### WICAA



"If you can dream - and not make dreams your master": We all dream of success, not just success in careers, but success in relationships as well as success in feeling our personal integrity.



So, to everyone who participated in our sports program this year, whether you were the star of your team or not, a great big THANK YOU is deserved!






I wondered how she would react, waking her up, like this.


