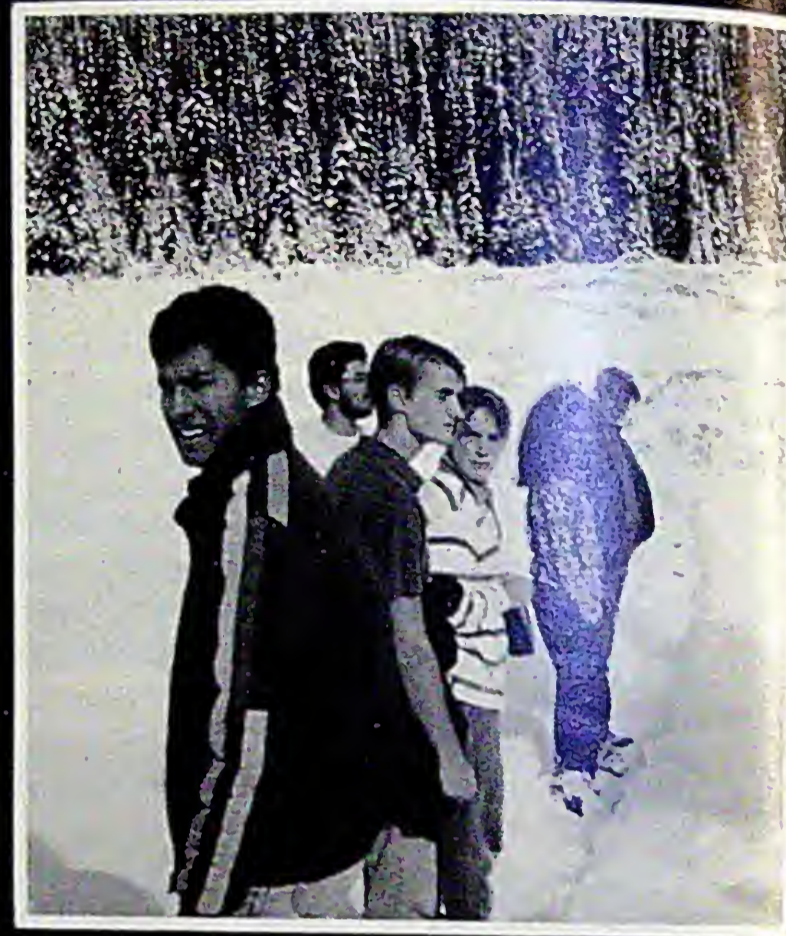
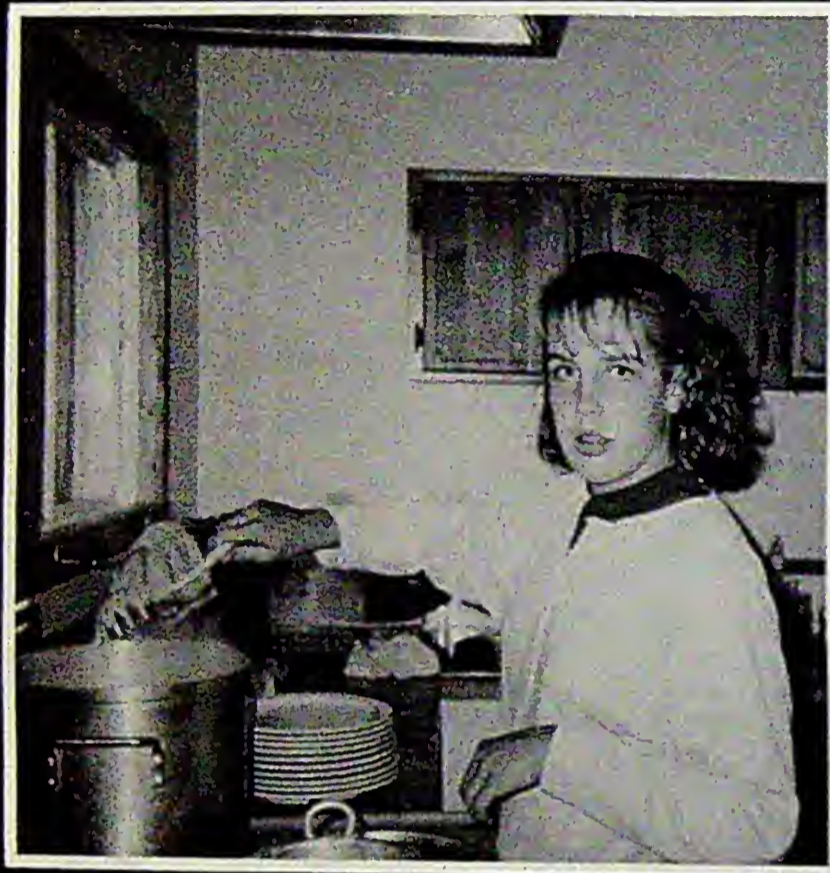
