prove both the quantity and the quality of intra-murals.

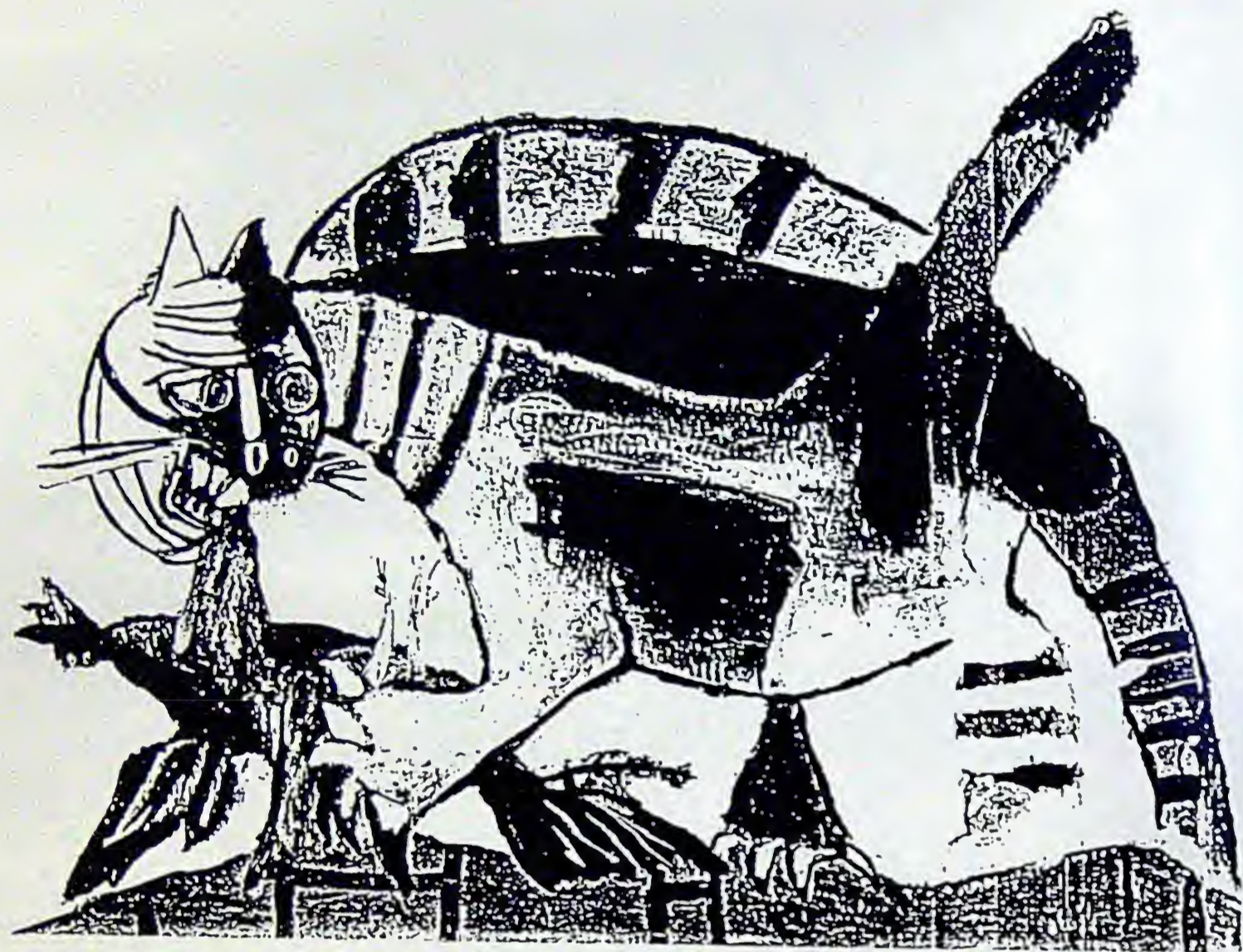
We organized the annual ski day when no less than 130 students spent an exhilarating day on the slopes of Lake Louise.

