All goods, except coal oil, are quoted freight paid to your nearest railway station in Ontario, except to points north of the lakes, that is, on the north shores of the Georgian Bay and Lakes Huron and Superior; neither do I pay freight to stations farther north than Gravenhurst, nor east of Almonte.

To all these outside districts I ship goods with the understanding that the buyer pays freight from Toronto, and I allow a discount of three per cent. off invoice.

Prices are cut so fine in this catalogue that I will not have sufficient profit to prepay freight on any order amounting to less than ten dollars, but instead will allow three per cent. discount off invoice.

If you have been using mixed teas, my No. 107, at 40 cents per pound, would give you excellent satisfaction. It is a choice tea made by mixing No. 102 Congou and No. 105 Hyson together, with a small proportion of India Tea.

No. 49, Mixed Tea, at 30 cents per pound, has a good rich flavor, and is excellent value.

I sell immense quantities of the above mixed teas, and everybody who has used them seems well satisfied.

I will put my teas up in five, ten, fifteen, twenty, and twenty-five pound caddies at list prices; but if you order by the half chest I will allow a reduction of 2½ cents per pound off all teas, except Siftings.

A half chest of tea contains from 60 to 80 pounds.

In Lodges where there are a number of parties ordering tea to the amount of fifty pounds or over, I can put it up in five or ten pound paper parcels, and pack it in a half chest, and allow you 2½ cents per pound reduction off each kind, but in no instance can I ship less than fifty pounds at the reduced rate.


