia is one of the biggest challenges we face as a nation. "This report and map will help drive up standards of dementia care across the country by showing what excellent care looks like, and challenging the rest to become like the best."

But shadow minister for care and older people Liz Kendall said: "If David Cameron was serious about improving the quality of dementia care, he would not have cut council budgets for older people's social care to the bone."

Ben carries on after staring death in the face at just 22

"IT BRINGS home a sense of your own mortality when a friend dies in vour arms.

He is just 22. But as a member of the Armed Forces serving Queen and country, Ben Jones has stared death

country, Ben Jones has stared death straight in the face more than once. Driven at by a suicide bomber and coming under fire from a Taliban marksman, the senior aircraftman reveals his story of life on the front line in Afghanistan.

Ben, of II Squadron Royal Air Force Regiment, recently completed his final tour of duty after suffering serious leg injuries on active service in Helmand Province.

He suffered a broken left thigh, dislocated knee and torn tendons during an attack near

He suffered a broken left thigh, dislocated knee and torn tendons during an attack near Camp Bastion on September 30.

Ben, who grew up in Willenhall, recalled how he was part of a foot patrol among a group of 14 personnel when the attacker, who was killed instantly in the blast, struck. He says he was among four servicemen to be injured. "We had received a radio message to stop a suspicious car which had been spotted in the area," he says.

Detonated

"Within seconds it came careering round the corner. We started to draw our weapons and to flag down the driver to stop, but he didn't. He just drove at straight at us and detonated the car, which was converted into an improvised explosive device – in effect a homb on wheels

bomb on wheels.

"He was five metres in front of us. I was injured by the flying metal and debris. There was nothing left of the driver and only a small piece of metal remained of the white

car afterwards.

"The lads with me sent for Apache helicopters which came and provided aerial protection and cover until the American med-

tection and cover until the American medical team arrived on the scene to treat us. Planes were flown in to take us back to camp. "I was taken to the operating theatre straight away to remove the bits of metal from my leg."

After five days at the camp hospital he was flown to Selly Oak Hospital, in Birmingham, where he stayed for four days at its specialist unit for injured military personnel.

He now wears a leg brace to aid rehabilitation and visits RAF Cosford weekly for physiotherapy. But this was not the first brush

"Ryan got shot in the head. I was just behind him," he recalls. "He died in my

arms, but it all happened so quickly he didn't suffer. I was quite shaken up for quite a bit afterwards. It does bring home to you a sense of your own mortality. We stood in a guard of honour as his coffin draped in the Union Flag was put on a plane to be flown home."

But, despite facing death and suffering heartache since he joined up in 2010, he says he is proud to have served his country, "I'm glad I went to Afghanistan," he says. "I'm proud to have served Queen and country, but it's also been a great career move. It's

Rescuer Rudy bows out from an amazing career

LISA WRIGHT talks to firefighter Rudy Parkes who has retired after a long career helping out communities at home and abroad

But now after three decades of service Rudy has retired.

During his career the veteran fire-fighter, who ended his service as watch commander at Cradley Heath, and is married to Clare, 40, and father to 10-year-old William, has not only saved lives in the Midlands, but also spent more than 20 years visiting some of the poorest parts of the world to help build schools and community facilities schools and community facilities

He has led more than 50 trips to Romania and six to Tanzania.

This was alongside his firefighter duties and his role in the International Search and Rescue squad which has included working in earthquake-hit Japan and Haiti.

And it was in Haiti in 2010 that he was

part of a team that carried out his most

memorable rescue.

"We were actually searching a supermarket, there were about 40 of us rescuers and it was around lunchtime.

In March the next year he also joined the ISAR squad helping to find the survivors of the earthquake in Japan.

As his career drew to a close Rudy was also one of the 200 firefighters who attended the huge fire at Jayplas recycling plant in Smethwick in July, sparked by a Chinese lantern that floated onto the site.

He said: "I've loved every minute, I've got no regrets and I've loved going to work every day and every night."





They say the authority cannot afford to spend any money on the scheme while it faces £19m of cuts. A pilot scheme was set to be launched in the coming months to cauge the set to be launched in the coming months to gauge the level of support. The most recent figures collected show 86 per cent of pupils eligible for free school meals were taking up the offer.

A report detailing the recommendations has stated the extra cost to the council

the extra cost to the council by offering the discount

by offering the discount would be impossible.

"Figures presented to scrutiny estimated the cost of a wholly free service to be approximately £12m per annum and the £1 per meal service being in the region of £8m," it reads."

Chris Holliday, head of leisure and community

leisure and community health at Walsall Council, said: "It is worth noting

during the recent national school meals week some schools did agreed to serve meals to their children for £1 to encourage youngsters to try a hot dinner. It is also worth noting from September 2014 all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be offered a free lunchtime meal in line with the Government's announcement earlier this year."

Councillor Gareth Illman-Walker, a member of the school catering working group set up to look at plans for the future, says he is 'disappointed' by the decision to scrap £1 meals.

"I think it increases the burden on parents in terms of family finances," he said. "Part of the recommenda-

"Part of the recommenda-tions were to increase the number of children having school meals in line with other authorities, but now this is just another disincen-tive for children to have hot meals during the day."
