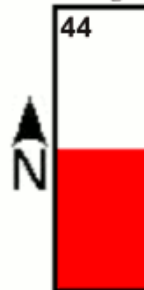

Gislingrud, Norway, 13 April 1940: Second Bataljon, I Artilleri Regiment was mobilized on the April 8th in Fredrikstad. On the 11th the Bataljon was ordered to the Askim area to support the bridge groups 2, 3 and 4 defending the Glåma River crossings. On the 12th, Batteri 5 engaged the Germans at Fossum bridge. As the enemy

pushed across the river, the batteri first displaced to Tømmerås on the 13th and eventually to Gislingrud.

Board Configuration:



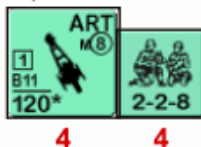
Only hexrows R-GG are playable.

VICTORY CONDITIONS: The Germans win if at game end they have amassed ≥ 5 CVP more than the Norwegians.

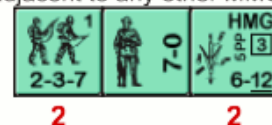
Norwegians setup first. Balance: in Victory conditions replace "5" with 6

Batteri 5/I Artilleri Regiment[ELR - 2], setup as indicated, see SSR 6 & 7. {SAN: 0}

Setup ≤ 2 hexes from 44X6:



Setup anywhere, 1 MMC per hex and not adjacent to any other MMC:



Germans moves first. Balance: in Victory conditions replace "5" with 4

Elements of the Fliegerkorps X[ELR: 0], enter automatically on Turn 1. {SAN: 0}



SSR:

1. EC are normal, with no wind at start.
2. Kindling is NA.
3. All buildings are Single Story. Orchards are not in season and Grain is Open Ground.
4. There are no German Player Turns for any purpose.
5. Since there are no German ground units on the map, Norwegian units lose their HIP/concealment only if they fire or are broken/pinned. However E7.25 (re: a unit moving in Open Ground) applies normally. There can be no Mistaken Attack [E7.32]; such a result is

ignored and the plane remains in play.

6. The half-squads and the SMC may use HIP and if setup in suitable terrain they may begin the game entrenched. The HMGs may start the game in AA mode.
7. The Norwegians Guns setup onboard with no HIP or concealment and unemplaced. The Guns may not gain concealment during the game. The Guns may not fire Smoke. Substitute any extra ART Gun for the 4th 120* ART counter, treat it as if it were a 120* ART counter.

AFTERMATH: After arriving at Gislingrud, the batteri reported ready to fire at 1500, although there was no contact with the radio equipped spotter. Aircraft from Fliegerkorps X attacked the batteri and were in turn engaged by the AAMGs assigned to provide air defence. This prompted another withdrawal east to Skifterudengen. The next day, batteri 5 along with the rest of the Norwegian units in the Østfold region area, withdraw into Sweden and were interned there.
