

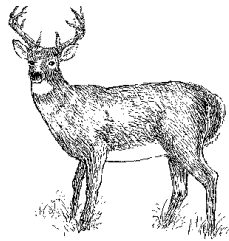
Before the fire

Red-cockaded woodpecker's had lots of homes.



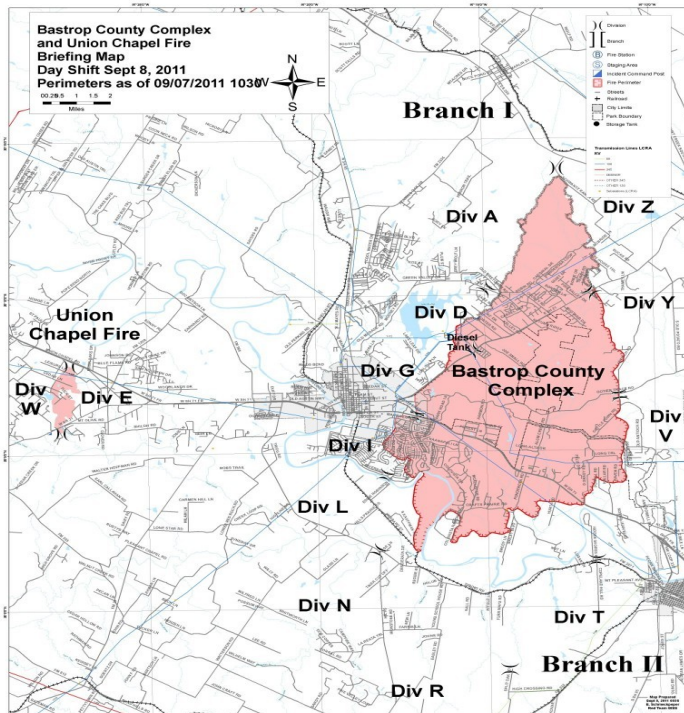

The Bastrop Fire



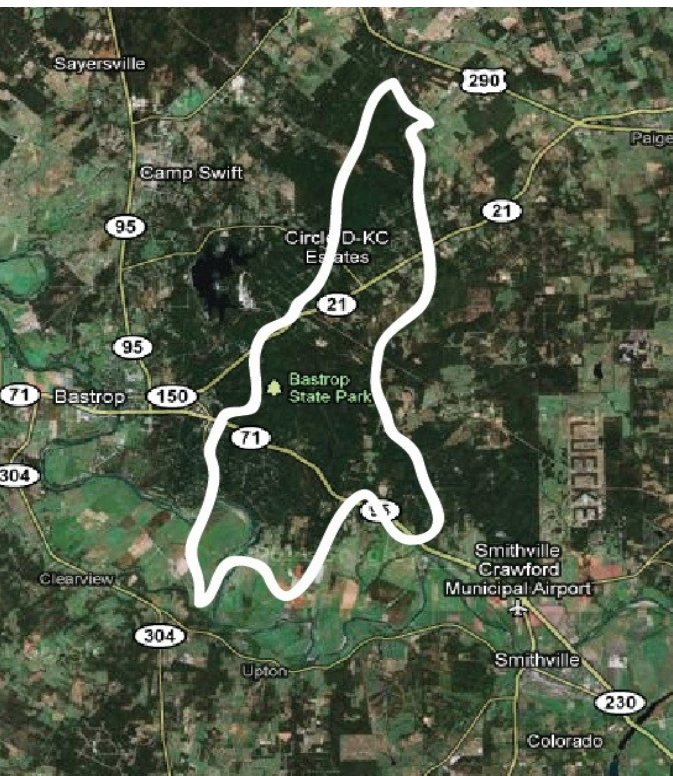

- A total of 1669 homes and 41 commercial buildings were also lost in the fire.
