



The teaching profession is an incredible vocation, and serving as a teacher and as a leader at a school is a privilege; I have always loved the work, in spite of the inevitable challenges that occasionally present themselves. It may seem self-evident, but joining such a well-respected educational institution as W.I.C., and embracing yet another new role, has been a "defining moment" for me over the last three years. However, the "moment" part of "defining moment" occurred for me during a Social Studies class I was teaching first semester. I had returned to the classroom after a six year hiatus, and I found myself wondering if I could even remember what to do! Honestly, to look into the faces of my new students, I was momentarily overcome with panic! In my mind, I returned to a day 12 years ago when I was teaching a Social Studies 30 class in which my son was a student. We were vigorously preparing for the diploma exam when he and I made eye contact and I realized, for the first time from a parent's perspective, how much the success of our children matters. I don't mean just academic success — as important as that is. In that moment, my hopes and dreams for his success became larger than life and I realized, perhaps for the first time in my career, the true importance of my role as teacher.

In my new classroom at W.I.C., recollecting that moment with my son, the defining moment came full circle. I was filled with renewed excitement and enthusiasm for the work in front of me, and was reminded that, in order to realize one's potential, one must embrace uncertainty and take risks. In that process, we risk failure, rejection and disappointment; however, if we do not embrace the opportunity, we risk not realizing the joy and the potential of all life has to offer. In that moment, I recollected Amelia Earhart's poem, "Courage."

The defining moment for me this year was, and is, recognizing that a little courage allows us to dream big and to realize, in the words of Ursula LeGuin, that "it is the journey that matters in the end." As a teacher and a leader in the school, I get to be part of the journey, and I relish that fact.

It is a privilege to be allowed to share in your journeys.


BOYD BELISLE Head of Secondary Education In December 2011, Mr. Belisle left the College to pursue new and exciting opportunities outside the



However, as the racers approached the finish line it became apparent that something was wrong: two of our girls failed to show up with what we had confidently expected to be good times. We started to trace the course back from the finish line and finally discovered our two runners. It transpired that one of the girls had twisted her knee during the race and her teammate, the girl whom I had anticipated placing in top position, had stopped to help her. In doing so, she had given up her personal opportunity to achieve the finish which she was capable of achieving.
























B.P. Energy Project — STS2

In June 2011 W.I.C. was generously given a grant for \$10 000 from B.P. Canada to do a project on energy. Our project took place in the 2011-2012 school year and it was called STS2, which stands for Students Teaching Students Solar. The project involved eight of our senior students who taught all the junior science classes a short unit about solar energy. The grade 7's focused on building solar powered model cars. The grade 8's did a comparison of the three types of light bulbs and then built a L.E.D. glowing ice ball powered with mini solar panels. The grade 9's built solar lanterns which in turn were given to remote villages in Brazil and Tanzania. We are very appreciative of the generosity of B.P. Canada for funding this project and we hope that our students learned a bit more about solar energy and its huge potential as part of the solution to the global energy problem. 












Grade 8 Science Fair