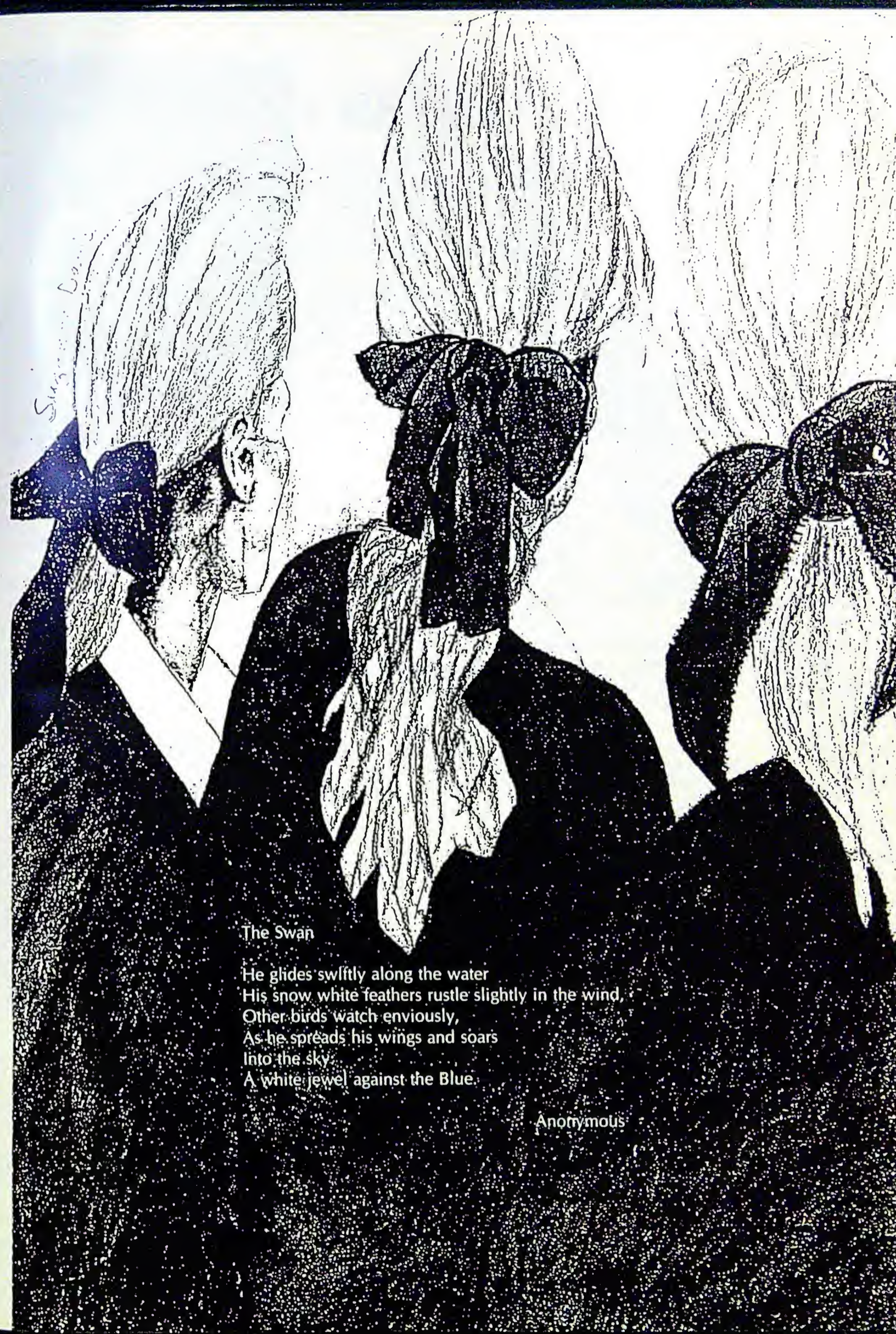

The sobbing got louder. Maggie must have been having that nightmare again. I got out of my warm bed and huddled next to her. Her seven year body was limp. After I woke her up, I had the urge to go and see Elizabeth, my foster mother.

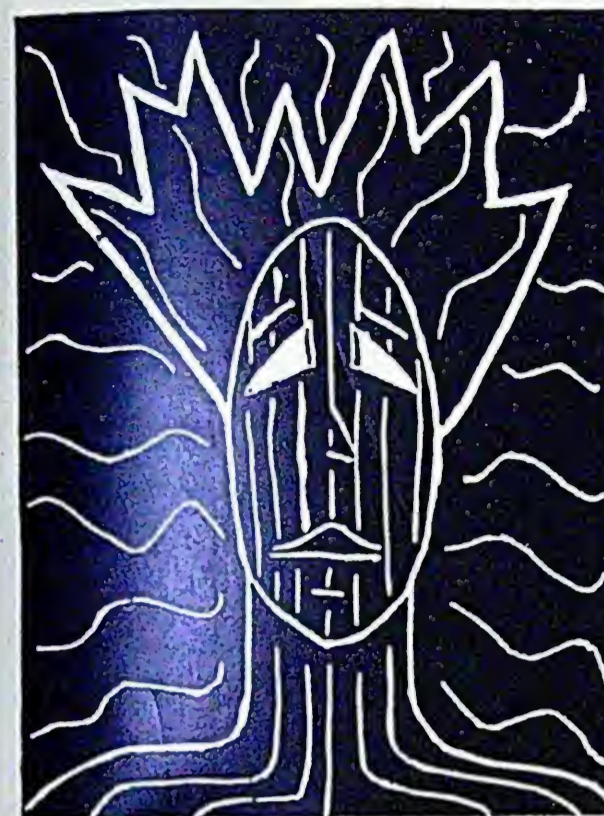
I wondered how she would react, waking her up, like this.