WIC a un nouveau roi

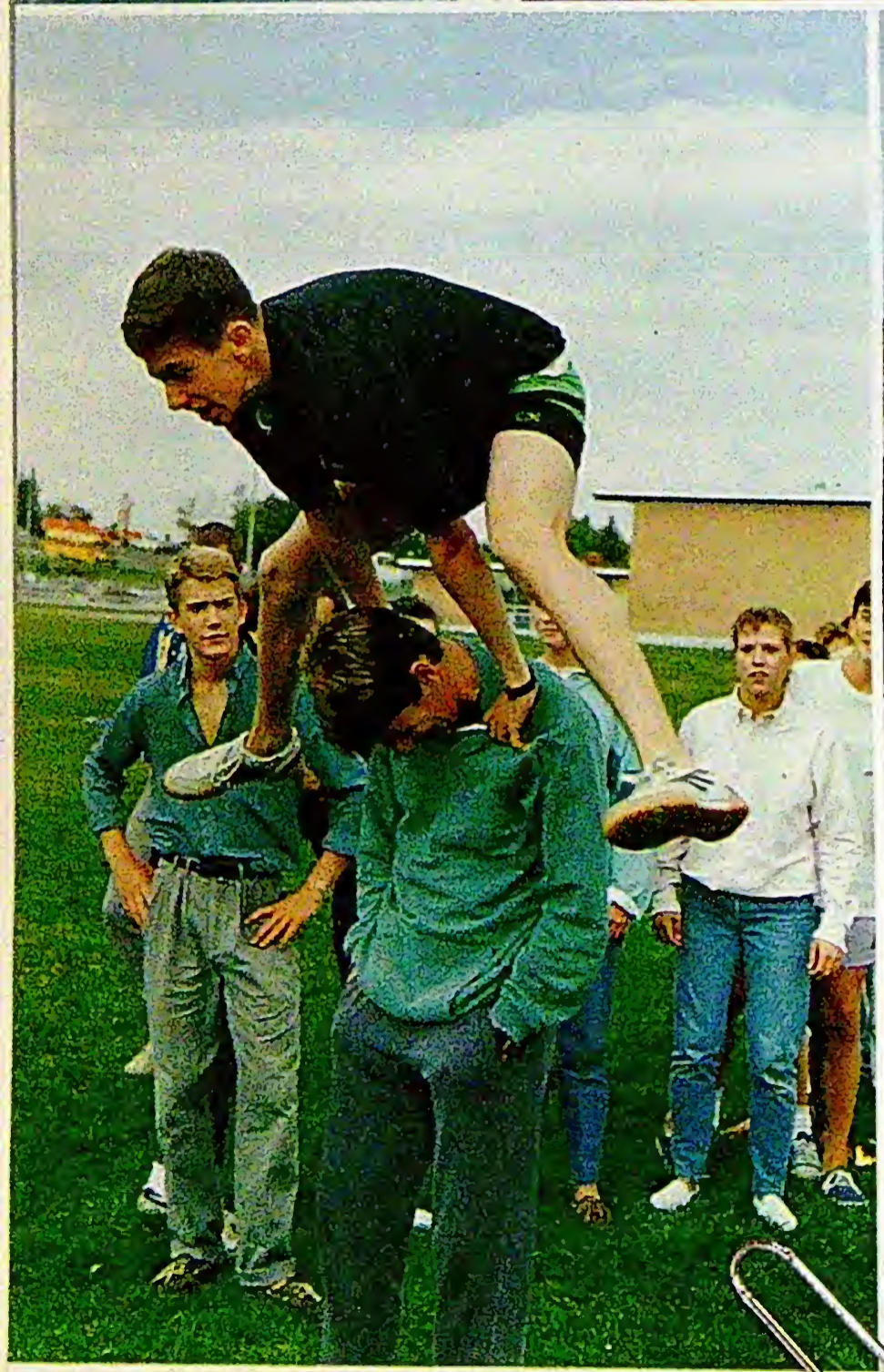
