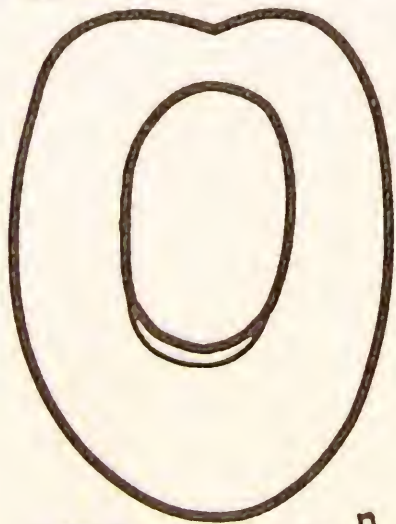

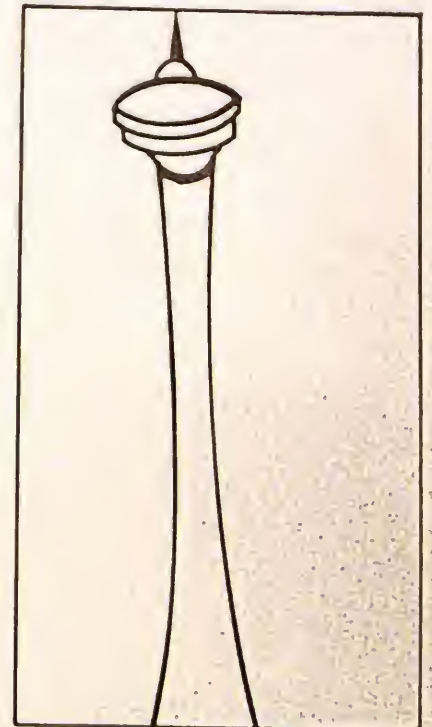

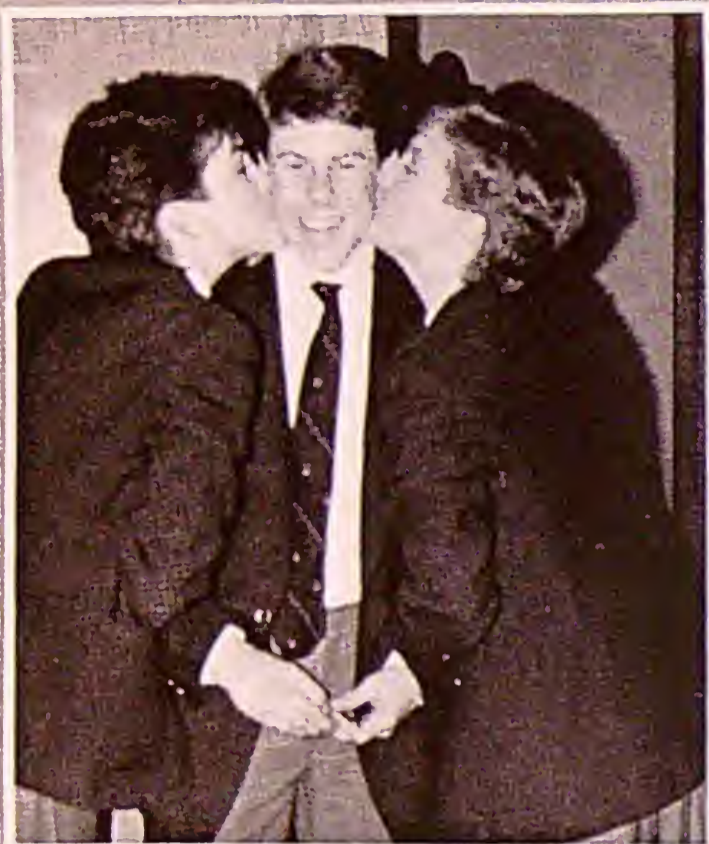
PREFECT BOARD

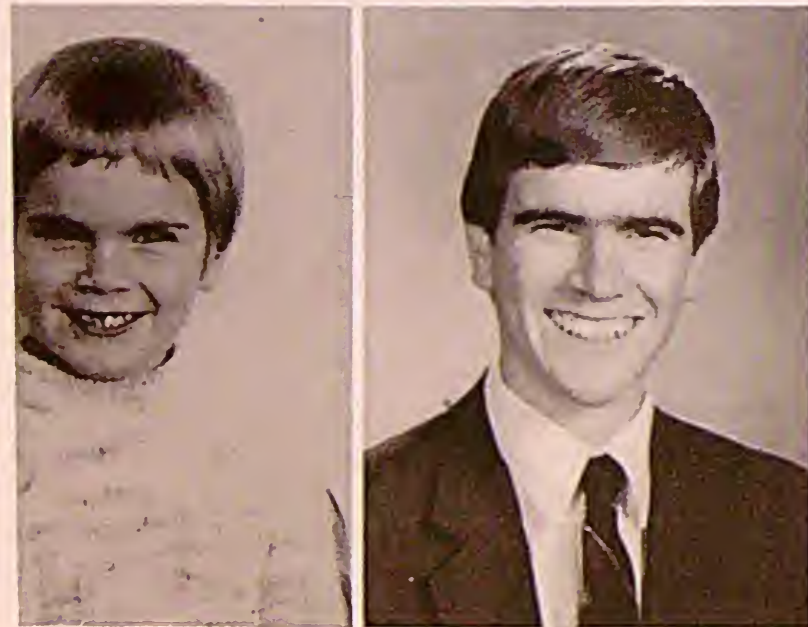


Michelle Beauchamp - In the future
