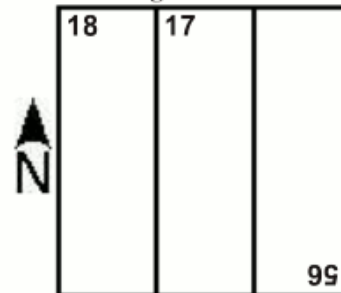

South Hov, Norway 13th April: Although the Germans had crossed the Glaama River and were moving with little resistance, the Norwegians were not ready to go quietly. A 4th German column formed in Lillistrom by units of the 340th infantry regiment lead by Cpt. Gutsche. They began driving towards Mysen riding in

Norwegian trucks but as they reached South Hov they were in for a surprise as a Norwegian Company was prepared to defend a roadblock till the bitter end.

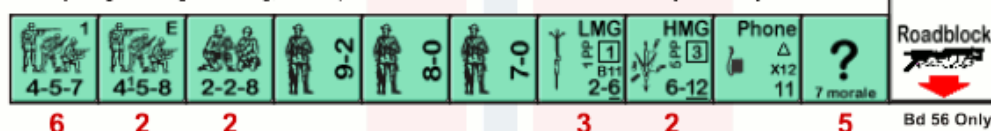
Board Configuration:

Company Orre[ELR: 3], setup on or east of board 17 row 9 {SAN: 3}

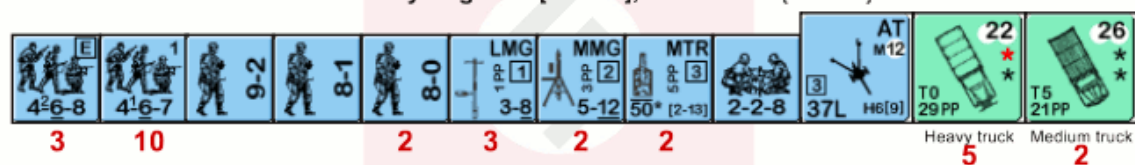

SSR:

1. EC Ground Snow with wet EC (road are not plowed) with no wind at start
2. Ponds are frozen. Board 56 hex P6 has a steeple.
3. The Norwegian HMG must start the game crewed
4. All German units must enter as Passengers
5. Prior to setup the German player designates which group of roads his trucks will enter from on board 18

either Q10 and A5 or Q10 and GG5. At least 3 trucks must enter from each of the two roads chosen. He then can determine after the allied setup which passengers will be on what truck and which road they will enter on.

6. The Norwegian field phone represents one battery of 70mm HE with normal ammo
7. Bore sighting is not allowed

AFTERMATH: It was a fight the Norwegians could not afford to lose, as the Germans continued pressing forward the defenders held there ground. The firefight lasted into the early evening when Cpt. Gutsche assessed the situation thinking that his company could be outflanked and cutoff, he decides to retreat to Fetsund. The Norwegians tenacity allowed them to force the German retreat and hold South Hov for another day. As for Cpt. Gutsche, promptly after he returned to Fetsund he was relieved of command.