ODE TO THE TEACHERS

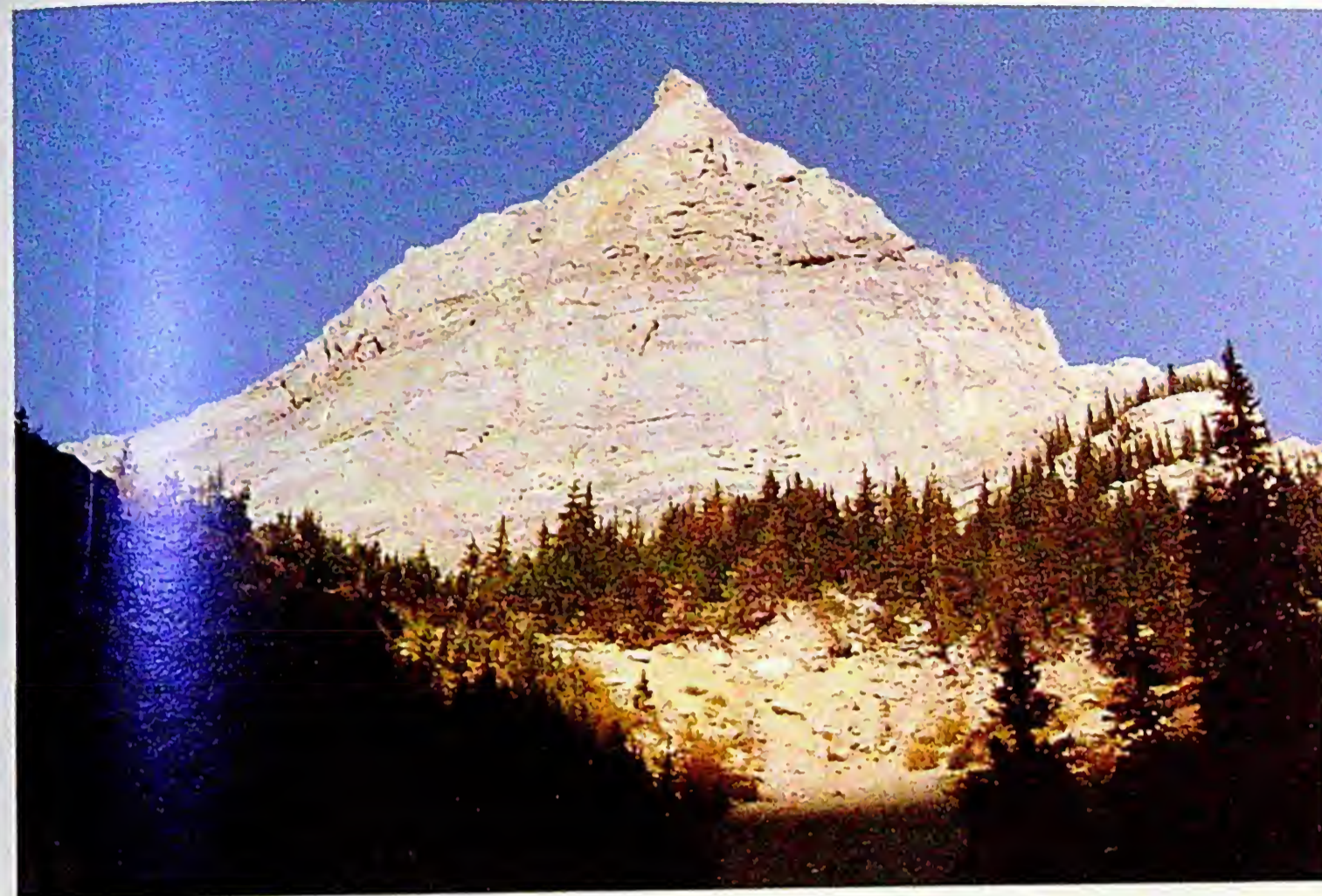
Cold showers.

