TERMS OF SALE.

I. The articles in the following list will be furnished at the prices named, ONLY when the quantity specified as follows shall be taken: When five are taken, they will be furnished at the rate per ten, when less than five are taken, two-thirds of our retail price will be charged; when fifty are taken, the rate per one hundred will be charged; when five hundred are taken, the rate per one thousand will be charged.

II. When furnishing Trees, Plants, &c., at prices quoted in this list, we reserve to ourselves the right of selecting sorts, which will consist of the leading popular varieties, but we will give the purchaser his choice as far as consistent with our stock.

III. The terms of payment must be, invariably, CASH IN HAND, OR SATISFACTORY NOTE OR DRAFT, payable at some bank, for amount of invoice.

Trees are packed in secure boxes, by competent men, for which we charge only for boxes and materials used.

Workmen and materials required by dealers in filling orders on our grounds furnished at cost.

Purchasers will be particular to give plain and explicit directions as to the route and manner in which they wish purchases forwarded.
