

Tracy Unified trustees to see list of cuts

Tracy Unified School District Superintendent Jim Franco will tell the district's board of directors Tuesday what the schools will likely have to do without next year.

Franco will present his

\$15 million list of reduction suggestions. The district faces a deficit because of declining revenue from the state.

Franco's ideas will come from a working list of \$16 million in ways to save money over two years, starting this June.

Likely, schools next year will be missing many teachers and most normal day-to-day supplies. The district sent out about 150 pink slips to its teachers and other employees Monday, notifying them they might be laid off in the next few months.

The board is anticipated to accept the superintendent's report a week before it makes its final decisions at 6:30 p.m. March 30 in the gym at West High School, 1775 W. Lowell Ave.

Also on the agenda

- The board will vote whether to approve its application for a state grant for preschool classes at South/West Park Elementary School.

The state gives the district \$183,500 every year for the preschool, where most kids are learning English as a second language.

- The board will vote whether to approve Tracy Adult School's application for a Workforce Investment Act grant that could help keep that school open next year.

At Tracy Adult School, high school students catch up on credits in the evening, older adults earn diplomas and hundreds of residents learn English.

Most of the adult school's budget is on the chopping block, and it will close if the board votes to limit its funding to only one \$100,000 grant, director Dave Pickering said.

The Adult Education and Family Literacy grant would award the school \$225 for certain student achievements.
