# **Humanitarian Initiatives**



### Around W.I.C.!

This year, the *Etudes Sociales 20* class invited Minister of Immigration, the Honourable Jason Kenney, who is also our school's local Member of Parliament, to W.I.C. to describe a subject close to our hearts. Prior to this, our class met with Andy, the school's caretaker, who explained the incredible story of his immigration to Canada. Andy was an Ethiopian refugee, escaping conscription into the army during a time of civil war. With the help of friends and work colleagues. Andy made it out of Ethiopia and spent several years in a German refugee camp. The process of applying for refugee status and a travel visa was painstakingly slow as Andy would spend the next four years waiting to be permitted to travel. During this time, Andy met Eden, whom he would soon marry. Finally, when Andy was granted refugee status, Eden had not yet received her visa, so he came to Canada where he planned to work and earn enough money to bring her to Calgary.

Our class wrote letters to Mr. Kenney describing this incredible story, and how much it would mean if he could facilitate Andy's wife coming to Canada. Whether our letters played a role or not, it seemed our prayers were answered as Eden recently obtained her visa and has now joined Andy in Calgary! On behalf of the Etudes Sociales 20 class, and on behalf of West Island College, we would like to congratulate Andy and welcome Eden to Canada! -Chris Spence and Sasha Selby




#### Q-What were your top five highlights?
