San Juan Unified considers closing 3 adult education schools

CARMICHAEL, CA - The San Juan Unified School District is considering closing all of its [adult education programs](#) in a cost-saving measure that would affect about 3,000 students.

Officials told teachers and staff in a meeting Wednesday that the adult programs at Winterstein Adult Center, Sunrise Tech Center and Orange Grove School could all be on the chopping block, said district spokesman Trent Allen.

A final decision will be made on Jan. 25, 2011 and will depend on the governor's budget proposal set to be released on Jan. 10.

Allen said current adult program teachers credentialed to teach K-12 grades and have seniority may be transferred to other schools within the district. Staff who are only certified to teach adult education will be out of a job if officials move forward with the closures, said Allen.

Most area schools in other districts have minimized or eliminated their adult education programs entirely while San Juan Unified is one of the few that has kept all of its programs intact, Allen said.
