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# THE INTERVIEW

*Johnny: Thank you for agreeing to speak to us today Lyn, could you tell us why you began to believe that the high acclaim for the Limitless Lactis vaccine may be somewhat unfounded?"*

*Johnny: You and your husband must have gotten an awful shock when your daughter started to show symptoms of cutaneous leishmaniasis.*

*Lyn: Yes, my husband and I barely slept for weeks and then when Liana started to get sick it really took a toll on all of us. (Johnny hands Lyn a tissue as she tears up)*

*Johnny: Take your time Lyn, and what were these symptoms that your daughter had?*

*Lyn: Well firstly we observed small ulcers on her arms and legs which started to join together. It looks like the vaccine hasn't worked like it should have.*

*Johnny: That must have been extremely difficult for ye. We might now move onto your blog on the Syrian refugees. Those of my generation were all been taken*

*aback by the war in Syria in 2014-2018. Tell us why you decided you would write about it on Limited Times.*

*Lyn: Well, the incidence of Leishmaniasis skyrocketed during and after the refugee crisis and what I learned about the thousands of people impacted was truly harrowing. It was quite upsetting to think of either of my children leaving their homeland*