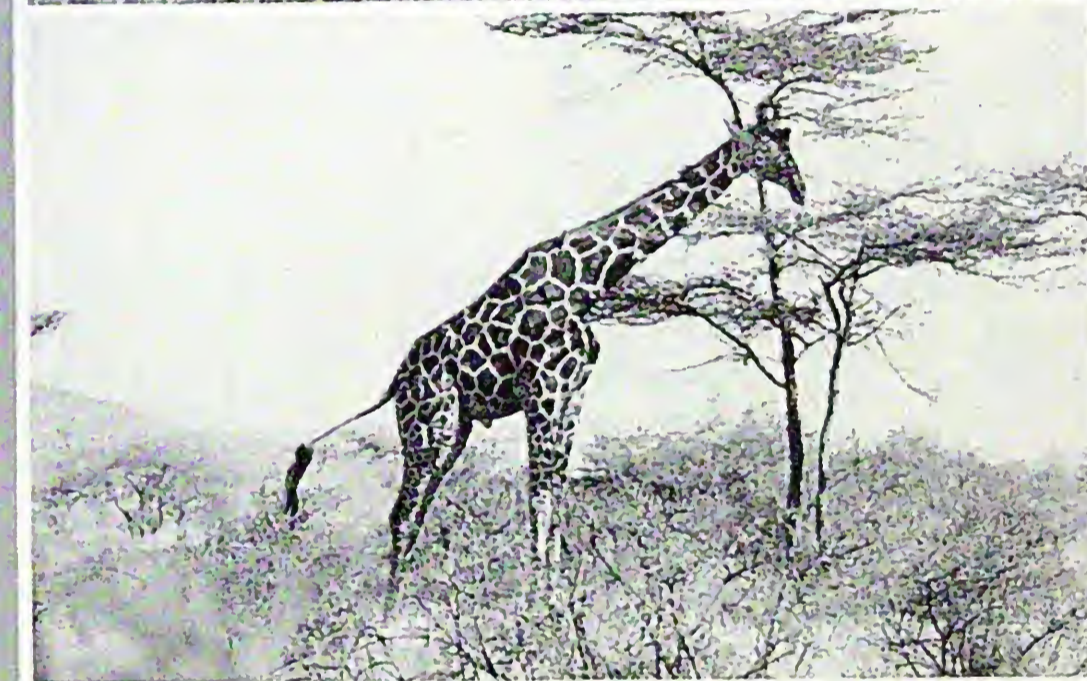
It was an incredible trip, full of new experiences and will not be forgotten by those of us lucky enough to go.

The Junior school, this year, has fulfilled its job description requirements in being as lippy and juvenile as was expected of them by all senior members. They have

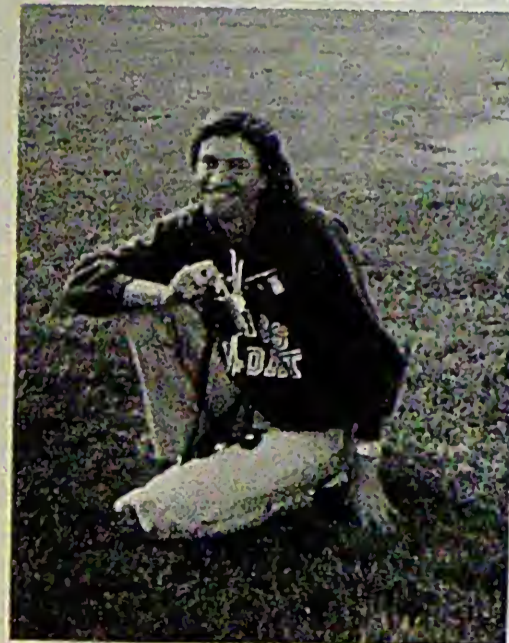
succeeded in physically destroying many parts of the school and staff (i.e. a certain Canadiens tie) So we would like to thank the juniors for all their help.

