

Tested under the number S.C. 3 in the Southern Cooperative Cucumber tests of 1949, Santee's accumulative score was easily first when the cooperators were asked to rate the three best varieties for commercial production in their area.

Santee was rated as having the same good quality, fruit size, length, and general shape as Cubit. Its fruit color and shape as well as vine vigor was reported as slightly better than Cubit. It carries moderate resistance to both downy mildew and angular leaf spot. Season 60 days.

Gives Tremendous Yields of Round-Oval Pods This Bean, increased under U.S.D.A. No. 1625-17, has been introduced by the U.S.D.A. in cooperation with Mississippi, Florida, and Alabama Experiment Stations. It is the result of a cross of Commodore and Streamliner and then crossed with U. S. No. 5 Refugee. "Contender" is resistant to common bean mosaic and has shown considerable resistance to powdery mildew. It shows fine possibilities for mar-

ket gardeners and shippers and seems to be well adapted to a wide range of climatic conditions, possessing heat tolerance that may well establish it as an excellent variety for summer and fall plantings where present standard varieties some times do not set pods well. One to two days earlier than Black Valentine Stringless, maturing in 52 days. Plant: Intermediate height giving a somewhat spreading appearance 15 to 16 inches tall.

Pods: Slightly longer than Black Valentine Stringless although thicker and heavier and almost round in the young market stage. They are stringless with less fibre than Black Valentine Stringless, therefore, showing more tendency to curve.




BUSH BEAN TOPCROP

ALL AMERICA GOLD MEDAL WINNER Topcrop Snapbean is a Top Medal Award Winner, held over an extra year for the huge increase of seed necessary to launch this outstanding new Green Podded Bush Snapbean of universal appeal. Formerly designated as U. S. No. 1, Topcrop was developed by Dr. W. J. Zaumeyer, Bureau of Plant Industry, Beltsville. Md.

Topcrop Snapbean is a variety for the market gardener, shipper and processor. It is the result of a cross between Full Measure and U. S. No. 5 Refugee. It is immune to common bean mosaic, and to "greasy pod" or "shiny pod," a virus disease. Wide and thorough tests during the past few years indicate adaptability to most parts of the country, and it has the vigor to develop plants of good size under adverse weather conditions.

In comparative tests, Topcrop is earlier than Tenderegreen and Supergreen. High yields are borne during a short interval, giving a few large pickings rather than a number of small pickings. Because of its mosaic resistance, it has consistently outyielded the commercial varieties of the same general class, such as Tendergreen, Longreen, Full Measure, and others.

The pods of Topcrop are $5\frac{1}{2}$ to 6 inches long, 7/16inches wide and round; they are slender when young, fairly large when older. Seed development is slow, making for a very meaty pod, even in relatively advanced stages of maturity. Pods are a slightly lighter green than Tendergreen. This is an excellent variety for shipper and market gardeners. It was developed at the Regional Vegetable Breeding Laboratory at Charleston, S. C. "Southland" is a standard type red, general purpose tomato, maturing in the same season as Rutgers, or slightly earlier. It is highly resistant to Fusarium Wilt and collar rot and has considerable resistance to early blight and at least one form of late blight.



Here is a downy mildew resistant variety that produces fruit that are acceptable in the most critical markets. A cross between Puerto Rico 40 and Cubit, Palmetto produces fruits that are in the same class as Cubit. Typical fancy fruits are 8 to 9 inches, slightly more pointed at the ends than Cubit, with the same excellent color as Cubit and Marketer, superior to A & C.

Under epidemic mildew conditions in Charleston, Palmetto outyielded Marketer 4 to 23 times in fall crops. Similar reports have been received from Florida and Texas. Spring crop yields compare favorably with other varieties during normal years, but when mildew strikes, Palmetto continues to produce long after other varieties are ruined.

On nearly all lawns there are unsightly bare spots under the shade of trees, which have baffled all efforts to get into Grass, but with this mixture there need be no further difficulty. It is a combination of fine, dwarf growing, evergreen varieties, which in their wild or natural state are to be found growing in the woods or other sheltered and shaded spots. Ground that has been densely shaded by trees is frequently "sour," and if the drainage is defective it is apt to be covered with moss and coarse Grasses. In such cases an application of slaked lime, at the rate of one hundred pounds to each thousand square feet, or two tons to the acre, is an ex-cellent corrective and sweetener, but the moss should be first raked off.