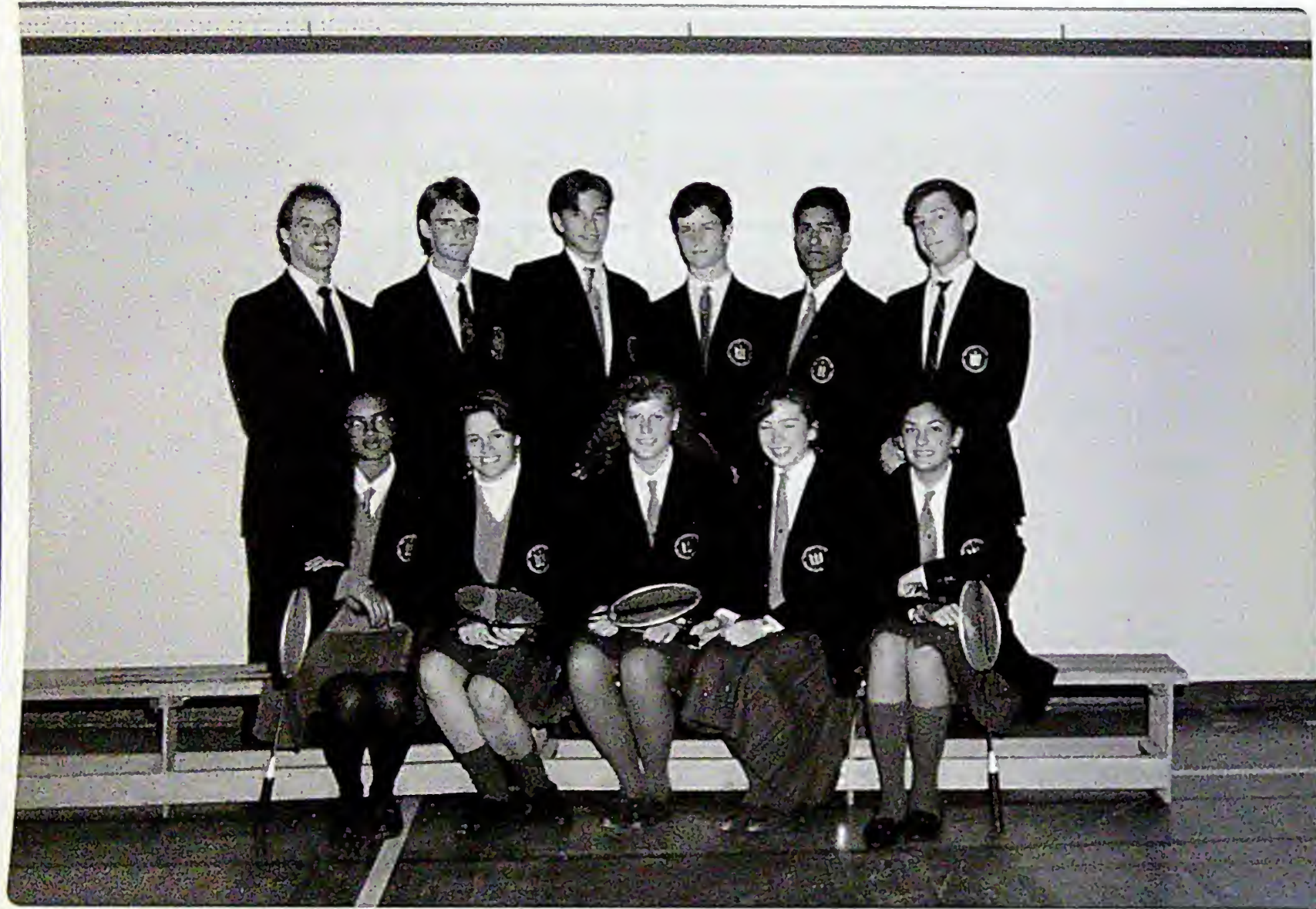
